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### Summary of Findings

Review of Funds
Administered by District Attorneys General
and
Judicial District Drug Task Forces
First through Thirty-first Judicial Districts
For the Year Ended June 30, 2013

#### Scope

Our review included an examination of funds administered by the district attorneys general for the year ended June 30, 2013. In addition, our review included an examination of judicial districts' drug task force funds administered by the task forces' boards of directors for the year ended June 30, 2013.

#### Results

Five judicial districts had findings. We reviewed these findings and recommendations with the district attorneys general and representatives of the drug task forces to provide an opportunity for their response. Officials in the First, Second, Third, Fifteenth, and Twenty-third Judicial Districts provided written responses on certain findings, which are paraphrased in this report. Details of these findings, recommendations, and management's responses are presented in the Findings, Recommendations, and Financial Section of this report.

The following are summaries of the findings from our review:

#### FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- The drug task force had a cash shortage of \$1,999 as of June 30, 2013.
- Official prenumbered receipts were not issued for some miscellaneous collections.
- Drug task force records for seized cash were not maintained properly.
- Confidential informant payment history logs were not maintained properly.
- Equipment inventory control records noted several items as missing.
- Quarterly income summary reports were not filed currently.
- The drug task force had deficiencies in the use of justice assistance grant program funds.

#### SECOND JUDICIAL DISTRICT

Drug task force records for seized cash were not maintained properly.

#### THIRD JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Drug evidence seized by the drug task force was missing.
- The drug task force had a cash shortage of \$1,700 at June 30, 2013.
- Deficiencies were noted in the recording and managing of seized property.

#### FIFTEENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

• The drug task force had deficiencies related to some credit card transactions.

#### TWENTY-THIRD JUDICIAL DISTRICT

♦ The office had deficiencies in the administration of drug control funds.

#### INTRODUCTION

This report reviews funds administered by District Attorneys General and Judicial District Drug Task Forces for the year ended June 30, 2013, for the first through the thirty-first judicial districts of the State of Tennessee. A separate review was conducted in each of the 31 judicial districts of the funds administered by the District Attorneys General and Judicial District Drug Task Forces. The results of our reviews of the judicial districts are presented in this report.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Each judicial district comprises from one to seven counties. Main offices are generally in the county where the district attorney general resides, with branch offices located in other counties. The district attorneys general had funds on deposit with some county trustees included in the respective judicial districts. The county trustees had one or more of the following types of funds on deposit: District Attorney General, Drug Task Force, Federal Asset Forfeiture, Metro/County Appropriations, Mediation Services, and Others.

#### **District Attorney General Fund**

The District Attorney General Fund is used primarily to account for fees received from violating the Fraud and Economic Crimes Prosecution Act of 1984. In addition, this fund accounts for other sources of revenues received by the District Attorneys General, such as: grants, investment income, miscellaneous refunds, contributions, and other local revenues.

#### **Drug Task Force Fund**

Some judicial districts have established multi-jurisdictional drug task forces under the leadership of the district attorneys general. These drug task forces were created by contract (mutual aid agreement) between the participating district attorneys general and city and county governments, and were approved by their respective legislative bodies. Each judicial district drug task force, which generally includes sheriffs and police chiefs of participating law enforcement agencies within each judicial district, is governed by a board of directors.

Drug task force funds should be deposited with the county trustee in the county of each district attorney general's residence or another county designated by the district attorney general. The county trustees should credit these funds to the Judicial District Drug Fund.

All nonconfidential financial operations should be expended through these Judicial District Drug funds under the administration of the county mayors/executives. The directors of the drug task forces should submit requisitions to the county mayors/executives for goods and services, which would then be obtained through the county's purchasing system. Cash transactions for confidential funds should be requisitioned and disbursed under the supervision of each drug task force director and chairman.

#### Federal Asset Forfeiture Fund

In 1984, the United States Department of Justice enacted the Comprehensive Crime Control Act, which gave the Office of U.S. Attorney General the authority to share federally forfeited property with cooperating state and local law enforcement agencies. The three primary goals of the Justice Department's forfeiture program are 1) to punish and deter criminal activity by depriving criminals of property used for or acquired through illegal activities; 2) to enhance cooperation among federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies through equitable sharing of assets recovered through the program; and 3) to procure revenues to enhance forfeitures and strengthen law enforcement.

