May 27, 2014 – A controversial figure from the age of 15, Omar Khadr has spoken to the media for the first time since being released on bail earlier this month and the exclusive interviews will be featured in OMAR KHADR: OUT OF THE SHADOWS, a documentary collaboration between the CBC, the Toronto Star and White Pine Pictures, airing this Thursday night at 9 p.m./9:30 p.m. NT on CBC-TV. Radio-Canada will broadcast the documentary this Saturday, May 30, at 9 p.m.

Based in part on the book *Guantanamo's Child: The Untold Story of Omar Khadr* by award-winning Toronto Star reporter Michelle Shephard, the documentary explores Khadr's life beginning with his upbringing in suburban Toronto, to Peshawar and into Afghanistan, and ultimately back to Canada. Shephard, a co-director on the film, has been covering Khadr's story for the Toronto Star since 2002, including more than 25 trips to the U.S. Naval Base, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

Directed by award-winning filmmaker Patrick Reed and co-directed by Shephard, OMAR KHADR: OUT OF THE SHADOWS offers an intimate look at how a Canadian teenager became the central figure of one of the first U.S. war crimes trials since the prosecution of Nazi commanders in the 1940s and the only juvenile ever tried. The film includes unprecedented access to Khadr following nearly 13 years in detention, as well as interviews with his lawyer, Dennis Edney, former interrogator Damien Corsetti, and members of the Khadr family.

Leading up to the premiere, an interview with Shephard will be featured on THE NATIONAL tonight to discuss the documentary and her experience following this controversial story for the past 13 years.

OMAR KHADR: OUT OF THE SHADOWS is produced by White Pine Pictures in association with CBC, Radio-Canada, Al Jazeera English, Al Jazeera Arabic, Al Jazeera America, and with the participation of Shaw Media Hot Docs Development Fund, Canada Media Fund, and the Ontario Media Development Corporation.

I should give you a more complete answer, sorry. There is no relationship between us and Al Jazeera. We simply both invested in versions of the same film. They are among the networks that financed film - specifically, buying foreign rights. They had no editorial say over the Canadian version, and didn't even see it before we aired it.

Their participation in financing film is acknowledged in the tail credits, as is customary. Radio Canada's role as another financier is equally acknowledged.

Omar Khadr tells Al Jazeera his Guantanamo story

- In his first interview since release, Khadr says he wants to move on
- Uses interview to recall his Guantanamo experience of 13 years

Omar Khadr, the former Guantanamo detainee in his first full-length interview since being released from a Canadian prison says "I don't wish people to love me. I don't wish people to hate me. I just wish for people to just give me a chance."

Khadr, in his first interview talks about his arrest in Afghanistan who at the age of 15 then spent a decade at Guantanamo Bay. The interview is part of a documentary called Guantanamo's Child – Omar Khadr, a collaboration between Al Jazeera and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. It airs on Al Jazeera English on Sunday 7th June at 20.00 GMT and CBC on Thursday 28th May at 9pm Canadian time.

Released on bail on May 7 while he appeals his US military conviction, Khadr says he worries whether his new freedom is going to last or wonders if he is "just hungry to experience everything all at once." But having spent the last 13 of his 28 years behind bars, Khadr admits he will face a considerable degree of public suspicion: "People are just going to think that I am fake. You go through a struggle, you go through a trauma, you're going to be bitter, you're going to hate some people. It's just the normal thing to do — and this guy, not having these natural emotions, is probably hiding something."

Khadr recalls the darkest days while in Guantanamo saying it has had a profound effect on him but he managed to survive, he says: "I've been in Guantanamo for 10 years and if there's any place where I was going to be brainwashed was in Guantanamo, where I only had only one source of influence and that was not necessarily the healthiest and I think I did okay".

Khadr says his own experience was something he endured and it's something he would't want on anyone else. "I wouldn't wish this experience on anybody. But I have a hard time thinking about wishing that I haven't gone through this experience. People say hypothetically "if you can go back, would you change anything?" I would change the fire fight maybe. But within that change I would do lot of things like I've come to know wonderful people I've come to know myself because of

this experience. And, it's a very hard trade for me. But things happened for a reason. Sometimes you have to fall to appreciate standing up."
