BOSTON COLLEGE vs WAKE FOREST AT A GLANCE

THE MATCH UP

- Wake Forest will hit the road for the first time in 2017 and open ACC play on Saturday, September 9 against Boston College in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts.
- Kickoff is set for 1:00 p.m. at Alumni Stadium and will be broadcast on ACC Network Extra. Robert Lee and Matt Chatham will have the call of Saturday's game.
- Saturday's game can also be heard on the Wake Forest Sports Network. Stan Cotten and Lary Sorensen have the call with Dave Goren reporting from the sidelines.

WAKE FOREST STORYLINES

- Wake Forest opened the 2017 campaign on the right foot, rolling past Presbyterian, 51-7, on Thursday, August 31.
- Senior Cam Serigne and redshirt freshman Greg Dortch each caught a pair of touchdown passes. John Wolford accounted for four touchdowns (three passing, one rushing) while Kendall Hinton added three more (two passing, one rushing).
- Wake Forest's 51 points scored are the most under head coach Dave Clawson and the program's most since scoring 54 against Duke in 2010.
- The Deacs were picked to finish fifth in the ACC Atlantic Division.

THE OPPOSITION & SERIES HISTORY

- Boston College opened the 2017 season on the road, topping Northern Illinois, 23-20 on Friday, September 1. Colton Lichtenberg hit a go-ahead 37-yard field goal with 2:13 to play before the Huskies missed a potential game-tying 39-yard field goal in the closing seconds of the game.
- The Eagles are led by fifth-year head coach Steve Addazio, who has led the team to a 25-27 record during his time at the helm of the program.
- Saturday will be the 25th meeting between the two programs, with Boston College holding a 13-9-2 advantage.

LOOKING AHEAD

- The Deacs return home to face Utah State in nonconference action on Saturday, Sept. 16. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. on ACC Network Extra.
- The game will highlight a week of activities as Wake Forest celebrates Homecoming.

Weekly Press Conference

Wake Forest's weekly press conference begins each Tuesday at 11 a.m. in the Rovere Room in the Miller Center on campus, beginning with selected players. Lunch will then be served and Dave Clawson will meet with the media at 12:00 p.m. in the Rovere Room followed by lunch with the print media in the Rovere Room. Any specific player requests must be made before noon on Monday. Quotes and video of the press conference will be posted on WakeForestSports.com.

ACC Weekly Teleconference

Dave Clawson participates in the ACC's weekly teleconference every Wednesday at 12:00 p.m. For the media access number, contact the ACC Media Relations Office or the Wake Forest Athletic Communications Office. The teleconference is archived online at theACC.com.

Wake Forest typically conducts its practices on campus at the Doc Martin Practice Complex adjacent to the Pruitt Football Center. Coach Clawson is available in person most days of the week and players are available Tuesday and Wednesday after practice.

The Dave Clawson Show

Coach Clawson's weekly radio show with the Voice of the Deacons, Stan Cotten, airs on the Wake Forest IMG Sports Network and online at WakeForestSports.com. The show will be held live on location at Bib's Downtown through Oct. 10 and then held at the IMG College studios in downtown Winston-Salem.

WOLFORD EARNS STARTING NO. 1

- Senior quarterback John Wolford was named as the starter for Wake Forest's season-opener against Presbyterian.
- Wolford became the first quarterback in school history to start four season-openers. He started at Louisiana-Monroe in 2014 in his first collegiate game, at home against Elon in 2015 and at home vs. Tulane in 2016.
- Only seven Demon Deacon QBs have started three season openers: Norm Snead (1958-60), Larry Russell (1969-71), Mike Elkins (1986-88), Rusty LaRue (1993-95), Brian Kuklick (1996-98), Riley Skinner (2007-09) and Tanner Price (2011-13).
- In three preseason intrasquad scrimmages prior to the 2017 season, Wolford completed 38 of 50 passes for 471 yards and five touchdowns with no interceptions and a passing efficiency of 188.13.

