#### PHI CHAPTER HOMECOMING



### **CONVOCATION 1988**

At 2:00 on the afternoon of August 10, 1988, Grand Sage John J. Merino, Jr., with the rap of the gavel opened the 39th Biennial Convocation in Chicago, Illinois. "The Windy City" played host to the 447 brothers representing 109 chapters, 4 colonies, and 5 alumni clubs in attendance.

Business Session #1 was opened according to ritual with the role call of delegates and Grand Officers. T.J. Schmitz, Executive Director of Tau Kappa Epsilon Fraternity, was the opening speaker on the subject of "Motivation .... Key to Success". That evening the Opening Night Reception was held in the West Tower of the Hyatt Hotel with entertainment by a "Blues Band".

Business session #2 began with the Sigma Pi Foundation, Inc., report and the explanation of the merger of the 1923 corporation into the Sigma Pi Fraternity International, Inc., This was followed with the biennial report of the Sigma Pi Educational Fund, Inc.

The opening afternoon speech, "Hazing", was made by Eileen Stevens. Her son Chuck was the victim of a pledging activity in a local fraternity that resulted in his death. The delegates spent the rest of Business Session #3 discussing the Risk Management Policy proposal by the Grand Council. That evening, most of the undergraduate brothers with a few young hearted alumni, went to the Six Flags Amusement Park, north of Chicago.

Friday morning, Ed King, Dean of Men at Bradley University, spoke on "Secret Thoughts of the Ritual". This was followed by the first session of Educational Workshops for the offices of Sage, Second Counselor and First Counselor. The topics of Membership, Education, Multiple Sclerosis/Philanthropy, and Public Relations were also addressed.

The Alumni Luncheon was the opportunity for the Grand Council and undergraduate brothers to honor the voluntary work of the Province Archons and Chapter Directors. The following men received certificates:

The Educational Workshops continued during the afternoon with Ed McClane, Beta-Gamma Chapter, speaking to the undergraduate brothers on "Rushing" and Jeff Knezovich, Beta-Gamma Chapter, spoke to graduate brothers on "Alumni Programming". This was followed by eight more sessions for officers and other topics dealing with chapter operations.



Saturday, August 13th, Mary Petersen, Greek Advisor from the University of Iowa, got the attention of all the brothers with her talk on "Alcohol, Stress, and Sex".

The final day of Convocation business included changes in the Constitution and By-Laws, with adoption of dues increases for initiation fees, undergraduate dues, and chapter charter dues. The Risk Management Policy was also adopted and the approval of the Foundation merger into the Grand Chapter, becomes effective September 1, 1988.

The Nominating Committee made their report and the candidates began their speeches for the election onto the Grand Council. Greg J. Evans, Beta-Phi Chapter, was elected Grand Sage succeeding John J. Merino, Jr., Beta-Omicron Chapter, who will remain on the Grand Council as Past Grand Sage. Also elected to Grand Council offices were Dennis V. Day, Alpha-Rho Chapter -Grand Second Counselor; Howard L. Vierra, Beta-Eta Chapter - Grand Third Counselor; John Williams, Epsilon-Psi Chapter - Grand Fourth Counselor; Mark A. Metz, Epsilon-Zeta Chapter - Grand Fourth Counselor; John Williams, Epsilon-Psi Chapter - Grand First Counselor; and Bruce Peterson, Upsilon Chapter -Grand Herald.

The Awards Banquet was opened by E. Andrew Morris, Executive Director, with the theme song of "The Blues Brothers". This was followed by the invocation given by Past Grand Sage, Gary B. Tash, from Beta-Pi Chapter at the University of Virginia.

Grand Sage Merino introduced the head table's honored guests, board members, past and present council members. Executive Director Morris then made the introductions of the staff and the "Drew's Brothers", including Paul Wendel and Kevin O'Rourke, who were co-chairmen of the overall programming of the Convocation.

Eleanor Fitzpatrick, mother of Karen M. Fitzpatrick and mother-in-law of E. Andrew Morris, was a special guest of the Convocation to present the awards named in honor of Karen, who was editor of the EMERALD magazine.

Sigma Pi International Sweetheart, LeAnne Rogers, representing the Epsilon-Kappa Chapter of Southern Arkansas University was presented to the standing ovation of the delegation.

The Past Grand Sage's Medallion was given to John J. Merino, Jr., in recognition of his eight years of service and contributions on the Grand Council. He then passed the gavel to his

successor, Greg J. Evans.

Four alumni were honored with Founder's Awards. Cletus A. Broecker, Eta Chapter at Purdue University, 1927, was awarded the Fraternity highest honor in recognition of his many years outstanding and superior contributions to the growth and development of Sigma Pi Fraternity, International. Brother Broecker has long been dedicated to the goals and purposes of Sigma Pi, and for many years has played a major role in promoting the Fraternity. He has served on the Grand Council, Sigma Pi Educational Fund Board of Trustees, and the Eta Chapter Alumni Association.

