Our History

Texas A&M University-Commerce began as East Texas Normal College in 1889 when founder William Leonidas Mayo opened the doors to a one-building campus in Cooper. His creed, which continues today, was “ceaseless industry, fearless investigation, unfettered thought,

and unselfish service to others.” The institution’s history of dynamic change began in 1894 when “Mayo’s College” moved to Commerce. The State of Texas took over the campus in 1917 and the name was changed to East Texas State Normal College. In 1923, the school was renamed East Texas State Teachers College. The graduate program was added in 1935, and in 1957 the Legislature, recognizing that the purpose of the institution had broadened from teacher education, changed the name to East Texas State College. Following inauguration of the first doctoral program in 1962, the name was changed to East Texas State University. In 1996, the institution entered The Texas A&M University System and became Texas A&M University-Commerce. Today, on the Commerce campus, the Metroplex Center, the Universities Center at Dallas, Navarro College Partnership, and through state-of-the-art distance learning, the University meets the undergraduate, graduate and professional needs of the citizens of Northeast Texas and beyond. It’s mission is



achieved through teaching, scholarship, and service activities on its campuses, and in the community and region.

That kind of teaching, along with his motto of “Ceaseless Industry, Fearless Investigation, Unfettered Thought, Unselfish Service to Others” has withstood the test of time to become the cornerstone of this, the fifth-oldest public university in Texas.

DR. KEITH MCFARLAND

President

The 10th president of Texas A&M University-Commerce, Dr. Keith McFarland is in his eighth year as the chief executive officer of the second largest campus in the Texas A&M University system.

McFarland is a veteran of the A&M-Commerce campus, as he has served the university in a variety of ways over the last 37 years. He came

to the university in 1969 as an assistant professor of history and served in that capacity until 1973, when he was named assistant dean of the college of liberal and fine arts. At that time, his academic status was raised to that of associate professor of history.

In 1976, McFarland was named a full professor and promoted to head of the department of history. In 1983, he was named dean for graduate studies and research. He served in that capacity until being named president by Dr. Barry Thompson, then Chancellor of the Texas A&M University System.

McFarland, a native of Dover, Ohio, received his bachelor's degree in education from Kent State University in 1962 and his master's degree in history from The Ohio State University in 1963. He went on to earn his Ph.D. in history from Ohio State in 1969. From 1963 to 1965, he served his country as first lieutenant in the Army and was stationed in Okinawa.

A 20th century military historian, McFarland has published books and authored numerous articles on the subject. Among his books are "Harry H. Woodring: A Political Biography of FDR's Controversial Secretary of War" (1975) and "The Korean War: An Annotated Bibliography" (1986).

McFarland and his wife, Nancy, have three grown children. The Commerce resident is an active member of the Presbyterian Church of Commerce where he is an elder and adult teacher.

He's also active in the Lone Star Conference, having served as a past chairman of the Lone Star Conference Council of Presidents. Active in the community as well, McFarland is a member of the board of directors for the Commerce Chamber of Commerce and the Commerce Economic Development Corporation, and was named the chamber's Citizen of the Year in 2001. He's also an active member of the Rotary Club of Commerce and has received both the Service Above Self Award and the Governor's Outstanding Rotarian Award.



JIM JOHNSON

Director of Athletics

Entering his second year as the director of athletics at Texas A&M University-Commerce is Jim Johnson, who came to the Lions in July of 2005. He has already made strides of improvement in the A&M-Commerce athletic department with the renovations to Memorial Stadium, a new radio network for Lion athletics and a new website for Lion athletics (www.lionathletics.com).

The members of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) voted Johnson to its Executive Committee as a College Division Representative during their annual convention, this past summer. He is joined on this committee by many of the nation's top directors of athletics. Johnson also is currently a member of the NCAA Division II Membership Committee. In July of this year, he was elected as national chair of the Membership Committee succeeding Herb Reinhard, athletics director at Valdosta (Ga.) State University. Jim also serves on the Division II Community Advisory Group. This task force is charged with designing Division II's community engagement plan to aid in the division's strategic positioning initiative.

Before coming to the Lions, he spent the previous two years as an associate athletic director for development and the director of government relations at Central Missouri State in Warrensburg, Missouri. He also spent five years working at the NCAA headquarters in multiple roles, starting as a membership services representative before advancing into a role as a membership coordinator and Division II governance liaison.

Prior to his stint at Central Missouri State and the NCAA, Johnson was a consultant with the law firm of Hall, Rend, Kllian, Heath and Lyman, P.S.C. As a consultant, he worked with the NCAA Division II Conference Commissioner's Association, the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletics Conference and the Great Lakes Valley Conference. In addition, Johnson served an integral role on the NCAA Division II Championships Eligibility Project Team in 2003 and 2004.