Through an agreement with the United States Department of Justice and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), the Office of District Attorney General of the Thirtieth Judicial District is participating in this forfeiture program. Under this agreement, the District Attorney General's Office has assigned to the Drug Task Force (DTF) an officer who is under the direct supervision and control of DEA supervisory personnel. Upon request by the District Attorney General's Office, DEA reimburses for overtime payments made to the The District Attorney General's Office deposits these officer assigned to the DTF. reimbursements with the Shelby County financial director, who channels the funds through Shelby County's General Fund. Also, under this agreement, the District Attorney General's Office requests from DEA its share of property recovered through joint law enforcement activities in which the officer assigned to the DTF participates. Payments received are deposited with the Shelby County Trustee's Office into the U.S. District Attorney General Federal Asset Forfeiture Fund. Pursuant to the Department of Justice's policy, funds made available through this program must be used by the District Attorney General's Office for law enforcement purposes.

Through an agreement with the Internal Revenue Service, the Office of District Attorney General of the Twentieth Judicial District also participates in the forfeiture program. Payments received by the Twentieth Judicial District are deposited to a separate fund in Metro-Nashville Davidson County and must be used for law enforcement purposes.

#### Metro/County Appropriations Fund

The Metro/County Appropriations Fund consists of funds appropriated by the counties and cities in the Twentieth and Twenty-third Judicial Districts.

#### **Mediation Services Fund**

The Mediation Services Fund consists of funds received from a one dollar litigation tax that is assessed on all cases in the General Sessions and Juvenile Courts in Davidson County and other appropriations received by the Twentieth Judicial District for the support and operation of victim-offender mediation centers.

#### Other Funds

Other funds in the Thirtieth Judicial District consist of funds raised from contributions from the City of Memphis to enhance a witness protection program (Witness Relocation Fund), donations received from various groups to promote initiatives to increase the quality of life in certain communities located in Shelby County (Broken Window Fund), and certain forfeited funds (White Collar Crime Fund).

#### BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The various governmental funds are accounted for using the modified accrual basis of accounting.

#### FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Total revenues and expenditures of these funds for the 31 judicial districts, as well as beginning and ending balances for the year examined, are presented below:

#### **SCOPE**

The reviews include an examination of funds administered by the district attorneys general for the year ended June 30, 2013. In addition, the reviews include an examination of the administration of judicial district drug task force funds by the Drug Task Forces' Boards of Directors for the year ended June 30, 2013. Our reviews consisted of tests of records and auditing procedures that we considered necessary in the circumstances.

Findings and recommendations, as a result of our reviews, are presented in the Findings, Recommendations, and Financial Section of this report. Five judicial districts had material findings. We reviewed these findings and recommendations with the district attorneys general and representatives of the Drug Task Forces to provide an opportunity for their response. The written responses from the District Attorney Generals and/or Drug Task Force Directors of the First, Second, Third, Fifteenth, and Twenty-third Judicial Districts are paraphrased in this report. Other officials made oral responses; however, these oral responses have not been included in this report.

## FINDINGS, RECOMMENDATIONS AND FINANCIAL SECTION

## FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

#### FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

## FINDING 2013-01 THE DRUG TASK FORCE HAD A CASH SHORTAGE OF \$1,999 AS OF JUNE 30, 2013

As reported in the previous year, the Drug Task Force (DTF) had a cash shortage of \$2,195 as of January 31, 2013. The DTF personnel located documentation to support disbursements of \$196 leaving a balance of \$1,999 as of June 30, 2013. The remaining cash shortage was liquidated on August 9, 2013, when \$505 was located in a lock box in the DTF office and on October 10, 2013, with the receipt of \$1,494 as settlement of a claim filed on the agency's surety bond. Since the cash shortage was not liquidated until after June 30, 2013, the entire amount (\$1,999) is reflected as a cash shortage as of June 30, 2013.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

A shortage of \$1,999 was discovered during the audit. All monies were accounted for except for \$1,494, which was covered by insurance. These issues were caused by the previous office manager, whose employment has since been terminated. An investigation was conducted into the missing funds; however, evidence did not warrant criminal charges. All cash records are now being properly maintained by the new office manager and will be kept up to date.

