AICTE Committee headed by Prof. I.K.Bhatt, Director, Malaviya National Institute of Technology, Jaipur along-with their expert members Prof. N. M. Singh, Department of Electrical Engineering, Veermata Jeejabai Technological Institute (VJTI), Matunga, Mumbai; Prof. N.B.Singh, Department of Civil Engineering, Institute of Engineering & Technology, Sitapur Road, Lucknow – 226 021 and Mr. Anil Datta, Architect, E-4/51, Sector-16, Rohini, Delhi also visited the University together with the UGC team..

All the Committee members reached the place of stay on 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2011. An introductory, post-dinner meeting was held on 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2011 in which the Chairman of Expert Committee briefed the members about the purpose of the visit.

On 30<sup>th</sup> May, 2011 the Expert Committee Members were received by Mr. Sudhir Kartha, Chancellor, Dr. Tapti Roy, Vice-Chancellor, Sh. A.R.Chauhan, Pro-Vice-Chancellor & Registrar and faculty, staff and students at the Indus International University on the campus. After the welcome address by the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor of the University make a presentation on the courses, activities and programmes offered by the university.

The Expert Committee made queries and sought clarifications on some points and the Vice-Chancellor gave clarifications. Thereafter, the Expert Committee members visited the university campus to inspect the physical infrastructure, library, laboratory, class rooms, work shops, in-door sport facilities, auditorium (yet to-be furnished) and dispensary.

Discussions were held with the faculty and laboratorary staff during the visit about the equipments available and experiments performed in laboratoraries. The Committee also interacted with some students, faculty and staff in separate meetings. Detailed discussions were held and they were encourage to give feed-back about the strength of the University and to specify the things to be improved in the university.

## 2. Background of the University:

The Indus International University (IIU) has been established under Indus International University (Establishment and Regulation) Act , 2009 (Act no. 1 of 2010) of Govt. of Himachal Pradesh as a private University under the Kartha Education Society , Mumbai . Indus International University has been set up as a non profit institution with its primary objective being to provide access to educational opportunities in different disciplines to students in rural India who traditionally had to travel to other cities where major public Universities are located.

The Kartha Education Society, Mumbai, is a registered society having its registered office at Mumbai. The society charter is to provide quality education and research opportunities in under represented areas that haven't been served by the traditional public Universities. It has been active for the past 15 years in setting up and running several Colleges and Schools both in the UAE and India apart from maintaining key partnerships with some Universities in other countries.

# 3. Vision of the University:

The Vision of the University is to be recognized nationally and internationally as a leader in providing innovative educational opportunities for learners within the global society.

## 4. Mission of the University:

The Mission of the Indus International University (IIU) is to provide a high quality, contemporary world class undergraduate education to its students and produce graduates who will be well prepared for a globally interdependent, culturally diverse society and be leaders in their respective professions.

## 5. Objectives of the University

(as specified by the University):

- 1. To provide the opportunity of acquiring higher education to all those who are academically qualified to do so,
- 2. To offer nationally and internationally relevant, career oriented courses of instruction and learning while providing appropriate resources and facilities that are required for the offering of such courses of study,
- 3. To promote scholarship and encourage the advancement of learning,
- 4. To attract and retain top class undergraduates and post graduates, and prepare them for successful lives and careers in programmes that combine academic excellence with practical skills and entrepreneurial orientation,
- 5. To relate its activities to the social, cultural and economic needs of the people of Himachal Pradesh in particular, and the country in general,
- 6. To develop academic partnerships and collaboration in teaching and research with Institutions of higher learning world-wide so as to expose both staff and students of the University to influences outside their immediate environment,
- 7. To institute a quality culture within every aspect of its operations,
- 8. To produce well-rounded graduates, who will be academically sound, globally aware with strong leadership skills and

### (B) Mentorship Scheme

The student is the focus of all activities of the University. The Indus International University has , therefore, introduced the scheme of " Mentorship " wherein a group of students is assigned to a teacher – mentor who guides his / her students and also acts as a first point of contact with the parents .

### (C) Performance Incentive Scheme

This scheme , has been introduced in the University for providing incentive to faculty members with respect to teaching , career/ professional development , relationship building to enhance institutional image. Under the scheme, the best performing member will be granted a performance benefit equivalent to one month's basic salary .

# (D) Fee concession to girl students

The University , as a special gesture to girl students , has decided to grant 10% fee concession to all Himachali girl students to encourage them to pursue higher education .

# (E) Free books and uniforms

The Indus International University has also taken a decision to provide free books and uniforms to all students for the academic year 2011-12.

### 8. **OBSERVATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE:**

- Land area of the University is as per norms of Himachal Pradesh Government & AICTF.
- Building is complete in-terms of class rooms, admn. area, amenities and circulation area. However, there is shortage in Laboratory and work shop area.
- Computer and peripherals are adequate as per the norms.
- There is shortage of faculty specially in the technical programme offered by the University. Presently, there is no faculty at senior level available at the University.
- Progrmmes like B.Tech.(Integrated) need to have additional faculty.
- B.Tech. (Integrated) programmes are not as per UGC nomenclature.
- Library is adequate in-terms of books & sitting capacity. However, there is shortage of International journals.

- Some of their MBA students of 1st batch have already been placed in companies like HCL, Indiamart etc.
- The University has adequate transport facilities for students and staff even through it is located in a not-easily-approachable area.
- This University when fully developed should make a good impact in this educationally backward region.
- The society promoting this university has experience in imparting education in the middle-east countries and has already taken initiatives for collaboration with some UK universities.

### 9. SUGGESTIONS OF THE COMMITTEE:

- Sufficient funds should be allocated for the salary of the faculty yet to be recruited.
- Urgent steps should be taken to recruit faculty at all levels as per norms of the Statutory Bodies. The University should evolve a mechanism of web-based standing advertisement.
- Number of experimental set-ups in the Labs. are not sufficient according to the student strength. A time-bound equipment procurement policy should be

in-place to meet the laboratorary equipment requirement of the growing strength of students.

- The internet facility though available on the campus is not reliable. Efforts should be made to get cable-connectivity.
- Faculty should be encouraged and be given incentives to register for Ph.D.
- Conferences and workshops in different areas should be planned and conducted for the benefit of teachers and students.
- Budget for in-house research should be provided to initiate and develop research facilities.
- Efforts should be made for having collaboration with industries.

### 10. RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE:

In view of the above facts and observations, the Committee recommends that the University should fulfill all requirements mentioned in this report and those specified in the enclosed AICTE Committee report. The University can again approach UGC for inspection within a period of one year.
