



 services exports in 2016.



Washington's Top 5 Export Categories (Millions of U.S. Dollars)




### **Exports Support Jobs**

 Nationally, U.S. jobs supported by exports reached an estimated 11.5 million in 2015, up 1.9 million from 2009.

## Exports Sustain Thousands of Washington Businesses


 A total of 12,656 companies exported from Washington locations in 2014. 11,352

...and **20%** of known Washington goods export value






## Foreign Investment & Jobs in Washington

Number of Employees by Country of UBO





### **Free Trade Agreements**


- The U.S. currently has 14 free trade agreements in force with 20 countries.
- Washington's exports to U.S. FTA partners totaled \$17.7 billion in 2016.

# In 2016, exports to FTA markets accounted for **22%** of Washington exports



Since 2006, exports from Washington to FTA markets have grown by 35%





### Washington's Metropolitan Exports

 Seattle-Tacoma-Bellevue is the 3rd largest metro area reporting exports nationwide.