DORTCH'S DEACON DEBUT

- Redshirt freshman Greg Dortch made quite the impression in his first college game against Presbyterian on Aug. 31.
- Dortch caught two touchdown passes among his four receptions for 55 yards. His touchdowns came on receptions of 7 and 42 yards, both in the second quarter.
- Dortch impressed on his four punt returns, gaining 76 yards including a long return of 29 yards. The 76 yards in punt returns were the most ever by a Deacon freshman. His 29-yard return tied the longest by a Deacon in 2016. Jessie Bates III had a 29-yard return vs. Louisville.
- His two touchdown receptions marked the first time a freshman caught two TD passes in a game since Chris Givens had a pair in 2009 against Maryland.
- Dortch also became the first freshman in school history with multiple TD catches in the first game of a career.
- During the game, color commentator, and former Wake Forest head coach Al Groh noted on Dortch, "He's like a knuckleball thrown at fastball speed."

STADIUM RECORDS FALL

- Among the BB&T Field records set during Wake Forest's season-opening 51-7 win over Presbyterian:
- The Deacons threw five touchdown passes to surpass the previous mark of four set against Tulsa in 1989 and tied against Duke and Florida State in 2011.
- Wake Forest tied the stadium record with a 44-point margin of victory. The Deacons beat UAB 47-3 in 1999.

FIRST TIME ACTION

- Wake Forest played true freshmen DB Coby Davis, CB Ja'Sir Taylor, LB Jake Simpson, OL Sean Maginn, and LB D.J. Taylor.
- Malik Grate made his debut as a cornerback after redshirting

- Grad transfer DT Deon Young saw his first action after coming in from Northern Arizona University.
- Other redshirt freshmen to see their first on-field action were DE Carlos Basham, Jr., PK Ben Brown, RB Arkeem Byrd, TE Thomas Cole, WR Greg Dortch, WR Davis Johnson, DT Sulaiman Kamara, TE LaRonde' Liverpool, S Luke Masterson, OL Je'Vionte' Nash, QB Jamie Newman, WR James Sriraman, OL Taleni Suhren, OL Tyler Watson, and ROV Ja'Cquez Williams.

WELCOME BACK

- Wake Forest had a pair of veterans return to the field after a year of inaction.
- Junior RB Isaiah Robinson missed all of 2016 with an injury.
- Robinson carried the ball for the first time since Nov. 21, 2015. Robinson had a team-high 12 carries for 49 yards against Presbyterian.
- DT Zeek Rodney came back from a year out of school to record an 11-yard sack and 4-yard tackle for loss.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Wake Forest's 76 yards in punt returns were the most by the Deacons since collecting 85 yards at Northern Illinois in 2002.
- Greg Dortch's 76 yards in punt returns were the most since Fabian Davis had 85 yards at Northern Illinois in 2002.
- Mike Weaver had his streak of 31 consecutive PATs snapped when he missed his first attempt of the game. Weaver converted his next six attempts.

2017 WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

QUARTERBACKS SHINE IN OPENER

- Quarterbacks John Wolford and Kendall Hinton excelled in the season opener against Presbyterian. Wolford started and played a quarter and a half before yielding to Hinton.
- Wolford's 199.25 QB efficiency rating was the second-highest of his career behind a 211.23 rating in the 2015 season-opener against Elon.
- Wolford's highest QB efficiency rating vs. a Power 5 opponent came in 2016 when he posted a 192.72 rating vs. Virginia. Against the Cavaliers, Wolford completed 9-of-10 for 83 yards and a touchdown.
- It was Wolford's third 3-touchdown passing game and his second 4-total touchdown game (Elon 2015).
- Thursday marked the first time in school history two quarterbacks each threw multiple touchdowns.
- Hinton ended Thursday's game with a passer rating of 300.20.

