ALLGOOD-BAILEY STADIUM

Fans attending Miner football games have beautiful surroundings to watch games on the campus. Allgood-Bailey Stadium is in its 46th year as the home of the Miners and the facility has undergone a few changes over the years.

The most recent makeover took place following the 2000 season, thanks to a \$1.5 million gift from alumnus and former Miner player Keith Bailey and his wife, Pat. The couple's donation led to the construction of lights, a new restroom and concession facility for the stadium and an all-weather track for the university's track and field program. In the summer of 2006, the locker room facilities were renovated and the seating areas on both sides of the stadium were updated this summer.



During the groundbreaking ceremony in October 2000, S&T officials announced that the stadium complex would be named Allgood-Bailey Stadium in honor of retired S&T coach Dewey Allgood. Bailey, a 1964 graduate of S&T who served as chair, president and chief executive officer of The Williams Companies Inc. in Tulsa, says Allgood was a major influence during Bailey's years at S&T.

Allgood spent 40 years as a coach at the university and was the Miners' head football coach when the facility, built as part of a package with the Gale Bullman Multi-Purpose Building, opened for play in 1967.

The stadium retained the name of the old field which hosted Miner football from 1915 to 1966. It was named for alumnus Daniel Cowan Jackling, who donated \$5,000 to construct the original Jackling Field that stood just south of Bishop Avenue; the location is now the site of several campus buildings near the Curtis Laws Wilson Library. A plaque on campus between the Humanities/Social Science and Computer Science buildings marks the spot where the original field was located.

The current facility seats 8,000 spectators, with a steel grandstand on the east side and another set of bleachers on the opposite side. A dressing room facility, which includes locker rooms, meeting rooms, storage areas and offices, is located at the south end of the facility. The 810-square-foot stadium press box stands atop the west stands.

The first game in the facility was played in 1967, before the stadium was completed. A total of 5,000 temporary bleachers were used during the first year and the complex was completed by the start of the 1969 season.

The 73rd Missouri General Assembly provided \$2 million for the construction project in 1965. Construction was performed by the Maggi Construction Co. Inc. of Rolla. In the summer of 1998, a new grass playing field was installed by Munie Outdoor Services of Caseyville, Ill., the same firm that installed the grass baseball field at St. Louis' Busch Stadium II. Maggi Inc. and CSE Enterprises were the lead contractors during the 2001 stadium renovation.

ABOUT MISSOURI S&T



Campus overview

Missouri S&T is one of the top technological research universities in the nation. Surrounded by Ozarks scenery (Rolla is about 100 miles west of St. Louis), the campus is accessible, safe and friendly. Known for its engineering programs, S&T also offers degrees in the sciences, liberal arts, humanities and business. Over 7,000 students are currently enrolled in classes, making S&T big enough to accommodate a diverse population but small enough for individuals to stand out.

S&T students are expected to actively participate in the processes of getting an education, whether that means joining a student design team, participating in intercollegiate athletics, conducting research with faculty members, helping to assure safe drinking water in a Central American community, or planning activities for the campus's next St. Pat's celebration. Upon graduation, these experienced students are in extremely high demand by companies across the nation and around the world.

Without exceptional faculty members and involved alumni, it wouldn't be possible to give these students a world-class education. The campus currently employs astronauts, bridge builders, chemists, filmmakers, historians, pyrotechnicians, rocket scientists, solar energy experts and video bloggers. S&T graduates, many of whom give time and money back to the university, work on the International Space Station, play professional poker, run NASCAR teams, search for cancer cures, win Academy Awards and lead Fortune 500 companies.

S&T is a campus in motion. With more than 200 student organizations on campus, there's a place for everyone to get involved. Students can be seen pedaling human-powered vehicles in the shadow of Toomey Hall, the new mechanical and aerospace engineering complex, or building solar-powered cars and houses. Mining engineers are growing oil-producing algae underground while materials scientists are learning how to mend broken bones with glass in their laboratories.

Founded in 1870, the University of Missouri School of Mines and Metallurgy was the first technological institution west of the Mississippi River. One of four campuses in the University of Missouri System, the name was changed to the University of Missouri-Rolla in 1964 and changed to its current name of Missouri University of Science and Technology in 2008.

ATHLETICS AT MISSOURI S&T

About athletics

Missouri S&T boasts a competitive athletic program as a member of NCAA Division II and the Great Lakes Valley Conference in all of its sports except for swimming (aligned with the New South Intercollegiate Swimming Conference); the GLVC will be playing its first season of football in 2012. With the addition of volleyball in 2007, S&T fields eight men's and seven women's varsity teams.

Missouri S&T student-athletes have shown success at the national level both on the field and in the classroom.


On the field

S&T has had teams that have finished in the top 10 at the national level for 14 of the past 16 seasons. S&T has won four NCAA national championships on an individual basis in swimming during the past seven seasons, with Zlatan Hamzic capturing the title in the 200-yard breaststroke at the 2009 NCAA Division II Championships. S&T's 200-yard freestyle relay team won back-to-back Division II championships in 2001 and 2002, while the 400-yard freestyle relay team took home a national title in 2002. The Miner swimming team has finished among the top four in the nation in three of the past six years, headed by a runner-up finish at the 2008 national meet.

Missouri S&T's men's track and field team swept the GLVC championships in 2009 and combined with the women's team to send eight individuals to national competition -- and all of them finished among the top eight to earn All-America honors.

S&T's men's soccer, women's basketball, baseball and volleyball teams have all qualified for NCAA post-season play during the course of the last two athletic seasons, with the men's soccer team reaching the championship game of the 2010 NCAA Midwest Regional. Since 1935, Missouri S&T athletic teams have won or shared 37 league titles in the conference in which it was affiliated.





MISSOURI S&T ALL-AMERICA SELECTIONS



Ed Kromka (1941): Kromka was the first Miner to earn All-America honors as he was named to the Little All-America Team. Kromka, who died in 1971, was one of the charter inductees into the Miner Athletic Hall of Fame in 1987.



Frank Winfield (1969): Winfield was named to the Kodak All-America Team at offensive guard after a standout year that saw S&T post its first winning record in years. Winfield was inducted into Miner Athletic Hall of Fame in 1990.



Merle Dillow (1974): Dillow was chosen to the Kodak All-America Team after a 50-catch, 786-yard season. He shares the record with eight touchdown catches in one season. Dillow was inducted into the Miner Athletic Hall of Fame in 2000.



Bill Grantham (1980): Grantham was named to the Kodak All-America Team after helping lead the Miners to a 10-0 record and No. 10 final national ranking in 1980. He holds the MIAA record with 29 career interceptions. Grantham was inducted into the Miner Athletic Hall of Fame in



Eivind Listerud (1993): Listerud was the chosed to Kodak's All-America team following the 1993 season when he was one of the nation's most accurate placekickers. Listerud made 12 of his 13 field goal attempts and scored a team-high 56 points. He also earned second-team GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors that season.