Johnson's ties to the Lone Star Conference begin with the seven years he spent at Tarleton State University. At TSU, he served in multiple roles over seven years including compliance coordinator, men's athletic coordinator and assistant to the athletic director. He also was a member of the coaching staff as the head men's golf coach and head women's volleyball coach and taught coursework as a member of the health and physical education faculty. Johnson was actively involved in the Texans move from NAIA status to the NCAA and the LSC.

The Jacksboro, Texas native is the son of Dottie and the late Clifford Johnson, earned his bachelor's in business administration from Tarleton and went on to earn his master's in education from TSU. He and his wife Cindy, who was recently named the assistant commissioner for compliance at the Southland Conference, are the proud parents of two sons, Ely (6) and Riley (4).

Assistant Director of Athletics

James Gibson begins his third year with the Texas A&M University-Commerce athletic department staff, serving as the Assistant Director of Athletics/Chief Financial Officer (CFO).

Gibson provides administrative leadership and guidance in the areas of business and finance, athletic medical services, human resources, facilities and event management of the Lions athletic department. As the department's CFO, he manages the athletic department's annual operating budget and long-range financial forecasting. Most recently, the Stinnett, Texas native was actively involved in the renovation of Memorial Stadium.

Prior to arriving at A&M-Commerce, he served as the Emergency Medical Services Coordinator at Texas A&M University in College Station where he supervised all the emergency services for the campus, community and home athletic events. While at Texas A&M he was elected to serve as Secretary for the Regional Trauma Advisory Council and was a member of the Brazos County Child Fatality Review Team.

Before Texas A&M, he was the business manager in the athletic department and a member of the faculty at his alma mater and Lone Star Conference member – West Texas A&M University. He earned his bachelor's degree in Sports and Exercise Science in 1999 and went on to earn his master's in 2001. Gibson is licensed by the state of Texas and certified by the National Athletic Trainer's Association as an athletic trainer. He is an active member of the College Athletic Business Management Association. He serves on the Membership Committee and was most recently chosen to serve on the Program Committee for the upcoming year. Gibson also serves as a member of the leadership staff at several Fellowship of Christian Athletes leadership and sport camps through out the year.

His ties to athletics originate with his father, who was a successful football coach and athletic director of 36 years in the public school system.



SUMMER SPURLOCK
Student-Athlete Services Coordinator and Senior Woman Administrator

Formerly the assistant women's basketball coach for the Lions, Summer Spurlock was hired as the new Student-Athlete Services Coordinator and Senior Woman Administrator in July.

Among her duties are the administration and completion of NCAA certification of academic eligibility for A&M-Commerce student-athletes. Spurnon will maintain eligibility and financial aid records on all student-athletes and serve a vital role in the liaison relationship between academic advisors, registrar, financial aid, scholarship and admissions offices. In addition to eligibility and financial aid responsibilities, she will assist

coaches in maintaining recruiting and playing and practice season records.

The Roswell, N.M. native will also handle the oversight and administration of athletic injury/health insurance for Lion student-athletes in collaboration with multiple parties to ensure prompt and accurate payment of all medical bills.

As a coach, she was involved in the tutelage of five all-Lone Star Conference selections and was an all-conference performer herself in 2002-03 as a senior. In addition, she was a recipient of the Susie Knause Memorial Heart Award and was named to the CoSIDA/Verizon Academic All-District and All-American teams in 2003.

She earned her bachelor's degree in finance from A&M-Commerce in 2002 and is currently doing work on her master's degree. The daughter of Charlie and Diane Spurnon, she was married to Michael Spurlock of Commerce in August.

Jason Price is in his second year as a member of the Texas A&M University-Commerce Athletic Department staff as the Assistant Athletic Director for External Affairs. The Forney, Texas native oversees all external operations in the Lions Athletic Department including marketing, media relations, game promotions and ticket sales.

Price rejoined the athletic department after serving as the Coordinator of Undergraduate Advising in the College of Business & Technology. His primary responsibilities were to monitor and ensure compliance with the Texas Success Initiative set forth by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board as well

as recruiting and advising students.

No stranger to Lion Athletics, Price had a successful two-year stint as the Head Women's Golf Coach at A&M-Commerce before being promoted to the Director of Golf. As the women's head coach, the team was ranked a program-high No. 6 in the nation.

Coordinator of Athletic Medical Services

In his third year at Texas A&M-Commerce, Barri Mulkey begins his first as the Coordinator of Athletic Medical Services.

