Extract from his speech delivered at the 38th CAF Ordinary General Assembly*

We have reasons to hope that the level of CHAN, which the 5th edition is scheduled to be in Kenya in 2018, will go on ameliorating itself. Some reasons are linked to some programmes initiated some years ago and which are consolidating themselves.

For instance, the coach licensing and the club licensing. This is like a measuring rod towards professionalism in conformity with the realities of each of our member associations. We take advantage of the experiences of FIFA, UEFA, CONCACAF, AFC, whom we have Memoranda of Understanding, to equip clubs with the minimum necessary to allow them to be engaged in the interclub competitions of CAF in the near future.

Competitions that will be subject to major reforms as of next year, considering the introduction of groups phases with sixteen (16) clubs instead of eight, like it is now. All of these demands organization and the accompanying means. (...)

More than ever before, we have the ability to make CAF perennial, meet up with our various commitments, and ever more. Last year, we signed new contracts with Lagardère Sports and IFAP Sports for the marketing of media rights and the marketing of our competitions, for the period 2017 through 2028, that is about 12 years, with a minimum guarantee of over 1 billion dollars. In relative terms, it is a 400% raise, compared to the previous contracts. An illustration of how attractive our competitions have now become to different marketing partners broadcasting of the four corners of the planet.

We should therefore be able in the upcoming years to substantially increase our financial support to member associations, prize money of our competitions and to increase the budgets of our development programs.

WHO WINS THE 25TH TOTAL CAF SUPER CUP?

Mamelodi Sundowns, the second South African club to win the prestigious CAF Champions League after Orlando Pirates, will play host to TP Mazembe (DR Congo), the winner of the 2016 CAF Confederation Cup, in the 25th edition of the Total CAF Super Cup on Saturday, 18 February 2017 at the Lucas Moripe Stadium, Pretoria.

If history is to be respected, the South Africans will have the advantage of prognosis. Only thrice (1992, 1997, 2011), has the winner of the second-tier CAF Confederation Cup lifted the one-off match trophy. This year, the Congolese side pose a great challenge to their host. With three CAF Super Cup triumphs to their name since 2009, it is a familiar terrain for 'Les Corbeaux' who will for the first time not be playing at their favourite Lubumbashi grounds.

Player-for-Player, it is a balanced affair. In the ranks of Sundowns are three of the five players shortlisted for the African Player of the Year – Based in Africa (2016) namely eventual winner Denis Onyango, Khama Billiat and Hlompho Kekana. The fourth, Keegan Dolly has since joined French side, Montpellier.

On the other hand, Mazembe will be without the trio of Jonathan Bolingi, Merveille Bope and Christian Luyindama, who have also moved to Belgian side, Standard Liege.

HISTORY OF THE COMPETITION

Established in 1992, it is a one-off match that pits the winner of the CAF Champions League against the winner of the CAF Confederation Cup. In principle, the match is hosted by the CAF Champions League winner. CAF can also choose, for various reasons, to have the game played at the home grounds of the CAF Confederation Cup winner or in some cases, on a neutral ground.

NOTABLE PLAYERS

Raphael Chukwu

Recognised as one of the deadliest striker to ever play in the South African Premier Soccer League, the Nigerian striker scored 48 goals during his time at Sundowns between 1996 and 1999.

Bennet Masinga

The 33 goals scored by Bennett Masinga for Sundowns in 1990 is still the most goals scored by a Sundowns player in a single season.

Daniel Mudau

Mudau played for Sundowns for more than a decade, winning three league titles, a Bob Save Super Bowl and a league cup.

Harold Legodi

Harold 'Jazzy Queen' Legodi was a very skillful midfielder that won the hearts of South African footballer lovers. He played a big role in the club's achievements between 1987 and 1992.

Notable Club Coaches

Angelo Tschilas

Tschilas was the first coach to win a league title for the Brazilians. This was in their very first appearance in the National Soccer League in 1988.

Ted Dumitru

The late Dumitru took over at the club in 1997 and led Sundowns to two successive league titles and two domestic cups. In 2001, the Romanian led the club to the final of the CAF Champions League were they lost to Al Ahly. Dumitru died on 26 May 2016 at the age of 76.

Pitso Mosimane

Mosimane started off a bit shaky in his role but has since delivered two trophies plus a league title to the club. The former South Africa national team coach has made history for the club by lifting the CAF Champions League for the first time.