SERIGNE AMONG NATION'S TOP TIGHT ENDS

- Senior tight end Cam Serigne now has 14 career touchdowns, extending his own career record for TD receptions by a tight end.
- Over the past three seasons, Serigne has caught 130 passes (54 in '14, 46 in '15, 30 in '16).
- Heading into the 2017 season, Serigne has caught a pass in 37 consecutive games, tied with Christian Kirk of Texas A&M for the national lead. Allen Lazard of Iowa State is third with a catch in 36 consecutive games while James Washington (Oklahoma State, 33), Calvin Ridley (Alabama, 31) and Ryan Yurachek (Marshall, 30) all have a streak of 30 or more games.

distinct segments.

- The Deacons' first three games against Presbyterian, Boston College and Utah State will be played against teams that combined to go 12-24 last year. Boston College was the only team to go to a bowl in 2016.
- The final four games, vs. Notre Dame, Syracuse, NC State and Duke, will be against teams that combined to go 19-30 last season with NC State the only team from the group to go to a bowl game.
- The middle five-game portion of the schedule is akin to the Yankees' great line-up dubbed Murderer's Row.
- The five opponents, including Appalachian State, Florida State, Clemson, Georgia Tech and Louisville, combined to go 52-15 during the 2016 season.
- All five teams went to a bowl game with Clemson claiming the national championship.
- Louisville was the only one of the five teams during Wake Forest's middle five-game stretch not to win its bowl game in 2016.

WATCH LISTS

- Several Wake Forest players have been named to preseason watch lists for national awards.
- Duke Ejiyor leads the way with three selections, as he was named to the watch lists for the Bednarik Award (top defensive player), Bronko Nagurski Trophy (top defensive player) and the Ted Hendricks Award (top defensive end).
- Cam Serigne was named to the watch list of the Mackey Award (top tight end), in addition to being the tight end on the preseason All-ACC squad.
- Ryan Anderson is on the watch list for the Rimington Award (top center).
- Mike Weaver is on the list for the Lou Groza Award (top kicker).
- Wendell Dunn is on the list for the Wuerrfel Trophy (community service and academic achievement).

CLAWSON YEAR FOUR

- Fourth-year head coach Dave Clawson has excelled in the fourth season at his three previous schools.
- Clawson owns an overall record of 29-11 and a conference record of 19-4 in three previous Year Fours.
- At Fordham in 2002, Clawson led the Rams to a 10-3 record and the second round of the FCS playoffs.
- At Richmond in 2007, the Spiders were 11-3 and reached the third round of the FCS playoffs.
- At Bowling Green in 2012, the Falcons went 8-5 and reached the Military Bowl.

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR EXPERIENCE

- All four Wake Forest defensive coaches have experience as a defensive coordinator.
- Returning DL coach Dave Cohen was the DC at Delaware, Western Michigan and Rutgers, as well as the head coach at Hofstra.
- New defensive coordinator Jay Sawvel was the defensive coordinator at Minnesota in 2016.
- Linebacker coach Brad Sherrod served as the DC at Sam Houston State in 2016 and the co-defensive coordinator for the Bearkats in 2014 and 2015.
- Safeties coach Lyle Hemphill was the DC and safeties coach at Stony Brook from 2013-16.
- Each of the four coaches helped lead their team to the postseason while serving as DC.

2017 CAPTAINS

- Wake Forest will have six permanent captains for the 2017 season.
- On offense, TE Cam Serigne, QB John Wolford and C A'Lique Terry will serve as captains while DE Wendell Dunn, LB Grant Dawson and LB Jaboree Williams are all defensive captains.
- Both Dunn and Serigne are in their second year as team captains.

100 PERCENT SCORING RETURNS

- Wake Forest returns every player who scored a point in 2016.
- Wake Forest scored 265 points a season ago, its highest scoring total since 2011. Mike Weaver is the top returning scorer with 91 points last year.
- RB Cade Carney and QB John Wolford each return after having scored 36 points each in 2016 on six touchdowns.
- Wake Forest returns players who accounted for 189 of 190 receptions in 2016 and 1,872 of last year's 1,895 rushing yards.

