PARALYMPIC HISTORY

HISTORY OF THE PARALYMPIC MOVEMENT

Following World War II, traditional methods of rehabilitation could not meet the medical and psychological needs of large numbers of soldiers and civilians with a disability. In 1944, at the request of the British government, Dr. Ludwig Guttmann founded the National Spinal Injuries Center at Stoke Mandeville Hospital. A strong advocate of sports therapy, Guttmann encouraged his patients to play sports under the belief that sports would enhance the quality of life for people who were injured or wounded.

On July 29, 1948, the day of the Opening Ceremony of the Olympic Games in London, 16 injured British servicemen and women participated in an archery competition at the first Stoke Mandeville Games. Four years later, the first International Stoke Mandeville Games were held when Dutch ex-servicemen joined the movement. From then on, the International Stoke Mandeville Games were to be held annually.

In 1960, the 9th Annual International Stoke Mandeville Games saw 400 athletes from 23 countries compete in the same city as the Olympic Games for the first time in Rome, Italy. While the subsequent International Stoke Mandeville Games would be held during the Summer Olympics, it was not until 1988 that both were held in same city in the same venues. It was at these Games that "Paralympics" became the official term of use. Originally a pun combining "paraplegic" and "Olympic", the word "Paralympic" now represents "parallel" and "Olympic" to illustrate how the two movements exist side by side.

In 2001, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and International Paralympic Committee (IPC) formalized an agreement stating that the Paralympic Games would be held after the Olympics in the same city using the same venues.

In 2001, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and International Paralympic Committee (IPC) formalized an agreement stating that the Paralympic Games would be held after the Olympics in the same city using the same venue. 4,200 athletes from 165 countries are expected to compete at the London 2012 Paralympic Games. With 15 countries making their Paralympic Games debut and an increase of 250 athletes in comparison to the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games, London 2012 is poised to be the biggest Paralympic Games ever.

PARALYMPIC HISTORY

MOTTO

The Paralympic motto is "Spirit in Motion", expressing the inspirational character of the Paralympic Movement as well as elite performance of Paralympic athletes. It also stands for the strong will of every Paralympian. The word "Spirit" implies that the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) is not limited to only staging high performance sport, but that there is a strong message behind our movement. "Motion" on the other hand, implies that the IPC is an organization on the move.

SYMBOL

The symbol of the Paralympic Games is composed of three "agitos" ("I move", in Latin) colored red, blue and green – the three colors most widely represented in national flags around the world. It is a symbol that is in motion encircling a center point; emphasizing the role that the IPC has of bringing athletes from all corners of the world together and enabling them to compete. It also emphasizes the fact that Paralympic athletes are constantly inspiring and exciting the world with their performances – always moving forward and never giving up – as embodied in the new Paralympic vision "To Enable Paralympic Athletes to Achieve Sporting Excellence and to Inspire and Excite the World".



AIMEE MULLINS

President of the Women's Sports Foundation from 2007 to 2008, Mullins has found both success and fame through athletics. An athlete her entire life, Mullins made a groundbreaking achievement at Georgetown University where she competed as the first-ever amputee on an NCAA Division I track team. She is the first person in the world outfitted with woven carbon-fibre prostheses modeled after the hind legs of a cheetah. She set world records in the 100m, 200m and Long Jump, and represented Team USA at the 1996 Atlanta Paralympic Games. Through all of her accomplishments, she is best known for changing the world of prosthetics and the way people perceive athletes with unique bodies. A passionate advocate for revolutionary thinking about body image, Mullins has built a lateral career in acting and as a consultant on innovative thinking, for which she is invited around the world to speak on a range of issues. Her iconic status as a muse in the worlds of art and fashion led to her selection in February as the global brand ambassador for L'Oreal Paris. The U.S. Olympic Committee recently selected the retired Paralympian as its Chef de Mission of Team USA for the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

ARCHERY



In 2010, Paralympic Archery (previously part of U.S. Paralympics) became part of USA Archery, in hopes of unifying archers competing within Paralympic and Olympic Teams. Looking ahead to the competition that will take place in London at the Royal Artillery Barracks, the sport's future has never been brighter.

Led by Para National Head Coach Randi Smith, two years of providing competition and training opportunities for Para U.S. Archery Team (USAT) members, and conducting camps to introduce archery to prospective competitors has resulted in a strong team for the 2012 Paralympic Games. In 2008, the team picked up two individual bronze medals: one for 2012 Paralympic Team member Jeff Fabry (Tulare, Calif.) in the Men's Individual Compound W1 event, and another for Lindsay Carmichael (San Antonio, Tex.) in the Women's Individual Recurve - Standing event – the first ever individual medal in Olympic or Paralympic archery for an American woman.

In London, the team looks to continue that success, with three Paralympians returning in 2012: Fabry, who will compete in his third Paralympic Games; Eric Bennett (Surprise, Ariz.) in his second Paralympic appearance, in the Men's Individual Recurve – Standing; and Russell Wolfe (Widnoon, Pa.) in Men's Individual Recurve – W1/W2. They will be joined by archers who may be new to the Paralympic Games, but are experienced individual competitors, with solid domestic and international competition experience: Lee Ford-Faherty (Perry, Ga.) in Women's Individual Recurve – Standing; Matt Stutzman (Fairfield, Iowa) in Men's Individual Compound – Open; Jerry Shields (Jacksonville, Fla.) in Men's Individual Compound – W1, and Dugie Denton (Joliet, Mont.) in Men's Individual Compound – Open.

In London, all of these archers will compete individually, and bring strong competitive experience to the table. Fabry is a three-time Paralympic Games medalist who's shooting for the top of the podium in London, following his most major international win: a team silver at the World Archery Para Championships in Torino, Italy last year. Bennett, in his second Paralympics appearance, will look to clinch his first Paralympic Games podium finish in London following five years of top finishes domestically and internationally. Wolfe, also on his second trip to the Paralympic Games, is a United States Veteran (Army), and most recently claimed individual bronze at the Parapan American Games in Guadalajara, Mexico, following a career of medal wins at high profile events such as the IPC Archery World Championships and the European Grand Prix.

Ford-Faherty has high individual finishes at international events to her credit, winning individual gold at the Parapan American Games in 2011, as well as a 4th place individual finish at this year's World Invitational Disabled Archery Competition in Stoke Mandeville. Shields and Denton, both United States Veterans (Army) have also both claimed top finishes in national qualifiers and are members of the Para U.S. Archery Team; Denton also clinched a Parapan American Games bronze in 2011, and top ten finishes at the World Archery Para Championships and European Grand Prix. Stutzman, in his first year as a member of the Para U.S. Archery Team, and just two and a half years after he began shooting archery, set a world record this year for the longest accurate archery shot (230 yards).

BOCCIA



Austin Hanson, the sole American athlete competing in boccia, is a four-time U.S. Paralympian from Topeka, Kan. At the Atlanta 1996 Paralympic Games, Hanson, a BC3 classification, made his debut with a fifth place performance. He missed the mark for the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games, but made the team for Athens 2004 and Beijing 2008, securing his spot in history as one of the United States' best boccia players.

Hanson has competed in the gold medal match of the national championships 13 times over the past 16 years, capturing an impressive 10 national titles. The two-time Paralympic Trials Champion has competed in three America Cups, four World Championships and four World Cups.

Boccia has been a part of the Paralympic Games since 1984. It was originally presented as a sport for athletes with cerebral palsy (CP), but is now open to all athletes with severe physical disabilities. Paralympic boccia competition is open to male and female athletes with severe locomotor disabilities of a cerebral or non-cerebral origin, including individuals with cerebral palsy, stroke, traumatic brain injury, high-level spinal cord injuries, muscular dystrophy, multiple sclerosis, amyotrophic lateral sclerosis and arthrogryposis.

The sport tests the athlete's coordination, accuracy, concentration, and ability to strategize. Boccia is played indoors on a flat, smooth surface by individuals, pairs or teams of three. To score points, athletes throw, kick or use an assistive device to propel leather balls as close as possible to a white target ball (the jack).

In an individual match, each player throws six balls. An individual match has four ends. In pair matches, there are four ends with each athlete getting three balls. Pair games are played by athletes with disabilities of non-cerebral origin who throw and by athletes who use a ramp as an assistive device to propel the ball. Throwers with CP play in teams of three, each getting two of the balls. They play six ends.

Boccia is Sept. 2-8 with medals awarded on Sept. 4 and Sept. 8.

CYCLING



Between dominating the 2011 Parapan American Games, 2011 Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) World Championships and World Circuit, the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Cycling Team is poised to best the 14 medals they collected at the 2008 Paralympics in Beijing.

Coached by Craig Griffin (Colorado Springs, Colo.), the team is comprised of seven U.S. Paralympians, four current world champions, and three U.S. Military veterans. Leading the team to London will be returning 2008 Paralympic cyclists Allison Jones (Colorado Springs, Colo.), Greta Neimanas (Colorado Springs, Colo.), Oscar Sanchez (San Diego, Calif.), Jennifer Schuble (Birmingham, Ala.), and Anthony Zahn (Colorado Springs, Colo.).

In her sixth Paralympic Games appearance, Jones is hoping to add to the five Paralympic medals (2 gold, 3 silver) that she collected the past six Paralympic Summer and Winter Games

as a cyclist and alpine skier. In 2008 in Beijing, Jones claimed silver in the time trial behind U.S. teammate Barbara Buchan. Jones rides into London after claiming a gold and pair of bronze medals at the 2011 Parapan American Games. Since her silver medal at the 2008 Paralympics, Jones has collected five medals (two gold, three bronze) in the last three UCI Para Cycling Track and Road World Championships.

After making her Paralympic Games debut in Beijing in 2008, Neimanas has claimed ten medals (one gold, seven silver, two bronze) on the World Championship stage. Between her dominating performances at the 2011 Parapan American Games (one gold, two silver medals) and the 2012 UCI Para-Cycling Track World Championships (one gold, two silver medals), Neimanas heads to London as a solid medal contender.

Another athlete looking to add to his medal count is Oscar Sanchez. Since the 2008 Paralympic Games, Sanchez has been unstoppable on the international circuit. After claiming gold and bronze in Beijing, Sanchez has claimed five world championship titles, a first place finish in the 2011 UCI Para Cycling World Cup series and a pair of gold medals at the 2011 Parapan American Games.

Aside from claiming two gold medals at the 2011 Parapan American Games, Jennifer Schuble also set American records in the 500 time trial and 3k pursuit events. Despite claiming ten medals (five gold, four silver, one bronze) on the world championship stage since 2007, it is easy to claim the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games as the highlight of her career thus far. In Beijing, Schuble claimed gold and a pair of silvers while also setting a world and Paralympic record in the 500m time trial and 3km pursuit trial respectively.

Zahn looks to London with hopes of bettering his bronze medal finish from the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games. Since those Games, Zahn claimed a bronze medal at the 2009 and 2010 UCI Para Cycling Road World Championships. On the national stage, Zahn followed up his silver medal performance in 2011 with a national championship in the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Road Cycling National Championship in the C1 classification.

Joining the five returning Paralympic cyclists are Monica Bascio (Evergreen, Colo.) and Muffy Davis (Salt Lake City, Utah), both of whom will be making their Summer Paralympic Games debut.

In 2010, with two Winter Paralympic Games (2006, 2010) behind her, Bascio contemplated retirement before a change in the governance of Paralympic Cycling pushed her to take her cross-training sport – handcycling – to the next level. The following year Bascio claimed the overall World Cup series title and followed that with a gold medal winning performance in the road race at the 2011 Parapan American Games. With retirement far from her mind, Bascio heads to London aiming for her first Paralympic medal.

Despite being a newcomer to the Summer Games, Davis has shined on the Paralympics' biggest stage in two different Paralympic Winter Games. As a skier, Davis won three silver medals and a bronze between the 1998 and 2002 Paralympic Winter Games. Turning to handcycling as a way to get back into shape after her daughter was born, Davis won her first National Title just two months after beginning the sport. Since then, she's accumulated numerous titles, among them the Overall World Cup Champion in 2012 as well as gold in the mixed relay at the UCI World Road Championships in 2011.

The Paralympic Cycling Track events will begin on August 30, with the Women's Individual Pursuit while the Paralympic Cycling Road events will start on September 5, with the Men's Individual Time Trial.

After a stellar competition year, the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Equestrian Team is hoping to bring home a medal from the London 2012 Paralympic Games. After a silver medal team finish at the 1996 Paralympic Games in Atlanta, the U.S Paralympic Equestrian Team has been chomping on the bit of earning a team medal for the red, white, and blue during the 2000, 2004 and 2008 Games.

The U.S Paralympic Equestrian Team will compete in three para-equestrian dressage events during the Games including the mixed individual championship, the mixed team championship, and the mixed freestyle championship test. Each test consists of five grades, Grade Ia, Ib, II, III, IV, where each rider competes within their classified grade. Athletes are classified according to his or her physical disability where Grade Ia is the more severely disabled riders and Grade IV is the least physically impaired equestrians.