Cole Drussa (2003-04): Drussa was the first Miner player to earn All-America honors in two different seasons, doing so following the 2003 and 2004 campaigns. In 2003, he earned second-team All-America honors from Football Gazette after a year in which he was among the national reception leaders for tight ends. Drussa caught 55 passes for 601 yards on the season with five touchdowns in 2003. The following season, Drussa was a consensus All-America pick after catching

69 passes for 790 yards and seven touchdowns. He was a first-team All-America pick by Daktronics and Football Gazette, second-team by D2Football. com and third team on the Associated Press Little All-America Team. In addition, he was a first-team choice to ESPN The Magazine's Academic All-America Team.


Joe Winters (2006): Winters was named to Football Gazette's All-America squad as an honorable mention pick after breaking the school record for passing yards in a season with 3,724. Winters also threw 35 touchdown passes on



the season to earn first-team all-conference honors in the Great Lakes Football Conference.

Ashton Gronewold (2005-06-07): Gronewold completed a standout career in the 2007 season by being selected to the Associated Press Little All-America First Team, Daktronics and Football Gazette second team and D2Football.com third team. In 2007, he accumulated a school record 2,250 yards and was named a regional finalist for the Harlon Hill Award, given to the top player in NCAA Division II. As a junior, he was selected to the Associated Press Little All-America second team, Football Gazette's third team and D2Football.com's honorable mention squad after a season where he broke the S&T singleseason marks for receiving. He holds the Miners' seasonal marks for receptions with 87 (set in 2007), yards with 1,120 (2006) and touchdown catches with 17 set in 2005, as well as the career marks in all three categories. In 2005, Gronewold netted honorable mention All-America laurels from Football Gazette. He was named Great Lakes Football Conference's "Offensive Player of the Year" in 2006.

Bryan Crider (2009): Crider earned a spot on the Associated Press Little All-America team following a senior year in which he caught 57 passes for 604 yards and four touchdowns. The 57 catches gave Crider a total of 142 for his career.



the most by any tight end in Miner history. During the season, Crider had a 12-catch, 134-yard performance against Saint Francis (Ind.), including a key 24-yard reception in S&T's game-winning drive.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA SELECTIONS

S&T is proud of its academic reputation as one of the top institutions for science and technology. The results are shown in the consistently strong performance of the student-athletes on the S&T campus.

During the 2011-12 academic year, over 200 student-athletes at S&T finished with a 3.0 or better GPA, a total that included 38 members of the football team. The university also had 148 individuals named to the academic teams in the past year that were released by the Great Lakes Valley Conference, Great Lakes Football Conference and New South Intercollegiate Swimming Conference.

A total of 125 S&T student-athletes were selected to the GLVC's All-Academic team for the 2011-12 school year, one of 10 schools in the 16-team conference with at least 100 named to that squad.

S&T student-athletes have won 61 Academic All-America awards, as selected by CoSIDA and its program sponsors, and 191 Academic All-District awards during the past 20 years. In addition, numerous teams and individuals have been honored for their success as student-athletes by their various national organizations.

In the past year, six S&T student-athletes earned Capital One Academic All-America honors. A total of 13 individuals were named to their selected Academic All-District teams during the 2011-12 season. S&T has had 30 Academic All-America selections over the past eight seasons for a total of 40 since 2000, the fifth-best total in NCAA Division II.



Chad Shockley is the most recent Miner to earn Academic All-America honors, landing his award following the 2010 season.



HEAD COACH DAVID BROWN



Brown officially assumed the head coaching duties March 15, 2010 and is the 14th head coach in the history of the Miner program -- and only the sixth since 1937.

"It is an honor and a privilege to be the head football coach at Missouri S&T," Brown said. "S&T is a great place to get a first-class education, play competitive football and live in one of the best regions in the country," Brown said. "I look forward to coaching and recruiting the type of student-athletes who strive to attain All-America status on the field and in the classroom."

"I am exceedingly pleased to have David on our staff," said S&T director of athletics Mark Mullin. "He brings tremendous experience and enthusiasm to our program. The common theme that emerged was that David is an outstanding person, tremendous coach and rising star in the coaching ranks of college football and the interview process did nothing but reinforce that."

Missouri S&T posted a 6-5 record under Brown's direction during the 2011 season, the first winning season for the Miners since the 2008 campaign. The Miners went 4-1 on their home field in the process -- losing only to a Midwestern State team that finished the regular season undefeated and ranked No. 2 in the nation -- and the mark included a win over a highly-regarded Lindenwood team in Rolla.

The Miners' performance in the 2011 season helped earn Brown share the Great Lakes Football Conference's "Coach of the Year" honor with Urbana's Dave Taynor.

The Miners went 3-8 during Brown's first season as head coach, but the Miners were able to win the Great Lakes Football Conference title when they pulled out a late victory at Saint Joseph's in their next-to-last game of the season.

Over his four seasons at Ohio, Brown served as the defensive backs coach and also worked with aspects of the special teams. He was in charge of the punt return unit and also assisted with the punt and kickoff teams.

During his stint at Ohio, the Bobcat defense was been one of the best in the nation, ranking among the top 20 at the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Series level in pass efficiency defense and leading the nation with 38 turnovers gained in the 2009 season. It was a year that saw the Bobcats win the Eastern Division title in the Mid-

America Conference and earn a berth to the Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl to face Marshall University.

It was the second division title and bowl appearance for the Bobcats since 2006, when Ohio played the University of Southern Mississippi that season in the GMAC Bowl.



Ohio's defense also ranked 29th overall, 15th in pass efficiency and 18th against the pass in 2006, with two members of that team's secondary ranking as the top two players in the MAC in passes defender per game.

Prior to joining the staff at Ohio, Brown spent five seasons on the staff at Cal Polytechnic State University in San Luis Obispo, Calif., serving as the team's defensive coordinator in the 2004 and 2005 seasons. Cal Poly won the Great West title in each of those two seasons and earned its first berth – and victory – in NCAA Division I-AA (now Division I Football Championship Series) championship play in 2005.

In the two years as defensive coordinator, Brown headed one the top units in Division I-AA. Both teams led the nation in quarterback sacks, with the 2005 squad recording a school record of 67. The 2004 squad led the nation in rushing defense by allowing an average of just 84.3 yards per game and also ranked among the top 10 nationally in scoring defense, turnovers gained and interceptions, while the punt return team averaged better than 12 yards per return.

The Mustangs also had the recipient of the Buck Buchanan Award for the top defensive player in Division I-AA in 2004 in linebacker Jordan Beck and again the following season when defensive end Chris Gocong – who led the nation with 23.5 sacks – landed the honor.

Brown was the Mustangs' linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator in his first three seasons at Cal Poly and also assisted with the kickoff and punt return teams.

Throughout the years at both Ohio and Cal Poly, Brown's return units have also ranked high nationwide with seven of the nine teams posting team averages of better than 10 yards per runback.

In total, Brown has coached six All-America performers at four different positions (one linebacker, two cornerbacks, one safety and three return specialists), including five at Cal Poly and one at Idaho State, where

In the summer of 2004, Brown participated in the National Football League's minority internship program with the Detroit Lions. In the spring of 2005, he traveled to Tokyo, Japan to help teach the Fujitsu Frontiers' coaching staff on defensive and overall coaching strategies.