ONE SCORE, FOURTH QUARTER GAMES

- Head coach Dave Clawson frequently mentions Wake Forest's plethora of one score games in the fourth quarter.
- That is defined as the Demon Deacons and their opponents being separated by 8 points or fewer in the final quarter.
- In Clawson's 37 games as head coach (13-24), the Deacons have played 24 such games.
- Wake Forest is 10-14 in one score, fourth quarter games, including a 6-3 mark last season.

YOUTHFUL DEMON DEACONS

- Wake Forest is tied for second in the nation for the fewest seniors on its 2017 roster with nine.
- TE Devin Pike, C A'Lique Terry, LB Jaboree Williams and QB John Wolford were all part of Dave Clawson's first recruiting class in 2014 and have not used a redshirt season.
- Five Deacons redshirted in 2013 and are fifth-year seniors in 2017: LB Grant Dawson, DE Wendell Dunn, DE Duke Ejiolor, TE Cam Serigne and PK Mike Weaver.
- Georgia Southern has the fewest seniors in FBS with eight while Illinois also has nine seniors. Louisiana-Monroe and Wyoming each have 10 seniors.

WOLFORD 1,500-500

- In 2016, John Wolford became the first Wake Forest quarterback to throw for at least 1,500 yards and rush for 500 yards in the same season.
- Wolford finished the year with 1,774 passing yards and 521 rushing yards.
- In addition, Wolford's 521 rushing yards on the year were the third-most in a season by a Wake Forest quarterback. Larry Russell holds the top two marks with 803 yards in 1971 and 649 yards in 1970.

HOMETOWN HEROES

- Three times during the 2016 season a Wake Forest player, playing in front of his family and friends in his hometown (or state), rose to the occasion with an outstanding game.
- QB Kendall Hinton (Southern Durham) spearheaded a comeback at Duke on Sept. 10 as the Deacons overcame an early 7-0 deficit to win 24-14 in Durham.
- S Jessie Bates III turned in an outstanding game at

Indiana, just 175 miles from his hometown of Fort Wayne, Indiana. Bates had a pair of interceptions, returning one for a touchdown, and led the Deacons with eight tackles.

- WR Scotty Washington, a Washington D.C. native, had five receptions for 57 yards vs. Temple in the Military Bowl. Washington had five receptions during the regular season before making his second career start.
- In 2017, a number of Deacons will be playing in or near their hometowns:
 - OT Jake Benzinger (Williamston, MA) at Boston College
 - DB Malik Grate (Pendleton, SC) and RB Will Drawdy (Easley, SC) at Clemson
 - S Jessie Bates (Ft. Wayne, IN) at Notre Dame
 - PK Mike Weaver (Pineville, NY) at Syracuse
 - Wake Forest has 15 players from Georgia who will be close to home for the Georgia Tech game in Atlanta on Oct. 21. Most notably S Cameron Glenn (Stone Mountain, GA), DE Chris Calhoun (Alpharetta, GA), LB Nate Mays (Calhoun, GA) and DT Willie Yarbary (Augusta, GA).

NO TRIP TO THE TRIANGLE

- Wake Forest will not play a game in North Carolina's Research Triangle in 2017.
- The Deacons played at least one game in the Triangle every year between 1923 and 2009.
- This marks just the third season since 1923 that Wake Forest will not play a game at Duke, NC State or North Carolina, as the Deacs did not travel to the Triangle in 2009 or 2013.
- In 1922, the Deacons played UNC at Goldsboro and hosted both Duke and NC State.

HINTON'S CARRIES

- Through one game of the 2017 season, Kendall Hinton has 124 career carries and has rushed for 10 touchdowns.
- That translates to Hinton scoring on 8.1 percent of his carries. It also means that Hinton scores a touchdown once every 12.4 carries.
- Fullback Ovie Mugheli holds the school mark for touchdowns per carry. Mugheli (1999-2002) scored 13 career touchdowns on 137 carries or once every 10.5 carries.
- Hinton is second in school history for all Demon Deacon rushers with more than 100 career carries.

