WHEREAS, the State Highway Department is renoving its ropair shops and supply depot from Camp Mabry to buildings newly erectec on the above recentily acquired tract, where same will be permanently located; anf

WHFREAS, the Honorable R. M. Hubbard df New Boston, Texas, now deceased, was from Jamuary 21, 1918, to February 15,1925 , nember of the State Highway Commissjon, and served a poxt of that timo as Chairman thereof, in which capacity he displeyod keen executive ability and admixaply exemplif'ied every attribute of a wor thy public servent; and

WHPREAS, the said F. M. Hubbard subsequently becane a member of the Legislature, and an author and sponsor or the bill creating the Eoard of County and Road District Indebteciness, and continued to at ell times give unstintingly of his time and energy to the solution of highway problems, evidencing always an ardent interest in the welfare of the State Highway Department; now therefore,

BE IT REGOLVED by the State highwoy Commission that the recently procured site be named Camp R. M. Hubbard as a perpetual menorial to and in honbr of the distinguished R. M. Hubbard whose public spirited service and unselfish devotion have endeared him forever to his associates, and have entitled him to a place of prominence in the annals of the state Highway Department.

It is ordered by the Commission that Mrs. N. T. Earron, who underwent a serious operation on June 5,1935 , and who is not yet able to retufn to work, be carried on the payroll for the full month of August.

It is ordered by the Highway Comnission that Mrs. W. E. Schultz, who fell and sustained a badly frectured hip on July 21, 1934, and who has undergone two serious operations, the last on May 20 , be carried on the payroll for the month of July, 1935, it appeaxing from a statement of Dr . BE IT RESOLVED by the State Highway Commission that said Commission is proud of the morale and organization displeyed in the emergency by its officers, agents and omployees, ond desires to inthis manner publicly commend them for their devotion to duty, and for their faithful execution of a public trust.