Pitso Mosimane

Name: Pitso Mosimane

Growing up in Soweto, football became a serious business for Pitso after signing for Jomo Cosmos in the early 1980's at 18. Two years on, he joined Mamelodi Sundowns in 1985, a move that made headlines in South Africa as he became the most expensive player at the time. It did not take long to pay Sundowns back, playing a huge role in their Nedbank Cup triumph.

After a season, he returned to Jomo Cosmos, scoring 11 goals from his midfield position as 'Ezenkosi' won the league. Next stop for Pitso was Orlando Pirates in 1989 before leaving abroad to Greece, where signed for Ionikos. After six years in Greece, he joined Belgian outfit Rita Berlaar before signing up his career with Qatari side, Al Sadd in 1996.

As a coach, his breakthrough came in 2000, when he was named head coach of SuperSport United in 2000, a position he will hold for the next six years with the highlight being awarded as Coach of the Year for the 2004/2005 season. He was soon on the radar of the national team handlers, serving as



Assistant Coach to Brazilians Carlos Alberto Perreira and Joel Santana.

After the World Cup, Pitso was promoted to the head coach of Bafana Bafana but failed to guide the team to the Africa Cup of Nations in 2012. After leaving the national team job, Pitso joined Sundowns and has since silenced his critics with his record at the helm. The Brazilians have won the league twice besides other domestic honours.

Pitso made history by guiding Sundowns to the first ever continental title last October, at the expense of Egyptian giants, Zamalek, 3-1 on aggregate.

A goalkeeper in his playing days, Velud was nicknamed 'Le Chat' which means 'Cat' in English by fans of Stade de Reims, for his agility between in the post during 10-year stint. After hanging his gloves, he was in charge of some French lower division sides including Clermont Foot, whom he guided to win the National championship and earn promotion to the second-tier league for the first time in the club's history. His first job in Africa came in September 2009 with Togo before leaving Hassania Agadir of Morocco, and then to Algerian side, ES Setif, where he won the double during the 2012/2013 season, and being named best coach in the Algerian top flight. His next stop was at rivals, USM Alger, who won the Algerian Super Cup under his supervision incidentally against his former



employers, ES Setif. The Frenchman will go on to win the Algerian Ligue 1 with USM Alger, making him the first foreign coach to win two league titles in a row with two different clubs. He joined Mazembe in January 2006 replacing compatriot Patrice Carteron, and guided 'Les Corbeaux' to the CAF Super Cup triumph last year as well as winning the CAF Confederation Cup title.

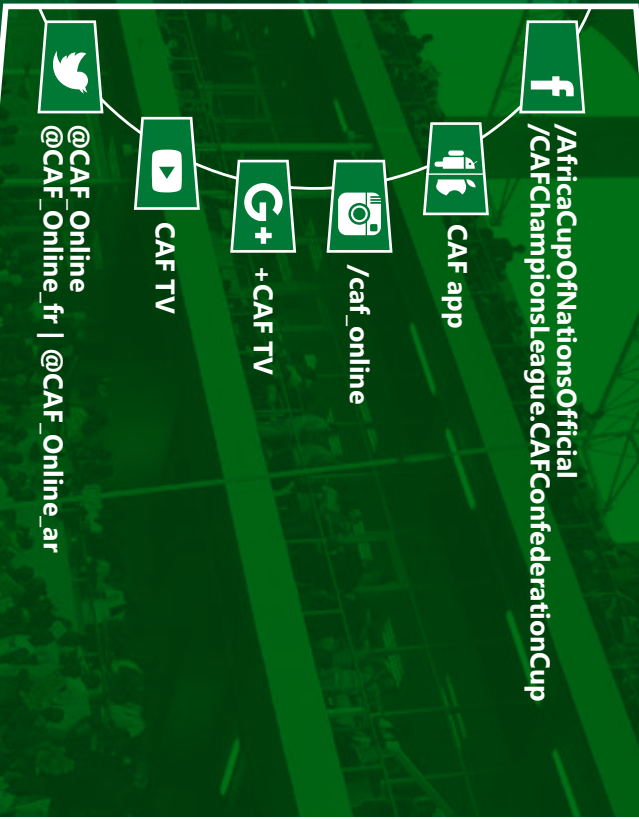