Brown has also served stint as the defensive coordinator at Venice High School in Los Angeles, Calif., the defensive coordinator for the Cologne Crocodiles in Cologne, Germany, the defensive backs coach at Claremont McKenna College in Claremont, Calif., and the defensive backs coach at Allan Hancock College in Santa Maria, Calif..

"Our team will play with great effort and lots of enthusiasm," Brown said. "We will place a high level of importance on special teams play. We'll use an aggressive, attacking style of defense and will get the ball in the hands of our playmakers on offense."

A native of Los Angeles, Brown earned his associate's degree from Santa Monica College in 1992 and went on to receive a bachelor's degree in physical education from Cal Poly in 1996. He was a two-year member of the Mustangs' football team, leading the squad with 69 tackles and intercepting three passes in 1994. As a senior, when he was a team captain, he registered 54 tackles and three interceptions.

Brown also received a master's of education degree in cross-cultural teaching from the National University in San Diego in 2000.

COACHING STAFF



Nate Saum, Assistant Coach (Offensive Coordinator)

Nate Saum is in his third season as the offensive coordinator for the Missouri S&T football team.

A year ago, the Miners made significant improvement on the offensive side of the ball, averaging 342.3 yards per game of offense, including an average of 141.2 yards a game on the ground that was the highest mark for an S&T team since 2008.

During his first season with the Miners, he worked with one of the top receivers in the nation in Chad Shockley, who finished 10th in NCAA Division II for pass receptions with 87 and 14th in yardage with a school record 1,187 yards.

Saum was a graduate assistant at Ohio University during the 2009 season and worked as a student assistant on the Bobcats' staff for four seasons prior to that, working with the team's running backs. One of the players he coached, Kalvin McRae, posted back-to-back seasons with over 1,000 yards rushing and set the school record with 4,398 career rushing yards.

A running back on two state championship teams during his high school career at Amanda (Ohio) Clearcreek High School, Saum earned his Bachelor's degree in physical education from Ohio University in 2009.



Brett Sykes, Assistant Coach (Defensive Line)

Brett Sykes, a former defensive lineman at Ohio University, is in his third season on the Missouri S&T coaching staff in 2012 and will work with the Miners' defensive line.

A year ago, he guided a defensive line contingent that recorded a large percentage of the team's 34 quarterback sacks and 91 tackles behind the line of scrimmage.

Sykes spent seven seasons in the Ohio program, five as a player from 2003-07 and two as defensive quality control working with the defensive line and assistant strength and conditioning during the 2009 campaign. As a player, he appeared in every game throughout his collegiate career at defensive tackle and totaled 92 tackles during his four seasons of eligibility.

As a senior, he finished with 37 tackles (15 solo) from the defensive tackle spot and finished fifth in the Mid-America Conference among defensive linemen with 27 tackles during the 2005 season.

Originally from Cleveland, Ohio, Sykes received his bachelor's degree in recreation management from Ohio in 2007. Sykes and his wife, Malory, live in Rolla.


George Booker begins his second season on the Miner staff in 2012, where he will serve as the linebacker coach in the upcoming season. Booker came to Missouri S&T after a stint at Western Washington University in Bellingham, Wash., where he was the defensive line coach for the Vikings.

At Western Washington, Booker assisted the defensive unit on run defense adjustments and pass protecton schemes, while also managing the team's video personnel. He also handled the administrative support for recruiting multi-cultural students and athletes at WWU.

the University of Idaho, San Diego State University, Montana State University and Cal Polytechnic State University, handling the defensive line coaching duties at each of those stops. Booker was also an assistant coach at Santa Monica Catholic High School in California, where coordinated the defensive line and served as the team's academic advisor.

In addition, Booker served for three seasons in the National Football League's minority coaching fellowship, spending the 1998 and 1999 summers with the Minnesota Vikings and 2002 with the Dallas Cowboys.

Booker was an all-league performer as a defensive tackle and center at Santa Monica Catholic during his prep career and was an all-league defensive tackle at Western Washington in 1992, where he earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science and recreation in 1993. He is the father of three children, Elijah, 13; Sydnee, 11; and Chloe, 9.



Andrew Ravadge, Assistant Coach (Offensive Line)

Andrew Ravadge, who started at center for the Missouri S&T football team for two seasons and has assisted the Miner coaching staff for the last three years, is in his second season as the offensive line coach for the Miners.

Ravadge worked with an offensive line unit that allowed the Miners to post their highest per game rushing average since 2008 during the 2011 campaign. As a unit, the Miner offense averaged 5.1 yards per play last season and 342.3 yards per game.

I'm very proud to have Andrew as our offensive line coach," said Miner head coach David Brown. "He is a true Miner. He's a very intelligent, hard working, tough young man who is passionate about the game of football. He's a great teacher.

Coach Ravadge has been a great role model for our young men," Brown added. "He can definitely relate to the challenges that our student-athletes fight through on a daily basis. I look forward to him helping us become successful on and off of the field for years to come."

Ravadge joined the Miner football program as a player in 2006 after spending two years at DeAnza College in California and one at Cal Polytechnic State University. He started in 18 games during the 2006 and 2007 seasons for the Miners at the center position.

He stayed in the Miner program as a student assistant and graduate assistant coach for the next three years, working with the offensive line for two seasons and with the tight ends during the 2010 campaign.

Ravadge, who received his bachelor's degree from Missouri S&T in business information systems, is originally from Cupertino, Calif., where he was a first-team all-conference selection and scholar-athlete at the high school level.



Gerold Rodriguez is in his second season on the Miner staff as a graduate assistant coach in charge of the wide receivers.

During the 2011 season, the Miners had four wide receivers that caught at least 20 passes and had one of the top wideouts in the Great Lakes Football Conference in Smook Thomas, who caught 52 passes and earned first-team all-conference honors.

Rodriguez played four seasons at that position at the collegiate level, spending two years at the University of Arizona and his last two at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas. He was an outstanding kick returner at UNLV, averaging 23.8 yards per return in the 2007 season.

Rodriguez is a native of Los Angeles, Calif., and is the cousin of J.P. Losman, who played with the Buffalo Bills in the National Football League.

SAT POOTBALL

Brandon Jordan, Assistant Coach (Offensive Line)

Brandon Jordan joins the Missouri S&T coaching staff this season and will assist with the offensive line, the position he played as a member of the Miners from 2007-09.

Jordan was a two-year starter for S&T, including the 2008 campaign in which the Miners won the Great Lakes Football Conference championship as part of a record-setting 7-4 season. Missouri S&T posted its highest modern day total of 408 points during that season.

Last summer, Jordan was a member of the United States' national team that took part in the fourth International Federation of American Football Senior World Championships in Austria, a tournament won by the U.S. team that was coached by former Northwest Missouri State head coach Mel Tjeerdsma. Jordan has also played professional football for the New Orleans Voodoo of the Arena Football League.

Jordan, a native of New Orleans, La., graduated from Missouri S&T with a degree in business management.