He presently works as the athletic trainer for the Lions football team. Mulkey has spent the last two years as an assistant athletic trainer for the Lions, working primarily with the women's basketball, track and field and cross country teams and assisting with football. In addition to his athletic training duties, he also teaches in the Health and Human Performance department. He has taught multiple courses for the athletic training major and been involved in the oversight of practicum work by

student athletic trainers.

Before joining the Texas A&M-Commerce athletic department, he was the head athletic trainer and coordinator of athletic training services at East Texas Baptist University in Marshall, Texas. He assisted in the development of an athletic training education program, served as an instructor of athletic training education courses and supervised the athletic training inventory, bids and budgets. SCOTTY CONLEY

Head Coach: Third Year

Alma Mater: Texas A&M-Commerce, 1970

You can come home again. One has only to ask Scotty Conley. The Winnsboro native came home when his alma mater came calling and became the 17th head football coach at Texas A&M University-Commerce on December 11, 2003 when appointed by A&M-C president Dr. Keith McFarland.

Conley earned a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1970, and his master's degree in secondary and higher education, awarded in 1973. His first season saw the Lions improve from 1-10 to 4-6 overall with three of the losses coming by three points or less in righting the ship.

He led the Trinity Valley Community College Cardinals to the 1997 National Junior College Athletic Association National Championship. He was named the NJCAA National Coach of the Year and American Football Quarterly Junior College Coach of the Year after directing TVCC to a perfect 12-0 record complete with a Red River Bowl victory over Garden City (Kan.). He won a pair of Southwest Junior College Football Conference championships at Trinity Valley and was named conference coach of the year twice, compiling a record of 32-12 in four seasons, winning at a 72.7 percent clip.

He left TVCC after the 1999 season to become the special team coordinator at the United States Naval Academy, where he coached the 2000 and 2001 season.

Before Trinity Valley, Conley spent 15 seasons as a college assistant coach, primarily at the highest levels of NCAA Division I-A football.

"We've made an excellent choice," stated McFarland. "There's no doubt he'll continue his success, put us back on the winning way and enhance the future of our football program."

His only non-Division I-A stop was just before going to TVCC when he was an assistant at Howard Payne from 1993 to 1995.

He was the special teams coordinator at Arkansas as well as linebackers and tight ends coach from 1990 to 1992, helping the Razorbacks to the 1991 Independence Bowl.

Conley coached running backs and receivers at Rice in 1989, running backs at Tennessee in 1988 and linebackers at Kansas in 1987.

He was a linebackers coach at Texas from 1982 to 1986 and helped coached the Longhorns to the 1982 Sun Bowl, the 1984 Cotton Bowl, the 1984 Freedom Bowl and the 1985 Bluebonnet Bowl.

He was also the running backs coach at Texas A&M in 1980 and 1981, helping the Aggies to a berth in the 1981 Independence Bowl.

Before going into collegiate football, Conley was the offensive coordinator at Plano Senior High from 1977 to 1979 and was the linebackers coach there from 1974 to 1976. While at Plano, he helped the Wildcats to the 1977 State 5A Championship and to district titles in five of his six seasons. He was an assistant at Mt. Vernon from 1972 to 1973 and at Whitewright in 1971.

Conley was in private business for two years after leaving Navy following the 2001 season. He was hungry to return, especially to his alma mater. "I used the time away from coaching to study other programs," Conley explained. "What I observed has been a great benefit to me. It's made me more committed in the direction we want to take this program."

Conley was an outstanding high school athlete for the WHS Red Raiders. He was inducted into the Winnsboro High School Hall of Honor a few years ago. He started his collegiate career at Texas A&M, where he lettered on the freshman team in 1966 before coming to Commerce to get his degrees.

Wide Receivers

The 2006 season will be Kevin Barbay's first as the wide receivers coach at Texas A&M-Commerce. Barbay has spent the last year at Baylor University as a volunteer assistant coach, working primarily

with the offensive side of the ball.

While on the Bears' offensive staff, he worked on the breakdown of opponent film, coordinated the self scout of the Baylor offense, developed cuts of the film for offensive players, as well as he compiled and printed frames for Baylor quarterbacks.

Prior to his involvement with the football staff, he did an internship with the strength and conditioning department after spending nearly three years at Kelly Catholic High School in Beaumont. As an assistant coach, he worked as the passing game coordinator and receivers coach. He was the offensive coordinator for the junior varsity teams and head coach of the freshman basketball team.

During his playing days, at Nederland High School, he played on teams that reached three-straight state quarterfinals and earned all-district and honorable mention all-state honors. After high school, he went on to play for Doug Williams at Grambling for one season, where they were the 2002 SWAC and Black College national champions and spent his last three years at Lamar University in Beaumont.