STARTERS ACROSS THE BOARD

- All 22 starters in the season opener against Presbyterian were veteran starters.
- The defense was led by veteran DE Wendell Dunn who made his 38th career start. DE Duke Ejiolor is second with 20 career starts.
- On offense, TE Cam Serigne made his 37th career start while John Wolford started his 35th contest.
- The youngest members of the starting line-up were RG Pat Osterhage and RT Jake Benzinger, as each made their second career start.
- On defense, CB Essang Bassey and DT Willie Yarbary each started for the third time in their career.
- PK Mike Weaver was in the starting line-up for the 39th consecutive game while P Dom Maggio made his 12th career start and LS Dayton Diemel started his seventh game.

RETURNING EXPERIENCE

- In 2017, Wake Forest loses just 25 of 143 offense starts (OL Ty Hayworth 12, C Josh Harris 10, FB Charles Argenzio 2, QB Kyle Kearns 1).

2017 WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

- The Deacons return 118 of 143 starts on offense (82.5%). Defensively, the Deacs will lose 69 of 143 starts from 2016 while returning 72 starts. (50.3%)
- Overall, Wake Forest returns 189 of 286 total starts (66.1%).

CH-CH-CH-CHANGES

- A number of Demon Deacons have changed numbers from last season.
- CB Amari Henderson has changed from No. 10 to No. 4.
- WR Steve Claude has moved from No. 81 to No. 88.
- Malik Grate has not only changed from No. 84 to No. 13 but also from WR to CB.
- DE Carlos "Boogie" Basham, Jr. has changed from No. 98 to No. 18.

THROUGH THE UPRIGHTS

- The Demon Deacons return Mike Weaver who entered his senior season fifth in school history in career scoring with 221 points.
- Weaver has now converted 48 of 65 career FGA and is second in school history in accuracy at 73.8 percent.
- His 48 career field goals made is second-most in school history.

MAGGIO WITH THE BOOT

- Punter Dom Maggio begins his second season as Wake Forest's punter after earning second team Freshman All-America honors in 2016.
- Maggio averaged 42.0 yards per kick as a freshman on 72 punts.
- Maggio averaged better than 40 yards per punt in each of his first six games becoming the first freshman in school history to achieve that feat.
- Dayton Diemel returns as the long snapper after taking over the reins during Week 7 of 2016 at Florida State.

FOUR-YEAR STARTERS

- John Wolford will be one of a handful of quarterbacks in the FBS to start their fourth season-opener.
- New Mexico State's Tyler Rogers and Troy's Brandon Silvers will be making their fourth consecutive start as well.

- Along with Wolford starting his fourth season-opener, two other Deacons will make their fourth opening day start.
- DE Wendell Dunn and TE Cam Serigne will each be starting for the fourth consecutive season.

DEACS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Eight of Wake Forest's 2017 opponents are received Week 1 votes in the Amway Coaches Preseason Poll.
- They include No. 3 Florida State, No. 5 Clemson and No. 17 Louisville, all fellow ACC Atlantic Division foes.
- Notre Dame (No. 29), NC State (No. 32), Appalachian State (No. 40), Georgia Tech (No. 41) and Syracuse are all receiving votes in the Coaches Poll.
- In the AP Poll, the Deacs will face No. 3 Florida State, No. 5 Clemson and No. 16 Louisville while Notre Dame, NC State and Appalachian State are also receiving votes.
- The Deacs have won as many as three games vs. ranked opponents in a single season. In 1979, Wake Forest posted wins over No. 12 Georgia, No. 13 Auburn, and No. 14 North Carolina.
- The Deacons also won two games vs. ranked opponents in 1999 (No. 14 Georgia Tech, No. 25 NC State) and in 2006 (No. 16 Boston College, No. 22 Georgia Tech).
- If the rankings hold, this would mark the third consecutive season the Deacons play top five opponents in back-to-back weeks. In 2015, the Deacs played Notre Dame (No. 4 CFP) and Clemson (No. 1 CFP) in back-to-back weeks and in 2016, Wake Forest faced Louisville (No. 5 AP) and Clemson (No. 4 CFP) in consecutive weeks.

