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

3 Quotas

Each NOC may enter one (1) women's team only, comprising not more than twelve (12) athletes and five (5) officials.

4 Eligibility

- 4.1 To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation (SEAGF) Charter and Rules as well as Rule 40 and the By-law to Rule 40 of the Olympic Charter (Participation in the Games).
- 4.2 Only nationals of the country of the NOC shall be qualified to represent the NOC in the Games. All

disputes relating to the determination of the country, which an athlete may represent in the SEA Games shall be resolved in accordance with Article 31 of the South East Asian Games Federation (SEAGF) Charter and Rules as well as Rule 41 and By-law to Rule 41 of the Olympic Charter (Nationality of competitors).

5 Submission of Entries

Entries of each participating NOC must be submitted in accordance with the regulations laid down by the Malaysia SEA Games Kuala Lumpur 2017 Organising Committee (MASOC).

5.1 Deadline for "Entry by Number"

8 Training

8.1 Training Policies

Pre-competition training will be allocated to all NOCs two (2) days prior to the start of the competition for the sports (including familiarisation, if necessary). Training sessions are strictly by allocation; no change and addition of training requests are allowed. NOCs are required to notify the Sport Information Desk if any NOC does not intend to use the allocated training session.

9 Competition Procedures, Rules and Regulations

9.1 Competition Rules

The Netball competition of the 29th SEA Games Kuala Lumpur 2017 will be held in accordance with the SEAGF Charter and Rules and the current International Netball Federation (INF) Rules and Regulations under the guidance of the Technical Delegate (TD) appointed by International Netball Federation (INF).

In case of any disagreement in the language interpretation of the INF Rules and Regulations, the English version shall prevail. Any unforeseen cases not covered by the Rules and Regulations shall be resolved as follows:

- 9.1.1 General Issues: To be resolved in accordance with the SEAGF Charter and Rules.
- 9.1.2 Technical Issues: To be resolved in accordance with the INF Rules and Regulations and INF Norms.

9.2 Competition Format

- 9.2.1 The participating teams will play in a preliminary single round robin format competition. The following points will be awarded for each match:
 - (i) two (2) points for a win.
 - (ii) one (1) point to each of the two (2) teams for a draw.
 - (iii) zero (0) point for a loss.
- 9.2.2 The top four (4) ranked teams will qualify to play in the Semi-finals in the following format:
 - (i) The top ranked team will play against

the third ranked team in Semi-finals 1.

- (ii) The second ranked team will play against the fourth ranked team in Semi-finals 2.
- 9.2.3 The winners of the Semi-finals 1 and 2 will qualify to play in the Finals for the Gold medal.
- 9.2.4 There will be no play-off for the Bronze medal and the losing semi-finalists will be awarded the joint Bronze medal.

9.3 Tie-breaker

- 9.3.1 Preliminary round robin competition
 - (i) If there is a tie on points between two
 (2) teams at the end of the preliminary round robin competition, the result of the match between the two (2) teams decides the winner.
 - (ii) However,
 - if the two (2) teams draw their match, or if more than two (2) teams have the same number of points at the end of the preliminary round robin

competition, goal ratio of the preliminary competition will decide the placings (that is, goals for divided by goals against).

- If their goal ratio is identical, then goal difference will be applied (that is, the difference between goals for and goals against).
- (iii) If there is still a further tie, the team scoring the most goals will be declared winner.
- 9.3.2 If there is a tie at the end of quarter 4 in any of the semi-finals or finals matches, no draw will be permitted. The procedure for extra time where a winner is required will be as follows:
 - (i) There shall be a four (4) minute interval at the end of full time.
 - (ii) Extra time shall consist of two (2) halves of seven (7) minutes each, with an interval of one (1) minute at halftime. Teams shall change ends at halftime. The Centre Pass is taken by the team entitled to the next Centre Pass.

- (iii) During both of these intervals, substitutions and / or team changes may be made [INF Rule 9.1 (i) (a)].
- (iv) During extra time, normal injury or illness procedures shall apply [INF Rule 9.3 (i)].
- (v) If a tie remains at the end of extra time, a visual signal shall be used to indicate that play shall continue until one team leads by two (2) goals.

9.4 Match Duration

Each match shall be sixty (60) minutes in duration comprising four (4) quarters of fifteen (15) minutes each. The intervals between the 1st and 2nd quarters and the 3rd and 4th quarters shall be four (4) minutes each. The half-time interval (between 2nd and 3rd quarter) shall be eight (8) minutes.

9.5 Match procedures and protocols

- 9.5.1 Final team registration of up to twelve (12) athletes must be finalised by the close of *Entry by Name* deadline set by MASOC. After this time, no changes or amendments will be permitted.
- 9.5.2 Teams shall not be required to play more

than one match each day except in special circumstances, which may include but not be limited to, a protest being upheld, or that a match is unable to be played as scheduled.