Barbay was recently married to the former Kacie Wilcox of Port Neches, who is in her third year of law school at Baylor University.

Offensive Coordinator

Joe Castillo heads into his first season as the offensive coordinator for Texas A&M-Commerce.

A former graduate assistant for the Lions from 1995-99, he joins the Texas A&M-Commerce coaching

staff after being the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ronald Reagan High School in San Antonio, Texas.

While at A&M-Commerce, Castillo received his bachelor's and went on to earn his master's in education while serving as a graduate assistant. He worked primarily with the wide receivers and served as an assistant strength and conditioning coach.

After earning his master's degree, Castillo went on to coach at The Colony High School where he served as the receivers and special teams coach for the varsity. After spending four years at The Colony, he was hired as the co-offensive coordinator at North Garland High School from 2002-03 and moved on to the varsity wide receiver coach/special teams coordinator position at nearby McKinney High School from 2003-04.

Castillo is married to the former Angie Nunez, who is also a graduate of A&M-Commerce. They have a three-year old daughter, Mary Jo.



**JOE
CAUTHEN**

Defensive Coordinator

Entering his seventh season as the defensive coordinator for the Lions is Joe Cauthen.

Last fall, Cauthen directed a Lions defense that led the Lone Star Conference in total defense (318.9 yards per game), rushing defense (127.4 yards per game), scoring defense (18.3 points per game) and red zone defense (61.8% ended in scoring). An anchor of that defense, J.D. Hearn led the nation with an average of 13.3 tackles per game. His efforts earned him national recognition including eight post-season awards.

At Texas A&M-Commerce, Cauthen has coached five All-Americans, four Lone Star Conference linebackers of the year and two defensive lineman of the year.

Under Cauthen, the 2003 Lions finished fourth in the conference and 41st in nation in total defense. He molded together a strong unit in 2001, where they ranked second in the league in total defense, first against the run, second against the pass and third in scoring defense.

Cauthen came to A&M-Commerce in January of 1999 after two seasons as the defensive line coach at Stephen F. Austin State University. Running Backs

In his first season as the Lions running backs coach, Steven Ennis comes to Texas A&M-Commerce after spending last season at Lone Star Conference rival Midwestern State. Ennis helped lead Mustangs' running back Ross Harrison to second team All-Lone Star Conference South Division honors as he rushed for 1,088 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2005.

Before working at Midwestern State, Ennis was an assistant football coach at Dallas Skyline High School as their running backs coach and involved with the strength and conditioning of the team.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, he was a running back at Southwest Missouri State (2001-2002) – now Missouri State – and Purdue University (1999-2000). He also played with Mississippi State for a year before moving to Commerce and was a state medalist in golf during high school in Murrah, Miss. Winfred earned a perfect 4.0 grade point average with a master's in kinesiology and human performance in 2004 from Texas A&M-Commerce. He has worked in the scholarship office as a director as well as been an advisor to the Phi Beta Sigma fraternity.

He has been married to the former Stacey Davis of Greenville, who competed on the Texas A&M-Commerce track and field team, for 17 years. They have three children--Yakira (16), Danielle (14), and Dahyana (11).



KRIS KOCUREK

Defensive Line

Taking over the defensive line duties for Texas A&M-Commerce is Kris Kocurek, who has been at fellow Lone Star Conference institution Texas A&M-Kingsville for the last two years as the Javelinas defensive line coach.

He was active in the development of LSC standout Wilbert Martin, who was twice selected first team all-conference and was a free agent signee of the Baltimore Ravens. He was also involved with the recruiting of potential student-athletes on the high school and junior college level and taught activity courses in the kinesiology department.

The former Texas Tech Red Raiders standout, returned to his alma mater after spending two years in the NFL - Tennessee Titans (2002) and Seattle Seahawks (2001). While serving as a student assistant, Kocurek coached the defensive tackles with defensive line coach Ruffin McNeil as Texas Tech advanced to the EV.net Houston Bowl.

During his playing days in Lubbock, as a defensive lineman, he was named to All-Big 12 Coaches Football Team in 1998, 1999 and 2000. During his senior year, he was selected as a team captain and was voted Defensive Player of the Year and earned Player of the Week honors on three occasions. As a player, he played in the Houston Bowl as a senior and the Independence Bowl as a sophomore.

He holds a bachelor's degree from Texas Tech and recently earned his master's at Texas A&M-Kingsville.

MORRIS LOLAR

Secondary

A three-year starter and two-time All-American and former secondary coach at Friends University, Morris Lolar begins his first season at Texas A&M-Commerce.