ON THIS DATE IN DEACON FOOTBALL HISTORY • SEPTEMBER 9 • RECORD: 3-3

2006: In a critical game that would serve as a catalyst for the remainder of the 2006 season, Wake Forest improved to 2-0 with a dramatic 13-10 win over Duke at BB&T Field. The Deacons trailed 10-0 at the half before John Tereshinski caught a 5-yard scoring pass from Riley Skinner to cut the deficit to three. Micah Andrews put Wake Forest ahead 13-10 with a 2-yard run with 1:28 to play. Duke drove to the Wake Forest 11 where Joe Surgan's game-tying 28-yard field goal was blocked by Chip Vaughn to secure the Deacon victory.

1978: Wake Forest scored a pair of first quarter touchdowns and shut out Virginia 14-0 at Groves Stadium. Quarterback Ken Daly connected with Eddie Wright on a 33-yard scoring pass for the early lead before James McDougald scored on a 1-yard run. The win marked the debut of Wake Forest head coach John Mackovic. The shutout marked Wake Forest's first since blanking North Carolina 3-0 in 1966.

1977: Wake Forest defeated Davidson 26-20 at Groves Stadium as junior college transfer Clayton Heath scored on a pair of 1-yard runs. Ken Griffith scored on a 60-yard run and Chuck Ramsey scored on a 14-yard run as the Deacs ground out 251 yards rushing. The win marked the head coaching debut of Deacon head coach Tom Harper.

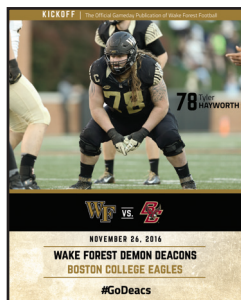

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- Boston College scored a touchdown in the fourth quarter and held off a Wake Forest rally as the Eagles defeated the Demon Deacons 17-14 at BB&T Field.

Wake Forest (6-6, 3-5 ACC) had a 14-10 lead going into the fourth quarter but Boston College (6-6, 2-6 ACC) responded with a late touchdown drive and stymied two Demon Deacon

possessions to close out the game. Boston College became bowl eligible with the victory.

Quarterback John Wolford completed 16 passes for 137 yards with two touchdown passes while adding 69 yards rushing. Cam Serigne had six catches for 49 yards and a touchdown while Cortez Lewis had 67 yards on four catches with a score.

Marquel Lee led the defense with 11 tackles including seven solo stops and 1.5 sacks. As a team, Wake Forest had five sacks and five breakups while holding Boston College to just 167 yards of total offense. The Eagles did not eclipse 100 yards in either rushing or passing.

Boston College took advantage of a Wake Forest turnover in the first quarter, kicking a field goal early in the frame for the 3-0 lead. The Eagles added a touchdown later in the quarter on an 11-yard run from Myles Willis which led to a 10-0 advantage for Boston College going into halftime.

Trailing by 10 midway through the third quarter, Wolford zipped a five-yard pass to Serigne for the score.

The Deacs took a 14-10 lead on a 37-yard highlight throw-and-catch from Wolford to Lewis.

Boston College retook the lead in the fourth quarter on a 13-yard touchdown pass to Tommy Sweeney which put the Eagles in front 17-14.

Late in the fourth quarter, Wake Forest drove to the BC 22-yard line but missed a 40-yard field goal to tie the game. The Deacons had the ball with less than a minute late but the Eagles stopped the drive and finished out the game for the win.