There are 11 sets of medals including one set of medals for the team country competition. Each team consists of four athletes and horses or three athletes and horses. One team member must be classified Grade Ia, Ib or II. Not more than three team members may be of the same Grade. In a team composed of four athletes the three best total scores only count for the team result. Of the 11 medal opportunities, there are five medal sets for the mixed individual championship results and five sets for the mixed freestyle championship test results.

The 2012 U.S. Paralympic Equestrian Team was selected in June 2012 to compete among 78 horse and rider combinations and 26 nations around the world in London. Missy Ranseshousen of Unionville, Pa., is the chef d'equipe who will lead Rebecca Hart (Unionville, Pa.), Jonathan Wentz (Richardson, Texas), Donna Ponessa (New Windsor, N.Y.), and Dale Dedrick (Ann Arbor, Mich.) into competition at Greenwich Park.

Hart, a 27-year-old veteran of the Paralympic Games, was only one spot away from earning a medal at the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games. This year she is armed with Jessica Ransehousen's horse Lord Ludger for the Grade II competition.

Wentz, 21, maintained the 10th spot in the Para-Equestrian Dressage World rankings throughout 2012. He is looking to continue his consistency with Kai Handt's horse NTEC Richter Scale in the Grade lb competition.

Ponessa was new to Para-Equestrian competition in 2011 and made it her goal to make the 2012 Paralympic Equestrian Team. As she and Wesley Dunham's mare Western Rose head to London they will be looking to top the intense Grade la competition.

Rounding out the team is Dedrick, who is an orthopedic surgeon by trade. Her performance over the 2011-12 season earned her and horse Bonifatius top international scores. Dale will also compete in the Grade II competition alongside Hart.

These four superb riders are no stranger to their Para-Equestrian Dressage rival countries including Great Britain, Germany, Denmark and Canada. As the Paralympic equestrian competition unfolds, the U.S. riders will be a team to watch.

PREVIEW

GOALBALL



Ranked second in the world, the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Women's Goalball team aims to reach the gold medal match for the third consecutive Games at the London 2012 Paralympic Games. After claiming silver at the 2004 Paralympics in Athens, the 2008 Paralympics saw the U.S. defeat China in a shootout to avenge a preliminary round loss and claim gold for the second time in history. With a strong team comprised of rookies and veterans, this year's team is poised to defend its gold medal.

Coached by Ken Armbruster (Colorado Springs, Colo.) the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Women's Goalball team may be the most seasoned team in goalball thanks to a quartet of returnees from the gold medal team in 2008. Despite having two girls – Amanda Dennis (Peachtree City, Ga.) and Jordan Walters (Colorado Springs, Colo.) – making their Paralympic debut, the remaining girls – Jen Armbruster (Portland, Ore.), Lisa Czechowski (Boonton, N.J.), Asya Miller (Portland, Ore.) and Robin Theryoung (Colorado Springs, Colo.) – have a

combined thirteen years of goalball Paralympic experience heading to London. Since the quartet of veterans joined forces in 2004, U.S. women's goalball has collected nine international medals (six gold, silver, two bronze).

London will be the sixth Paralympic appearance for Armbruster. Last year's Team USA flag bearer, Armbruster's experience in the Paralympics includes a bronze in 1996, silver in 2004, and gold in 2008. Though they are goalball teammates now, Czechowski and Miller were track and field teammates at the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games. Both competing in the discus, Czechowski claimed silver in the F12 classification while Miller nabbed bronze in the F13 classification. Extending her athletic achievements even further, Miller was crowned best lifter at the 2009 ISBA Powerlifting World Championship.

While London will be the first Paralympics for Dennis and Walters, they both have experience on the international level. Key contributions from Dennis helped fuel the U.S. gold medal performance at the 2011 Parapan American Games and a solid performance from Walters in the 2010 World Championships helped the team clinch one of the earliest 2012 Paralympic games qualifications for Team USA.

The 2012 Paralympics goalball competition is shaping up to be an exciting series of match ups in London. The ten-team pool (split into two groups of five) includes Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Denmark, Finland, Great Britain, Japan, Sweden, and the U.S. Despite the pool's difficulty, many believe China and the U.S. will meet in the gold medal match for the third consecutive time in international play. They first met in the 2008 gold medal match where the U.S. avenged a preliminary round loss to claim gold over the host country. Two years later it was China getting the upper hand on the U.S. in the World Championship tournament.

Preliminary rounds of the women's goalball tournament will start in the Copper Box on August 30 with Team USA facing a Sweden squad that took home bronze in the 2010 World Championships. Preliminary rounds will last through September 4 before the top four teams in each group qualify for the knockout round.



POWERLIFTING



Fresh off bronze medal performances at the 2011 Parapan American Games in Guadalajara, Mexico, Mary Stack (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Ahmed Shafik (Tucson, Ariz.) will represent the United States in powerlifting at the London 2012 Paralympic Games. With both claiming their first ever international medals in Guadalajara, each is now in position for the London podium.

"Mary and Ahmed are our veteran lifters, and they both prove that practice and resilience pays off because for the first time in both of their careers, they medaled internationally in 2011 at the Parapan American Games, and now they are both ranked fourth in the world on their way to London," U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting Head Coach Mary Hodge said. "They are extremely driven athletes and will represent the USA well at the Paralympic Games."

Stack, who competes in the +82.5kg weight class, has been a fixture on the U.S. National Team since 2000 and the London Games will mark her fourth appearance on the U.S. Paralympic Powerlifting Team. Over the past few years, she has experienced a steady rise, finishing seventh at the 2006 International Paralympic Committee Powerlifting World Championships then improving to

fourth in 2010. In her third place effort at the recent Parapans, she lifted 116kg, 122kg and a personal best 127kg in three attempts.

While Stack is a seasoned veteran, Shafik is a relative newcomer to international powerlifting and will make his Paralympic debut in London. Competing in the 90 kg - +100 kg event, he cleared a top lift of 175kg to claim the third spot on the podium in Guadalajara.

Initially offered only to athletes with spinal cord injuries, powerlifting made its debut as a Paralympic Games medal sport at in 1964. The sport has since grown to include numerous disability groups. From 1992-96, the number of participating countries more than doubled. It is one of the fastest growing Paralympic sports in the world.

Athletes draw lots to determine order of weigh-in and lifts. After the athletes are categorized within the 10 different weight classes (male and female), they each lift three times (competing in their respective weight class). The heaviest "good lift" (within the weight class) is the lift used for final placing in the competition

Rowing will be contested for the second time at the London 2012 Paralympic Games. When rowing made its debut at the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games, Team USA fielded athletes for all four events, winning a silver and bronze medal. In total, three crews will represent the United States in London.

The legs, trunk and arms four with coxswain crew lineup includes Alexandra Stein (Stamford, Conn.), the coxswain, Dorian Weber (Brighton, Mass.), Andrew Johnson (Riverside, Conn.), Eleni Englert (Oceanside, Calif.) and Emma Preuschl (Indianapolis, Ind.), who is the only returning member from the Beijing silver medal winning team. Stein, Johnson, Englert and Preuschl return from the crew that finished sixth in the event at the 2011 World Rowing Championships in Bled, Slovenia.

"Four years ago on the recovery dock in Beijing, I set a goal to compete in the 2012 London Paralympic Regatta, so it feels pretty amazing to know that my commitment to achieving that goal has come full circle," said Preuschl. "It is an honor and privilege to represent my country at the Paralympic Games for the second time."

Rob Jones (Lovettsville, Va.), who became a bilateral above knee amputee in July 2010 while serving as a U.S. Marine Sergeant in Afghanistan, and Oksana Masters (Louisville, Ky.) will compete in the trunk and arms mixed double sculls. It is the first Paralympic Games for both athletes, who qualified for the Games at the final Paralympic Qualification Regatta in Belgrade, Serbia.

Jones and Masters, who call themselves "Team Bad Company," led from the start of the qualification race, holding off Brazil's Isaac Ribeiro and Josiane Lima, a Beijing Paralympic bronze medalist and 2007 World Champion. Jones and Masters gained a 4.5-second lead by the halfway mark, and rowed away from the field, posting a 4:11.29, 6.9 seconds ahead of their competition.

"Absolutely, we are ready to go for a world record," Masters said of her goals for London. "Of course we want to win a gold medal, too, but we know exactly what time we have to get and we're aiming for it."

Nine-time national team member Ron Harvey (Downington, Pa.) will compete in the men's arms and shoulders single sculls with the hopes of improving on his fifth place finish from 2008. He is a three-time medalist at the World Rowing Championships in adaptive single sculls.

"It's going to be a very strong (field in London)," Harvey said. "The level of competition goes up every year. I know that Tom Aggar (Great Britain's arms and shoulders single sculler) has been dominating for years, and I'm sure he really wants to win on his home course. Everyone was closing the gap on him last year, challenging him. I expect that there will be some very fast racing."

A total of 96 rowers, 46 men and 46 women, will compete at venue Eton Dorney from Aug. 31-Sept. 2, with all finals on the last day of competition. The athletes will compete in races of 1000m in four events, classified according to the amount of functional ability they have - from the ability to move only arms and shoulders through to having the use of legs, trunk and arms.

SAILING



After being introduced as a demonstration event at the Atlanta 1996 Paralympic Games, sailing became a full medal sport in 2000. U.S. sailors have fared well on the Paralympic stage, claiming five medals, more than any other country. Led by a quartet of returning Paralympians, the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Sailing Team looks to continue its tradition of success at the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

The two-person keelboat (SKUD18) made its official Paralympic debut at the 2008 Paralympics with the U.S. taking gold. This year's crew consists of Paralympic newcomer Jennifer French (St. Petersburg, Fla.) and 2004 Paralympic Sonar bronze medalist JP Creignou (St. Petersburg, Fla.). The duo has fared well in international competition, claiming silver at the 2011 International Association for Disabled Sailing (IFDS) World Championships and bronze at the 2012 Rolex Miami OCR (ISAF Sailing World Cup).

After claiming a bronze and silver in the single-handed keelboat (mixed 2.4mR) at the 2000 and 2004 Paralympics, Tom Brown (Castine, Maine) looks to claim his third Paralympic medal as part of the three-person keelboat (Sonar) team in London. Joining him will be Paul Callahan (Cape Coral, Fla.) and 2004 Paralympic sonar bronze medalist Brad Johnson (Pompano Beach, Fla.). As a team, the trio finished sixth at the 2012 Rolex Miami OCR ISAF Sailing World Cup.

An alternate to the 2008 U.S. Paralympic Sailing team, Mark LeBlanc (New Orleans, La.) will make his Paralympic debut in the mixed 2.4mR competition. No stranger to international competition, LeBlanc heads to London with fifteen top-ten finishes in his last eighteen international competitions. A two-time U.S. National Champion in the event, LeBlanc is a serious medal contender.

The six-member U.S. team will be coached by Betsy Alison (Newport, R.I.). A five-time winner of the prestigious U.S. Rolex Yachtswoman of the Year award, Alison was also named 1999 Sailing Coach of the Year by the U.S. Olympic Committee for her work with disabled, youth, and women sailors. As head coach of the 2008 U.S. Paralympic Sailing Team, Alison was the driving force behind the team's gold and bronze medals at the 2008 Paralympic Games in Beijing.

USA Shooting history was made in January with the naming of its members for the 2012 Paralympic Games Team. For the first time ever, USA Shooting will be sending athletes to compete in the Paralympic Games after having formed a Paralympic division after the 2008 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Nominees to the team are now complete with the naming of Eric Hollen (Colorado Springs, Colo.) and Sergeant First Class Josh Olson (Fort Mitchell, Ala.) to the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Team. Hollen will shoot pistol while Olson will compete in the rifle events.

Hollen, a former U.S. Army Ranger in the 2/75 Ranger Regiment, suffered a life-altering injury

on his horse farm in Tennessee. It took Hollen awhile to gain his a new lease on life by seizing the opportunity to compete in the sport of shooting.

"I am so proud of Eric and all he has accomplished," said National Paralympic Coach Bob Foth. "He has taken advantage of the unique opportunities available as an OTC Resident Athlete— the amazing support and intangibles that come with being in a high performance environment with focused athletes."

At the IPC World Cup Sydney, Hollen won a bronze medal in P4 Mixed 50m Free Pistol. He followed that by shooting a 557 in P1 Men's 10m Air Pistol, to tie three shooters and move on to the finals where he fired 98.1 points to secure a silver medal. His performance in Sydney eventually proved to be the deciding factor in his Paralympic nomination. While on patrol with his unit (101st Airborne division third brigade 1/187) in Iraq in 2003, Olson was struck by a rocket-propelled grenade resulting in the loss of his right leg from the hip down.