After finishing his playing days at Friends University in 1993, Lolar spent time in training camp with the Kansas City Chiefs before signing with the Edmonton Eskimos. In two seasons, he recorded 105 tackles and picked off six passes - three of which he returned for touchdowns. Lolar was also a member of the 1993 Eskimo team that went on to win the Grey Cup, the CFL's equivalent to the Super Bowl. After a brief hiatus from football, he returned to the game in 1998. As a member of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, he played in nine games, made 23 tackles, forced five fumbles and recorded an interception.

After the 1998 season, he got into coaching at his alma mater where he served as the secondary coach. He coached three all-conference selections, including an All-American. Following two years at Friends University, he went on to Wichita Northwest High School, where he coached four all-city defensive backs, including the Kansas Player of the Year. He moved on from Wichita Northwest High School to Wichita North, where he served as the defensive coordinator. His efforts were instrumental in the biggest win-loss turnaround in school history before he was hired back at Friends University as their secondary coach in 2004 where one of his players earned all-conference honors twice.

Lolar graduated with his bachelor's in organizational management and has done coursework on his master's in management.



REUBEN VAUGHN

Offensive Line

Making a return to the Texas A&M-Commerce football program and entering his first season as the Lions offensive line coach is Reuben Vaughn. Vaughn, who was a graduate assistant for the Lions during the 2000 and 2001 seasons under Eddie Brister, returns to A&M-Commerce after stints at Texas A&M-College Station with Dennis Franchione and Texas State with Bob DeBesse.

At Texas A&M, he handled multiple responsibilities on the offensive side of the ball. He was the assistant offensive line coach and was involved with the scout team for defense and special teams. Vaughn also was involved with the organization and preparation of game plans, playbooks and scouting reports.

For the 2002 season, he was the defensive line coach at Texas State University (formerly Southwest Texas State University) and also helped direct the special teams units. The defensive unit recorded 91 tackles for loss, including 16 sacks.

While present-day Lion squads enjoy the full support and allegiance of the university administration and community, the start of football at the university wasn't well heralded.

Early efforts to bring the sport to the campus were thwarted by the school's founder, Dr. William Leonidas Mayo, who disliked the sport and was reported to have said, "If any fellow brings a football on this campus, I'll kick both him and the football off."

But by 1914, a group of students – led by Mayo's own son Marion – had formed a team. After two contests against Commerce High School (both victories, though one was by a forfeit after a fight occurred), the ET squad played its first intercollegiate contest against Wesley College, a now defunct Methodist college in nearby Greenville.

They lost 35-0, going 2-1 in the "out-law" season of 1914.

The following year, ET first lady Etta Mayo told her son to gather his team together again for a practice and she would stay in the office with the president and study his reaction.

The practice started and President Mayo asked about the disturbance on campus. He was lulled into a not too antagonistic attitude by Lady Mayo, who argued for the sport. Just how much persuasion was required was never recorded, but the football practice continued. It led to the addition of football to the newly created athletic program which included basketball, tennis and baseball.

It was later said that Dr. William Mayo, the man who once outlawed football, "threw his hat to the sky and cheered when he saw a new-born football team battle its way to victory".

In 1916, Mayo hired Texas A&M stand-out Johnny Garrity to become the first coach of the Lions.

World War I caused the first interruption of football in 1918. The program

resumed in 1919, and with it came a new venue for Lion football. No longer did the team play at the City Park. A new field was constructed on campus, complete with a grandstand, for the grid-iron action. College Field was born.

In the spring of 1922, the university joined the old Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Association to become a conference member for the first time.

Homecoming came to campus in 1928. At first, Homecoming games were held every other year and only when North Texas came to Commerce. Then in 1939, the Lions played the first "annual" Homecoming game, beating Southwest Texas 19-6.

Playing at night was unheard of until Oct. 17, 1930, when the Lions faced West Texas A&M in Canyon for ET's first contest played at night and under artificial light.

A year later, lights were added at College Field during a renovation of the facility. The first night game in Commerce debuted Oct. 2, 1931, when ET defeated Trinity 6-0.

It was also the first win for J.V. "Dough" Rollins, the new Lion coach.

The year 1931 was also memorable

for events that would reshape Lion athletics forever.

The university, along with North Texas, Southwest Texas State, Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin State, joined forces as the Lone Star Conference was born on April 25, 1931, with the first football season of play in 1932.

Rollins' team finished fourth in 1932, but soon started the Lions' domination of LSC football by posting the league's first unblemished conference record (5-0) in 1933.

In 1934, Rollins' Lions recorded East Texas State's first perfect record, 8-0. The Lion defense was almost perfect as well, holding their opponents off of the scoreboard until a Southwest Texas touchdown in the last two minutes of the year's final game.

