St Cuthbert Mayne were beaten 4-0, Teignmouth B 6-0 and Newton Abbot College 5-2, with the highlight of the group matches was the 6-0 demolition of Torquay Academy, pressing high to win the ball back and taking every opportunity to get a shot on goal, backed up by goalkeeper Harry Lock who made a number of good saves to stop anyone from scoring.

This left a fantastic record of 4 straight wins with 21 goals scored and only 2 gaols conceded.

The Semi Final pitted us against the Group 1 Runners-Up, KEVICC'S, who had only lost 1 game during their group stage. Despite this, the boys beat KEVICC'S 4-1 in a one-sided game that they completed dominated.

The final was against Torquay Academy, who had won their Semi-final against Group 1 winners Paignton with a comprehensive 3-0 win.
