Pacir'c Railroed Company, dated April 29. 1935, for a tract of land across their property for the construction of State Highway No. 3 at Mile Fost 4.75 of the San Antonio, Uvalcie $\%$ Gulf Railroad south of San Antonic, be and is hereby cancelled in view of another contract ontered into by and between the same railroad and the State, dated Deomber 31, 1935, covering the same tract of land. The second contract, in addition to the easement, provided for the donstruction of the hishway across the railroad.

The Buresu of Public Roads having advised that, pending receipt of a comitment for future surfacing within a dofinite date, as required by the rules and regulations for Works Frogram Grade Crossing Projects involving elimination of grade crosangs by relocation, the project agree ment camot be exeauted nor Federal payments made, it is hereby ordered that, following construction of grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 16, in Bexar and Wileon Counties, between San Antonio and ploresville, and proper stabilization of roadbed, surfacing of this relocation be included in the next Federal Program for which such construction is eligible and proper funds ore available, and that, in the event Federal funds are not available for surfacing in the constructicn season follow ing completion and stabilization of this work, the State will make arrangements, with or vithout Federal participation, for the undertaking of such minimum work as necessary to provide all-weather travol facilitios on these projects and the State Highway Fngineer is hereby directed to ad vise the Bureau of Iublic Roads accordingly.

In Bexar County, it is ordered by the Comnission that Highway No, 9 be routed through the City of San Antonio over Fredericksburg Road, and Flores Street (North and South) and from the South City Limit; of San Antonio along South Flores Street rofd to a connection with State Hiphway No. 66 at a point approximately 2.5 miles south of South City Limit of San Antonin. This order is to become offective only after Bexar County has furnished extra right-of-way along South Flores street road as onlled for by field notes to be furnished by the State Highway Engineer.

In Bowie County, the Commission has previously ordered that that section of Highway No. I between Simms and Bassett be widened and given a road oil treatment, this work to be completed by June eth, in order to provide a satisfactory travel surface in time for the anticipated increas in traffic to the Centenniel celebration. It is understion, and so or-
dered by the Comnission, that this improvenent will be considered stage construction and preliminary to placing a surface on this section of highway comparable to that section between Simms and Carbondale, such additional work to be done during the Calendar Year 1937.

The Bureau of Eublic Roads having advised that, pending recoipt of a commitment for future surfacing within a definite date, as required by the rules and regulations for Works Frogram Grade Crossing Projects involving elimination of grade crossings by relooation, the profect agrefment cannot be executed nor Federal payment, made, it is hereby ordered that, following construction of grading and drainage structures on Highway No. 35, in Brazoria County, between Alvin and Angleton, and proper stabilization of roadbed, surfacing of this relocation be included in the next Federal Irogrem for which such construction is eligible and proper funds are available, and that, in the event Federal funds are not avail. able for surfecing in the construction season followirg completion and stabilization of this work, the State will make arrangementa, with or without Federal participation, for the undertaking of such minimum work s necessary to provide all-weather travel facilities on this project and the State Highway Engineer is hereby directed to advise the Eureau of Public Roads accordingly.

Whipreas, on March 17, 1936, Minute No. 12018 was passed by the Highway Conmission directing that a highway from Marathon to the Chisos State Park, Terlingue, and St. Helena Canyon on the Rio Grande River be taken over for the maintenance; and

WHRREAS, the Division EnEineer has submitted an estimate of the cost of the equipment nocessary to maintain this highway, the cost of regular maintenance for the balance of the fiscal year, and the amount required to plave this road in a satisfactory condition at this time, the total being $888,046.00$;

But as maintenance funds are not available to place this road in the condition as recomended by the Division Engineer, it is ordered by the Cormission that only $\$ 31,400.00$ be appropriated for reconditioning the road at this time; maintaining it for the balance of the fiscal year; constructing 24 cattle guards; and placing a linited number of signs and markers; and that an appropriation of $\$ 4850.00$ be made to cover the cost of constructing a warehouse at Marathon and 4 maintenance camps on this road. It is also ordered that 2 pick-up trucks, 5 dump trucks, 5 maintainers, and 5 bunk houses with which to maintain this road be purchased, and an appropriation of $\$ 20,200.00$ is hereby made to purchase this equipment.

In Brewster County, it is ordered by the Commission that an appropriation of $\$ 28,352.93$ be made to cover the cost of completing the grading necessary to open Highway No. 10 from Junction with Highway No. 3 east of Alpine to the Pecos County line. Because of the minimum amourit of work necessary to open this road for traffic, it is not feasible that this work be done by contract. Therefore, it is ordered that this work be done under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Maintenance Division with maintenance forces.