The 1935 season brought Coach Bob Berry to the campus and the Lions claimed their third consecutive LSC title.

A 6-0 loss to North Texas on Homecoming 1936 kept the Lions from winning not only their fourth consecutive league championship, but what would have been six straight titles as the "Berrymen" claimed the LSC crown in 1937 and 1938.

The 1936 season brought the first Lion All-American.

Halfback Johnny Garrison earned an honorable mention selection on the Associated Press Little All-America team. In 1938, fullback Darrell Tulley was selected to the AP first team, another Lion first.

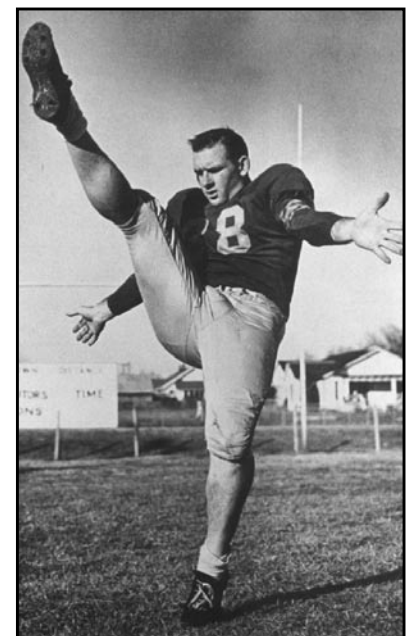
Berry's coaching tenure was interrupted by World War II as the Navy called the Lion coach in 1942.

He was replaced for the season by basketball coach Dennis Vinzant who led the Lions to another league title before college officials suspended intercollegiate athletics because of the war.

Football and Berry returned in 1946 with the most famous game in East Texas history.

Sam Houston State came to Commerce for a Lone Star Conference contest, but a driving rainstorm had turned the field into a quagmire and neither team really wanted to play.

The game quickly became an unusual contest between Lion punter James "Cargo" Batchelor and Sam Houston's Jan Jones. Batchelor punted 31 times for 1,187 yards for an average of 38.3 yards per punt. Jones, however, had one more punt for 16 yards than did Batchelor, and his 32

punts for 1,203 yards (37.6 per kick) set the national collegiate mark. The combined total of 2,390 yards of punting is a record for the most between two teams in a game. Both records stand today. The game ended in a 0-0 tie.

In 1950, Memorial Stadium, dedicated to the 78 former students who lost their lives during World War II, was opened.

Coach M.A. "Catfish" Smith returned to coach his alma mater's football team in 1951. He lost two of his first three games, but those would be his only Lion losses. He led the team to a 9-2 season record and the start of something special.

The Lions steamrolled the competition in 1952 as Smith led the Lions to their first postseason game in history, a 33-0 victory over Tennessee Tech in the seventh-annual Tangerine Bowl.

The 1953 season would be even more spectacular as Smith's Lions rolled through the regular season unbeaten and returned to the Tangerine Bowl with a 29-game winning streak. A 7-7 tie with Arkansas State in the Tangerine Bowl ended the streak.

Unexpectedly, Smith left, but Kansas University coach J.V. Sikes, a former Lion assistant under "Dough" Rollins in the 30's, was persuaded to return.

Sikes did not disappoint. He took the Lions to LSC titles in five of his first six seasons and to Tangerine Bowl victories following the 1957 and 1958 seasons.

It was the era of "Stumblin' Sam" McCord, the Lions only two-time first team Associated Press All-American. In the three seasons he quarterbacked the squad, the Lions lost only three times - and only once at Memorial Stadium.

In the spring of 1964, a sudden heart attack claimed Sikes' life and assistant Ernest Hawkins was named his successor and the start of the most successful coaching tenure in school history had begun. In 1966, Hawkins' Lions won the tough Lone Star Conference with a 4-1-2 record.

It was that same year that a small halfback from Texarkana began his collegiate playing career with the Lions.

"King Arthur" James came alive in 1968, opening the season with 323 rushing yards at Abilene Christian to set a Lone Star Conference record that stands today. He gobbled up 1,538 yards that season and ended his career in 1969 as the first Texas runner to gain 4,000 yards rushing, finishing with 4,285. His jersey (No. 30) is the only one in school history to be retired.

The 1969 Lions tied for the LSC title, thanks to heroics by George Daskalakes and Jim Dietz. On the last plays of the season against Stephen F. Austin, Dietz connected with Daskalakes for a touchdown and a two-point conversion for the 36-35 victory.