## FINDING 2013-02 OFFICIAL PRENUMBERED RECEIPTS WERE NOT ISSUED FOR SOME MISCELLANEOUS COLLECTIONS

The Drug Task Force (DTF) did not issue receipts for some miscellaneous collections. Sections 9-2-102 through 9-2-104, *Tennessee Code Annotated (TCA)*, require prenumbered receipts to be issued for all collections. We noted one instance where funds were seized and deposited with the trustee; however, the funds were not receipted by the DTF. In addition, we determined that receipts were not issued for checks received for payment of vehicles and various other items sold using <u>govdeals.com</u>. Due to the absence of receipts, we could not determine if these checks were deposited in compliance with provisions of Section 5-8-207, *TCA*, which requires that all public funds be deposited within three days of collection. This deficiency exists because management did not implement internal control procedures that would ensure funds were properly receipted as required by state statutes.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Receipts should be issued for all collections, and all collections should be deposited within three days of collection as required by state statutes.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

Prenumbered receipts were not being properly issued for some miscellaneous collections. Again, this issue arose from the previous office manager. It shall be the practice of the First Judicial District Drug Task Force to issue receipts for all monies received from any entity.

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## FINDING 2013-03 DRUG TASK FORCE RECORDS FOR SEIZED CASH WERE NOT MAINTAINED PROPERLY

The Drug Task Force (DTF) maintains an operations summary report, which reflects details related to seized cash, including the final disposition and amounts, which have not been awarded to the DTF by the Tennessee Department of Safety. In addition to the operations summary report, individual DTF personnel maintain detailed logs of cash seized from defendants. However, these detailed logs had not been reconciled with the balance reflected on the operations summary report. As a result of not reconciling the detailed logs with the operations summary report, the operations summary report was understated by \$63,535.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Inventory records for seizures of cash should be properly maintained. The operations summary report of seized cash should be reconciled with the detailed logs maintained by agents to ensure that totals of seized cash are accurately reported.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

Records for seized cash were not properly maintained by the First Judicial District Drug Task Force; however, all monies in question were accounted for. It shall be the practice of the First Judicial District Drug Task Force to properly maintain all records for current and future monies to include any cash received from the U.S. Attorney's Office, Drug Enforcement Agency, and other outside agencies.

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## FINDING 2013-04 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANT PAYMENT HISTORY LOGS WERE NOT MAINTAINED PROPERLY

Payments to confidential informants were recorded on agent's activity logs and supported with the required signed documentation. However, some payments were either not posted at all or were posted incorrectly to confidential informant payment history logs.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Confidential informant payment history logs should be maintained properly and periodically reconciled with the individual agent's activity logs.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

Payments to confidential informants were not properly maintained on a summary log as required. Rather, the payments were kept by each individual in the case file. It shall be the practice of the First Judicial District Drug Task Force to maintain an accurate log, separate from the case file, to document confidential informant funds.

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## FINDING 2013-05 EQUIPMENT INVENTORY CONTROL RECORDS NOTED SEVERAL ITEMS AS MISSING

A current control listing of equipment was maintained; however, the listing had several items that were noted as missing. From a review of the board's minutes, it could not be determined that the Board of Directors had been notified of or taken official action concerning these inventory items identified as missing.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Equipment should be periodically verified by management, and immediate steps should be taken to investigate any discrepancies. Management and the Board of Directors should review the inventory items noted as missing and determine if those items have been properly disposed.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

Several items noted on the inventory listing were found to be missing. Inventory issues regarding the missing items will be discussed at the next First Judicial District Drug Task Force Board of Directors meeting, scheduled for May 27, 2014. A request will be made at the meeting for a list of missing items, and the appropriate measures to be taken to recover the property.

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## FINDING 2013-06 QUARTERLY INCOME SUMMARY REPORTS WERE NOT FILED CURRENTLY

The Drug Task Force (DTF) is the recipient of a grant under the Edward Byrne Memorial Grant Program. The DTF could not document that it filed the quarterly income summary reports required by the Office of Criminal Justice Programs (OCJP) for the quarters ending March 31, 2013, and June 30, 2013. These deficiencies resulted from a lack of management oversight and a failure to adequately prepare, maintain, and file the quarterly reports.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Quarterly program income summary reports should be properly filed and maintained. Management should file the quarterly reports for the quarters ending March 31, 2013, and June 30, 2013, with the OCJP.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

The quarterly program income summary reports were not properly filed by the previous office manager. It shall be the responsibility of the new office manager or the First Judicial District Drug Task Force Director to ensure the reports are adequately prepared, maintained, and filed according to the requirements set forth by OCJP. It is the understanding of the district attorney general that all necessary reports due on March 31, 2013, and June 30, 2013, have been filed.