It is, therefore, ordered that this work be done under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Maintenance Division with maintenance forces. A.F.E. 36-132

WHEREAS, in Eastland County on Highway No. 1, in the construction of NRM 19-G, certain property owned by W. H. Bennett of Fort Worth, Texas, was used for the purpose of a channel, due to a misunderstanding concerning the ownership thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is essential that the chamel as constructed be maintained for the purpose of drainage; and

WHEREAS, for the construction of this project the State Highway Department acquired certain right-of-way, and the City of Ranger acquired certein right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ranger is under no obligation to assume the damage to the above mentioned property.

NON, THEREPORE, it is ordered by the Comaission that an amount of $\$ 200.00$ be prid to W. H. Bernett upon receipt of proper deed to the damaged property, with the understanding that upon acceptance of the above emount the said W. H. Bennett releases all claims against the State of Texas for damage thereto.

In E1 Paso County, it is ordered by the Commission that an inoreased appropriation to the Maintenance Budget of $\$ 6,225.50$ be made to covor the cost of properly taking care of the trees and shrubs along Highway No. 1 in Ei Paso County, a distance of 62.255 miles. This work is to be done under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Maintenance Division.

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In Erath County, it is ordered by the Cormission that an appropriation of $\overline{\$} 1,719.60$ be made to cover the cost of Roadway Maintenance on that section of Highway No. 66, from Morgan Mill to Stephenville a distance of 11.464 miles, for the balance of the fiscal yoar, and the State Highvay Engineer is instructed to take this section of road over for maintenance inasmucl? as all conditions imposed in this desirnation have been complied with.

It is ordered by the Comission that Minute No. 11417, passed by the Highway Conmission in session October 22, 1935, appropriating $\$ 9,500.00$ to cover the cost of placing a light gravel course on that sece tion of Highway No. 66 from the south odge of stephenville to the junom tion with Highway $N_{0}$. 67, be mended to provide that $\$ 2,329.25$ of this appropriation be expended in graveling the 1.10 mile section of highway from the south end of the brick pavement at Stephenville south and that the balance of this eppropriation be cancelled.

IT IS ORDFRED by the State Highway Commission, that conditioned upon the State's legal right to operato a free ferry, the ability of the Stato to secure appropriate insurane protection for the state's interosts and liabilities, and further conditioned upon the agroement of Galveston County to continue to assume the cost of necessary chamel dredging, the Galveston-Bolivar Ferries will transport cargo without the collection of tollis from and after May 1, 1936; and

IT IS FURTHRR ORDERED by the Comnission that title to the ferry vessels shall remain in the County of Galveston.

In Glassoock County, the Attorney General having completed the oondemnation of right-or-way through the land owned by Mrs. P. A. In Parker County, it is hereby ordered that a project be added t the 1936 Regular Federal Aid Irogram (Item 8, Division 2), providing for the construction of grading and drainage structures of sections of High way 1 between the propesed T. \& P. grade separation project and the Palo Finto County line a distance of approximately 3.0 miles at an estimated cost of $156,000.00$ of which sum $\$ 78,000.00$ will be Regular Federal Aid Funds; this program addition being contingent upon sufficien funds being released from other program projects to permit the financing of this project; and the State Highway Ligineer is directed to submit a request to the Bureau of Public Roads providing for this program addition.

In Folk: County, it is ordered by the Commission that an approm priation of $\$ 22,432.30$ be made to cover the cost of reflooring eight timber bridges on Highway No. 35 between the Noches River and Corrigan. This work is to be done under the direction of the State Hifghway Engiree through the Maintenance Division.

## A.F.E. 36-168

In Red River County, it is ordered that the onstruction of grad ing and drainage structures and surfacing oi Highway No. 49, from Bogota to a connection with the present pavement .9 mile west, be placed on the 1937 Regular Federal Aid Irogran.

In Refugio County, moved by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Wood, it is agreed by the Comission that with the limited amount of State funds available during the calendar year 1937, the Commission will complete the pavement on State Highway No. 173 in this county and the state Highway Engineer is instructed to propare plans and to receivo bids on this project not later than December 31, 1936.

In Robertson County, WPSO 914-A for which bids were received March 25, 1536, since the low bid excooded the engineer's estimate opproximately $33 \%$ and aince this overrun is not supported by detailed inm vestigations of the project, it is hereby ordered that all bids be rejected and the project be readvertised for letting at an early date, this order subject to concurrence by Bureau of Public Roads.