COACHING STAFF



D.J. Dace, Assistant Coach (Tight Ends)

D.J. Dace joins the Missouri S&T coaching staff this fall after spending the last season on the staff at Southeast Missouri State. Dace will assist with the tight ends in the 2012 season.

Dace was part of the Redhawks' staff a year ago under head coach Tony Samuel, the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award in 2010 as the national coach of the year. Dace assisted with the defensive line for the Redhawks during his one season on the staff.

Dace, who is from Cuba, Mo., played on the offensive line at Missouri Valley College and later transferred to Southeast, where he received his Bachelor's degree in physical education.



Luke Rayfield, Assistant Coach (Linebackers)

Luke Rayfield is in his first season on the Miner coaching staff after previously serving as a student assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State University. He will coach the flex linebackers at S&T this fall.

Rayfield spent two years on the staff headed by Tony Samuel, including the 2010 season when the Redhawks won their first Ohio Valley Conference championship and played in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. Rayfield worked with Southeast's special teams during that year and also spent both of his seasons working with the linebackers.



Rayfield, who is originally from Scott City, Mo., received a football scholarship to play at Central Methodist University before transferring to Southeast. He earned his bachelor's degree in education from Southeast in 2012.

Cory Sullivan, Assistant Coach (Running Backs)

Cory Sullivan, a former member of the coaching staff at Ohio University, is in his first year on the Miner staff and will work with the S&T running backs.

While at Ohio, Sullivan worked with the Bobcats' wide receivers, running backs and special teams and was also responsible for film breakdown, scout teams and charting opponent tendencies on game day. He spent four seasons on the Ohio staff working as a student assistant.



During his time at Ohio, the Bobcats appeared in three bowl games – the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl, R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl and Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. He is originally from Springfield, Ohio and played for Joel Marratta and Kenton Ridge High School; he graduated from OU in 2012 with a Bachelor's degree in sport sciences.

Dr. Cheryl B. Schrader, Missouri S&T Chancellor

Dr. Cheryl B. Schrader became the 21st chancellor of Missouri University of Science and Technology on April 2, 2012. A former president of the IEEE Control Systems Society, with more than 10,000 members worldwide, Schrader is one of the few female engineers to ascend to the top leadership position of a college or university in the United States.

Previously, Schrader was associate vice president for strategic research initiatives at Boise State University, a position she held from February 2011 until her appointment as S&T chancellor. While dean of Boise State's College of Engineering from 2003 to 2011, the college's undergraduate engineering enrollment increased by 60 percent, graduate enrollment increased by 36 percent, and funding for research grants and contracts in the college more than tripled.



Schrader earned a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering from Valparaiso University in 1984. She earned a master of science and Ph.D. degrees in electrical engineering from the University of Notre Dame in 1987 and 1991, respectively. Her research background is in the area of systems and control. A past president of the IEEE Control Systems Society, she continues to serve as a member of the ABET Engineering Accreditation Commission. This commission, which is dedicated to providing world leadership in stimulating innovation and excellence in engineering, today accredits 2,100 engineering programs at more than 400 colleges and universities.

Schrader began her teaching and research career at the University of Notre Dame while undertaking internships and consulting work with McDonnell Douglas Astronautics Co. in the early 1980s and Chimera Research in the early 1990s. Following a brief period as an adjunct assistant professor at Rice University in 1991, Schrader moved to the University of Texas at San Antonio, where she rose to serve as a tenured professor of electrical engineering and associate dean at both a college of sciences and a college of engineering. She then joined Boise State in 2003.

Passionate about increasing interest in STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) education, Schrader's current research interests focus on creating and assessing innovative learning methods to help students of all ages succeed in the STEM areas.

Schrader is a recipient of the Presidential Award for Excellence in Science, Mathematics and Engineering Mentoring from the White House (2005); the IEEE Education Society Hewlett-Packard/Harriett B. Rigas Award; the Idaho Women Making History Award; and the WebCT Exemplary Online Course Award. She was also named one of Valparaiso University's Top 150 Most Influential People.

Dr. Debra Robinson, Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs

Dr. Debra A.G. Robinson is in her 10th year as the campus's vice chancellor for student affairs. She took over the position Jan. 1, 2003, after spending two years as S&T's associate vice chancellor for student and international affairs.

Robinson joined the S&T student affairs staff in 1980 as a counseling psychologist. She later was assistant director and associate director of the S&T Counseling Center, and served as director of S&T's Center for Personal and Professional Development from 1990 through 2001. In 2001, she was appointed associate vice chancellor for student and international affairs.



She is responsible for directing S&T's leadership development programs, coordinating several administrative functions within the division, coordinating staff development and training efforts, and managing relationships with external constituents. She also serves as an adjunct faculty member in the engineering management department.

Robinson earned her bachelor of arts degree in psychology from the University of Illinois Springfield in 1976 and her master of arts and doctorate degrees in counseling psychology from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana in 1977 and 1980, respectively. She is a member of the American Psychological Association, the International Coaching Federation and the Society of Psychologists in Management. She also remains active as a management and coaching consultant, and has written numerous papers and book chapters on a broad array of topics, including leadership development, engineering education, career

MISSOURI S&T ADMINISTRATION



Mark Mullin, Director of Athletics

Mark Mullin is in his 21st year as Missouri S&T's director of athletics, where he oversees a program that won four championships while it was affiliated with the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association and several in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, while having numerous student-athletes win academic honors on both the conference and national levels.

During the 2011-12 school year, S&T had a very successful showings on the athletic field in several years, winning two division titles in the GLVC as well as capturing a championship in swimming through its affiliation. S&T had its volleyball team qualify for NCAA play after seeing three teams reach NCAA regional competition in the 2010-11 school year.



Missouri S&T recorded its highest finish ever in the U.S. Sports Academy
Director's Cup standings in 2007-08, a year in which S&T served as the host
institution for the 2008 NCAA Division II Swimming & Diving Championships; the Miners finished as the
national runner-up at that meet. During Mullin's tenure, Missouri S&T has also served as the host for the NCAA
South Central men's basketball regional, MIAA men's basketball finals in 1996, 1999 MIAA cross country
championships, 2008 GLVC cross country championships and 2010 and 2011 GLVC outdoor track & field
championships.

In addition to his duties as athletic director, Mullin served as swimming and diving coach for 12 years and led the Miners to a 96-27 dual meet record and seven regional championships. His final team finished third at the 1998 NCAA Division II Championships, the highest finish ever for an S&T athletic team at the time at an NCAA championship event.

Mullin has served two terms as the chair of the NCAA Division II men's and women's swimming and diving committee and is serving on the NCAA regional advisory committee in football for Super Region 3 this season. He completed a two-year term as the president of the MIAA after spending the two prior years as the conference's vice president prior to S&T's switch to the GLVC.

Dr. Jeff Cawlfield, NCAA Faculty Representative

Dr. Jeff Cawlfield, professor of geological engineering at Missouri S&T, is in his 10th year as the university's faculty representative to the NCAA. He took over the duties in January 2003 following the retirement of Dr. Jack Ridley, who had served in the role for the previous three years.