WAKE FOREST VS. BOSTON COLLEGE

• Boston College holds a 13-9-2 lead in the all-time series with Wake Forest that dates back to Nov. 8, 1941. Wake Forest claimed the last meeting in Chestnut Hill, a 3-0 victory in 2015.

• The team that has scored first has won the past nine games in the series.

• Wake Forest snapped a four-game losing streak with a win in 2011 and also won the 2012 contest, 28-14 in Winston-Salem.

• The Deacons are 4-8 against BC since the Eagles joined the ACC in 2005.

• Twelve of the last 14 games between the two schools have been decided by 10 points or fewer. Eleven of the last 15 have been decided by 8 points or fewer.

• All-time, Wake Forest is 6-9-1 against the Eagles in Mass., and 3-4 in Winston-Salem.

• The teams met eight straight seasons from 1946-53 but discontinued the series until the 2003 game at Alumni Stadium. The 2003 meeting was the first between the two schools in 50 years.

• The 1942 and 1953 meetings took place at Fenway Park, home of the Boston Red Sox.

• The 1952 game was played in Winston-Salem but was considered a neutral site meeting since the Deacons' home at the time was in Wake Forest, N.C.

IT HAPPENED AGAINST BOSTON COLLEGE

• In one of the biggest wins in Deacon history, Wake Forest defeated No. 11 Boston College 21-14 at BB&T Field on Nov. 4, 2006. The win put the Deacons in control of the ACC's Atlantic Division. The win remains the highest-ranked opponent that Wake Forest has defeated at home.

• The Deacons have only had one 100-yard rusher against Boston College. That happened in 1952 when Joe Koch rushed for 106 yards and one touchdown on 17 carries in a 7-7 tie at Bowman Gray Stadium.

• The Deacons' 12-6 win at Braves Field in Boston during the 1946 season attracted 38,500 fans, the largest crowd to ever seen Wake Forest play football at that time.

• WR Michael Campanaro set the school and ACC record for receptions in a game when he caught 16 passes against Boston College in 2012.

• Punter Alex Kinal set a school record in 2015 when he unleashed eight punts of 50 yards or longer.

WF - BC CONNECTIONS

• Wake Forest offensive coordinator Warren Ruggiero was the quarterbacks coach at Kansas State in 2008 while BC tight ends coach Frank Leonard was coaching the tight ends in 2007-08.

• When Dave Clawson was named head coach at Richmond in 2004, he succeeded Jim Reid who is now BC's defensive coordinator and linebacker coach.

• Deacon defensive line coach Dave Cohen was the defensive coordinator at Rutgers in 2012-13 while BC defensive backs coach Anthony Campanile was a defensive assistant.

2017 WAKE FOREST FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

Dave CLAWSON

Head Coach

4th Year

The 2016 Wake Forest football season ended exactly the way it began, with a win. And for head coach Dave Clawson and the Demon Deacons, that was exactly what the doctor ordered.

Wake Forest won its first four games of the 2016 season, the longest winning streak to open a campaign since 2006. The year ended with a thrilling 34-26 win over No. 23 Temple in the Military Bowl, marking Wake Forest's first-ever bowl victory over a ranked team.

The improvement in the Wake Forest football program in 2016 was noticeable in nearly every facet of the program. The Deacon offense improved in the national rankings in rushing offense and scoring offense. The defense posted program highs by finishing 11th nationally in sacks and 24th in tackles for loss. For the third straight year, Wake Forest fielded a top-40 defensive team.

For head coach Dave Clawson, the 2016 season marked year three in a career that has steadily shown vast improvement in year three. During his time at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, Clawson's year three teams averaged six wins. He exceeded that mark with seven victories in 2016.

From the addition of McCreary Field House, one of the nation's top indoor practice facilities, and an expanded weight room, Clawson and the Deacons are moving full speed into 2017.