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#### FINDING 2013-07

## THE DRUG TASK FORCE HAD DEFICIENCIES IN THE USE OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM FUNDS

The State of Tennessee, Department of Finance and Administration, Office of Criminal Justice Programs conducted a review of the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program (CFDA No. 16.738) in the First Judicial District dated July 11, 2013, which disclosed the following deficiencies:

- A. The agency could not provide personnel records for review for the director, five agents, and the administrative assistant. The Tennessee Office of Criminal Justice Programs Administrative Manual, Chapter VI, Personnel Policies and Procedures, 4. Personnel File Requirements states, "agencies are required to maintain personnel files for all staff employed by grant monies." The agency did not have personnel files available during the time of review.
- B. The agency submitted the annual fiscal year end 2012 Byrne/JAG report late. The report was submitted on August 3, 2012, but was due on July 31, 2012. The Tennessee Office of Criminal Justice Programs Administrative Manual, JAG Grant, Chapter III, Reporting Section states, "that the annual JAG report is due on July 31."
- C. The agency submitted the Quarterly Performance Measures Report for the second and third quarters late. The report was submitted on February 6, 2013, but was due on October 15, 2012. The Tennessee Office of Criminal Justice Programs Administrative Manual, JAG Grant, Chapter III, Reporting Section states, "that the quarterly performance measures report is due on October 15."
- D. Information into the TNCOP Database had not been submitted since May 2011. The Tennessee Office of Criminal Justice Programs Administrative Manual, JAG Grant, Chapter II, JAG Grant Purpose/Requirements, B. Program Requirements Section states, "in order for law enforcement agencies to qualify for grant funds, the agency must comply with Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 38-10-101, et.seq., and submit crime statistics using the Tennessee Incident Based Reporting System to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation."

E. Invoices for reimbursement had not been submitted for the fiscal year 2012-13 as of the review date. The Tennessee Office of Criminal Justice Programs Administrative Manual, Chapter VII, Section C. states, "subrecipient agencies must request reimbursement at least once per quarter based on expenditures incurred. However, it is recommended that agencies invoice monthly, when monthly expenditures are incurred." As a result of this deficiency, the monitoring objectives of reliability of financial reports, cost allowability and eligibility, and contractual compliance could not be completed.

## FINDING 2013-001 DRUG TASK FORCE RECORDS FOR SEIZED CASH WERE NOT MAINTAINED PROPERLY

Our review noted that \$11,420 of seized cash was discovered by the Drug Task Force (DTF) while cleaning-up old evidence at the Kingsport Police Department. From discussions with DTF personnel and our review, the cash represents monies seized; however, no paperwork was found to process the cash. Additionally, most of the seized cash was not listed in the agency's seizure log. The failure to document seized cash in the agency's seizure log increases the risk of fraud and fails to accurately report seized assets held in DTF custody. It appears that all of this cash relates to old cases from former DTF administrations, and that this cash was misplaced until the current administration cleaned-up evidence to relocate to another storage area. However, the discovery of this cash represents an internal control weakness because all seizures have not been properly reported. It should be noted that extended tests revealed that all current seized items were listed and reported to the Tennessee Department of Safety.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The DTF should attempt to identify the \$11,420 by case and process the cash to the proper agency or owner. All seizures of money or other assets held by the DTF should be reported and listed in the seizure log.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

On behalf of the Second Judicial District Drug Task Force Board of Directors, I would like to express our appreciation to the Division of Local Government Audit of the Office of the Comptroller of the Treasury. The recent conversation regarding the auditor's findings during the exit interview was productive and put into the proper context for the timing of the violations found. In response, we understand the basis of the recommendation and had already made attempts to disburse the money to the rightful owners prior to the auditor's visit. Based on the practices set forth by the current administration, we feel this should eliminate any future occurrences, and the operations of the Second Judicial District Drug Task Force will be in full adherence to the policies and procedures governing it.

## FINDING 2013-001 DRUG EVIDENCE SEIZED BY THE DRUG TASK FORCE WAS MISSING

On September 26, 2012, the Drug Task Force (DTF) director was preparing an inventory of evidence for destruction orders, when it became obvious that certain evidence was missing. The director then informed the district attorney general who directed him to contact the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI). On February 5, 2013, the district attorney general advised us that drug evidence seized by the DTF was missing in numerous cases. After completing the inventory, the DTF director reported a total of 223 cases in which a portion or all of the evidence related to the cases were missing. The TBI is currently investigating this matter.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Officials should continue to take steps to determine what happened to the missing evidence and assign responsibility for this lack of internal control. Internal controls for evidence should be strengthened and include physical controls, tracking, segregation of duties, documentation, audit, and training.