After joining the S&T faculty in 1987, Cawlfield was named professor of geological engineering in 1999 and became head of the geological engineering department the following year. He moved into the role of associate dean in 2001. Cawlfield received an S&T Sustained Excellence in Teaching award in 2003. Cawlfield received his bachelor's degree in civil engineering from Washington State University in 1981 and his master's and doctorate degrees at the University of California-Berkeley.



Cawlfield is also an Honorary Knight of St. Patrick, an honor he received in 2002 along with a group that included Dr. Manuel Pacheco prior to his retirement as president of the University of Missouri System. He was selected by Pacheco to attend the first UM Administrative Leadership Development Program during the 2000-01 academic year.

Sarah Moore, Assistant Director of Athletics/Senior Women's Administrator

Sarah Moore is in her 10th year as the assistant director of athletics at S&T, where she also serves as the senior women's administrator. In addition to her administrative duties within the athletics department, Moore is also the chair of the physical education and recreation department.

Moore spent 13 seasons as the head coach for the S&T cross country and men's track programs and 18 seasons as the head coach of the women's track squad before moving into the administrative level. She is a 1973 graduate of Union University and is in her 28th year at S&T, where she has also coached the Lady Miner softball and tennis teams. While serving as track coach, she completed a six-year term as a member of the NCAA Track and Field committee.

Debbie Hickey, Officer of NCAA Compliance/Budget

Debbie Hickey is in her 16th year as the university's budget and NCAA compliance officer for the university's department of intercollegiate athletics.

Hickey is in charge of handling all NCAA eligibility matters for the 300-plus student athletes in the Missouri S&T athletics program. She is in her 23rd year at the university, previously serving in the accounting and fiscal services office.

After posting its first winning season since 2008 last fall, Missouri S&T's goal for the 2012 campaign is not only to finish on the plus side of the ledger again, but to contend for the first Great Lakes Valley Conference football championship.

With the GLVC sponsoring football for the first time this fall, the Miners come into the season figuring to be one of the top contenders for the title. But in order to reach that goal, they need to stay injury-free and make improvements in some key areas, some of them that did better their numbers a season ago.

"One of the biggest things we did last year was improve in the turnover battle," said S&T head coach David Brown. "We went from 102nd in turnovers lost to a tie for seventh in that category. However, we have to get more on the defensive side and with an improved secondary, I think we'll be able to do a bettter job of complimenting our pass rush."

The 2012 Miners will be an experienced group with 20 seniors dotting the roster and with 20 returning juniors on top of that, a number of players who have seen plenty of playing time as Miners possess many of the top two lines of S&T's pre-season depth chart.

The Miners will begin their season at home for the first time since 2007 when they host Oklahoma Panhandle State on Sept. 1 at Allgood-Bailey Stadium. Following a Thursday night road game at Arkansas Tech, S&T will begin its inaugural GLVC season Sept. 15 at McKendree. Back-to-back home tilts with Kentucky Wesleyan and Indianapolis will follow, then the Miners will play twice at home in October against William Jewell and Urbana.

Quarterbacks

With a full season under his belt, Josh Firm has a solid hold on the starting quarterback position for Missouri S&T as the 2012 season nears. What falls in behind Firm on the depth chart, however, is where some real competition is expected to take place.

Following a season in which he threw for 1,826 yards and 14 touchdowns, Firm heads into the season as the starter as confirmed by Brown. He followed that up in the spring game by throwing for 227 yards on 16 completions.

"Josh played well for us last fall and has had a great off-season," Brown said of his quarterback who completed 150 of his 288 throws in 2011 with only four interceptions.

We look to continue to take care of the football and that was definitely one our strengths in 2011," Brown said. "Finishing drives with points is always a point of emphasis and we will continue to work to improve in that area."

However, Firm is only quarterback on the roster with game experience at the collegiate level.

The competition for the backup role begins with two redshirt freshmen, Evan Merz and Reed Brown. Merz, who stands 6-6, was good on eight of his 16 passes in the spring game while Brown did not take part in that contest as he was playing on the S&T baseball team at the time.

Another newcomer to the Miner roster in the spring, Kyle Livengood, did play in the spring contest and was 10-of-17 passing for 98 yards after coming from Missouri Valley College.

S&T is also looking at a pair of talented freshman to compete for the No. 2 spot at quarter back in Peter Simpson and Logan Fitch. Simpson, a product of St. Louis' Lindbergh High School, threw 20 touchdown passes as a senior and 39 in two years as the Flyers' starting quarterback, while Fitch, who comes to S&T from Columbia's Hickman High School, was a mobile signalcaller who threw for nearly 1,000 yards as a senior.

Running Backs

Despite losing their top rusher from the 2011 season, Missouri S&T will bring a deep stable of running backs into the 2011 season.

With the loss of Ryan Taylor – who ran for 625 yards and seven touchdowns last year – along with three others who ranked among the team's top five runners in terms of yardage last fall, one would think the Miners would be a bit thin this area. But as the spring game showed, there's plenty for Brown to be optimistic about with regards to the running game.

The one returner among the top five rushers in 2011 is Curterris Golden, a senior who scored seven times and ran for 472 yards last season. Golden comes into the 2012 campaign less than 500 yards away from the top 10 on the all-time rushing list at Missouri S&T.

"Curterris has had many memorable runs during his career," Brown said. "He is a player that we feel can set the tone for our running game as he battles for yardage on every carry."

Behind Golden is junior Anthony Moore, who had 29 carries in a limited role as a freshman, but spent his sophomore season playing in the secondary. He will be joined by redshirt freshman Scott Hendricks, who had an impressive spring outing and is arguably the fastest player on the Miner roster.

Anthony had a good spring and is expected to contribute this fall," Brown said. "Scott is an explosive player that had a good spring. It's not likely that he'll get caught from behind once he gets into the open field."

Three freshmen – David Hughes II, Tyler Dawidowski and Brent LaPietra, who threw for Missouri S&T's track team last spring -- will also compete for time at the running back position.

Wide Receivers/Tight Ends

While there may be inexperience in the second and third levels of the depth chart at quarterback and running back, the same can't be said at the wide receiver and tight end positions, where Missouri S&T has a bevy of players that have already contributed to the team's success in the past year.

At wideout, the Miners bring back their top four pass catchers from the 2011 season, led by senior Smook Thomas. Thomas, who earned first-team all-conference honors in the Great Lakes Football Conference as both a receiver and kick returner last fall, caught a team-high 52 passes for 675 yards and already ranks among the top 10 in school history for receptions. Thomas should also reach the top 10 for receiving yards early in the 2012 campaign.

"Smook Thomas will end his career as one of our all-time greats," said Brown. "He is a special player to watch. He is a threat to score whenever he touches the ball. He is also an extremely hard worker that sets a great example for his teammates."



Smook Thomas led the Miners in receiving and earned all-conference honors in that capacity and as a kick returner following the 2011 season.

After a slow start in 2011, Joseph Hyman finished as S&T's second-leading pass catcher with 25 for 401 yards and six touch-downs – with all of the scoring catches coming in the second half of the season. Hyman and Thomas will be joined at wide receiver by senior Kevin Dillon, who also caught 25 balls a year ago and Leon Moody, a talented sophomore who had 20 catches in his first season as a Miner.