After spending 18 months at the Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Olson received his assignment to the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit in Fort Benning, Ga. This is Olson's first Paralympic Games nomination—he just missed the threshold in 2008, but has been a member of the Paralympic National Team for five years. Olson is also involved in the TROOPS F1RST Foundation and has participated in "Operation Proper Exit" where he assists other vets recovering from injuries sustained during combat by visiting their place of injury in Iraq. In honor of his service and dedication to the country, Olson was awarded the Purple Heart from former President George W. Bush.

At the 2011 IPC World Cup in Sydney, Australia, Olson finished sixth in R3 (Mixed 10m Air Rifle Prone SH1). Earlier in 2011, he finished seventh in R6 (Mixed 50m Rifle Prone) at the IPC World Cup Alicante and eighth in R6 at the IPC World Cup USA.

"Olson has worked hard and overcome so many obstacles on this journey and will be a great teammate," Foth said. "Josh lost his leg while serving his country and now has a chance to represent all of us in the highest level."

PREVIEW SITTING VOLLEYBALL



The U.S. Paralympic Women's Sitting Volleyball Team hopes to serve up a historic gold medal winning performance at London 2012 Paralympic Games. At the Athens 2004 Paralympic Games, when the sport of women's sitting volleyball made its debut, the United States claimed the inaugural bronze medal. Team USA improved to second at the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games, losing to China, the only country to capture Paralympic gold in women's sitting volleyball.

The Americans' chances at bringing down China's women's sitting volleyball dynasty will be known from the start. On Aug. 31, the opening day of the women's

tournament, the United States has drawn China, the reigning World Champions and a team poised for a third straight Paralympic Games victory. China is No. 1 in the world and the United States is ranked second by the World Organization for Volleyball Disabled (WOVD).

In other preliminary action in Pool B, the United States faces Slovenia on Sept. 1 and Brazil on Sept. 3. The women's medal matches are on Sept. 7.

In July, the U.S. and China teams faced off in exhibition play in Shanghai with China winning all three days. In its first match, Team USA fell to China in five sets (25-18, 25-17, 25-27, 21-25, 15-13). Day 2 saw the Americans downed 25-16, 25-20, 27-25. China claimed the final victory 25-12, 26-24, 25-22.

"Overall, for the three days I was pleased with the way the team played several facets of the game," Head Coach Bill Hamiter said about the exhibition play. "I was also pleased that we were able to play

China since we had not met them since 2010. The team [USA] needed to become more familiar with them and the staff needed critical data that will help us in building a match plan for London."

Team USA also faced No. 3 Ukraine in Shanghai, capturing one victory over the three days. In the bronze medal match of the 2010 WOVD World Championships, Ukraine defeated Netherlands, silver medalists in Athens and bronze medalists in Beijing.

"These are the tough matches that we need to prepare for, for the Paralympics," Hamiter said. "We are being pushed to execute at a high consistent level. We are doing some wonderful things against the world's best team but we have to pass more efficiently against their tough serving."

Katie Holloway (Lake Stevens, Wash.) was among the top performers in China, contributing 22 points on 15 kills, three blocks and four service aces against Ukraine on Day 2. On that same day, Holloway again charted a high-scoring game with 20 points off of 16 kills, two blocks and two service aces against China.

Holloway is one of eight athletes who will return from the 2008 U.S. Paralympic Women's Sitting Volleyball Team that won the silver medal in Beijing: Allison Aldrich (Schuyler, Neb.), Heather Erickson (Fayetteville, N.C.), Kendra Lancaster (Westfield, Ind.), Brenda Maymon-Jenson (Charlestown, Ind.), Nichole Millage (Champaign, Ill.), Kari Miller (Washington, D.C.) and Lora Webster (Phoenix, Ariz.). Aldrich, Lancaster, Maymon-Jenson and Webster were all on the 2004 team as well.

Monique Burkland (Ardmore, Okla.), Michelle Gerlosky-Schiffler (Lake Wales, Fla.) and Kaleo Kanahele (Oklahoma City, Okla.) are all making their Paralympic Games debuts.

Lancaster is the team captain. In May 2011, she suffered injuries in a head-on car accident in Morgan Country, Ind. She was taken to Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis in critical condition. But after a year of recovery, she returned to the team for its recent trip to Netherlands where it won the DELA Trophy 2012.

Men's sitting volleyball is also contested at the Paralympic Games, but Team USA did not qualify.

A young U.S. team squares off against twotime defending gold medalist Ukraine on Sept. 1 in the teams' opening match of Group B competition

The U.S. Paralympic National Team faces some tremendous competition when it begins play in Group B at the 2012 Paralympic Games from Sept. 1-9 at the Riverbank Arena in London.

Paralympic soccer, which made its debut at the 1984 Paralympic Games, is played sevena-side on a smaller field and with smaller goals than non-disabled soccer. Each team plays with seven men using the International Federation of Associated Football (FIFA) rules, which have been slightly modified to accommodate the disabilities of the athletes.

The U.S. Paralympic National Team participated in its first Paralympic Games during 1992 in Barcelona and the squad

followed that up with its best finish during the 1996 Atlanta Games, placing fourth as the host nation.

This time around, the U.S. squares off against two-time defending Paralympic gold medalists Ukraine, host Great Britain and Brazil, which placed fourth at the 2008 Beijing Paralympics.

The U.S. was drawn into Group B and opens the eight-team tournament against Ukraine on Sept. 1 (1 p.m. local / 8 a.m. ET), followed by matches against Brazil on Sept. 3 (9 a.m. local / 4 a.m. ET) and host nation Great Britain on Sept. 5 (4:15 p.m. local / 11:15 a.m. ET). All matches will be played at Riverbank Arena in London.

The relatively young U.S. roster selected by head coach Jay Hoffman includes a leader in veteran midfielder Josh McKinney, who reached the 100-cap milestone with the team in May, as well as 23-year-old forward Rene Renteria, who has emerged as a main goal-scoring option for the team, plus a trio of

20-year-olds in midfielders Adam Ballou and Tyler Bennett and defender Chad Jones. Goalkeeper Alex Hendricks, at age 16, is the youngest player on the roster.

The average age of the U.S. Paralympic National Team roster is 24 years old.

In preparation for the Paralympic Games, the U.S. participated in the BT Paralympic World Cup in England and ended up capturing third place (out of four teams), but gained valuable experience playing against Paralympic group opponents Brazil and Great Britain.

On June 23, 2011, the U.S. qualified for the 2012 Paralympic Games by defeating Ireland 3-2 in the final group match at the 2011 CPISRA Football 7-a-side World Championships in the Netherlands.

Ukraine enters the competition defending its gold medals from the 2004 Athens Paralympic Games and the 2008 Paralympic Games in Beijing, having outscored its opponents 19-1 during the group stage four years ago and beating Brazil 6-0 in the semifinals before eventually defeating Russia for the gold medal 2-1 after extra time.

The squad has been led during the last two competitions by Volodymyr Antonyuk who scored both goals for Ukraine in the 2008 gold medal match.

Following a tough opening round draw against Ukraine, the U.S. comes up against yet another strong opponent in Brazil.

The Brazilians earned a silver medal during the 2004 Paralympic Games, a bronze medal in 2000 and most recently finished in fourth place after losing 4-0 to Iran in the bronze medal match of the 2008 Paralympics.

The reigning BT Paralympic World Cup champions, Brazil is led by Jose Guimaraes and Fabio Bordignon and recently defeated Great Britain 4-2 in the BT Paralympic World Cup finals in Manchester, England in May. The U.S. finished third in that competition, defeating Ireland 3-1.

Great Britain, the host country, is making its second straight appearance in the Paralympic Games following a seventh place finish in 2008. The country's best finish was a bronze medal in 1984.

Team GB is expected to include Michael Barker, who is considered one of the more prominent Paralympic players in the world, as well as Martin Sinclair who is the brother of Swansea City winger Scott Sinclair. The squad defeated the U.S. 7-0 during the BT Paralympic World Cup in May.





Made-up of 34 team members (20 female and 14 male), the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Swimming Team roster will be the second largest U.S. team on the ground in London, and most likely, will have the largest medal haul of all U.S. teams.

The roster is comprised of 15 returning Paralympians and 19 athletes who will be making their Games debut in London. A mix of nine of those athletes are members of the U.S. Paralympics Swimming Resident Team, who live and train at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo. and is coached by retired Paralympian Dave Denniston.

"When I look at the team, I see a great blend of veterans and rookies," said Tom Franke, one of two head coaches for the team. "There are returning medalists from Beijing who hope to continue their success, as well as a new group of rookies hoping to step onto the podium. What makes this squad so special is the genuine feeling of team spirit and belonging... hopefully that will lift the level of performance to heights never before reached by a U.S. Paralympic Swim Team."

The women's team will be led by Jessica Long (Baltimore, Md.), a seven-time Paralympic gold medalist who competed in her first Paralympic Games in 2004 at the tender age of 12. Long, who set four new world marks in the trials just two months out from the Games, will compete in seven events.

Victoria Arlen (Exeter, N.H.) and Mallory Weggemann (Eagan, Minn.), who will both make their Game debuts, also both set new world marks at the trials in late June. They're both expected to be highly competitive in their respective events in London.

On the men's side, of note is Navy Lieutenant Bradley Snyder (St. Petersburg, Fla.), who will be competing in seven events in London. Snyder lost his vision from an IED explosion in September 2011 while deployed in Afghanistan. A former Naval Academy swim team captain, Snyder got back in the pool shortly after his injury. September 2012 will mark not only the anniversary of his accident, but also just how far he's come in one year's time.

Paralympian Justin Zook (Plymouth, Minn.), who won gold in the 100m backstroke in Beijing, is looking to continue his dominance in the event in London.

Resident athletes Lantz Lamback (Augusta, Ga.) and Rudy Garcia-Tolson (Bloomington, Calif.) are also expected to earn some hardware. Lamback, who won four medals in Beijing (gold-100m backstroke, silver-100m freestyle, silver-400m freestyle, bronze-50m Freestyle) is figured to be a favorite in his events.

Garcia- Tolson is the world record holder and defending gold medalist in the 200m IM, an event in which he hasn't been beat since 2004.

Evan Austin (Terre Haute, Ind.), Dalton Herendeen (South Bend, Ind.) and Ian Silverman (Baltimore, Md.) will all compete in their first Paralympic Games. Their strength, speed and youth is expected to add additional depth to the team.

Looking back to 2008 in Beijing, the U.S. swim team finished first in the official medal count with total of 17 gold, 14 silver, and 13 bronze medals, for a total of 44 medals won. Team USA was followed by China, Ukraine, Great Britain and Russia.

He is classified as S-10, SB-9, SM-9. He placed first at the U.S. Paralympic Trials in the 50, 100, 400, 1500m freestyle events as well as the 100 butterfly and 200 IM. He was born with mild cerebral palsy and has undergone muscle lengthening surgery to lower extremities, as well as serial casting and Botox injections. Silverman dedicates the 2012 London Paralympic Games to his best friend and teammate, Alec J. Cosgarea, who tragically passed on July 9, 2012.

The 2012 U.S. Paralympic Table Tennis Team looks to return to the podium after being held off at the 2008 Paralympics in Beijing. The three-member team of Pamela Fontaine (Double Tree, Texas) Tahl Leibovitz (Tudor Village, N.Y.) and Tara Profitt (Newington, Conn.) will be coached by Sean O'Neill (Portland, Ore.) who also served as head coach in 2008 (Beijing) and 2004 (Athens).

To say the squad has experience is an understatement. Leibovitz has previously represented the United States in the 1996, 2004 and 2008 Paralympic Games, claiming two medals (one gold, one bronze) in 1996 and bronze in 2004. Fontaine and Profitt will be making their first Paralympic Games appearances since traveling to Stoke Mandeville for the 1984 Paralympic Games. The 1984 Games were the last time in which the Paralympics were held in a different venue from the Olympics.

After the 1984 Games, Fontaine and Profitt both retired from table tennis to attend college. Both began playing competitively again in recent years and they met each other again at the 2008 U.S. Nationals. It was in 2008 when both Fontaine and Profitt decided that they would work to qualify for the 2012 Paralympic Games.

As a team, Fontaine and Profitt have claimed an array of medals as a doubles team. After winning gold at the 2009 Parapan American Games, the duo has gone on to nab gold at the 2011 Copa Costa Rica and 2011 Brazil Open while settling for silver at the 2011 Parapan American Games. Both athletes have seen success on the individual stage as well. The 2011 Brazil Open individual gold medalist, Fontaine was the only female U.S. representative at the 2010 Paralympic World Championships in Gwandgju, South Korea. Adding to her team gold medal, Profitt won silver at the 2011 Copa Costa Rica.

