WHEREAS, Mrs. Elam, the ladies of the Edgewood Garden Club, and the citizens of Edgewood have erected in said park a granite marker or monument with the name, "GIBB GILCHRIST PARK", insoribed thereon, and have determined to dedicate the park on Friday, May 17, 1935, to Gibb Gilohrist, State Highway Engineer, as a permanent and lasting tribute to the public service he has rendered and is rendering; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the State Highway Commission express to Mrs. Elam, the ladies of the Edgewood Garden Club, and the citizens of Edgoo rood its appreciation for their splendid and inspiring compliment to Mr . ailchrist and for the honor conferred upon him.

P. $925-\mathrm{B}$, is awarded to Publio Construction Co., Denton, Texas, for $\$ 30,758.24$, which is the lowest and best bid.

In Jack County, on bids recoived May 13, 1935, contract for grading, drainage structures, sledged stone base and asphaltic conorete pavement from junotion of Highway \#34 to Jacksboro, a distance of 5.141 miles, on State Highway No. 66, U. S. Public Works Highway Project \#NRH 437-B (1935) is awarded to Brown \& Root, Inc., Austin, Texas, for \$67,841.07, which is the lowest and best bid.

S. Public Works Highway Projoct 非RH 370-B (1935 is awarded to Froeming Bros., Inc., of Texas, Dallas, Texas, for $\$ 150,112.17$, which is the lowest and best bid.

In San Patricio County, on bids received May 13, 1935, contract for grading and drainage struotures frow Highway \#12 near Mathis to the Live Oak County line, distance of 3.735 miles, on State Highway No. 9, U. S. Fublic Works Highway Projeot \#NRH 789-A (1935) is awarded to Cage Bros. s J. C. Ruby, Bishop, Texas, for \$1,280.47, which is the lowest and best b\|d.

In Anderson County, an appropriation of $\$ 13,635.64$ is hereby made to cover the cost of widening the orown, flattening the slopes and widen ing small structures on that section of Highway No. 43 extending from Neohes to the Neches River, a distance of 3.994 miles. This work is to be done under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Mair tenance Division as Special Job No. M-10-F-9, on condition that right-ofway of not less than 100 feet in width be furnished free of obstruotion, by the County.

Whereas, Atascosa County has turned over to the Highway Department cheok in the amount of $\$ 2,250.00$ to reimburse the Department for right-of-way on N.R.S. 166, Highway 66, extending from the Bexar-Atascosa County line south 2.16 miles;

It is therefore ordered by the Commission that Highway 273 be pedesignated from Devine in Medina County to at or near Jourdanton in Atascosa County.

In Bexar County, an increased appropriation of $\$ 2,130.90$ is hereby made to Job No. M-15-G-5, which covers prime coat and base preservatire on that section of Highway No. 3 from Twenty-fourth Stroet in San Antonio 5.2 miles west. This inoreased appropriation is neoessary to covpr the contract price plus 5\% for engineering and oontingencies on this work the estimate having been overrun this amount.

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It is ordered by the Commission that the claim of D. H. Buohanan Construction Company for the remission of liquidated damages assesised on S.P. 47-C, Highway 66, Bexar and Comal Counties, be not allowed; it being considered that the slow progress on the projeot was caused by the contractor's negligence and shortage of material and equipment rather than on acoount of failure to obtain right-of-way or on account of delay by the grading contractor, as set out in the contractor's clain. This is in accordance with the recomendation of the Committee on Claims.

In Brazos County, the application of said County, joined by A. \& M. College for construction of a pavement from the Administration Building on the college campus to the now location of Highway No. 6, is referred to the State Highway Engineer for report and reconmendation to the Commission.

In Brazos County, it coming to the attention of the Commission that said county has failed or refused to pay to the State Highway Puads, $2 l l$ the amount approximating $\$ 25,000.00$, said sum being due to the State Highway Fund, and funds being in escrow in Brazos County under way prior to passage of the law creating the Board of County and District Road Indebtedness;

It is therefore ordered by the Commission that a demand be made at once in Brazos County for the payment of this amount.

Job M-13-L-5, which originally covered gravel base course and road oil prime coat on 1.693 miles of Highway No. 29 from the city limits of Gonzales south, is hereby made to cover the cost of placing a light surface treatment of cold mixed asphaltio concrete. In Haskell County, it is ordered by the Commission that no further bids be advertised for work in this county until Haskell County has paid the Highway Department the $11,559.93$ due on F.A.P. $587-A^{1 l}$, on Highway 18 .

It is ordered by the Cormission that $\$ 185.50$ be paid to $R_{0}$ W. Briggs and Company in full settlement of their claim for additional comm pensation on U. S. In Hamilton and Erath Countios, it is orderod by the Conmission that a state highway be designated from Hico, in Hamilton County, in a northerly direction, crossing State Highway No. 68, and thence on the most practioal route to intersect Highway No. 10, at or naar the ErathHood County line; the purpose of the designation will be to shorten the distance of travel from Highway No. 66 to Fort Worth and Dallas; and it is further ordered that survey be made provided Comaissioners " Courts of Hamilton and Earth and perhaps Hood Counties obligate themsolves to secure necessary rightmof-way on approved location.

In Refugio and San Patricio Counties, it is ordered by the Conmission that such field surfeys as are neaessary to determine the future route of Stato Highway No. 29, between Refugio and Gregory be made in order that local poople may adjust their lateral road program to the highway location.

It is ordered by the Comission that in construction of a New Mexico Connection for Carlsbad Cavern, that preference be given State Highway No. 83, and to a Seminole-Lubbock connection via State Highway No. 137 and Stato Highway No. 51.

It is ordered by the Commission that a request be made of the American Association of Stato Highway Officials that U. S. Highway No. 62 be changed to go from Lubbock via Brownsfield and Seminole, thence west on State Highway No. 83 to the New Mexico line;

It is further ordered that the matter be taken up with the New Mexico Highway Department with the view of getting them to request a similar change.

It is ordered by the Commission that each of the following contracts having been exaninod by the Commission and it being found that it complies with the order of award by the Commission is horeby approved in accordance with Section 12, Chapter 186, General Laws of Texas as passed by the 1925 Legisleture, 39th Regular Session.