- 9.5.3 If a match has to be rescheduled and/or an additional match is required to be played, consideration shall be given to scheduling that match at a time that takes into account factors, which may include but are not be limited to, adequate recovery time, equitable schedules for the teams concerned.
- 9.5.4 No less than sixty (60) minutes before the due time for a match to start, each team must submit to the Competition Management Office, the Team Start List for that match. The names of all the athletes and officials shall be listed, identifying those athletes and their respective positions that will start the match on court.
- 9.5.5 No alterations or additions may be made to the athletes identified as starting on court or their positions within sixty (60) minutes of the scheduled start time except in the event of injury/illness in the sixty (60) minutes prior to the start of the match.
- 9.5.6 A change in playing position or substitution

of that athlete with another may be permitted if, in the opinion of an independent medical practitioner or Technical Delegate, the athlete is deemed to be incapable of participating in or starting that match. In such a case, the Bench Officials of the team shall be notified immediately and the alteration registered as a team substitution or change.

- 9.5.7 Once the Team List is submitted, that information will be made available to the Bench Officials, Media, Sports Presentation and each team competing in that match.
- 9.5.8 Team Benches shall be allocated on the following basis:
 - (i) Team 1 (first named team on the match schedule) will take the bench to the right of the scorer's desk as it faces out on to the playing court.
 - (ii) Team 2 (second named team on the match schedule) will take the bench to the left of the scorer's desk as it faces out on to the playing court.
- 9.5.9 The captain's toss for choice of first centre pass or goal end (INF Rule 5.1.1 (v)) will be conducted on the court and is observed by

the reserve umpire who conveys the result to the officiating umpires. The captain from the first named team shall toss the coin with the captain from the second named team calling either heads or tails.

9.5.10 During each match, Team Managers shall provide as required team changes and/or substitutions to the designated officials.

9.6 Delays, postponements or cancellations

The Technical Delegate must consult the MASOC Secretariat if there is any delay, postponement or cancellation of any competition that affects the scheduled times for "live broadcast" or victory ceremonies.

10 Sports equipment and Competition attire

10.1 Sports equipment

All sports equipment used by athletes in competition must comply with the SEAGF Charter and Rules and the International Netball Federation (INF) Rules and Regulations.

10.2 Competition attire

10.2.1 All attire worn by athletes in competition must comply with the SEAGF Charter and

Rules and the INF Rules and Regulations.

- 10.2.2 Each team must carry two (2) sets of bibs with different colours.
- 10.2.3 Each team must play in the uniform registered for that team. If alternative uniforms or bibs are required for identification purposes, the first named team will have the first choice.

11 Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal

The appointments of Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal members will be in accordance with Article 41 of the SEAGF Charter and Rules.

11.1 International Technical Officials (ITOs)

11.1.1 International Netball Federation (INF) shall appoint one (1) Technical Delegate and such number of International Technical Officials as may be approved by MASOC.

> MASOC will pay for the costs of international transportation based on an economy direct-route fare, local transport and accommodation for these International Technical Officials (ITOs).

- 11.1.2 Each participating NOC may nominate one (1) INF qualified Netball umpire to officiate in the competition in accordance with the SEAGF Charter and Rules subject to the following conditions:
 - The nominated Officiating Umpire must be on the INF List of Qualified Umpires for 2016.
 - (ii) The appointment of NOC nominees shall be subject to the approval of the TD.

Participating NOCs shall bear the international transportation costs for their nominated Technical Officials while MASOC will bear costs related to local transport and accommodation for these Technical Officials.

11.2 National Technical Officials (NTOs)

Malaysian Netball Association will appoint such number of National Technical Officials as may be approved by MASOC to assist the International Technical Officials.

11.3 Jury of Appeal

The Jury of Appeal shall consist of the three (3)

members who will be appointed by International Netball Federation (INF) and who will also serve as the Umpires Appointment Panel.

12 Protests and Appeals

- 12.1 Any written protest must first be made and submitted by the Chef de Mission or Team Manager to the Technical Delegate within thirty (30) minutes after the end of the event in which the protest is generated with the payment of a Protest Fee of USD200.00 per protest payable to MASOC. If conditions causing a potential protest are noted prior to the start of the event, a written protest must be lodged before the signal to start the event is given.
- 12.2 All protests must be considered by the Technical Delegate concerned who must make a decision as soon as possible. He/She must state the reason(s) for his/her upholding/rejecting the protest.
- 12.3 Any Chef de Mission or Team Manager dissatisfied with the decision of the Technical Delegate, may appeal to the Jury of Appeal by submitting the written appeal to the TD within sixty (60) minutes of receipt of the TD's written decision. The appeal must be heard and decided by the Jury of Appeal for the sport within two (2) hours after receipt of the written protest.

