





NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT HIGHLIGHTS

The first two weeks of August 1969 were spent moving firing batteries from tactical sites to the immediate area around the Battalion CP and MACG-18 in preparation for embarkation from the Republic of Vietnam.


On 11 August 1969 an advanced party left for Okinawa to locate and recover personal baggage stored there. "A" and "C" batteries began loading aboard ship on 13 August and departed Danang that same day aboard the USS RELLE GROVE, LSD-2 and the USS TORTUGA ISD-26. On 14 August "B" and H&S batteries departed Danang aboard USS TULARE LKA-112.


A breif stop was made at Okinawa by all three ships to pick up personal baggage. The two LSD's then stopped at Yokosuka, Japan 21 August and sailed for CONUS on 26 August. The LKA arrived at Sasebo, Japan 23, August and sailed for CONUS on 31 August. The Battalion was still embarked at the end of August.

The Battalion embarked after four and one half years of continuous service in RVN with no damage to equipment. Loading of all three ships was completed swiftly and smoothly.

- 1. "A" Battery quard was increased from 5 August to 12 August 1969 when K. Co. 26th Marines took charge of Hill 724.
- 2. "B" Battery emplaced extra wire around perimeter until 11 August at which time Marine Air Control Squadron 4 assumed the responsibilities for ground defense of Hill 647.
- 3. "C" Battery cut grass around the perimeter and continued to improve the defensive wire until MASS-3 took over the ground defensive of Hill3327 on 11 August 1969.
- 4. H&S Battery made no changes in defensive position during the month. Defense condition III was in effect all month.

H. Training

- 1. "A" Battery conducted training in Convoy Procedures, Personal Health, UCMJ, Conduct Marks, Effects of Discharges, Military Bearing, and Map Reading.
- 2. "B" Battery conducted instructions on Embarkation and Convoy Procedures.
- 3. "C" Battery conducted four hours of GMS classes.
- 4. H&S Battery conducted no GMS classes, Technical of Team training during the month of August, while making preparations to embark: from RVN.
- I. Logistics: Logistics plans continued for deployment and relocation of 1st LAAM Bn.

J. Supply

- 1. The entire Battalion organic supply account was loaded aboard the USS TULARE LKA-112, upon embarkation from RVN.
- 2. All documents to Force Logistics Command and 3rd Force Service . Regiment were cancelled prior to deployment. The requisitioning objectives were reduced in accordance with poeretional directives for the redeployment of 1st LAAM Bn.
- 3. All temporary loans and garrison property accounts were terminated prior to deployment.
- 4. Expenditures, 1st MAW grant amendent brought all funds to zero balance prior to deployment from RVN.

M. Commication/Electronics

- 1. Radio Relay Section: During the first part of the month the four AN/MPC-60s were painted, steam cleaned and reassembled for embarkation. Operational radio relay communications were maintained until 9 August 1969. Eight AN/PRC-27s and other minor items were palletized and packed for embarkation.
- 2. Radio Section: All AN/MRC-83s were prepared for embarkation. Windshield covers were mounted and antenna mounts were replaced. All vehicles were steam cleaned. AN/TRC-75 and AN/TSC-15 communications central was banded and mounted on an M-37. Minor radio items were packed in a CONEX box.
- 3. Message Center Section: Office equipment was packed for embarkation and continuous communications were maintained ashore and afloat by facilities of the 1st MAW communicationscenter and the USS TULARE. 110 incoming messages were precessed during the month.
- 5. Wire Section: All equipment was cleaned and packed for embarkation operational trunks and locals were maintained until 11 August 196%. All wire lines tagged for the benefit of MASS-3, which was moving into the battalion area.
- 6. General; The communications platoon, upon mounting out of the combat zone after four and one half years, leaves Vietnam with every piece of equipment that it entered with.