In 1972, the Lions went all the way. Led by future pros Harvey Martin, Will Cureton, Autry Beamon, Curtis Wester, James Talbot, LeRoy Johnson and Tim Collier, the Lions won the NAIA Championship. The Lions defeated Carson-Newman 21-18 in a heavy fog in Commerce for the

title. That was the first of eight consecutive national titles for Lone Star Conference teams.

History continued at Memorial Stadium in 1977. The Lions ended Texas A&M-Kingsville's 46-game unbeaten streak with a 7-6 win.

The Lions returned to the NAIA playoffs in 1980 behind future pro Wade Wilson and advanced to the semifinals. Elon College pulled off a 14-6 win to hand the Lions their first postseason loss.

The 1983 Lions tied for the LSC title, the last of four for Hawkins who retired from coaching following the 1985 season after 22 years and a 132-92-6 record. He remains the Lions' all-time winningest coach.

Eddie Vowell took over the following year, eventually leading the Lions to a number two-national ranking during the 1988 season.

In 1990, the Lions won their first outright LSC title since 1972. The Lions made the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time and advanced to the quarterfinals.

Pittsburg State's 56-game regular season winning streak - the longest in the nation at the time - ended with a loss to the Lions at Memorial Stadium in 1991. The Lions returned to the Division II playoffs that season, marking the first consecutive postseason appearances for the team in 33 years.

Pat Williams erased a 40-year school record with 13 interceptions to lead all NCAA divisions and make the Lions Division II's top pass defense in 1992. Billy Watkins capped an outstanding career in 1993 by setting a new Division II record with 281 kicking points. In 1994, the Lions set a new school mark for total defense, allowing Northwest Missouri State just 39 yards.

The Lions returned to playoff form after a four-year absence in 1995, winning their last five regular season games and six of the last seven to finish with an 8-3 record and a bid to the NCAA Division II playoffs, but fell in the first round at Portland State 56-35.

In 1996, freshman kicker David Dell set school and LSC records for field goals in a season with 17 and also set a new school mark with 16 kicking points in a 40-0 win at Harding, while senior WR James Epps became the Lion to eclipse the 1,000 yard receiving mark with 1,058 yards on 57 receptions.

Following the 1998 season, Eddie Vowell retired as the head coach of the Lions with a 72-71-1 record, posting the second highest win total in A&M-Commerce history.

In 1999, as Eddie Brister took the reigns as Lion mentor. In 2001, led by senior Demetrius Rector who became the first Lion in 13 years to rush for over 1,000 yards, the Lions posted a 7-4 record.

The 2003 season saw the Lions tally a low not seen since 1929, a 1-10 overall record. However, the Lions had first-team All-America punter Chris Miller and two of the top defenders in the LSC South in defensive end Derrick Crawford and linebacker Jared Williams.

December of 2003 marked a new era as well with Scotty Conley retiring to his alma mater as the university's 17th head football coach.