- 12.4 Any NOC dissatisfied with any decision by the Jury of Appeal may make any appeal in accordance with Articles 42 and 43 of the SEAGF Charter and Rules.
- 12.5 The protest fee shall be refunded if the protest is upheld; it will be forfeited if the protest is rejected.

13 Doping Control

- 13.1 MASOC, under the guidance of the SEAGF, will be responsible for the Anti-Doping Programme during the 29th SEA Games, Kuala Lumpur 2017. The Anti-Doping Programme will be implemented in accordance with SEAGF Anti-Doping Rules and the World Anti-Doping Code and its relevant International Standards.
- 13.2 Doping Control stations will be set up at the competition venue, where in-competition testing will be conducted. The Test Distribution Plan and criteria for athlete selection for each sport will comply with the Doping Control protocol established by the SEAGF and MASOC.
- 13.3 Doping Control procedures will be implemented according to WADA's International Standards for Testing and Investigations. Sample analysis will be performed at a WADA-accredited laboratory.
- 13.4 An athlete identified for doping testing should be

accompanied by a team official for the entire testing process.

14 Victory Ceremony

- 14.1 Victory Ceremonies will be held in accordance with the SEAGF Charter and Rules to honour the individual and team achievements of the winning athletes.
- 14.2 The athletes who have been judged first, second and third shall take their places, in their sport attire or NOC designated attire, on a stand facing the Tribune of Honour, with the winner slightly above the second who is on his/her right, and the third who is on his/her left.
- 14.3 The flag of the country of the winner shall be hoisted on the central flagpole and those of the second and third on adjoining flagpoles on the right and left respectively as they face the arena. Meanwhile, the National Anthem of the country of the winner is played and the athletes and spectators shall face the flags.

15 Media Interview

- 15.1 All athletes should pass through the Mixed Zone.
- 15.2 Athletes and/or coaches should attend press conference and interview requests for them.

16 General Rules and Regulations (SEAGF Charter and Rules)

The 29th SEA Games Netball Competition will also be conducted in accordance with the SEAGF Charter and Rules which shall have precedence, including the following provisions:

16.1 SEAGF Article 30 - General Rules of the South East Asian Games

To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation Charter and Rules as well as Rule 40 and the By-law to Rule 40 of the Olympic Charter (Participation in the Games).

16.2 SEAGF Article 31 – Nationality of Competitor

Only nationals of the country of the NOC shall be qualified to represent the NOC in the Games. All disputes relating to the determination of the country, which a competitor may represent in the Sea Games, shall be resolved by the Executive Committee in accordance with the By-law to Rule 41 of the Olympic Charter (Nationality of Competitors).

16.3 SEAGF Article 42 – Arbitration Panel

The Council shall appoint an Arbitration Panel

comprising such number as the Council may decide, of independent persons of good standing from amongst the South East Asian countries to deliberate and decide finally on all questions concerning the Games or any claims, protests or appeals (including on any violation of anti-doping code, rules or regulations) from any sport under Sections 41 and 43 or any disputes arising from or related to the Games. NOCs or the Organising Committee may submit questions to the Arbitration Panel. In addition, the Arbitration Panel may intervene in all questions of non-technical nature outside the Jurisdiction of the Jury of Appeal set up for each sport in the programme of the Games.

16.4 SEAGF Rule 43 – Claims, Protests and Appeals

- (a) Decisions made by the judges, referees and umpires on the competition field of play concerning matters of fact or judgement calls are final and no appeals are allowed. Appeals against other decisions of the judges, referees or umpires or regarding any other matter must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the NOC of the country making the claim, protest or appeal.
- (b) Except in exceptional circumstances, any claim, protest or appeal must be made in writing within sixty (60) minutes of the

decision giving rise to the claim, protest or appeal. The Jury of Appeal, after an investigation, shall then give a decision within two (2) hours of such claim, protest or appeal.

(c) Any NOC dissatisfied with the decision of any Jury of Appeal may, within twenty-four (24) hours of the notice of the decision of the Jury of Appeal, appeal in writing to the Arbitration Panel under Clause 42 which shall decide on the matter. All decisions of the Arbitration Panel shall be final.

16.5 SEAGF Rule 44 – Penalties in Case of Fraud

A competitor proved to have fraudulently transgressed or breached any provisions of the Charter, Rules, Regulations or By-laws of the Federation shall be disqualified and lose any position or medal he/she may have gained. If this competitor's NOC is proved to have been a party to the fraud, his/her country shall be disqualified in the sport concerned.