"Hyman has big play ability and had a strong second half of the season, which he carried into the off-season. He does a great job of attacking the football when it is in the air.

"Kevin Dillon is healthy and ready for a great senior season," Brown added. "He has been a consistent deep threat throughout his career. Leon Moody is one of the hardest working guys on the team. He is very dependable. He'll be there to make plays when called upon."

Dillon had a 72-yard scoring catch last year in the Miners' victory over Lindenwood, matching the longest touchdown reception for a Miner in 2011 with returner Nick Taylor, who will add depth at that position with returners Adam Clark, Danny Fishkind and Clay Kinman. Redshirt freshman Marc-Alan Tucker and incoming freshman Jaren Underwood are also expected to contend for playing time.

At tight end, lan Kreher made a successful transition to the offensive side of the football in 2011 and enters the season as the projected starter. Kreher finished with only four receptions, but did a solid job in the blocking department as the Miners had their highest rushing average in four seasons last fall.

"lan Kreher had a good junior year and we look for him having an even better senior year," Brown said. "He is a tough physical football player and makes that known every time he steps on the field."

S&T has plenty of experience back at tight end as well with the return of Jon Pischak, Alex Leach and Jake Giljum – who scored touchdowns on both of his pass receptions last season – as well as redshirt freshman Cody Burgess, who Brown noted could play a big role in the offense this fall.

Offensive Line

The key to any successful offense begins with the play of its offensive line. And the more experience that line has, the better the chances for success lie.

In the case of Missouri S&T's offensive line for the upcoming 2012 season, it is one where a lot of good things can happen with eight of the 10 players on the pre-season two-deep having seen a good deal of playing time in their careers as Miners.

Last season, the Miners averaged 141.2 yards per game on the ground, which was possible due to a line that produced two all-conference performers in center Pat Lang and guard Michael Underbrink. Lang, a senior, was named as the Great Lakes Football Conference's "Offensive Lineman of the Year", while Underbrink had a solid junior season right next to him.

The Miners could have as many as four past all-league players along the offensive line this fall with return of tackle Matt Mast and guard Brian Peterson, both of whom were sidelined for the 2011 season due to injuries.

"We're happy to have veterans like Pat Lang, Mike Underbrink, Brian Peterson and Matt Mast back," said S&T head coach David



Brown. "They all have great work ethics and have played a lot of good football. They'll play a large role in our pursuit of the league championship."

In addition to the four aforementioned players, the Miners also have experienced hands back in senior center Malcolm Booth and sophomores Forrestal Hickman – who made the Miners' starting lineup as a freshman at tackle – and Mark Parra and Zach Hargrove. Newcomer Collin Powers, a transfer from Glendale Community College, will also bring collegiate experience to the unit.

"Forrestal Hickman and Mark Parra had very productive freshmen seasons," Brown said. "They are fighting to be fixtures at our tackle positions for years to come. Collin Powers can play guard or tackle and will be in the mix for a starting position. Hargrove has big time ability. He is a hard worker and should be a dominant player for us."

Returning letterman Tom Schneider will also be in competition for a role on the offensive line as will redshirt freshman Vince Fricke and newcomer Sam Knesel.

"There will be a lot of competition for playing time along the offensive line. We have a good number of seniors mixed with young guys that played a lot last fall," Brown said.

Defensive Line

Heading into the 2011 season, one of the areas Brown wanted to see improvement in were the numbers on the defensive side of the football – namely the quarterback sacks, rushing yards allowed and turnovers created.

After improving the sack total from 18 to 34, the rushing yards from 207.9 to 118.8 and going from forcing only 17 turnovers at a minus eight ratio to forcing 20 at a plus six rate, it would be safe to say that mission was accomplished as the numbers helped S&T to a 6-5 record in 2011.

As for 2012, the goal is for continued improvement to give the Miners a chance to contend for the first Great Lakes Valley Conference football title – and it all begins with the play on the defensive line.

It is an experienced unit S&T will put on the field this fall, with returning lettermen dotting spots all along the line on the two-deep heading into the fall practice season.

"Experience is the key upfront for us in 2012," Brown said. "Freddy Dugard, Jimmy Barnhart, Eddie Rascon, and Josip Juric have played a lot of quality reps for us and should give us a good starting point this fall."

Dugard and Barnhart, both juniors, had eight sacks apiece to lead the Miners in that category last fall and return to their starting position as bookend defensive ends in the Miner scheme. Rascon, who saw most of his playing time at end as well last season, will move inside alongside Juric, a sophomore who was an honorable mention all-conference performer a season ago.

Not only do the Miners have experience in the projected starting group, but also in the second and third lines of the depth chart as well. At the defensive end positions, S&T brings back lettermen Quinton Robinson and Dan Mauszycki, with returner Jacob Nutt and redshirt freshmen A.J. Warren and Jeff Deason also competing for spots.

Returning lettermen Jon Vance – a solid special teams player as well for S&T – and Geoff Correnti along with redshirts Steve Martin and Austin Terry and transfer Daleroy Davey will also be in the mix at defensive tackle.

Linebackers

One of the keys to Missouri S&T's success on the defensive side of the ball last fall was the play of its linebacker corps and with that group relatively intact for the upcoming 2012 season, Brown feels the Miner defense can take a huge leap forward this season.

It begins with two juniors – Chris Emesih and Chris Horn – who have been two-year starters for the Miners. Emesih recorded a team-high 100 tackles during his sophomore season, including eight for a loss, while Horn had 43 tackles and a pair of interceptions. Both players were selected to the Great Lakes Football Conference's all-league team as first-team selections after the 2011 season.

"Emesih and Horn are two cornerstones of our defense," Brown said. "Emesih can run and hit with the best of them, while Horn knows our defense as well as anyone and is one of the most technically sound players in our program.

"However, we'll need some surprises from other returners and newcomers in order for this group to be as good as it should be," Brown added.

Three returning letterwinners – junior Dalton Gillispie and sophomores Jake Schneider and Nick Kruse – figure to be in the mix at the inside linebacker spots. In addition, redshirt freshmen Chance Alexander could also contend for playing time.

The third linebacker position will also be manned by an all-league performer from 2011, as senior Jordan Pulou landed honorable mention All-GLFC honors after finishing with 33 tackles and followed that with a strong spring season in Brown's opinion.

Brown was also pleased with the play this spring from Zach Melber, while returners Lonnell Jones, who missed the second half of the season with an injury and Ryan Morse will also push for significant playing time.

One of the Miners' incoming freshmen, Rob Cidlik, has a chance to also work into the rotation this season according to Brown.

SET

Secondary

The one area on defense where Missouri S&T was hit hard by graduation was in the secondary, as three of the four starters on opening day last season completed their eligibility. But with injuries affecting a couple of those players during the year, it did allow an opportunity for others to gain experience, giving Brown a good outlook for that unit for the upcoming 2012 season.


