Bureau of the Census Cotton Information

Cotton consumed during the month ending December 31, 1994, amounted to 879,446 bales. Cotton on hand in consuming establishments at the end of December was 648,608 bales, and the total in public storage and in compresses was 11,846,800 bales. Active consuming cotton spindles totaled 2,913,000, and the quantity of domestic cotton exported, excluding linters, was 773,800 bales. These and other data were published in "Census Bulletin M22P(94)-12", dated January 26, 1995.