The London 2012 Paralympic Games will be the fourth appearance for Leibovitz. Although he did not medal in Beijing, Leibovitz has won medals in virtually every Paralympic table tennis category in which he has competed and has won ten gold medals at the Parapan American Games since 2003.

Table tennis competition at the Paralympics will kick off on August 30th at the ExCeL, the largest competition venue at the London 2012 Games.

With American athletes collecting 26 track and field medals at the Athens 2004 Paralympic Games and 28 medals at the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games, the United States is poised to be among the leading nations in the track and field competition in London. Track and field is made up of two event groups: ambulatory, which is comprised of amputees and visually-impaired athletes, among other classifications, and the wheelchair division.

Split between the two groups, the United States will send a team of 58 to London, which includes 54 athletes and four guides for the visually impaired competitors. While rookies like sprinter Blake Leeper (Kingston, Tenn.) and shot putter Angela Madsen (Long Beach, Calif.), both who hold world records, are looking to make a splash in London, Team USA will be steered by a dozen seasoned athletes who medaled at the previous Games.

Four-time U.S. Paralympian Jessica Galli (Hillsborough, N.J.), the most decorated U.S. track and field athlete at the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games with five medals, set a world record 28.93 in the women's 200m (T53) at the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Trials – Track and Field in Indianapolis. Following her victory in the 200m, she said: "This race means a lot to me because I have had such a tough time since competing in Beijing. It feels great to be back to this shape and have a chance to compete in London." Not only will she be competing at the Games, she is a favorite for gold. Galli also holds the world record in the 400m, setting the 54.88 mark in Beijing, and in the 800m.

Galli will face competition from a familiar foe, her University of Illinois training mate, Anjali Forber-Pratt (Natick, Mass.). Forber-Pratt, who previously held the women's 100m (T53) world record, won two bronze medals in Beijing, taking third in the 400m (T53) and in the 4x100m relay (T53/54) with Galli and four-time Beijing medalist Amanda McGrory (Kennett Square, Pa.), who won the 5,000m four years ago. The relay team also included T54 racer Tatyana McFadden (Clarksville, Md.), who won three silver medals in Beijing and a bronze to the silver she won in Athens

Nicknamed "The Beast" by her Illinois teammates, McFadden is running sprints through the marathon in London, the first time that has ever been done, hoping for her first-ever taste of Paralympic gold. McFadden's younger sister Hannah McFadden (Clarksville, Md.), the youngest member of the track and field team at 16, will make her Paralympic Games debut this year. It marks the first time that sisters have raced against each other for Team USA in the Games.

Kristen Messer (Austin, Texas) holds the world record in the women's 100m (T33).

In the men's wheelchair races, new world record holder Raymond Martin (Jersey City, N.J.) highlights the field. At the U.S. Paralympic Trials, he won the men's 200m (T52) with a world record 30.18. Paul Nitz (Edina, Minn.), who is now a five-time U.S. Paralympian, also

returns to the T52 field after missing the cut for the Beijing Games. From 1992-2000, Nitz captured four gold medals including three titles in the 100m, an event he set the world record in earlier this year.

Josh George (T53) will compete in sprints, with the exception of the 100m, and the marathon, hoping to add to his four-medal collection from the Athens and Beijing Games. In 2008, George (Fairfax, Va.) claimed the men's 100m title, whileBrian Siemann (Millstone, N.J.) makes his first appearance at the Games.

The men's 100m (T44) highlights the ambulatory races. In June, Leeper set a new T43 Americas record in the race then in July tied the world record set by Oscar Pistorius, who recently became the first amputee to run at the Olympic Games. Pistorius is the reigning Paralympic Champion in the race, but was defeated by Jerome Singleton (Irmo, S.C.) at the 2011 International Paralympic Committee Athletics World Championships. Richard Browne (Jackson, Miss.) also joins the mix for the 100m.

Leeper is also a favorite in the 200m, the 400m and participate in the 4x100m relay, which Team USA won at the last Paralympic Games with help from Singleton and Jim Bob Bizzell (Odessa, Texas), the silver medalist in Beijing's 200m and 400m. Singleton and Bizzell, the 200m (T44) world record holder, will run the 200m in London. David Prince (Marietta, Ga.) and Jarryd Wallace (Athens, Ga.) will compete in the 400m.

April Holmes (Somerdale, N.J.), the grand dame of sprinters, is a favorite in the women's 100m and 200m (T44), holding the world records in both. She won the 100m at the Beijing Games, but was third at the recent World Championships.

In the men's T42 races, Shaquille Vance (Houston, Miss.) hopes for a podium performance but will have to contend with Rudy Garica-Tolson (Bloomington, Calif.), who is also competing in swimming.

David Brown (T11) of Hazelwood, Mo., Elexis Gillette (T11) of Raleigh, N.C., and Josiah Jamison (T12) of Vance, S.C., the United States' visually impaired athletes, all hope to contend in individual races. They will also join with Markeith Praice (T13) of Baltimore, Md., for the men's 4x100m (T11-13) relay.

Gillette is favored for gold in the men's long jump (F11) after back-to-back silver medals at the Paralympic Games in Athens and Beijing. He currently holds the men's long jump (F11) world record. Gillette will also compete in the triple jump.

In other men's field events, Jeremy Campbell (Perryton, Texas) is favored to defend his Paralympic Games title in the men's discus (F44). He heads into London as the world record holder, having bested his own world record mark three times recently. Campbell also owns the world record in the men's pentathlon, which he won in Beijing, but the event will not be contested in London.

Jeff Skiba (Sammamish, Wash.) hopes to win the men's high jump (F46) for the second time. He set the world record in that event during the Beijing Games. Skiba is also throwing the javelin. Tobi Fawehinmi (Arlington, Texas), the youngest male on the team, will compete in the F46 long jump and triple jump, as well as the men's 200m.

Two military veterans are in the mix for the women's field events Madsen, a retired U.S. Marine, recently switched focus from Paralympic rowing to field. She holds the world record in the women's shot put (F54/55/56) and will compete in the javelin (F54/55/56). Zena Cole (Toledo, Ohio) is competing in the women's club throw (F31/32/51) and the women's discus (F51/52/53) while CeCe Mazyck (Columbia, S.C.), who is retired U.S. Army, hopes to contend in the women's javelin (F57/58).





WHEELCHAIR BASKETBALL - MEN



The U.S. has not won a medal in the men's wheelchair basketball competition at a Paralympic Games since it won bronze in Sydney in 2000. Since Co-captain Paul Schulte scored that bronze medal clinching shot at the 2000 Paralympic Games, the U.S. Men's Wheelchair Basketball Team has struggled at the Paralympic Games.

Despite claiming three gold medals, a silver medal, and a bronze medal in international competition since 2000, they finished a disappointing seventh at Athens in 2004 before losing to Great Britain in the bronze medal game in Beijing in 2008.

However, the team's recent dominating performances has many thinking the U.S. may win its first men's wheelchair basketball Paralympic gold medal in 24 years, a drought tracing back to the Seoul 1988 Paralympic Games. In their last two tournaments, the U.S. has outscored its opponents by an average of 33 points.

The 2012 U.S. Paralympic Men's Wheelchair Basketball Team is comprised of veterans and newcomers. Of the 12 players traveling to London, seven have prior Paralympic experience, including: Eric Barber (Whitewater, Wisc.), Joe Chambers (Davis, Calif.), Jeremy Lade (Janesville, Wisc.), Jason Nelms (Detroit, Mich.), Paul Schulte (Ann Arbor, Mich.), Matt Scott (Detroit, Mich.), and Steve Serio (Long Island, N.Y.). The U.S. opens play on August 30 against Turkey in the new, temporary Basketball Arena in Olympic Park.

After winning gold in Athens in 2004, the U.S. women's wheelchair basketball team went through a rebuilding process when half of the 2004 team retired after those Games. Still, fresh faces joined a core group of veterans in Beijing in 2008 where they successfully defend their 2004 Paralympic gold. Now, four years later, the 2012 U.S. Paralympic Women's Wheelchair Basketball team seems poised for another run at Paralympic gold.

Despite retaining only five athletes – Sarah Castle (Centennial, Colo.), Mary Allison Milford (Magnolia, Ark.), Becca Murray (Germantown, Wisc.), Alana Nichols (Farmington, N.M.), and Natalie Schneider (Crete, Neb.) – from the gold medal team in Beijing in 2008, all eleven members of the 2011 Parapan American gold medal winning team will travel to London. The remaining seven athletes experiencing their first Paralympics are: Sarah Binsfeld (Vadnais Heights, Mont.), Jennifer Chew (Antioch, Calif.), Rose Hollerman (Elysian, Minn.), Darlene Hunter (Commerce, Mich.), Desiree Miller (Monroe, Wash.), Jennifer Poist (McSherrytown, Pa.), and Andrea Woodson-Smith (Waynesboro, Va.).

Since their 2006 silver medal at the International Wheelchair Basketball Federation (IWBF) World Championship, the U.S. women's wheelchair basketball team has won every major tournament they have entered. With 2010 World Championship and 2011 Parapan American Games gold medals fresh in their minds the team is determined to claim their third consecutive Paralympic gold – a feat only held by one other country, Canada.

WHEELCHAIR FENCING



Six U.S. fencers will represent Team USA at the Paralympic Games in London and, for the first time ever, an American wheelchair fencer will enter the Games ranked as #3 in the world.

Twenty-five-year-old Ryan Estep (Florence, Miss.) qualified for London with his gold medal win in the Category B epee event at the Pan Am Wheelchair Championships in Sao Paulo in August.

Just two years after being introduced to the sport, Estep found himself on the road to the Paralympic Games and now he has a new goal – reaching the medal stand.

Estep came one step closer to his goal in October when he advanced to the quarter-finals of the Wheelchair World Championships in Catania, Italy.

In April, Estep reached another milestone when he won a silver medal at the Montreal Wheelchair World Cup.

Estep credits Paralympic Coach Les Stawicki (Louisville, Ky.) with much of his rapid success.

"There is no way I would have been able to do close to what I've done with just picking up a sword for the first time, not knowing what fencing was three years ago, to being No. 3 in the

world. There's no way I would have been able to accomplish that without him," Estep said.

Estep will be joined in London by three Paralympic veterans.

A retired Air Force staff sergeant, Mario Rodriguez (Port Hueneme, Calif.) will be fencing in his fourth Paralympic Games after competing in 1996, 2000 and 2004.

Although he has fenced all three weapons during his Paralympic career, Rodriguez will specialize in Category A foil in London.

Three-time Paralympian Gerard Moreno (Los Angeles, Calif.) will compete in his fourth Games in the Category B foil event.

Gary Van Der Wege (Kyle, Texas) took a break from competing after the 2004 Games, but returned to international competition in 2011 when he won gold at the Pan Am Zonals in Category A epee to earn his trip to London.

Sixteen-year-old Catherine Bouwkamp (Fishers, Ind.) is the youngest member of Team USA, but the former able-bodied saber fencer is determined to make her mark in her Category A epee event.

While his teammates each qualified for London at the Zonals, Joey Brinson's primary event, Category B saber, wasn't contested in Sao Paulo.

Due to lack of numbers, the event wasn't held and the Brandon, Miss. native was forced to qualify through the world rankings.

By the end of the World Cup season, however, Brinson had accumulated enough points to earn Team USA's final position and is now focused on earning a top finish for Team USA in London.

A Mississippi high school football standout, Estep caught the eye of college scouts by his freshman year. When a car wreck put him in a wheelchair at age 18, Estep had to find another channel for his athletic talents.

In November, 2009, he tried wheelchair fencing on a dare. "A co-worker said: I bet I can whip your butt in fencing," he remembers. "I thought 'no way' and had to try it. I go to practice, and she beats the crap out of me. I had to keep going until I could compete with her. After the first tournament, I knew I was going to try to turn this into something big just because of the crazy amount of adrenalin it gave me."

Now, the 25-year-old is the No. 1 wheelchair fencer in the USA and No. 3 in the world. In August, he qualified for the 2012 Paralympic Games in London with a gold medal win at the Wheelchair Pan American Championsips in Brazil.

To get ready for the Games in September, he is working out with a personal trainer, attending team practices at Methodist Rehabilitation Center, training with the Paralympic coach and studying film of fencing bouts. "Six days of the week I'm doing something that involves fencing," he said. "I don't want to be just one of the better people in the U.S – I want to be the best in the world. And the only way that is going to happen is through a lot of sacrifice and dedication."

2008 saw a return to the top of the podium for the U.S. Paralympic Wheelchair Rugby Team after a bronze medal finish in 2004. The team was focused on retaining its status as the number one team in the world and regaining the title of gold medalists. With that dream realized, shortly after the Games, Coach James "Gumbie" Gumbert looked ahead to London.