## FINDING 2013-002 THE DRUG TASK FORCE HAD A CASH SHORTAGE OF \$1,700 AT JUNE 30, 2013

As reported in the prior-year report, the Drug Task Force had a cash shortage of \$1,700 as of February 14, 2013. The cash shortage was liquidated on December 12, 2013, with proceeds received from the agency's bonding company. Since the cash shortage was not liquidated until after June 30, 2013, the \$1,700 is reflected as a cash shortage as of June 30, 2013.

## FINDING 2013-003 DEFICIENCIES WERE NOTED IN THE RECORDING AND MANAGING OF SEIZED PROPERTY

As reflected in the prior-year report, we noted deficiencies in the recording and managing of seized property. The current drug task force director has made improvements in recording and managing seized property. However, certain unrecorded items were discovered by the director while updating inventories and records. These unrecorded items included the following:

A. Cash totaling \$160 was discovered in various locations in the office. The director was unable to determine the source of the cash.

- B. Seized cash including collectible coins and currency totaling \$1,076.45 was discovered in the evidence room. The director was unable to determine the source of the cash.
- C. Various items of personal property were discovered stored in a semi-trailer at the impound lot. The director has not been able to locate an inventory of the semi-trailer's contents. Therefore, the director has not been able to determine the source of these items.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

The director should continue to determine the status of the items noted above. All items that are determined to be the property of the drug task force should be disposed of in compliance with board policies and procedures. All inventory logs for seized cash and personal property should be maintained on a current basis. The director should inventory the personal property found in the semi-trailer.

Carmel Police Chief Mike Campbell, Surgoinsville Police Chief Jeff Hesoun, Hancock County Sheriff George L Maxey, Baileyton Police Chief Joshua Ferguson, and Tusculum Police Chief Danny Greene, who make up the governing Board of Directors of the Third Judicial District Drug Task Force, and Tim Davis, Director, we would like to express our sincere appreciation to the auditors for their guidance through a difficult transition from our previous director to our current director. Because of such guidance and the efforts of the director and the Board of Directors, all past deficiencies, which occurred under the previous director have been identified and corrected as of this audit.

There were no deficiencies or recommendations noted for the current director's tenure. An achievement we will strive to repeat in the future.

# FINDING 2013-001 THE DRUG TASK FORCE HAD DEFICIENCIES RELATED TO SOME CREDIT CARD TRANSACTIONS

We noted the following deficiencies related to some credit card transactions. These deficiencies were the result of the failure of management to correct the finding noted in the prior-year report.

- A. During the year, credit card purchases totaling \$17,347 were made on behalf of the Drug Task Force. These credit card purchases included vehicle maintenance, travel, equipment, and various supplies and materials. Of these charges, \$691 had no supporting documentation other than the monthly credit card statement. As a result, we were unable to determine the propriety of these purchases.
- B. Some monthly credit card statements were not paid in a timely manner. Although the Drug Task Force Fund had sufficient funds to pay the credit card bills in full each month, finance charges of \$82.96 were incurred.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force should obtain necessary documentation for all credit card charges before payment is made to the credit card vendor. Credit card statements should be paid currently to avoid any related finance charges.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DRUG TASK FORCE DIRECTOR

Due to certain mail order vendors going paperless and some vendors' credit card machines not working properly, there was an absence of a few receipts. In the future, every effort will be made to obtain a receipt. If employees cannot obtain a receipt, a report will be generated to explain the purchase and the reason an original receipt was not received.

The finance charges are the result of items being returned and not being paid for by the credit card statement date. In the future to avoid finance charges, complete payment will be made based on the monthly statement, and credit balances will be subsequently adjusted.

#### FINDING 2013-001 THE OFFICE HAD DEFICIENCIES IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF DRUG CONTROL FUNDS

Several forms required by the Comptroller of the Treasury documenting payments to confidential informants did not have the required signatures of two officers. The signature of the first officer is necessary to document that he made the payment, and the signature of the second officer is necessary to document that he witnessed the payment. These forms are necessary to document the administration of confidential funds and to account for cash transactions related to undercover investigative operations. These deficiencies exist because management failed to provide proper oversight, which results in increased risks of fraud and abuse.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Payments to informants should be documented by the signatures of two officers.

#### MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

The director of the Drug Task Force has increased oversight of the monthly reports from the agents assigned to the Drug Task Force. Each agent has been requested to read and sign an acknowledgement of a new standard operating procedure directive. Additional training is also being required to make absolutely certain that there will be no deficiencies by the staff and management moving forward.