Sean Martin, the lone returning starter from the beginning of last year, is back at one of the cornerback spots after leading the Miners with four interceptions in 2011. Martin will be joined at the cornerback spot by Naeem Forrester, a transfer from Pittsburg State who recorded 31 tackles and an interception last fall for the NCAA Division II national champions and Mark Hopkins, who returns to the Miner squad after missing the 2011 season.

In 2010, Hopkins was a first-team All-GLFC selection at cornerback and was also one of the nation's top punt returners, averaging better than 20 yards per return.

Returning sophomore Dawan Ferguson and redshirt freshman Khalan King will also contend for roles at the corner position.

At safety, the Miners will have two new starters in senior Billy Foster and sophomore Chris McKay. Foster had 24 tackles and an interception during his first season in a Miner uniform, while McKay added 14 stops and positioned himself in the starting lineup with a solid showing during spring drills.

"Foster and Forrester are expected to be big time playmakers for us this fall," Brown said. "Sean Martin returns after a solid 2011 season where he led the team in interceptions and McKay had a good offseason and earned the starting free safety position after spring ball."



Sean Martin led the Miners in interceptions in 2011 and is expected to be a key member of the Miner secondary.

Behind Foster and McKay, the Miners have returners Albert Yemitan, Brindin Jordan and Ryan Veatch, as well as newcomer Corey Reuter and redshirt freshman Payton Jimison who will contend for playing time.

"This is a group that must prevent big plays and create more turnovers," Brown said. The Miners improved their number of turnovers gained last year, but with 20, gained only four more than they did in 2011.

Special Teams

After some shuffling in the kicking game last season, Missouri S&T head coach David Brown is hoping for more stability in that area in the upcoming 2012 season. The Miners employed two kickers and two punters a season ago, with hopes that the experience gained will allow someone to take firm control of those spots this fall.

Adam Peden took over as the Miners' placekicker during the second half of the season and was successful on all 23 of his extra point attempts, while making three of six field goal attempts which included a 45-yard kick. Cole Wassner averaged 37 yards on 28 punt attempts.

The duo shared those duties with Will Morrison a year ago; Morrison averaged 35.2 yards per punt, made of four of his six field goal attempts and has handled the Miners' kickoff duties over the last year. However, Morrison recently decided to withdraw from the squad due to injury issues and in turn, leaves little experience in the backup spots at both kicking positions.

"Peden and Wassner all have quality game experience," Brown said. "Adam came on last season and took over our place kicking duties with a lot of success; he has a great work ethic. Wassner has a leg up on the punting job, but we expect to have some good competition at both positions."

Wassner, along with returning squadmember David Druse and incoming freshman Brennan Kristek and Logan Turk will compete for the placekicking job. Kristek will also compete for the punting role this fall.

The long snapping duties will likely involve a competition between returners Jon Vance, Geoff Correnti and Jordan Pulou. In terms of the return game, the Miners have several dynamic players that can fill those roles. Smook Thomas averaged better than 10 yards per punt return a year ago, while Mark Hopkins, who sat out the 2011 season, ranked among the NCAA Division II leaders in that category in 2010 at 20.5 yards per return.

"Smook has had many exciting returns during his career and Hopkins is back in the fold, so we hope that they will be able to recreate the dynamic duo that they had going for us in 2010," Brown said. "They are both sure-handed and are threats to make a big play on every return."

Leon Moody and Scott Hendricks could also be contributors in the punt return game.

S&T lost its top kickoff returner in terms of average a year ago in Mike Wilson (23.8 per runback) and is counting on sophomore Nick Taylor, who averaged 18.6 yards a return, Hopkins and Hendricks to help fill the void. Incoming freshman David Hughes II will also contend for that role this fall.

S&T holds off OPSU rally to claim win in opener

GOODWELL, Okla. – Missouri S&T took advantage of some mistakes in the punting game to build a 31-point lead in its season opener, then held on to come away with a 34-23 victory over Oklahoma Panhandle State for its first season-opening win in six years.

The Miners blocked two punts – recovering both inside the Aggies' five-yard line – and scored touchdowns on both occasions, while also turning a fumbled snap into another touchdown in the opening half of play.

The fumbled snap on the Aggies' second possession of the night was recovered by redshirt freshman linebacker Zach Melber and he returned it 25 yards for the first score of the evening. On OPSU's next possession, another redshirt freshman, Dawan Ferguson blocked Sean Livengood's punt and recovered the ball on the Aggie three-yard line.

Adam Clark went into the end zone on the next play to increase the Miner lead to 14-0.

S&T added to its advantage later in the period when Will Morrison kicked a 43-yard field goal, then John Heineken blocked another OPSU punt and recovered it on the three-yard line with 37 seconds to go in the half. Two plays later, Clark scored from the four, giving S&T a 24-0 lead despite accumulating only 53 yards of total offense in the first half.

S&T added to its lead – and more than doubled its offensive output for the night in the process – when Firm hit freshman wideout Nick Taylor down the middle of the field; Taylor took it 72 yards for a touchdown that gave the Miners a 31-0 lead and the game appeared to be headed for a rout. OPSU would run off 23 unanswered points to draw closer, but the Miners got a 39-yard field goal from Morrison in the final minute to clinch the win.

Six plays after the turnover, Firm threw a 24-yard scoring pass to Thomas to give S&T a 7-0 lead exactly midway through the first quarter.

The Rangers answered right back, as a 66-yard drive culminated in a four-yard scoring pass from Jech to Keith Barefield to make it 7-6 at the break, then the second half saw the game suddenly become more wide open.

After the Rangers took a 9-7 lead, S&T responded as Curterris Golden raced 48 yards to the NWOSU 24-yard line to set up a scoring run by Ryan Taylor on the next play that put S&T back in front.

S&T took a 17-16 lead in the fourth quarter on Adam Peden's 17-yard field goal, but the Rangers returned a short kickoff into S&T territory to set up the eventual winning drive. A 26-yard run by Jemril Martin got the Rangers to the Miners' two, then Jech scored on a quarterback sneak with 11:13 remaining to put NWOSU back in front.

Miners hammer 'Rockers in S&T's 1000th game

ROLLA, Mo. – Missouri S&T decided to have quite a celebration when playing its 1,000th football game, putting up its best offensive performance in nearly three years to blast South Dakota School of Mines 60-6 on Homecoming at Allgood-Bailey Stadium.

The Miners cut through the winless Hardrockers by scoring touchdowns on each of their first four possessions and added a defensive score along the way to build a 34-0 lead less than 20 minutes into the game. S&T finished the first half with a 40-0 lead and cruised through the second half as it finished with a season-best 572 yards of total offense, the most since putting up 666 in a Nov. 8, 2008 win over Southwest Baptist.

S&T got the ball to open the game and needed just four plays to cover 66 yards to get on the scoreboard. The drive ended with a 35-yard touchdown pass from Josh Firm to Kevin Dillon after only 95 seconds had elapsed.


Firm's second scoring pass covered 31 yards to Curterris Golden, who carried a defender into the end zone after making the catch to increase the lead to 14-0. Less than two minutes later, the defense got in on the scoring as Hilton Dawson picked off a Nick Russell pass and returned it 38 yards for a touchdown to make it 20-0.