The roster of this squad for the last four years has been one marked with tremendous depth and talent. Try-out camps were larger than ever before with a phenomenal pool of U.S. talent from across the country. As veteran athletes like Bryan Kirkland (Leeds, Ala.) who had led the squad to three Paralympic Games bid the sport farewell, newcomers like Joe Delagrave (Chandler, Ariz.) and Chad Cohn (Tucson, Ariz.) made their intentions to make a U.S. team very clear.

Seven athletes from 2008 are back in 2012. Led by team captains Will Groulx (Portland, Ore.) and Scott Hogsett (Tempe, Ariz.), veterans like Andy Cohn (San Diego, Calif.), Nick Springer (New York, N.Y.) and Jason Regier (Denver, Colo.) all bring strong Paralympic experience; in fact though, one tremendous difference for 2012 is that every U.S. athlete has been a big part of an international team either at zonals or World Championships in the last two years. The youngest athlete on the team, standout 20-year-old Chuck Aoki (Minneapolis, Minn.) is forecasted as the player to watch at these Games. Team USA's leadership is confident that this mix of experience and talent position them well for back to back gold medals.

Beijing illuminated are the power and depth of the USA team. Hard work has kept that light shining bright; in an age when "two a days" are the common turn of phrase for athletic programs Team USA camps regularly see no less than three a days for athletes, coaches and staff.

Global competition has increased - Across the globe, wheelchair rugby has gained serious momentum; teams from Great Britain, Australia, Canada and Japan are all threats to stop the repeat. At the 2012 Canada Cup in June, USA rugby was handed a rare loss from the hungry Japanese squad. How will the new level of global competition affect the 2012 Games?

Life changes - Off the court the lives of these men have changed a great deal in four years - marriage, children, new jobs and loss of parents and loved ones have all affected these athletes and their families. They are balancing responsibilities well and their commitment is strong and united.

Popularity of the sport - A fan favorite, rugby has gained in popularity and notoriety since the 2004 film Murderball. Rugby was the first sport to sell-out for the London Games, packed stands and avid fans are sure to highlight the rugby venue in London.



Wheelchair tennis player David Wagner (Hillsboro, Ore.) enters the London 2012 Paralympic Games on a mission.

Currently ranked No. 1 in the world in the quad singles division by the International Tennis Federation, the Athens 2004 Paralympic Games silver medalist and Beijing 2008 bronze medalist wants his first ever individual gold medal. And he wants to add a third consecutive doubles gold medal to his collection too.

Wagner is ranked No. 2 in the world in doubles with partner Nick Taylor (Wichita, Kan.), who he defeated in the bronze medal match in Beijing.

"When I'm playing him, I don't look at it as if it's Nick Taylor, my doubles partner," said Wagner, who has a singles record of 30-7 for the year. "I just look at it as it's my next person in competition."

Wagner will have more than sixth-ranked Taylor to contend with in London. Ranked No. 9 in the world is their country mate Bryan Barten, who is making his Paralympic debut this year.

Israeli Noam Gershony comes into his first Paralympic Games riding the momentum of a No. 2 ranking, the highest of his career, while No. 3 Peter Norfolk of Great Britain is looking to win his third successive Paralympic quad title on home soil following victories in Athens and Beijing. Earlier this year, Wagner defeated Norfolk.

While Team USA's quad athletes may be the strongest contenders for a wheelchair tennis medal, six other athletes are representing the United States. The men's team will be led by Stephen Welch (Southlake, Texas), Jon Rydberg (Pine City, Minn.), Steve Baldwin (San Diego, Calif.) and Noah Yablong (Ocean Ridge, Fla.), while the women's team features Emmy Kaiser (Ft. Mitchell, Ky.) and Mackenzie Soldan (Louisville, Ky.). Each athlete is slated to compete in singles and doubles.

USOC

"The United States Tennis Association is the National Governing Body for Paralympic tennis and is proud of the wheelchair tennis athletes who will represent the United States at this year's Paralympic Games," said Jon Vegosen, USTA Chairman of the Board and President. "Their ability to train their minds and bodies in order to earn the title 'Paralympian' is illustrative of their commitment and dedication to the sport of tennis. Watching them compete will be an honor."

The U.S. will be one of 30 countries represented by the 112 wheelchair tennis competitors from around the world, vying for gold in the men's, women's and quad events. The competition will take place at Eton Manor, a newly-built 10,500 seat venue built specifically for wheelchair tennis located in London's Olympic Park.

Wheelchair tennis is played on a standard tennis court and follows many of the same rules as tennis. However, in wheelchair tennis, a player is allowed to let the ball bounce twice before hitting a return shot. The athlete's wheelchair is also considered to be a part of the body, so rules applying to the player's body apply to the chair as well.

The London 2012 Paralympic Games marks the sixth time wheelchair tennis will be part of the competition, and the third time the quad division will be included.

USOC

Founded in 1894 and headquartered in Colorado Springs, Colo., the United States Olympic Committee serves as both the National Olympic Committee and National Paralympic Committee for the United States. As such, the USOC is responsible for the training, entering and funding of U.S. teams for the Olympic, Paralympic, Youth Olympic, Pan American and Parapan American Games, while serving as a steward of the Olympic and Paralympic Movements throughout the country.

In addition to its international games responsibilities and work to advance the Olympic and Paralympic Movements, the USOC aids America's Olympic and Paralympic athletes through their National Governing Bodies, providing financial support and jointly working to develop customized, creative and impactful athlete-support and coaching education programs.

The USOC also supports U.S. Olympic and Paralympic athletes on and off the field of play through programming such as direct athlete funding, health insurance, tuition grants, media and marketing opportunities, career services and performance-based monetary rewards. In addition, the Olympic Training Center facilities provide athletes with performance services, including sports medicine; strength and conditioning; psychology, physiology and nutrition assistance; and performance technology.

Additionally, the USOC oversees the process by which U.S. cities bid to host the Olympic/ Paralympic Games, the Youth Olympic Games or the Pan/Parapan American Games, while also playing a supporting role in the bid processes for hosting a myriad of other international competitions. Further, the USOC approves the U.S. trials sites and procedures for the Olympic, Paralympic, Youth Olympic, Pan American and Parapan American Games team selections.



USOC - U.S. Paralympics

U.S. Paralympics, a division of the U.S. Olympic Committee, is dedicated to becoming the world leader in the Paralympic sports movement and promoting excellence in the lives of people with physical disabilities. Since its formation in 2001, U.S. Paralympics has been inspiring Americans to achieve their dreams.

Today, there are more than 21 million Americans with a physical disability. In the past few years, thousands of military personnel have sustained serious injuries during active duty. Research shows that daily physical activity enhances not only an individual's self-esteem and peer relationships, it also results in increased achievement, better overall health, and higher quality of life. However, despite these findings, most individuals with physical disabilities do not have the opportunity to participate in any regular sports activity.

U.S. Paralympics manages extensive outreach initiatives, connecting with individuals with physical disabilities directly and supporting Paralympic organizations with program development. Through education, sports programs, and partnerships with community organizations, medical facilities and government agencies, U.S. Paralympics is making a difference in the lives of thousands of people with physical and visual disabilities every day.



USOC - History

Upon the 1894 founding of the International Olympic Committee, the two constituent American members, James Edward Sullivan and William Milligan Sloane, formed a committee to organize the participation of U.S. athletes in the inaugural modern Olympic Games to be contested two years later in Athens, Greece. The formal committee, initially named the American Olympic Association, was formed at a meeting in November 1921 at the New York Athletic Club.

In 1940, the AOA changed its name to the United States of America Sports Federation and, in 1945, changed it again to the United States Olympic Association. Public Law 805, which granted the USOA a federal charter, was enacted in 1950 and enabled the USOA to solicit tax-deductible contributions as a private, non-profit corporation.

In 1961, when major constitutional revisions were made, the name of the USOA was changed to its current designation – United States Olympic Committee.

In 1978, the passage of The Amateur Sports Act (now The Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act – revised in 1998) as federal law appointed the USOC as the coordinating body for all Olympic-related athletic activity in the United States. It specifically named the USOC coordinating body for athletic activity in the United States directly

relating to international competition, including the sports on the programs of the Olympic, Paralympic, Pan American and Parapan American Games. The USOC was also given the responsibility of promoting and supporting physical fitness and public participation in athletic activities by encouraging developmental programs in its member organizations.

The act included provisions for recognizing National Governing Bodies for the sports on the Olympic, Paralympic, Pan American and Parapan American Games programs and gave the USOC the general authority, on a continuing basis, to review matters related to the recognition of NGBs in the act. This public law not only protects the trademarks of the IOC and USOC, but also gives the USOC exclusive rights to the words "Olympic," "Olympiad" and "Citius, Altius, Fortius," as well as Olympic-related symbols in the United States.


The law also requires all governance councils of the USOC and NGBs to have at least 20 percent membership and voting power by "recent and active" athletes.

The USOC moved its headquarters from New York City to Colorado Springs, Colo., on July 1, 1978. Thanks to the generous support of the City of Colorado Springs and its residents, the USOC headquarters moved to its present location in downtown Colorado Springs in April 2010, while the previous site (two miles away) remains a U.S. Olympic Training Center.



USOC - Governance

The United States Olympic Committee includes volunteer leadership consisting of a 15-member board of directors and a professional staff headed by the chief executive officer, who is an ex-officio member of the board. The USOC also has four standing board committees (audit, compensation, ethics, and nominating and governance), three constituent councils to serve as sources of opinion and advice to the board and USOC staff – including the Athletes' Advisory Council, National Governing Bodies Council and Multi-Sport Organizations Council – and a Paralympic Advisory Committee. The AAC and the NGBC each have three representatives on the board.



AAC

The Athletes' Advisory Council is responsible for broadening communication between the United States Olympic Committee and active athletes, and serves as a source of input and advice to the USOC board of directors. The AAC consists of at least one athlete from each sport in which the United States is represented at the Olympic and Pan American Games, two athletes representing the Paralympic Sport Organizations or NGBs designated to govern a Paralympic sport, and six athletes elected by the AAC to serve at-large, including a chair and two vice chairs.

NGBC

The mission of the National Governing Bodies Council is to assist the NGBs and Paralympic Sport Organizations as they strive to achieve sustained competitive excellence. The NGBC represents the consensus views of the NGBs and the PSOs to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors, USOC staff and U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Assembly. The council is also charged with ensuring close cooperation and ongoing communication between the NGBC and other USOC entities, such as the Athletes' Advisory Council and the Multi-Sport Organizations Council.

MSOC

The Multi-Sport Organizations Council is comprised of one representative of each of the MSOs (community-based MSOs, education-based MSOs, armed forces organizations and affiliated sport organizations) selected by their governing board. The purpose of the MSOC is to ensure effective communication between the MSOs and the United States Olympic Committee.


PAC

The objective of the Paralympic Advisory Committee is to advise the United States Olympic Committee board of directors with respect to strategies for sustained competitive excellence in Paralympic sport and to assist the USOC in generating resources in support of Paralympic sport in the U.S. The PAC is chaired by a member of the USOC board.

USOC - Assembly

Once each year, in association with one of four regularly scheduled board meetings, the United States Olympic Committee holds the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Assembly. The event features a variety of meetings, workshops and presentations hosted by the USOC, including a National Governing Body executive directors meeting, and community partners and council meetings. The U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Assembly does not conduct or perform any governance functions.

The U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Assembly was established by the USOC in October 2003 to foster communication, cooperation and the development of new initiatives involving the USOC and the diverse sport associations involved in the Olympic and Paralympic Movements in the United States. Representatives of the NGB Council, Athletes' Advisory Council, Multi-Sport Organizations Council and Paralympic Advisory Committee are invited by USOC leadership to attend in order to advance and achieve the organization's mission.





USOC - National Governing Bodies

NATIONAL GOVERNING BODIES & HIGH PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT ORGANIZATIONS (HPMOS)

National Governing Bodies and HPMOs are organizations that look after all aspects of their individual sports. The NGBs and HPMOs are responsible for the training, competition and development of their sports, as well as nominating athletes to the Paralympic and Parapan American Teams.

USOC - Olympic Training Centers

Chula Vista, Calif.

The U.S Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista, Calif., is the first United States Olympic Committee training facility to be master-planned and built from the ground up. It is designated for developing America's athletes, as well as servicing the local community with outreach programs. The year-round, warm-weather sport facility was a gift to the USOC from the San Diego National Sports Training Foundation and rests on a 155-acre complex adjacent to Lower Otay Lake in southwestern San Diego County. It has venues and facilities for a variety of sports: archery, beach volleyball, BMX, canoe/kayak, cycling, field hockey, rowing, rugby, soccer, softball, track & field and triathlon, along with Paralympic track & field and volleyball. Through programs developed by NGBs of each sport, the center hosts and provides coaching, support and facilities to an estimated 4,000 athletes each year.

Colorado Springs, Colo.

