There were 25,750 bales from the 1993 crop which ginners estimated would be ginned after the March survey, compared with 30,350 bales for the 1992 crop, and 47,000 bales for the 1991 crop. The number of active cotton gins for crop year 1993 was 1,356, compared to 1,389 in 1992, and 1,508 for the 1991 crop year.

Bureau of the Census Cotton Information

Cotton consumed during the month ending January 31, 1994, amounted to 741,567 bales. Cotton on hand in consuming establishments at the end of January was 651,098 bales, and the total in public storage and in compresses was 10,836,203 bales. Active consuming cotton spindles totaled 3,232,000, and the quantity of domestic cotton exported, excluding linters, was 522,100 bales. These and other data were published in "Census Bulletin M22P(94)-01", dated February 24, 1994.
