The Deloitte Technology Fast 50 in Central Europe is a program that recognises and profiles fast growing technology companies in the region. The program, which is now in its 13th year, ranks the 50 fastest growing public or private technology companies. Technology Fast 50 award winners for 2012 are determined based on percentage fiscal year revenue growth over five years (2007 to 2011).

Revenue growth is calculated in local currency.

Companies must meet a minimum revenue threshold
(in Euros) in order to qualify. Exchange rates are based
on annual average given by the central bank of the
company's respective national currency.

The program includes the following related industry sectors:

- Software
- Internet
- · Computers and peripherals.
- Telecommunications/Networking
- · Media and Entertainment

The Deloitte Technology Fast 50 Program in Central Europe recognises technology companies that have achieved the fastest rates of annual revenue growth in the region during the past five years (2007 to 2011). It is part of the global Fast 500 programme.

Technology companies are invited to self-nominate for the program via our website.

Financial data about the companies is provided by the entrants themselves and is gathered via our online survey tool. This information is then cross-checked using each company's financial statements which have been verified by their accountants or a registered auditor.

  of the past 5 years. Exchange rates are based or
  annual average given by the central bank of the
  company's respective national currency.
- Been in business for a minimum of five years.
- 3. 2011 revenues in excess of € 25 million
- Be headquartered within Central Europe.
   Subsidiaries or divisions are not eligible unless they have some public ownership and are separately traded.

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
# CEO Survey highlights

The 2012 Technology Fast 50 CEO Survey is based on responses from over 130 CEOs of companies within the technology industry in the Central European region that applied for and met the criteria for this year's Fast 50.

#### **Survey respondents**


Most of the respondents were from the Software sector (54%), followed by Internet (28%) and Telecoms/Networking (10%).

#### Survey respondents breakdown by business sector 2012




Nearly half of the CEOs (48%) were located in Poland, followed by the Czech Republic (15%) and Hungary (13%).

Looking at company size, 48% were CEOs from a company with between 25 and 99 employees and 27% from a company with more than 100 employees.

#### Survey respondents breakdown by company size




#### **Personal challenge**

The biggest personal challenge for 31% of CEOs is developing leaders and delegating responsibility, up from 27% last year. For 24% of them it is achieving and

sustaining profitability and 21% responded that it is engaging employees in the company's vision.

#### Biggest personal challenge as a CEO




#### **Growth factors and threats**

65% of CEOs felt that high-quality employees contributed the most to their growth this year, down from 70% in 2011. Meanwhile 44% attributed part of

their growth to developing existing products or services, down from 51% last year.


#### Factors contributing to growth in the previous 12 months



CEOs reported that the most important contributing factor to growth over the next 12 months is high-quality employees, down to 48% from 55% last year.

Fewer CEOs reported that developing existing products or services is a critical growth factor, with only 31% feeling this way compared to 51% in 2011.


#### Factors contributing to growth over the next 12 months



The biggest threat to growth remains access to skilled labour according to 60% of CEOs. 36% of CEOs see a threat in limited access to capital, while 34% are wary

of increased competition from emerging powers, down from the 43% who felt this way in 2011.


#### Threats to growth in technology sector over the next 12 months



#### **Confidence level of growth**


89% of CEOs are either very or extremely confident of growth over the next 12 months: 61% are very confident while 28% are extremely confident.

Organic growth is the most likely scenario for the company within the next 12 months for 83% of CEOs.


#### Confidence level of growth over the next 12 months



#### **Expected revenue growth**

32% of CEOs expect revenue growth of between 11% and 25%, 29% expect growt between 26% and 50%.

#### Expected revenue growth over the next 12 months




#### **Growth potential**

CEOs still expect the greatest growth potential to come from cloud computing, with 64% expressing


this opinion. Only 29% of CEOs see potential in social networks, down from 52% in 2011.

#### Growth potential of technology sub-segments over the next year



Cloud computing is still viewed by CEOs as having the most potential over the next 1-3 years, though only 61% chose it compared to 78% in 2011. More CEOs are seeing medium-term potential in business software, which grew by 4 points to 41%. Nanotechnology, meanwhile, is viewed by CEOs as less attractive (31% compared to 41% in 2011).

#### Growth potential of technology sub-segments over the next 1-3 years




#### **Talent and performance management**

The biggest HR challenge for CEOs remains performance management and improvement. More CEOs reported finding leadership skills of managers a challenge.

The identification and development of high potential employees, one of the biggest challenges in 2011 with 51% of respondents, was only selected by 38% of CEOs this year.


#### **HR** challenges as CEO



The top three people-related factors contributing to growth remain the same as last year. Similar to last year, most CEOs (78%) selected technical skills and

know-how of employees as the people-related factor most contributing to growth.


#### People related factors contributing to growth over previous 12 months



CEOs reported that the biggest people-related threats to growth over the next 12 months will be limited availability of high quality candidates, with

67% expressing this view. Some CEOs see a threat in an unavailability of the right skills portfolio (37%) or in an inability to attract specific types of talent (31%).


#### Expected people related threats over the next 12 months



CEOs reported that they attract and retain employees through career growth opportunities (74%), flexible

working hours (68%) and interesting work assignments (66%).


#### Ways of attracting & retaining employees



The most common activity identified by CEOs to develop their talent was corporate culture, with 76% of respondents expressing this view compared to 68% in 2011. Internal trainings are nearly as common as they

were last year, while more CEOs chose coaching and mentoring (59% over 54% in 2011) and special projects for employees (56% versus 47% last year) as talent-development activities being run in their companies.