Colorado Springs, Colo., headquarters of the United States Olympic Committee and 23 National Governing Bodies, is also home to the largest of the three U.S. Olympic Training Centers. The OTC most closely resembles an international sports institute, in that it is a base for education, research and training opportunities, as well as a residence for top athletes in several sports. The center has 11 indoor gymnasiums; the largest indoor shooting facility in the Western Hemisphere, along with an outdoor shooting facility; one of 23 velodromes in the country; an aquatics center; and two sports centers. In addition, the OTC provides comprehensive performance services in its state-of-the-art sports medicine and sports science center. Overall, the OTC can provide housing, dining, recreational facilities and other services for more than 550 coaches and athletes at one time.

Lake Placid, N.Y.

Home of the 1932 and 1980 Olympic Winter Games, Lake Placid, N.Y., officially opened as a U.S. Olympic Training Center in November 1982, with the present facility opening in 1989. With on-site, world-class training facilities and access to neighboring winter resorts, the OTC is frequently home to winter-sport athletes and teams, such as biathlon, bobsled, figure skating, ice hockey, luge, skiing and speedskating. In addition, many summer-sport athletes make trips to the OTC to train, as do several U.S. Paralympic Teams, including the sled hockey, goalball, sitting volleyball, wheelchair basketball and wheelchair rugby squads. Many of the facilities used by athletes at the OTC were used during the 1980 Olympic Winter Games, including the Olympic Center, Olympic Speedskating Oval, Olympic Jumping Complex, Mt. Van Hoevenberg and Whiteface Mountain Ski Area.



USOC - Training Sites/Centers

OLYMPIC AND PARALYMPIC TRAINING SITES

The mission of the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Training Sites is to deliver additional resources, services and facilities for athletes and National Governing Bodies, while providing an elite athlete training environment that positively impacts performance. The USOC is partnered with 13 sites as part of this national training system of world-class facilities across the United States.

In 2010, two facilities hosted and trained 46 members of the 2010 U.S. Olympic Team, representing 15 of Team USA's medals at the Vancouver Games. In 2008, 139 members of the 2008 U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Teams trained at these sites, representing 12 of Team USA's medals from Beijing.

OLYMPIC EDUCATION CENTER

The U.S. Olympic Education Center, located on the campus of Northern Michigan University in Marquette, Mich., provides athletes the opportunity to continue their education while training to represent the U.S.

A U.S. Olympic Training Site since 1985, the OEC was recognized in 1989 for its special role in educating athletes and re-designated as the nation's only Olympic Education Center. The center has access to training facilities for a number of Olympic, Paralympic, Pan American and Parapan American sports, including archery, badminton, basketball, boxing, cycling, diving, fencing, field hockey, figure skating, ice hockey, judo, rowing, skiing (jumping, cross country and snowboard), soccer, softball, speedskating, table tennis, taekwondo, team handball, track & field, volleyball, weightlifting and wrestling.


Since the program's inception, more than 25,000 athletes, coaches, and officials from 51 countries have participated in OEC programs and training opportunities in 29 sports. While these athletes have combined to win more than 100 Olympic medals, it is the educational opportunities the OEC provides that makes the program truly unique. OEC athletes have achieved high school diplomas and college degrees, ranging from one-year certificates to master's degrees.

USOC - U.S. Olympic Foundation

The United States Olympic Foundation, headquartered in Colorado Springs, Colo., is a separate non-profit corporation established in 1984 as an endowment for sports in the Olympic Movement in the United States.

The foundation was created from the revenue generated by the 1984 Olympic Coin Program and a portion of the surplus from the Olympic Games of the XXIII Olympiad in Los Angeles. The two funding sources enabled the United States Olympic Committee to establish the foundation with an initial endowment of \$111 million. This amount, in accordance with the foundation's articles of incorporation, must remain intact.

The returns from the endowment are used to make an annual grant of 5 percent of the foundation's net assets to the USOC. The grant is used to promote Olympic-related sports in the United States. Since its inception, the foundation has awarded more than \$262.2 million in grants and has grown to a value of \$168.8 million as of Dec. 31, 2011. The foundation's board of trustees meets several times each year under the rules of its bylaws.



Lawrence (Larry) F. Probst III Chairman

Lawrence (Larry) F. Probst III was elected chairman of the United States Olympic Committee board of directors on Oct. 2, 2008, and assumed duties as chairman during the 2008 U.S. Olympic Assembly that began in Orlando, Fla., on Oct. 8. In addition, he serves on the International Olympic Committee's International Relations Commission, a post that he assumed by IOC appointment on March 10, 2011.



Probst is also chairman of the board of directors of Electronic Arts, the world's leading developer and publisher of interactive entertainment. Probst joined EA in 1984 and served as the vice president of sales until 1986, followed by four years as senior vice president of the company's publishing division. He led EA as president from December 1990 to October 1997, and was named CEO in May 1991, serving in that capacity until April 2007. Probst has been on EA's board of directors since January 1991 and was elected to the position of chairman of the board of directors in July 1994.

Under Probst, EA navigated multiple technology transitions and made strategic investments in new platforms such as mobile, online and other emerging markets. During his tenure as CEO, the company grew its annual revenue from \$175 million in 1992 to roughly \$3 billion in 2006, and expanded international operations to more than 75 countries.

Before joining EA, Probst was a national sales manager at Activision Inc. and a national accounts manager at Clorox. He holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Delaware.

Robert (Robbie) Bach

Robert (Robbie) Bach was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an independent director in December 2010.

Having worked at the Microsoft Corporation since 1988 in various marketing, general management and business leadership roles, Bach retired in 2010 as Microsoft's president of entertainment and devices. Serving in that position since 2006, Bach successfully



managed a worldwide, end-to-end business with over 9,000 employees and turned investment businesses into a division that generated \$8 billion in revenue and \$780 million in profit in 2010. He is also credited with netting Xbox as lead sponsor of the Sounders Football Club.

In addition to his work at Microsoft, Bach serves on the national board of governors for the Boys and Girls Clubs of America and is a member of the USOC's Multi-Sport Organizations Council. He has been a member of the Boys and Girls Club in Bellevue, Wash., since 1999, and chaired its board from 2004-06.



James Benson

James Benson was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an independent director in December 2010.

Benson is CEO of Benson Botsford LLC, a financial services investment company. He is also the founder and chairman of World T.E.A.M. Sports, an organization dedicated to providing opportunities through sport for people with disabilities. In addition, he serves on



Previously, Benson served as CEO of John Hancock Life Insurance Company, a division of Manulife Financial and a former Olympic sponsor. Before joining John Hancock in 2002, Benson was president of MetLife's Individual Business enterprise. He also held senior leadership positions with New England Financial, GenAmerica Financial Corporation and Equitable Companies Inc. – Equitable Life Assurance Society.

In 2006, Benson received the John Newton Russell Memorial Award, the life insurance industry's highest honor.

Benson holds a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Illinois and a master's degree in business administration from the University of Southern California.



Bob Bowlsby

Bob Bowlsby was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as a National Governing Bodies Council director in February 2007.

Bowlsby became the seventh commissioner of the Big 12 Conference on June 15, 2012. Prior to that, he served as director of athletics at Stanford University from 2006-12. At Stanford, he led a department that included 35 intercollegiate varsity teams, plus the physical education

department, intramurals, club sports, open recreation and the Stanford Golf Course.



Bowlsby has served as an Executive Committee member with both the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the Division I-A Athletic Directors Association, and was president of the I-A Directors group in 2002-03. He was elected chair of the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee and has been a member of the board of governors for the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. In addition, he was a member of the President's Commission on Opportunities in Athletics, appointed by President George W. Bush.

A native of Waterloo, Iowa, Bowlsby earned his bachelor's degree in 1975 from Moorhead State University, where he was a member of the wrestling team, and his master's degree in 1978 from the University of Iowa. NACDA named Bowlsby as Central Region Athletic Director of the Year for 2001-02, and in 2002, he was selected as the Street & Smith's SportsBusiness Journal National Athletic Director of the Year.



Ursula M. Burns

Ursula M. Burns was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an independent director in October 2008

Burns has been chairman of Xerox Corp. since May 2010 and CEO since July 2009 after having served as president of the company's business group operations, corporate senior vice president and president. Burns joined Xerox in 1980 as a mechanical



engineering summer intern, which led to several positions in engineering, including product development and planning. In June 1991, she became the executive assistant to Paul A. Allaire, then Xerox chairman and CEO.

From 1992 through 2000, Burns led several business teams, including the office color and fax business, office network copying business and departmental business unit. In May 2000, she was named senior vice president of corporate strategic services and, two years later, assumed the role of president of business group operations.

In April 2007, Burns was named president of Xerox, expanding her leadership to also include the company's IT organization, corporate strategy, human resources, corporate marketing and global accounts. At that time, she was also elected a member of the company's board of directors.

Burns serves on various professional and community boards, including American Express Corp., The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University, For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology, National Academy Foundation, Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the University of Rochester. She received a bachelor's degree from the Polytechnic Institute of New York in 1980 and a master's degree in mechanical engineering from Columbia University in 1981.

Anita L. DeFrantz

Anita L. DeFrantz was appointed to the restructured United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an International Olympic Committee director in July 2004.

DeFrantz was elected to the IOC in October 1986 and currently serves as the vice president of the International Rowing Federation (FISA). A 1976 Olympic rowing bronze medalist and 1980 U.S. Olympic Team member, she was a member of the U.S. National Rowing Team from 1975-80, winning six national championships and a silver medal at the 1978 World Rowing Championships.



First elected to the IOC's Executive Board in July 1992, DeFrantz chairs both the IOC Women and Sport Commission and the IOC Athletes' Commission Election Committee. Additionally, she is a member of the Juridical Commission, the Finance Commission, the Coordination Commission for the London 2012 Olympic Games and the Sport and Law Commission. In 1980, she received the highest honor of the Olympic Movement, the Olympic Order Medal of Bronze presented by the IOC.

From 1981-84, she was vice president of Olympic Villages for the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee. In 1985, DeFrantz joined the staff of the LA84 Foundation (formerly Amateur Athletic

Foundation of Los Angeles), the organization established to manage the surplus from the 1984 Olympic Games. She has served as the LA84 Foundation's president since 1987.

She is president and a member of the board of directors of Kids in Sports in Los Angeles. In addition, she is a member of The Knight Foundation Commission on Intercollegiate Athletics; steward of the Women's Sports Foundation; and serves on the board of directors for Western Asset Trust Inc., the Juvenile Law Center, the Institute for International Sport, Santa Monica College Foundation and the Los Angeles Sports Council. She is also a member of the NCAA Leadership Advisory Board; the Advisory Board Sports Business Institute; and the USRowing Task Force on Access, Affordability and Diversity.



James L. Easton

James L. Easton was appointed to the restructured United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an International Olympic Committee director in July 2004.

Easton is honorary president of the International Archery Federation (FITA) and was named to the IOC in 1994. After serving as vice president of the IOC from 2002-06, Easton is currently a member of the IOC Nominations, Marketing and Sport for All Commissions.



In addition, Easton is chairman and CEO of the leading archery equipment company, Jas. D. Easton Inc., and owner of Easton Technical Products and Hoyt Archery. He is also chairman of Easton-Bell Sports LLC and past owner and chairman of Easton Sports Inc.

A graduate of the University of California, Los Angeles, where he received a bachelor's degree in engineering, Easton is a member of the Board of Visitors of the Anderson School at UCLA, and a board member of both the National Archery Association Foundation and the LA84 Foundation.

John S. Hendricks

John S. Hendricks was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an independent director in February 2007.



Hendricks is the founder and chairman of Discovery Communications, the world's No. 1 nonfiction media company. Hendricks created Discovery Channel in 1982 as the first cable network in the United States designed to provide high quality documentary programming.

Hendricks has been the driving force behind Discovery's dramatic growth, including the expansion of Discovery Communications from its core property, Discovery Channel, to current global operations in more than 200 countries and territories with more than 1.5 billion cumulative subscribers. Under Hendricks' leadership, Discovery now encompasses more than 140 networks of distinctive programming, representing 28 entertainment brands.

Hendricks has been honored with a Primetime Emmy Award and the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences highest honor, the Governors Award, for conceiving the TLC series, "Great Books." The Ark Trust named him a recipient of the Genesis Award for lifetime achievement for his efforts in raising awareness around the globe about animal issues. Hendricks has also been recognized as the first corporate leader to receive the National Education Association's Friend of Education award.

In addition to the USOC, Hendricks serves on the board of directors of a number of other non-profit organizations, including the National Forest Foundation.

Before 1982, Hendricks founded and served as president of the American Association of University Consultants. He holds a bachelor's degree in history (magna cum laude, 1974) and an honorary doctorate (1991) from the University of Alabama in Huntsville.



Nina Kemppel

Nina Kemppel was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an Athletes' Advisory Council director in December 2010.

