Brian Roberts

For Brian Roberts, the World Maccabiah Games has been a family affair and a unique way for them to connect with

Israel, Judaism and the sport of Squash. Brian first heard of the Maccabiah Games when he was playing Squash at the University of Pennsylvania. He had bumped into an acquaintance, Glenn Whitman, on the Squash courts at Penn, who told him about his own recent experience at the Maccabiah Games.

Brian's first World Maccabiah Games was in 1981, as a member of the Open Squash Team. Once he qualified for the team, he asked his parents to accompany him to Israel. Brian was raised in a liberal, Reform Jewish family and while visiting Israel had not been a top priority when he was growing up, having his parents watch him as he marched into the Opening Ceremony was life-changing.

"My parents never understood Squash," Brian recounted, "but when they were sitting in Ramat Gan Stadium with thousands

ere sitting in Ramat ian Stadium with thousands of other Jewish athletes from around the world, they understood that moment."

Four years later, Brian again qualified for the Open Squash Team and brought along the woman he was dating, Aileen Kennedy, to cheer him on. After the Games were over they took a cruise and Brian proposed to her, and then returned to the States where they got married and started a family. Twelve years later, Brian qualified for the Masters Squash Team at the 15th Maccabiah in 1997 and returned to Israel with his young family.

In 2005, his oldest daughter Sarah qualified for the Open Women's Squash Team and Brian qualified for the Masters Squash Team, and they went to Israel together to compete at the 17th Maccabiah. Sarah participated in the B'nai Mitzvah ceremony during the ISRAEL CONNECT cultural and educational program and it had an enormous impact on her life.

After the 17th Maccabiah, Brian decided to take a break from competitive Squash and started training for his first Triathlon. He trained for 11 months and competed in a Triathlon on his 50th birthday. After completing the race, Brian decided to return to Squash. As luck would have it, his daughter Amanda qualified for the Juniors Girls' Squash Team in 2009 at the 18th Maccabiah and Brian competed alongside her. After the Games were over, Brian retired from competitive Squash.

"Marching into the Opening Ceremony was an amazing experience for Amanda, and for us to have a father/daughter moment at the Games was priceless," Brian said. "My son Tucker qualified for the 20th World Maccabiah Games this summer, so, of course, I am coming out of retirement one more time to share this incredible

Our message reached them, and they enjoyed chatting with me while I was overjoyed to observe how our mission of Jewish identity and pride, as well as our support of the State of Israel, have created a bond among American Jews.

As the world turns more hostile to the notion of Jewish right for self-determination in their sovereign country, and incidents of anti-Semitism are spread not only by individuals but by governments, I ask you all to remember how very fortunate we are to live in the USA. However, this good fortune is wrapped with responsibility; each of us must remember that Israel gives us a huge sense of pride in its unprecedented accomplishments and that we, in turn, must stand up for her future, for her very existence. Maccabi USA does it by educating our athletes about the facts on the ground in Israel and about the nature of Zionism in order that they can come back as ambassadors and advocates. During the Games, we instill in them the pride of being Jewish; and we do that through sports. Wow; isn't that fun and exciting!!

I hope to see you in Israel this summer for the 20th World Maccabiah Games.

Brian has been a continuous supporter of Maccabi USA. He recently reflected on a conversation he had with the business manager of his high school, Germantown Academy, while he was in college. Brian then joined the Board of Directors of Germantown Academy while a Junior at Penn.

Upon learning that Maccabi USA's Executive Director, Jed Margolis, is retiring at the end of 2017. Brian decided to donate \$1 million to the Maccabi USA Endowment in Jed's honor. This will help Maccabi USA continue to provide unique athletic and educational experiences to qualified Jewish athletes for years to come.

"I am also very grateful to Jed and the entire staff and volunteers of Maccabi USA and Maccabi World Union who put these Games together," Brian concluded. "They are the 'unsung' heroes who have provided me and so many others with some of the most extraordinary moments of our lives. Thank you is truly inadequate."

It is with great pleasure that I share with you my excitement and pride for the upcoming Games and Team USA!

I will never forget the incredible feeling I had in 1981 when I qualified for the 11th Maccabiah Games, my first

international competition. It was a dream come true, as I was able to follow in the footsteps of my father Dan (z"I), who competed in the 3rd Games in 1950, the first Games held after World War II and the birth of Israel.

The Maccabiah is the third largest multi-sport competition in the world, only behind the Olympics and the World University Games. I was fortunate to have marched into the Opening Ceremonies at both the Olympics and the World University Games. I was so proud to be an American, so proud of my own accomplishments, and so proud to represent my country.

However, when I marched into a Maccabiah Opening Ceremony, I was, more than anything else, proud to be a Jew!

And this proud Jew had a smile from ear-to-ear, goose bumps, and was literally walking on air as I waved to a packed stadium of friends. This was one of the rarest of moments for a Jew, as you knew that EVERYONE in that stadium was on your side and proud you were a Jew, too!

In the face of anti-Semitism and the continual fight that Israel faces regarding its very existence, Maccabi USA is so proud to be bringing



Team USA, at 1,100+ strong, and another 400 supporters, to Israel this July for the 20th World Maccabiah Games.

This year, we are expecting 10,000 participants from 80 countries, the largest gathering in the 85-year history of the Maccabiah. Maccabi USA has provided \$500,000 to Maccabi World Union which will enable athletes from Poland, Ukraine, Cuba, and the Czech Republic to participate.

