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## ENAMEN OFENS WORLD ZIGNIST CONFERENCE; APPRAIS TO BRITAIN AND ALLIES FOR JEWISH STATE

LALON, August 1. (JTA) -- The first world Zionist conference since the outbreak of the war opened here today with a dramatic address by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, in which he appealed to the British Government to stopt a new policy with regard to Falestine based on the acceptance of Jewish state-bad and recognition of Jewish rights to free immigration and settlement in Falustine, is urged the carrying out of a practical program of political and economic activities in order to achieve a speedy transformation of Palestine into a Jewish State,

The leader of the world Zionist movement also appealed to the United Nations, paticularly to the United States and the USSR, "to give their approval and support to the righting of an ancient wrong" and to secure for the Jewish people their place in the femily of nations.

The Jows, Dr. Weizmann said, with their 6,000,000 victims, their 1,000,000 fighters and 35,000 Falestine volunteers, were relegated to corridors at the San Francisco Conference, while states were admitted which had just signed declaration. Of were "Continuation of this anomaly is intolerable," he continued. "The Jewish people must be given their rightful place in the family of nations. Falestine as a Jewish State must be one of the fruits of victory. By God - it shall be!"

Emphasizing that the primary responsibility for enunciation of a new policy with regard to Falestine is Iritain's, Dr. Weizmann recalled the declarations by the lawriesn political parties and the endorsements given to the Zioniat cause by the late Fresident Roosevelt and Fresident Truman. "Our appeal," he declared, "goes out tall the United Nations, especially to the two major allies of Britain - the United States and the USSR - who in this very hour moothe mould the world's destinies."

The Zionists will not swerve and will not depart from the original aim of developing Falestine into a Jewish State as intended by the Balfour Declaration, Dr Weizmann stated. He demanded that the new British Government take definite steps "at the resent historic juncture" to implement the Declaration's original purposes "To do not claim in Falestine what belongs to others," he said. "But we want an opportunity to ereate new things. Important development sohemes are ready, but their execution depends on new political dispensations."

## Fledges Cooperation With Arabs In A Jewish Palestins

The world Zionist leader riedged that the Arabs in Falestine will retain their possessions and their linguistic, outsural and religious identity, as well as domplete equality of rights and natural ties with their brothern in the neighboring countries where Arab nationalism, he said, has ample scope.

"The Arabs," he pointed out. "have goined tremendously in the last war and in this war. Is this struggle to bring to the Arabs fulfillment of all their hopes, and to the Jews nothing? We are vitally interested in cooperating with our Arabs neighbors, but we can do so effectively only if we ourselves are firmly established in our cwn

pr. Weizmann revealed that he had had good reason to believe that revision of the Felestine policy would be underteken by the British Government "as soon as the European war was over." The tendency towards postponement, he said, may not be surprising in view of urgent questions on the international agenda.

"But we cannot wait," he continued. "Delay means the prolongation of the agony of the devist survivors in Europe, the growing of tension, and finelly a crisise hales there is a clear lead, the position is bound to deteriorate. Our people in large are going under, while in the Middle East new facts are being croated calculated to prejudge the issue. It cannot be expected that people should look with quantity upon the agony of their brothers and to the liquidation of their national law; the foundations of which were laid with so much devotion, effort and sacrifice. #### Wants 100,000 Certificates, Urges All Governments to Permit Emigration

Stressing the question of Jewish immigration to Falestine as "the most urgent, roles," the leader of the World Zionist Organization caked the British Government for a speedy decision on the Jewish demand for 100,000 certificates as a first installment on post-war Jewish immigration to Falestine. At the same time, he appealed tall governments to grant free exit to all Jews in their countries willing to salighte to Palestine. "I appeal to the conscience of the world; Let my people gol", be said.

Beferring to the Labor Government, Dr. Weizmann emphasized that the Zionist weement had never been linked up with eny one political party. He paid tribute to finsten Churchill, terming him a sincere friend of the Zionist movement and orediting him with the formation of the Jewish Brigade. He recalled the solid vote of the Fritish labor Farty against the White Faper and its pro-Zionist resolutions, emphanting that Herbert Morrison, one of the leaders of the Labor Farty, and present led Fresident of the Council, had gtated at the time the White Faper was adopted that it would not be binding upon subsequent governments.

## AUSTRIAN JEWS RETURN FROM THERESIEMSTADT TO VIEWA, JEWISH POPULATION REACHES 8,000

VIEINA, August 1. (JTA)—With the errival here today of 360 Jews from the theresienstadt concentration camp, the Jewish population of Vienna, which once numbered 180,000, totals slightly more than 8,000. Of these, shout 6,000 are married to non-lews and 1,000 returned in recent weeks form comps.

A JTA correspondent who witnessed the arrival of the Theresiens toddy was struck by the fact that they were mainly middle-aged and elderly. There were no children among them. One of the errivals told the correspondent that the Maris had given high priority to the extermination of all Jewish children up to the age of forteen.