The vice chair of the AAC, Kemppel has been actively engaged for many years with key constituent groups within the Olympic Movement. She has served on the AAC leadership team since 2008, currently serves as chair of the AAC Athlete Support Division, was



a member of the AAC Paralympic Task Force and was the former vice chair of the AAC Anti-Doping Committee. Kemppel also recently chaired the USOC Working Group for Safe Training Environments.

In addition to her work within the Olympic Movement, Kemppel is currently a principal at the Coraggio Group, a management consulting firm specializing in business strategy and organizational change. She works with public, private and non-profit clients on designing new business models, innovative revenue stream development, strategic planning and effective process improvements. From 2005-08, she worked at Oliver Wyman Consulting, a global consulting firm that specializes in strategy and financial services consulting.

Kemppel is a four-time Olympian in cross-country skiing (2002, 1998, 1994 and 1992) and an 18-time national champion. She received both her master's degree in business administration and her bachelor's degree in economics from Dartmouth College.

Jair K. Lynch

Jair K. Lynch was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an Athletes' Advisory Council director in July 2004.





Lynch has more than 15 years of experience in public and private real estate development and construction, including projects in both California and Washington, D.C. He founded JAIR LYNCH in 1998 and has since managed more than 1.2 million square feet of development valued at \$270 million. Under his leadership, JAIR LYNCH managed the development of the first LEED Gold and Silver certified public buildings in the District of Columbia and delivered the smallest LEED Gold for Neighborhood Development project in the country.

Lynch is an active member of several nonprofit boards of directors, including the DC Building Industry Association, Manna Inc. and the Recreation Wish List Committee. He was also instrumental in several organizations: Cultural Tourism DC, DC 2012 Olympic Coalition and the Fannie Mae Foundation's Advisory Committee on Affordable Housing Leadership.


Lynch is a two-time Olympian. In 1996, he captained the U.S. Olympic Gymnastics Team and won a silver medal on the parallel bars. He was a 12-time All-American at Stanford University and captain of Stanford's two-time NCAA champion gymnastics team. Lynch is also a member of the Stanford Hall of Fame and the U.S. Gymnastics Hall of Fame. While at Stanford, he earned a bachelor's degree in civil engineering and urban design. He is also a 2002 graduate of Leadership Washington and a John L. Loeb fellow from the graduate school of design at Harvard University.



Susanne Lyons

Susanne Lyons was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an independent director in December 2010.

A retired senior executive, Lyons has extensive global and Olympic experience, including 25 years of expertise in marketing, business strategy, human resources and revenue generation. Most recently, Lyons was the executive vice president and chief marketing officer



She has served on a variety of public, private, advisory and nonprofit boards, including current directorships with GAIN Capital, Marketo Inc., Zoe, WildCare and Singers Marin. She previously served as a director for CNET (2007-08), Lexica (1999-2001) and InsureZone (1999-2001).

Lyons has been recognized for her business leadership with several honors, including being named the Financial Women's Association of San Francisco "Woman of the Year" in 1999. She was also honored as one of the 50 most influential Bay Area business women by the San Francisco Business Times in 2001, 2004, 2005 and 2006.

Lyons received a bachelor's degree (cum laude) from Vassar College and a master's degree in business administration from Boston University.



Mary McCagg was appointed to the restructured United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as an Athletes' Advisory Council director in July 2004.

McCagg was the USOC Athletes' Advisory Council vice chair from 2000-04 and was an AAC member for the sport of rowing from 1996-2000. In 2000, she began serving on the USOC's board of directors and was one of five athlete representatives on the USOC Executive



Committee. She has been a member of the newly constituted board since its inception in 2004, and was a member of the USRowing board of directors from 1996-2000.

McCagg has been with Candlewick Press in Cambridge, Mass., since 1999, and currently works as the director of licensing, key property development and propriety sales. Previously, McCagg was assistant to the publisher at Dutton Children's Books, New York (1998-99); production manager for Retail Bank Merchandising, Cambridge (1992-94 and 1996-98); and fundraiser and marketing coordinator for the Chattanooga Rowing Club (1994-96).

A 1989 cum laude graduate of Harvard University with a bachelor's degree in psychology, McCagg competed in the 1992 and 1996 Olympic Games, rowing in the women's eight and reaching the finals both times. A member of the U.S. National Rowing Team from 1989-97, McCagg is an 11-time national champion, three-time world medalist – including a gold at the 1995 World Championships in Tampere, Finland – and a 1995 Pan American Games gold medalist.

McCagg was one of four USOC athlete service coordinators for the 2000 Olympic Games and was an assistant chef de mission for the 2004 U.S. Olympic Team.



Dave Ogrean

Dave Ogrean was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as a National Governing Bodies Council director in December 2010.

Ogrean, who began his second stint as executive director of USA Hockey in 2005 (first from 1993-99), has been associated with the Olympic Movement for more than 30 years. He has extensive experience in sport administration, fundraising, marketing, media and



the Paralympic sport of sled hockey, which he oversees in his present role at USA Hockey.

Ogrean serves on several boards and committees, including the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame Nominating Committee, U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Selection Committee, USOC National Governing Bodies Council and the Colorado Springs World Arena board of directors. In 2009, Ogrean was a member of the USOC CEO Search Committee, which ultimately recommended current USOC CEO Scott Blackmun in January 2010.

Prior to his current term with USA Hockey, Ogrean served as executive director for USA Football (2002-05), president and CEO of the Colorado Springs Sports Corporation (2000-02), and deputy executive director of marketing for the USOC (1999-2000). He also held roles at the College Football Association and ESPN. In addition, he has been involved in eight Olympic Games, seven U.S. Olympic Festivals and two Pan American Games.

Ogrean received his bachelor's degree from the University of Connecticut and his master's from Boston University. He has been recognized as one of the Top 50 People of Power and Influence by The Hockey News from 2006-10, and was named one of the Top 100 Most Powerful People in Sports by The Sporting News from 1993-99.

Michael (Mike) P. Plant

Michael (Mike) P. Plant was appointed to the United States Olympic Committee board of directors and began serving as a National Governing Bodies Council director in July 2004.

Plant was named executive vice president of business operations for Major League Baseball's Atlanta Braves in November 2003 and oversees stadium operations, security, finance, personnel, special events and the minor-league clubs. Plant joined the Braves after



having served as an executive vice president of Turner Sports since February 2002. Previously, he was president of the Goodwill Games and vice president of events for Turner Sports.

Prior to joining Turner Sports, Plant was president of Medalist Sports, a full-service sports marketing company he founded in 1988. Medalist Sports created and operated premier cycling events such as the Tour DuPont, Tour of China and the 1996 U.S. Olympic Team Trials. Plant was associate executive director of USA Cycling from 1986-88 and executive director of USA Canoe/Kayak from 1985-86.

Plant was a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Speedskating Team and competed in six world championships. Since 1980. Plant has been appointed to numerous committees of the USOC, U.S. Speedskating and USA Cycling. In January 1989, after serving two four-year terms as the U.S. Speedskating athlete representative on the USOC Athletes' Advisory Council, Plant was elected to a four-year term as AAC chairman. He served an eight-year term on the USOC board of directors and Executive Committee (1984-92) and was president of USA Cycling from 1995-2002.



In addition to the Athletes' Commission, Ruggiero was later appointed to the 11-member IOC Evaluation Commission that





A star player on the U.S. Olympic Ice Hockey Team, Ruggiero won a gold medal in 1998, silvers in 2002 and 2010, and bronze in 2006. During her 16-year career with the U.S. Women's National Hockey Team, she competed in 10 world championships, earning the gold medal on four occasions.

In addition to her athletic accomplishments, Ruggiero is the founder and president of a girl's hockey school; author of "Breaking the Ice," her autobiography; and formerly served as the director of the New York Islanders' Project Hope. She appeared on the sixth season of "The Apprentice," has participated in the ProSports MVP Olympic Heroes Tour, is active in Right to Play, is on the board of trustees for the Women's Sports Foundation (she will become president of the WSF in 2013) and serves on the World Anti-Doping Association board of directors.



Scott Blackmun became the chief executive officer of the United States Olympic Committee in January 2010 and was added as an ex officio member of the board of directors in September 2010.





Prior to joining the USOC, Blackmun practiced law in Colorado as a partner with Holme Roberts & Owen LLP (1988-93 and 2006-09) and Hogan & Hartson (1994-98). From 2002-06, he served as the chief operating officer of Anschutz Entertainment Group, one of the world's largest, most respected presenters of sports and entertainment events.

Blackmun is a member of the International Olympic Committee's Marketing Commission and currently serves on the board of directors of the USOC; National Foundation on Fitness, Sports and Nutrition; and the Colorado Springs Regional Economic Development Corporation. Chief Executive Officer


A resident of Colorado Springs, Colo., Adams is a graduate of the University of California, Los Angeles and obtained his law degree from Rutgers University.

Chief of Sport Performance

Alan Ashley was named chief of sport performance for the United States Olympic Committee on Sept. 1, 2010, after previously serving as managing director of sport performance since January 2010. Prior to that, Ashley served as a team leader in the sport performance division beginning in December 2006.



Ashley joined the USOC after spending 16 years with the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association, where he was a key contributor to the rise of the U.S. ski and snowboard teams, having most recently served as the vice president of athletics. At USSA, Ashley helped manage the coaching, training and organizational structure for six Olympic (alpine, cross-country, nordic combined and freestyle skiing; ski jumping; and snowboarding) and two Paralympic (alpine and cross-country skiing) sports involving 170 elite athletes, 125 elite coaches and administrative staff, 320 USSA clubs, 3,000 club coaches and 16,000 USSA member athletes.

Chief Marketing Officer

Lisa Baird was named chief marketing officer of the United States Olympic Committee on Jan. 20, 2009. As the USOC's CMO, Baird directs the sales and marketing division and oversees the development of innovative corporate sponsorship and licensing programs. Since joining the USOC, she has signed a number of sponsors, including first-time partners BMW Group in North America,



BP, Dow Chemical and Procter & Gamble, and launched an e-commerce site and several new marketing platforms that have successfully raised the awareness and profile of Team USA. In 2010, she led the redesign of the USOC brand.

From 2005-07, Baird served as senior vice president of marketing and consumer products for the NFL, where she directed the league's consumer products, direct marketing, e-commerce, entertainment marketing and advertising programs. LARRY BUENDORF

Chief Security Officer

Larry Buendorf has been the chief security officer for the United States Olympic Committee since April 1993. Buendorf oversees all security needs for the USOC, including the headquarters building in Colorado Springs, Colo., and the three U.S. Olympic Training Centers (Chula Vista, Calif.; Colorado Springs, Colo.; and Lake Placid, N.Y.). In addition, he is responsible for the security of U.S. delegations at USOC-supported games, including Olympic, Paralympic, Pan



Buendorf arrived at the USOC after a distinguished career with the U.S. Secret Service. While working for the Secret Service, he was special agent in charge of the protective division assigned to President Gerald Ford (1983-93). Buendorf also was special agent in charge of the Secret Service Omaha Field Office (1982-83); the Denver Field Office (1977-82); the presidential protective division (1972-77), during which time he provided protection to Presidents Nixon, Ford and Carter; and the Chicago Field Office (1970-72).

Buendorf is a recipient of the U.S. Treasury Department Meritorious Service Award and the U.S. Secret Service Valor Award for successfully thwarting the assassination attempt by Lynette "Squeaky" Fromme against President Ford in Sacramento, Calif., in September 1975. He also has been honored with a California Legislature resolution, the San Diego Crime Commission Valor Award and induction into the Minnesota Athletic Director's Hall of Fame.

Buendorf, who served as an officer in the U.S. Navy, received his bachelor's degree from Minnesota State University. He is a member of the International Association-Chiefs of Police, International Association of Police, International Security Management Association, American Society for Industrial Security, Overseas Security Advisory Council, Pikes Peak Law Enforcement Association and the Association of Former Agents-U.S. Secret Service.



RANA DERSHOWITZ

General Counsel

Rana Dershowitz currently serves as general counsel for the United States Olympic Committee after operating as general counsel and chief of legal and government affairs from March 2008 until February 2012. In her current role, Dershowitz is responsible for all legal issues faced by the organization and assumes all necessary functions as corporate secretary for the USOC board of directors. She also serves as the USOC's ethics officer, coordinating with the USOC Ethics Committee, which was established by the board.



Dershowitz' previous USOC duties also included oversight of the organization's legal and government affairs teams. She first joined the USOC in April 2007 as deputy general counsel, and the following month she was named interim general counsel.

Prior to joining the USOC, Dershowitz served in various roles for Madison Square Garden, including vice president and director of legal and business affairs. At Madison Square Garden, L.P., Dershowitz was one of the primary attorneys handling a broad range of legal and business matters for the NBA's New York Knicks, the NHL's New York Rangers, and the WNBA's New York Liberty. She also handled legal matters for Madison Square Garden Network and Fox Sports Net New York.