The Maccabiah provides an opportunity for everyone, young and old, to develop lifelong friendships, experience special moments which will last a lifetime, and return home as Ambassadors for Israel.

A Tribute to Sue Millis



Sue started working at Maccabi USA in January of 1986, shortly after she, her husband Barry, and their three kids -Adam, Josh and Abby - returned to Philadelphia. Because Barry's cousin Barbara Lissy was our Executive Director at the time, she offered Sue an Administrative Assistant position. Sue accepted and never looked back.

Over the course of her 31-year tenure, Sue saw many changes, certainly in people - both staff and volunteers - but also in technology! She still remembers

when staff members had to schedule time to use the office's lone computer. Most work was done on a typewriter or manually. But times have certainly changed. Sue now runs queries in the database, wordprocesses all her writing, and builds and manages spreadsheets. Of course, it was not the improved technology that kept her working at Maccabi USA for all these years. It was the people.

"The volunteers and staff who work at Maccabi USA are very passionate about its mission of using sports to build Jewish pride and support for the State of Israel. It has been so enjoyable for me to build relationships with so many people who have had a common goal over the years," Sue explained. "I love the stories I have been privileged to hear, the friendships that have been built – all of these things have made working at Maccabi USA a pleasure and an honor for me. And

it has permeated my family, which by extension has made them part of the Maccabi USA family."

Sue's younger children, Josh and Abby, often helped out at the office during school breaks. Her older son Adam, on break from college the summer of 1993, worked at the office every day sorting, organizing and packing up the apparel that would be taken to Israel for sale at the USA Team store during the Games. When the need arose for extra help in Israel, Adam was asked to serve as a manager on the 14th Maccabiah Games Team. He got to experience Israel firsthand as a member of the Team and develop the friendships and memories that Sue always enjoyed hearing about from athletes and volunteers.

Sue's family has always been central to her life. After her younger sister, Judy, retired and got involved in activities that had always been precluded by her full-time teaching job, Sue started to think about what she might do when she retired, too. Then, when her fifth grandchild was born in 2016, she realized just how many more things she wanted to do that could only happen if she retired.

Although it has been very hard for the staff and volunteers at Maccabi USA to see her leave, everyone understands why she retired, and are grateful that she continues to support the Marketing Department at Maccabi USA as an editor and proofreader on a part-time basis.

Sue Millis is definitely one of a kind and will always be remembered not just for what she's done but for who she is - for her kind heart, brilliant smile, and addictive laugh!



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



With the 20th Maccabiah Games just around the corner, the tireless efforts of our volunteers and staff are already paying off. On July 6 we will be marching into Teddy Stadium in Jerusalem at the Opening Ceremony with a USA Delegation of over 1,100 strong. That is more than double the size of Team USA at last year's Olympics in Brazil. Yet we are able to do it with the dedication of a committee of 125 and a staff of nine!!! Truly amazing!!!

In my last column I mentioned our Hasbara program in conjunction with StandWithUs. I learned that our umbrella organization, Maccabi World Union (MWU), is replicating this important program for all 10,000 athletes from 80 countries. Our ISRAEL CONNECT Program, formerly known as Pre-Camp, which Maccabi USA started over 30 years ago is also being embraced by many other countries. This is the highest form of flattery and we are proud of these programs.

Our athletes will also be engaged in our Tzedakah program known as Lev L'Lev, or Heart to Heart in Hebrew. It is another way that we are teaching values and creating connections to the broader community. I credit our volunteers with being the impetus for developing these wonderful components so that the Maccabiah experience goes well beyond the field of competition.

This summer's Maccabiah will feature a Culinary Competition, Hi-Tech program, Dance Festival and much more. Through the good work of Yogi, our Maccabi Shaliach, we have an intern program where eight young adults are living in Israel from January through the Maccabiah and helping with administering the Games. We are also thrilled to be working with Birthright. You should be aware that for the 10,000

athletes there will be 150,000 bed-nights, 1,800 buses daily, and a total budget of 120 million New Israel Shekels (over \$40,000,000) to produce the Games. We provide \$3.5 million in subsidies for Team USA, plus we are the only delegation to contribute to Maccabi World Union to make the Games happen. We provide over \$500,000 to MWU to help other countries like Poland, Czech Republic, Cuba, Ukraine, and others where the economies are tanking. Through our Light It Forward direct mail campaign, we help to assist athletes from distressed communities around the world.

As we approach the Opening Ceremony, the fundraising efforts have also ramped up so that we can get to the finish line. We are three-quarters of the way there and with a final push we will come up with the \$12,000,000 needed to send our Team to the Games. Our endowments continue to grow and help support our program. I am pleased to share with you that we recently received a match grant of \$1,000,000 from Aileen and Brian Roberts, and are most appreciative. Thank you to all our supporters and endowers for helping our Maccabiah dreams come true.

This summer in Israel will be truly special and I hope that you will join us. During the 20th Maccabiah Games we will mark the 50th anniversary of the reunification of the city of Jerusalem, our eternal capital; the 100th anniversary of the Balfour Declaration; and the 85th anniversary of the first Maccabiah Games in 1932. From the vision of a young teen, Yosef Yekuteli, and humble beginnings with just 390 athletes from 14 countries including 9 Americans, the Maccabiah now has almost 10,000 Jewish athletes from 80 countries worldwide.

Yet none of this would happen without our wonderful volunteers, who are key to our success. They are the ones who have put us on the map.