Major General **Ray D. Free**, Pi Chapter at the University of Utah, 1932, was honored in recognition of his many years of outstanding and superior contributions to the government of the United States of America. Brother Free is currently serving his fourth term in the Utah State House of Representatives. He was commissioned a Major General in June 1968. He is the recipient of many military decorations and awards, including the Distinguished Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart.

Moe M. Mitzman, Gamma-Kappa Chapter at the Indiana Institute of Technology, 1966, was honored in recognition of his many years of outstanding and superior contributions to the growth and development of Sigma Pi Fraternity, International. Brother Mitzman opened the Hickory Chemical Laboratories after graduating with a Chemical Engineering Degree. Over the years he has worked in industry and for the U.S. Government in engineering positions. Brother Mitzman organized Beta Sigma Tau at Tri State College and Indiana Institute of Technology, later to merge with Sigma Pi Fraternity.

The keynote speaker was **Hans M. Mark**, lota Chapter at the University of California-Berkeley, 1959, who received his Founder's Award in recognition of his many years of outstanding and superior contributions to the government of the United States of America and to higher education. Brother Mark was named Chancellor of The University of Texas System on May 30, 1984, after serving as Deputy Administrator of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and before that, as Secretary of the U.S. Air Force. Brother Mark now heads the fifth-ranking university system in the United States in enrollment, with more than 120,000 students.

The Multiple Sclerosis Awards were presented by Ms. Tracy White to the chapters which participated in fund raising efforts during 1987-88. Zeta-Beta Chapter once again won the top award with \$34,500 raised during the past two years.

The Bayard Award was presented to Mary Peterson. Coordinator of Greek Affairs at the University of Iowa. The new award was developed by the Grand Council to recognize the outstanding and devoted service of a university administrator to Greek Letter Societies.

Darrell L. Spriggs, President of the Sigma Pi Educational Fund presented the individual and chapter awards in recognition in the pursuit of scholastic excellence in the fraternity.

The Grand Sage's Award, presented to the chapter for the best all around chapter operations, went to California Sate University-Fullerton. Epsilon-Nu Chapter demonstrated outstanding efficiency, membership, scholarship, campus position, payment of financial obligations, individual campus participation, and chapter achievements. This was the second time the chapter has won the Grand Sage's Award since their founding in 1977.

We have also converted our old kitchen into a mini-gym. Through donations from the brother-hood, it is equipped with weights, a speed bag, and a heavy bag.


This spring was filled with many fun activities, including a hog roast, the annual "Suite Cram", and Greek Week.





New York Times, NY · May 25 · To the Editor: Fraternities on college campuses have been making headlines, some justified by tragic incidents that include hazing deaths and discrimination. The result: a small, but strong vocal appeal has been issued on and off campuses for the revocation of the charters of all Greek organizations ("Lessons" column, May 11)

The other side to fraternities rarely makes headlines. Some Greek organizations are strong supporters of non-profit health organizations. In particular, Sigma Pi and Theta Xi have made outstanding contributions to their national philanthropy, the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, through the Students Against Multiple Sclerosis program on more than 200 campuses.

Students raise funds and awareness for the fight against multiple sclerosis, which short-circuits the central nervous systems of more than 200 young adults each week.

The Sigma Pi Fraternity will be awarded the 1988 outstanding organization volunteer service award for its contribution toward eradicating this disabler of young adults. The Theta Xi Fraternity won this honor two years ago.

More than half the 235 Students Against Multiple Sclerosis chairmen are members of fraternities and sororities. Students raised almost \$40,000 last year to support our research efforts to find the cure for multiple sclerosis and provide local services to those with the disease. The University of Missouri at Columbia was this year's top fund-raising campus, having raised \$28,000 because of the combined effort of more than 35 Greek organizations.

In judging fraternities, the good must be included with the bad. Many exemplify and encourage student leadership and commitment, qualities that will produce tomorrow's leaders.

This event had many attractions, such as the Pepsi bmx bike trick team, costumes, games and prizes for the kids, a quartet, music, and along with thousands of raffle tickets. Since the first year the event has blossomed. We now have Radio, TV, and newspaper coverage for publicity. Pepsi has been our major sponsor, which has helped us get started. Support from our community has enhanced the fund raiser greatly.

This year our Chapter has received the 1988 Community Service Award from W.P.I.. Our chapter is always striving for better relations with our neighbors.

There is still no cure for Multiple Sclerosis as yet, but it is a great feeling knowing that 65 brothers in our chapter had contributed \$23,525 during the past three years toward that cause. 