With the addition last year of McCreary Field House, Wake Forest's state-of-the-art indoor practice facility, and the construction of the Sutton Sports Performance Center, which will mark yet another technologically advanced facility, Clawson and the Deacons are clearly on a roll.

On December 10, 2013, Clawson became the 32nd head football coach in Wake Forest University history. The head coach at Bowling Green State University from 2009 through 2013, Clawson led the Falcons to the 2013 Mid-American Conference championship with a 47-27 win over No. 16 Northern Illinois.

Clawson joined the Demon Deacons after five seasons as the head coach at BGSU in Bowling Green, Ohio. He built the Falcons to be explosive both offensively and defensively. The 2013 Bowling Green team ranked 29th in the nation in total offense and tenth in total defense. In 2012, BGSU was ranked sixth in the nation in total defense and 10th nationally in scoring defense, yielding just 16.8 points per game. The Falcons were one of only two non-power conference teams to rank in the top 30 statistically in both total offense and total defense in 2013.

Bowling Green's 2013 team went 10-3 overall under Clawson and won the MAC East title with a 7-1 record. The Falcons received a bid to the Little Caesar's Bowl in Detroit. It marked the third bowl appearance in five seasons for Clawson's team.

In his 16 years as a head coach, Clawson has delivered a conference championship at every stop. Prior to the 2013 Mid-American Conference title at Bowling Green, Clawson helped Richmond to a pair of Colonial Athletic Association titles in 2005 and 2007. His first championship as a head coach came in 2002 when he led Fordham to the Patriot League title.

He has also earned numerous Coach of the Year awards. He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2002 and was awarded the 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year award in just his second year in the league. The 2007 CAA Coach of the Year award marked his fourth conference Coach of the Year honor in his first nine years as a head coach.

In 2002, Clawson was the Schutt Sports/American Football Monthly I-AA Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award. In 2005, Clawson earned National Coach of the Year from I-AA.org and was again a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award.

A 1989 graduate of Williams College in Massachusetts, Clawson earned a degree in political economy. A native of Youngstown, N.Y., Clawson was a defensive back for Williams and went on to serve as a graduate assistant coach at Albany in 1989 and 1990. He moved to Buffalo for the 1991 and 1992 seasons, tutoring the secondary his first year and the quarterbacks and running backs his second.

In 1993, Clawson was named the running backs coach at Lehigh and helped the Mountain Hawks to a 7-4 record and the Patriot League championship. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1994 and spent two years in that role, adding another Patriot League title in 1995. Lehigh won a pair of Patriot League titles in his three years and his offense led the league in scoring, total offense and pass offense in each of his final two seasons.

Villanova hired Clawson as offensive coordinator in 1996 and his offense helped the Wildcats to NCAA FCS appearances in 1996 and 1997. During his tenure at Villanova, Clawson's offense established 70 program records, held the No. 1 ranking in the nation for six weeks in 1997 and won the 1997 Atlantic 10 championship. He tutored Brian Westbrook who became the first player in college football history to gain 1,000 yards both rushing and receiving.

Following the 1998 season, Clawson became the nation's youngest Division I head coach when he was named head coach at Fordham. Inheriting a team that had won just 22 games in the previous 10 years, Clawson turned the Rams into the Patriot League champions in his fourth season. He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002. Clawson helped the Rams 2002 FCS Playoffs where they defeated fourth seed Northeastern in the opening round before falling to Villanova.

Clawson was named the head coach at Richmond prior to the 2004 season. He guided the Spiders to the biggest two-year turnaround in school history, improving from 3-8 in 2004 to 9-4 in 2005. In 2007, his final year with the Spiders, Clawson guided Richmond to an 11-3 record, the Colonial South title and the FCS national semifinals.

He left Richmond in 2008 to replace David Cutcliffe as the offensive coordinator under Phillip Fulmer at Tennessee. Following that season, Clawson was named the head coach at Bowling Green in time for the 2009 season.

Clawson and his wife, Catherine, are the parents of two children, Courtney and Eric.