Firm scored on a fourth-and-goal play early in the second quarter, as he rolled to his right and took off for the end zone for the score. After the Miner defense got a three-and-out, Firm connected with Smook Thomas, who darted through the Hardrocker defense for a 55-yard scoring play that put the Miners up 34-0 with 10:34 left in the first half.

Golden got his second touchdown of the afternoon just before halftime on a three-yard run to give S&T its 40-point halftime advantage.

Ground work nets S&T road win over Panthers

OWENSBORO, Ky. – A huge performance by Missouri S&T's ground game – which including a record-tying seven rushing touchdowns – paced the Miners to a 52-28 victory over Kentucky Wesleyan.

The Miners ran for 356 yards on the afternoon, the most in a game in three seasons, and scored all seven of their touchdowns on the ground as they wore down the winless Panthers throughout the course of the afternoon. Meanwhile, S&T's defense intercepted four passes in the first half of the contest and kickstarted the offensive unit after it got off to a slow start.

Ryan Taylor and Curterris Golden each scored three times for S&T, with Golden scoring on first half runs of two and 22 yards and on a one-yard run in the fourth quarter. Golden had 112 yards rushing on the afternoon.

Taylor, who led the way with 151 yards on the ground, scored on a 35-yard run in the first half, then added scoring runs of three and 73 yards in the second half. Mike Wilson had the Miners' seventh touchdown run of the game.

The seven touchdowns on the ground tied the mark established on Oct. 25, 1986 against Lincoln. Meanwhile, Taylor and Golden became the first pair of Miner backs since 2007 and seventh since 1965 to eclipse the 100-yard mark on the ground in the same contest.

Long return dooms Miners in loss at Urbana

URBANA, Ohio – A 94-yard interception return to close the first half swung the tide of a tight contest in favor of Urbana, as the Blue Knights ended Missouri S&T's threegame winning streak with a 42-7 victory.

The Miners started a possession in Blue Knight territory in the final minute of the first half after Jon Vance blocked a punt, but with time running out in the first half, Juan McKeever jumped in front of a Josh Firm pass heading to the end zone and returned it nearly the length of the field to give Urbana a 21-7 lead at the intermission.

MIners end 2012 season with loss to Coyotes

VERMILLION, S.D. – Missouri S&T's football team took a step up in competition to close out the 2011 campaign and after cutting into an early 24-point South Dakota lead, ended up on the losing end of a 48-14 decision at the DakotaDome.

The Coyotes, a member of NCAA Division I's Football Championship Subdivision and ranked No. 24 in that division, jumped on the Miners right from the outset by scoring 24 unanswered points in the first quarter. USD drove 55 yards on its opening series for a touchdown, capped by a four-yard scoring run by Marcus Sims.

That scoring march was followed by a drives that ended with a 29-yard field goal by Kevin Robb, a 49-yard touchdown pass from Dante Warren to Will Powell and a 26-yard scoring run by Warren with 1:41 left in the opening guarter.

S&T got on the scoreboard late in the first quarter with an impressive 85-yard drive. Quarterback Steve Watson completed a 25-yard pass to Joseph Hyman on third-and-14 to keep the drive going, then ran 14 yards himself moments later to set up Curterris Golden's two-yard touchdown run with 1:47 to play in the half.

The Miners got the ball back before halftime and immediately got a 57-yard completion from Watson to Smook Thomas to get to the USD 17-yard line. After Watson completed another pass to Thomas on third down, Hyman caught a three-yard scoring pass with 14 seconds remaining to draw the Miners to within 10 at 24-14.

However, a short kickoff and a 24-yard return by Kyle Wheeler gave Robb a chance to try a long field goal before the break, which he made from 51 yards to dive USD a 13-point lead at the break.

GREAT LAKES VALLEY CONFERENCE



The GLVC is one of the largest conferences in NCAA Division II with the 16 members, the most recent addition being McKendree University for the upcoming year. The conference also has two associate members -- Central State University and Urbana University from the state of Ohio -- to compete in football as the GLVC begins sponsoring championships in 2012.

The formation of the GLVC can be traced as far back as 1972 when the athletic directors of three member schools - Kentucky Wesleyan, Bellarmine and Indiana State University at Evansville (now the University of Southern Indiana) - began preliminary discussions about forming a basketball conference. Four years later, the University of Indianapolis and Saint Joseph's College expressed interest. On July 7, 1978, those schools - along with Ashland University - united to become the GLVC.

Since formulation of the conference, seven schools have joined the league: Lewis University (1980), Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne (1984), Northern Kentucky University (1985), Kentucky State University (1989), Quincy University (1994), Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (1994), University of Wisconsin-Parkside (1994) and UM-St. Louis (1995). Ashland and Kentucky State left the conference after the 1994 season. IPFW left the GLVC following the 2000-01 academic year and SIU Edwardsville left the conference after the 2007-08 season.

The addition of Southern Illinois Edwardsville, Quincy, Wisconsin-Parkside and Missouri-St. Louis in the mid-1990s allowed the GLVC to become an immediate national power in several sports such as men's and women's soccer, women's softball and tennis.

At the start of the 2005-06 season, Missouri S&T, Drury University and Rockhurst University – all of whom have had a good deal of success at the regional and national levels in various sports – have enhanced the league's reputation at the NCAA Division II level. The conference expanded again prior to the 2009-10 season when the University of Illinois-Springfield and Maryville University become members of the GLVC and again last year with the addition of William Jewell College. McKendree replaced Northern Kentucky in the league's lineup in 2012-13 and Kentucky Wesleyan is in its final year as a league member in this academic year. Truman State, a former rival of S&T in the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, joins the GLVC as a full-time member in the fall of

The league's staff has also increased along the way, with the GLVC hiring its first full-time commissioner in 1996. In 2001, an associate commissioner was also added to the full-time conference staff and the GLVC's first full-time sports information director was added in the summer of 2006.

The GLVC can claim schools in several of the Midwest major media markets, with schools in Milwaukee/Northern Illinois (Wisconsin-Parkside), Chicago (Lewis), Indianapolis (Indianapolis), Louisville (Bellarmine), Evansville (Southern Indiana), Owensboro (Kentucky Wesleyan), Kansas City (Rockhurst/William Jewell), Springfield, Mo. (Drury) and St. Louis (Missouri-St. Louis/Maryville/McKendree).

The conference sponsors 17 championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, indoor and outdoor track and field, and tennis for men and basketball, cross country, softball, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, golf, and volleyball for women.

In 2001, the league announced the creation of the GLVC Hall of Fame, with the first class being inducted in 2002.

Jim Naumovich, a former sports information director and director of athletics at Quincy University, is in his seventh year as the commissioner of the GLVC. HALL OF FAME



The top student-athletes in the history of the university athletic program are permanently enshrined in the Athletic Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame is located on the ground level of the Gale Bullman Multi-Purpose Building. Heading into the 2012 academic year, a total of 140 individuals and 16 teams have been inducted into the Hall of Fame, a total that includes 79 members that played or coached football at the university as well as seven teams.