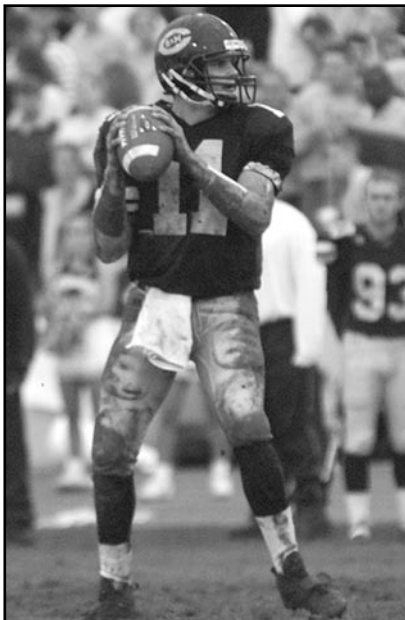

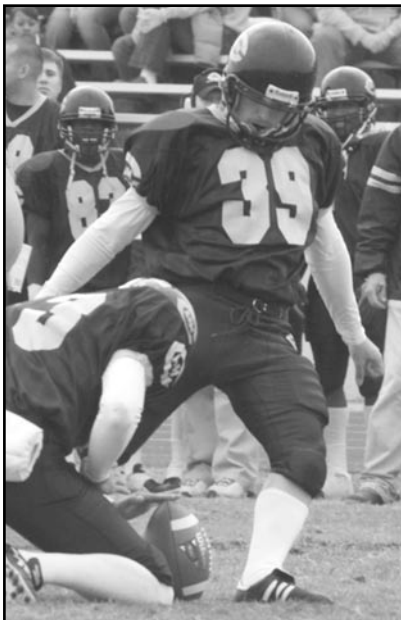

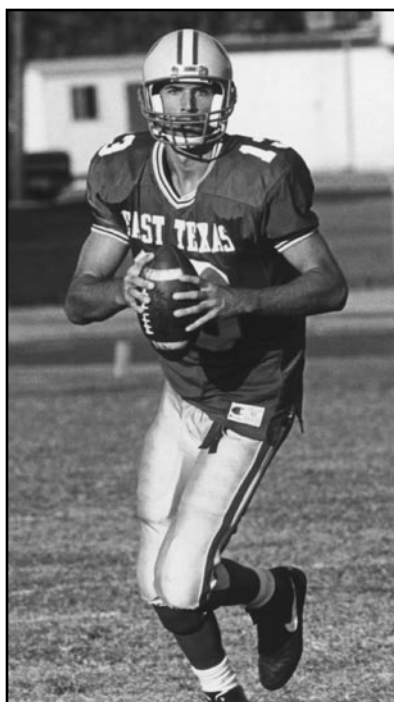

The Lone Star Conference



Long known as a premier leader in intercollegiate athletics, the Lone Star Conference (LSC) celebrates its 75th year of existence as one of NCAA Division II's most established and successful conferences.

The LSC – founded on April 25, 1931 – has grown from a five-team conference of Texas-based schools to a 15-member league that spans three states (Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico). The league continues to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of intercollegiate athletic programs that are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports.

Throughout the league's 75-year history, various institutions have competed under the LSC banner. Today, only Texas A&M University-Commerce (then East Texas State) remains from the original group that was formed in 1931 when North Texas State, Southwest Texas State, Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin withdrew from the old Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

The membership alignment has changed over the years, with current members having been added in each of the past five decades. Texas A&M-Kingsville (formerly Texas A&I) joined in 1954, followed by Angelo State in 1968 and Abilene Christian in 1973.

Conference membership remained within the Texas borders until 1984 when Eastern New Mexico was admitted. Since then, the LSC has expanded to include members from Arkansas and Oklahoma.

Central Oklahoma (1987) and Cameron (1988, 1996) were the next additions in the LSC's recent expansion phase, while Texas Woman's (1989) and previous members West Texas A&M (1986, 1993) and Tarleton State (1968, 1994) joined the league soon after.

Midwestern State was admitted early in 1995, and the league grew again later that year with the acceptance of four more Oklahoma schools -- East Central, Northeastern State, Southeastern Oklahoma and Southwestern Oklahoma -- along with Harding and Ouachita Baptist from Arkansas.

That brought the league membership to 17, but Harding and OBU departed the conference after the 1999-2000 academic year to bring about the LSC's current look.

Other past members of the LSC include Trinity, Houston, Lamar, Howard Payne, Sul Ross State and McMurry.

Beginning with the 1997-98 academic year, the league has been formed into two divisions – North and South – in football, volleyball, basketball, baseball and softball. Divisional champions are crowned according to results among division teams, with an overall league champion also being decided either by crossover games or a postseason championship tournament.

While the LSC has maintained a long-standing tradition of competitive athletic programs for its members, many teams and individuals have gone on to distinguish themselves on the national stage. Prior to the 2006-07 athletic seasons, LSC member institutions had collected more than 100 team national championships, including 64 in NCAA Division II.

This past year, the Abilene Christian men's outdoor track and field team claimed a Division II national title.

The LSC conducts conference championships in 15 sports (seven men and eight women). Men's championships include football, cross country, basketball, baseball, track and field, tennis and golf. Women's titles are determined in volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, softball, track and field, tennis and golf.

The conference office is located in Richardson, Texas, a northern suburb of Dallas. Stan Wagnon serves as Interim Commissioner, with assistance from Jay Poerner (Compliance) and Melanie Robotham (Media Relations).

The Athletic Hall of Fame

Athletes must have completed their eligibility 10 years prior to nomination, while coaches and administrators must have served A&M-C for 10 years. Additionally, the nominee must be a person of such integrity, character and sportsmanship that the A&M-Commerce family will be inspired by the recognition. Any member of the Athletic Association may nominate a person. LION GRID COACHES
The Lions have had 16 different head football coaches through the years. The first was actually a player-coach, Marion "Doc" Mayo in 1914. Ironically, he was a son of Professor W. L. Mayo, the founder and president of "East Texas Normal College" and the man who banned intercollegiate football from the campus. The 1914 season was an "outlaw" year for the Lions; but by 1915 "Doc" Mayo had convinced his father that football should be added to the extracurricular activities. M. A. "Catfish" Smith, who coached the Lions from 1951 to 1953 has the best percentage, winning 92 percent of his games (30-2-1), including two appearances in the Tangerine Bowl in '52 and '53.