Before MSG, Dershowitz was an associate in the television and film group of the renowned New York entertainment law firm of Grubman, Indursky & Schindler, P.C. She began her legal career as an associate in the New York office of the international law firm of Fried. Frank, Harris, Shriver & Jacobson, where she focused on litigation matters in the areas of antitrust, commercial law disputes, employment law and intellectual property. Dershowitz also served as an adjunct professor of sports law at New York Law School.

Dershowitz is a cum laude graduate of Harvard College, where she earned Phi Beta Kappa honors, received a John Harvard Scholarship and was a four-year member and 1989-92 captain of the Harvard varsity ski team. MIKE ENGLISH

Chief of Sport Operations

Mike English was named chief of sport operations for the United States Olympic Committee on Sept. 1, 2010, after previously serving as the chief of sport performance since June 1, 2009. Prior to that, he had served as the organization's managing director of athlete facilities and services since May 2005.

In his current role, English oversees the USOC's network of U.S. Olympic Training Centers, including locations in Colorado Springs, Colo.; Lake Placid, N.Y.; and Chula Vista. Calif., as well as other USOC facilities.

English joined the USOC staff in August 2004 as the director of the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs and oversaw the center's overall training service functions and operations. English came to the USOC from Quantum Corporation, where he had been employed since January 1985 in numerous managerial positions.

A member of the U.S. Shooting National Team from 1978-88, English was a resident athlete at the OTC in Colorado Springs from 1981-86. A five-time national champion, English earned a gold medal at the 1981 World Championships and is a three-time Pan American Games medalist (1983-gold, bronze; 1987-gold).

From April 2001-August 2004, English was president and chairman of the USA Shooting board of directors. He previously served as the National Governing Body's vice president and Athletes' Advisory Council Representative from 1996-2000 and was also an athlete director on the USA Shooting board (1988-96).

English has a bachelor's degree in business management from Regis University in Colorado Springs.

WALT GLOVER

Chief Financial Officer

Walt Glover has served as the United States Olympic Committee's chief financial officer since January 2005. He is tasked with the overall management and supervision of the organization's financial operations, including accounting, financial reporting, internal controls, budgeting and forecasting, cash management, risk management, mail services, purchasing and warehousing operations, travel services and USOC retirement plan administration.



Glover joined the USOC in September 2000 as director of budgets and analysis, and then held the position of controller from May 2002-January 2005.

Previously, Glover worked for Altria. During a 20-year career with the company, Glover held various financial management positions, including Southwest region director of finance (1996-2000). CHARLIE HUEBNER

Chief of Paralympics

Charlie Huebner was named chief of Paralympics for the United States Olympic Committee in July 2006 after having joined the organization in 2001 as the director of the newly formed U.S. Paralympics division. In his current role, Huebner oversees Paralympic programing across all USOC divisions.



Huebner is very active in volunteer community service projects that impact children's charities. He currently serves on the board of directors of The Christopher Ames Matthews Project, The Grace Fund and Pennies for Nicoll, and is co-founder of the Colorado Springs YOT Club, which is a cost effective black-tie event that collects toys for underprivileged children. In 1996, Huebner was one of 41 Americans to be named a Jefferson Award winner for community service.

TREVOR MILLER

Managing Director, Information Technology

Trevor Miller was named the United States Olympic Committee's managing director of information technology on March 31, 2009. Beginning in 2006, Miller served as the organization's director of enterprise applications and was responsible for application strategy, design and architecture, integration of package and custom-developed solutions, implementation of software development, data warehousing solutions and testing, and training.



In his current role, Miller is responsible for directing the business technology and information services essential to the operation of the USOC. These services include a centralized help desk, technical design and supply of USOC web applications, Olympic marks approval systems, and developing and supporting National Governing Body membership systems.

Miller has more than 14 years of experience in technical leadership, strategy and large-scale, complex product development in the telecommunications industry. Chief Development Officer

Janine Alfano Musholt was named managing director of development for the United States Olympic Committee in February 2008 and promoted to chief development officer in June 2008. Musholt oversees the USOC's private donor fundraising initiatives, including direct marketing and major giving opportunities, as well as the USOC's alumni activities in conjunction with the U.S. Olympians Association.



Musholt also serves as a representative for the USOC to the U.S. Olympic Foundation. Prior to her time with the USSA, Musholt worked in advertising sales at The Denver Post. A New Jersey native, Musholt received a bachelor's degree in American studies from Dickinson College in 1988. She currently resides in Colorado Springs, Colo., with her husband. Chuck, and their two dogs.

JOHN RUGER

Athlete Ombudsman

John Ruger was appointed as the athlete ombudsman to the United States Olympic Committee in March 1999. As such, his responsibilities include providing independent advice to athletes on all issues relating to their rights to compete, facilitating communications and assisting in mediation of disputes between athletes and Olympic family organizations, and assisting in the



development and implementation of policies to secure and support the rights of elite athletes.

Ruger previously worked for the USOC as manager of the southeastern operations for the Hometown '96 program. In the one-year Atlanta-based assignment, Ruger helped develop and implement the USOC's \$4.25 million grant program to maximize the U.S. team's homefield advantage at the 1996 Olympic Games.

Throughout his career, Ruger has also served as president of his own sports marketing and management company in Boulder, Colo.; vice president of operations for the Colorado Sports Council: and a member of the local organizing committee for the 1995 U.S. Olympic Festival.

Competitively, Ruger was a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team in biathlon. He competed on three world championship teams and coached the U.S. biathlon team from 1987-89.

Ruger has a bachelor's degree in economics from Rutgers University. He and his wife, Rita, have two daughters and currently reside in Boulder.



PATRICK SANDUSKY

Chief Communications & Public Affairs Officer

Patrick Sandusky became the chief communications and public affairs officer for the United States Olympic committee in February 2012 after joining the organization as chief communications officer in October 2009. Previously, Sandusky served as the spokesperson and vice president of communications for the Chicago 2016 Olympic bid.



Prior to leading communications efforts for the Chicago 2016 bid, Sandusky was a vice president at Hill & Knowlton, where he managed large-scale, multinational communications programs for both the Chicago and London offices, and was a leader in the firm's sports and crisis communications divisions. 

The role of the PAC is to serve in an advisory role to enhance competitive excellence in Paralympic sport, and assist the USOC in generating resources in support of Paralympic sport.

ANN CODY

As Director of Policy and Global Outreach for BlazeSports America, Ann Cody oversees the Washington, D.C. office, develops relationships with major national and international partners, shapes the organization's policy efforts, and supports the organization's sport development initiatives overseas.

As a Washington veteran and Paralympic sport expert of two decades, Ann has extensive knowledge and experience in sports management and governance, community-based sports, policy and

advocacy, international development, as well as governmental and international affairs.

Ann is widely known and respected throughout the world as a leader in sport and human rights. She has led a number of national and international advocacy initiatives on sport with a focus on girls and women and people with disabilities. Through her leadership, the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) established a policy on gender equity and several initiatives aimed at increasing participation by women in Paralympic sport and the



movement. Ann's significant international sport network and project experience anchors BlazeSports' international programs in Africa, Asia, and the Middle East.

Ann serves on the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) Governing Board and is the highest ranking American and highest ranking woman in the IPC worldwide. As IPC's liaison to the United Nations, Ann is working to ensure that sport is included in UN disability development efforts. She is a member of the International Olympic Committee 2018 Evaluation Commission. Ann holds a bachelor of fine arts and a master of science degree in leisure studies and therapeutic recreation from the University of Illinois at Urbana – Champaign. She is a Paralympic Gold Medalist in Athletics and competed on three U.S. Paralympic Teams (Basketball '84, Athletics '88, '92).

Prior to joining BlazeSports Ann served as a Vice President with B&D Consulting where she designed federal affairs strategies for amateur sports, health, and disability-related organizations and provided representation before the United States Congress and the Executive Branch.

BOB BALK

Balk broke his back in 1988 at a college party, where he fell off a roof. He began his disabled athletic career in wheelchair basketball and road racing before he started skiing in 1993. Four months later, he was at the Paralympic Winter Games in Lillehammer. The Games in Torino will mark Balk's sixth appearance at the Paralympics and his fourth consecutive Winter Games. Balk upped his intensity during the summer, including a week of training with teammate Chris



Klebl in California and then time on snow in late summer with Klebl and Monica Bascio in New Zealand. "Bob knows how to pace himself and when he's got to turn it up," Coach Jon Kreamelmeyer said, "and with his fourth Paralympics coming up, he wants to be even more ready." When he isn't competing or training, he works full-time as a venture capital investments manager for Boeing. Balk Paralympic Athletes Committee in September of 2004.

Nancy Ditz was a member of the 1988 U.S. Olympic marathon team, and was twice ranked as the top U.S. marathoner by Track and Field News. Ditz has won many road races, including the Los Angeles Marathon (twice), the San Francisco Marathon, the Oakland Marathon, the San Francisco Bay to Breakers, and the Sydney, Australia, City to Surf (three times).


Ditz, a 1976 Stanford graduate, finished second to Margaret Groos in the 1988 Olympic trials and was the first American to finish the 1988 Olympic marathon. Her time of 2:33:41 brought her 17th place.

She did not compete in track and field until after leaving Stanford, but did earn her varsity letter as a manager of the men's basketball team. Nancy's husband, Bruce Mosbacher, was a goalkeeper on the Stanford soccer team from 1974-76, earning All-West Coast and team MVP honors.

Ditz also served as a weekly columnist for the SF Chronicle and Examiner, in addition to being a color-commentator for a variety of major TV networks. Additionally, has served on the Stanford University Athletics Board and has been the director of the annual US Open meet at Stanford. Ditz is a long-time member of the board of USA Track and Field.

JAMES BENSON

James Benson was appointed to the U.S. Olympic Committee (USOC) board of directors and began serving as an independent director on Dec. 17, 2010.

George R. Mr. Puskar retired in 2000 as Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Equitable Real Estate—the company was one of the world's largest and most diversified real estate organizations with \$40 billion in assets under management as well as commercial property management and mortgage servicing divisions.

One of the core strategies for Mr. Puskar and World Team Sports remains various outreach programs incorporating athletes into motivational programs at schools to address the growing issues of childhood obesity, alcohol and drug abuse as well as the power of sports to overcome personal obstacles.

A native of Pittsburgh, Mr. Puskar graduated from Duquesne University with a BA in 1965 and joined Equitable Life's mortgage division a year later. During his early career at Equitable, he represented the company in the President's Executive Interchange Program, working in 1975 with the chief economist of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board. Prior to joining Lakeshore Foundation, Underwood served as Associate Director for Community Affairs at the Comprehensive Cancer Center of the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB). Before that, he served in Washington D.C. as a Senior Legislative Assistant for Congressman Ben Erdreich of the 6th District of Alabama. He also served on the United States Olympic Committee, Paralympic Working Group in 2000.

Underwood has held several elected positions including the City of Homewood City Council, City Council President, and State Senator, State of Alabama. He also served for 10 years on the City of Homewood School Board, including two terms as President of the Board.

Underwood is a member of the 2010-11 Class of Leadership Alabama. He is a Trustee for the Birmingham Business Alliance, and serves on the Boards of the Bryant-Jordan Scholarship Fund, Disabled Sports USA, and several other organizations. In 2003 he was nominee for "Citizen of the Year" for the City of Homewood.

At the 2008 Paralympic Games, Singleton turned in an impressive performance, winning a silver medal in the 100m T44 and helping the U.S. to a gold medal in the 4x100m relay.

JESSICA GALLI

Jessica Galli was injured in a car accident in September 1991, but shortly after became in involved in Paralympic sports. In 1998, she attended her first international event, the IPC Athletics World Championships in Birmingham, England, and has been competing internationally ever since.



After winning just one medal in the 2000 and 2004 Paralympic

Games, Galli won an incredible five medals in Beijing, including one gold, three silver and one bronze. Galli's medal haul was tops among the entire U.S. Paralympic Track & Field Team.

In June 2008, Galli set a new mark in the 400m at a European Wheelchair Championships meet in Switzerland, taking nearly a half-second off the old mark, set by Great Britain's Tanni Grey-Thompson. Three weeks later, she chopped another four-tenths of a second off her time - and broke two other world records, the 200m and 800m - at the Meet in the Heat in Atlanta. She reset the world record in the 400m at the Paralympic Games in Beijing and is currently the record holder for the 400m and 800m.

A 2000 Paralympic Games silver medalist in the 800m, Galli says finishing fourth twice in 2004 motivated her to excel in 2008.

Galli graduated from the University of Illinois in 2006 with a degree in kinesiology. In 2010, Galli graduated with a master's degree in community health - health policy and administration.