Despite the fact that helf of them were ill, the 360 laughed and chattered like children when they reached the Vienne reilroad station. They called greetings to the few fellow-Viennese who were on hend to greet them.

Everyone questioned said that they wanted to emigrate from Europe, where their times and children and hushands had been killed and where they themselves had suffered horrors which they find impossible to describe. They want to go relestine, installs, Africa, England, America, anywhere off this continent.

Although their citizenship rights have been restored, these Jews have heard tales of mistreatment and anti-Somitism in Foland, Slowkim and elsewhere, and they do sot wish to entrust their future to Europe. They pleadingly expressed the hope that semiody would help them flee.

#### mitain and u.s. Charged with failure to meet resionsibility to displaced persons

LONDON, August 1. (JTA)—The British and American governments are failing in their duty to the survivors of Nazi terror, a London News Chronicle correspondent writes today, describing the plight of the immates of the camps in Germany.

An atmosphere of "imprisonment, of being unmented and unloved is still there," he says. "A maze of red tape stronger than barbed wire is encircling the camps. It is not known whether there is a deliberate policy to make things sufficiently unplessant so that the interness will be ready to go enywhere, rether than remain, but that is certainly the feeling of many of the interness as well as competent social writers to whom I have talked."

In an editorial commenting on the dispatch, the paper says that what happens to these people is the responsibility of the allies. Common humanity and justice, it uses, demands that responsibility should not be shelved. The Chronicle says that future relations with liberated Surope will depend on a sympathetic, constructive stitude toward these intermees.

or. Israel Goldstein, president of the Zionist Organization of America, who returned here vestorday after a week's tour of camps in Germany, seid today that among the non-repatriable persons are 100,000 Jews, half of whom are in the American zone. This proclem, he declared, must be approached not as a muleence, but as a challonge of human rehabilitation. The pointed out that among the displaced Jews are many form countries like Poland where anti-Semtiem flourished before the war and was intensified during the Mazi occupation. These people, or, Goldstein said, will find it difficult and, in many onces, dengerous to return home.

### RETUGAL LIFTS RESIDENCE RESTRICTIONS ON REFUGEES. ALLOWING THEM TO LIVE ANYWHERE

HISBON, August 1. (JTA) -- The Fortuguese Government today announced the lifting of war-time restrictions on residence of refugees, who had been required to live only in designated communities cutside of Lisbon to which they were assigned.

## EL-SENATOR GILLETTE ACCEPTS TRESIDENCY OF AMERICAN LEAGUE FOR A FREE PALESTINE

MASINGTON, August 1. (JTA) -- Former Senator Guy M. Gillette of Iowa today emcanced his acceptance of the presidency of the American League for a Free Falestine and the post of chief political adviser to the Hebrew Committee of National Liberation.

Declaring that he considers the "so-called Jewish problem not as a Jewish or a Metrew question, but as an urgent problem of the United Nations and of the decent portion of mankind," Gillette urged that the Allied Control Commission in Europe recomize the "Hebrew national status" and permit "stateless or Axis Jewe" to decide their own status as Hebrew nationals, or stateless, or nationals of Germany, Rumania or Eungary, He also recommended:

1. Freeing of all Jews from Axis concentration camps.

2. Extension of UNRRA relief operations to the Belkan countries where, he charged, mudreds of thousands of Jews in Rumania and Hungary, particularly, are starving and have not yet received any UNRRA aid.

3. Addition of Jewinrerresentatives to the United Nations War Crimes Commission.

4. Consideration by the Reparations Commission now meeting in Moscow of the "claims and rights" of surviving Jews, and inclusion of compensation for the losses of the Jewish records.

Gillette said that every Jew in Europa should be authorized "to apply to the marest British consulate and receive his first papers of Felestinian citizonship." Eals suggested the creation of an Anglo-American-Russian committee with adequate pures to effect the speedlest repatriation of all such applicants to Felestine. These steps, Gillette asserted, are "essential for the commencement of a solution of the entire profilems." Annulment by the new British Government of "discriminatory less against Jews in Felestine" was likewise demended by Gillette.

# MISH ORGANIZATIONS DECIDE TO SUBMIT JOINT PROPOSAL TO UNKRA ON LIAISON OFFICERS

LONDON, August 1. (JTA)—Representatives of the American Jewish Conference, the ford of equties of Dritish Jews and the World Jewish Congress met here yesterday and agreed to submit a memorandum to the UNRRA proposing the appointment of Jewish laison officers to assist military occupation authorities in handling the problems of displaced and stateless Jews in Germany. The memorandum will be submitted in commection with the session of the UNRRA Council opening here on Aug. 7.

The anglo-Jewish Association today submitted to the Foreign Office a resolution stopped at the last meeting of its council urging that the work of finding permanent homes for Jewish victims be expedited and that early settlement in Palestine of survivors desiring to immigrate there be facilitated.

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
