The indices of the Denver Office are negative on this organization and on its officials.

This purports to be an invitation to join the Allied Scientists of the World with headquarters in Denver, although no name of any person is mentioned except Agnes Dobson as secretary to the Board of Governors.

[REDACTED] is an able scientist, has done valuable work in [REDACTED] written books, etc., so that such an invitation is not unjustified. Since neither of us has heard of this organization and since it may be;

- 1. Just a crackpot idea by some guy with a lot of money,
- 2. A good racket to collect \$25.00 per year from gullible scientists,
- 3. A Communist front organization for recruitment and perversion,
- 4. Some other nefarious activity,

we decided to send it on to you. Maybe you know all about it and might well endorse or condemn it publicly for whatever it is.

A few days ago this organization, or more precisely its Communication Office, America (941 Sevonteenth Street, Denver, Colorado), surprised me with a letter announcing that I have been elected to fellowship. The letter was accompanied by a pamphlet in which the purposes of this association were not very clearly defined and the ways and means in an entirely vague manner.

What puzzles me most about the letter and the pamphlet is that the organization apparently shuns publicity and does not even publish a list of their officers.

If you know anything about the "Allied Scientists of the World," please let me know.

This office has received three complaints regarding the captioned organization. One originated with

All transmitted similar material received from the captioned Scientists of the World, Communications Office, America, 941 17th Street, Denver, Colorado. In each case the printed material was sent with a brief cover letter from AGNES DOBSON, Secretary.

The original material is maintained at Philadelphia. One set of photostats is being transmitted to the Bureau and a similar set to Denver.

All three sets of originals are being maintained at Philadelphia. The original mailing envelopes in which the material was received by [redacted] and [redacted] are available at Philadelphia. Both are postmarked at Denver November 23, 1951.

A perusal of the material issued by the organization indicates the possibility that a mail fraud is being perpetrated. It is suggested that the Bureau and Denver check indices and that if no reason exists to the contrary, the matter be referred to the Post Office Inspectors at Denver.