In Rusk County, it is ordered by the Conmission that the construp-

In Shelby County, it is ordered by the Cormission that an appropriation of $\$ 960.00$ be made to cover the cost of rosdway maintenance on that section of Highway No. 87, from the intersection of Highways Nos. 8 and 87 at Carter's Filling Station southeest a distance of 3.84 miles, for the balance of the Piscal year, and the State Highway Engineer is instructed to take this section of road over for maintenence inasmuch as all conditions imposed in this designation heve been complied with. A.T.E. $36-170$

In Smith County, it is hereby ordered that a project be added to the Works Program Highway Progrem, Item 78 of the WPS classification providing for the construction of grading, drainage structures, and surfacing on foeder road extending from Bullard northeast to an intersection with Highway 110 a distance of approximately 8.4 miles with an assigment of $\$ 50,000.00$ Works Irogram Highway Funds, this order conditioned upon sufficient funds being released from other programed projects to finance its construction; the State Highway Bngineer is directed to sumit a rem quest to the Bureau of Fublic Roads providing for the addition of this project to the contingent program.

In Tarrant County, the matter of the old Dallas-Fort Worth Interurban right-ofway having been brought before the Comission, and the State Iifighay Engineer having reported on sane, it is ordored as follows :

First, that the State Highway Deparment recomend to "farrant, County and the City of Fort Worth that they accuire the entire right-of. way of the old Fort Worth-Dallas Interurban from Virginia Street in Fort Worth to a point near Handley whore the Interurben route turns to go undor the Texas \& Pacific Railroad, this recomendation being made with the condition that it be withdram if it is found that said right-ofway cannot bo obtainod for a reasonable prico.

Second, that in viev of the difficulty in determining under the policy of the Comnission the exact point where state construction should end and city construction begin, it is agroed thet this point shall be the asst line of Collard Street in Fort Worth, Texas.

Third, the State Highway Department agrees that, entering fort Worth from Dallas, future nocessary construction as far an the eest line on collaud stront shall become the duty and obligation of the state high Fry Deprotent, provided the tity of Fort Worth shall retain oonstruc. tion obligations from the east line of Collard Stroet into and through the City of rort Wortin.

Fourth, that it is to be understood that no funds aro available at tris time for construction by the State ifochway Department and that, this action does not oblitate the State Highay Department to any time of construction or any mature or extent of construction except as may he provided herein.

Fifth, that when any construction is done by the state and by the eity, that the btate Highmay Departnent will not be expected to construct more lanes of traficio then the eity provides on its section.

Sixth, that it shall be the intention of the stato Highway Dopartment on its section to provide parement for traffio ways only and parking and curb arrangenents will be otherwise provided except where needed for desiga of the roadway section.

Seventh, that this order shall be eproctive when neopted and approved by the City of Fort Worth and by Tarrant County.

In Tarrant County, it is heroby ordered that the Worke Progren Highway Project (Item 37 of the WrMI classification) providing for the reconstruction of Highway 10 extending from Koller to the Denton County line a distance of approximately 3.7 mj .les, for which $885,000.00$ Works Frogram funds were assipned, be withdrawn from the progran sinee detailed investigations disclose that proper design would requiro funds considerably in exoess of the amount assigned and sinee it is considered impractioable to maintain a detour that will satisfactorily sorvo the mam ticipated volume of Centemial traffic.

It is heroby further ordered that the funds released by this program withdrawn be assignod to a Works Program Highray profont(Item 47 of the WPM classification) providing for the construction of grading, drainage struotures, curbs spaced not less than 60 ft . face to race, full width surfacing, 10 ft . sidewalks on och side, and necessary pedestrian underpasiss, not to exceed two, on Laneastor street extending from Montgomery Avenue to Foch Street a distance of approximataly 0.8 mile at an estinated cost of approximately $\$ 105,000.00$ of which sum $\% 85,000.00$ is to be Works Program Highway (WPMH) funds.

As shown by the plat on file under dato of February 1.5, 1936, the above improvements are to be made conditioned that the Fedoral goveram ment will participate in theix cost in acocordance with the Rergenoy Rem lief Appropriation Aot of 1935.

If this appropriation is approved by the Federal government, an alternate route on State Highway $l$ through Fort Worth is dosignated along Lancaster Streot from a point where the Lancaster Extension on Pelham intersects Camp Bowie Boulevard at Montgomery Street, thence through the City of Fort Worth along the lines given tentative approval by the Bureau of Fublic Roads on February 15, 1936, and the Stato Highray Enginoer is directed to submit a request to the Bureal of Public Roads providing for the modification of the Federal Aid Highway System of Texas to include this alternate route.

This action will not oblipate the Department to any further axpenditures on this route, the object of this ordor being to provide at this time a route to the Centemial grounds now being construeted and to assist the city and county in this improvement so that traffie may be handled.

The State fighway Engineer is instructed to adrise the oity and county of this action and to state to them that this is as far as the Comission can go in this construction at this time, and to stato furthor that if this assitance is of benefit that every mans will be taken to expedite the work.

Before procoeding with the work a comnitment shall be obtained from the City of Fort Worth and Irom Tarrant County that should the Commisaion decide to proceed with further construction along the approver Lancaster street route through or adjacent to the City of Fort Worth, that the neoessary and required rightwof-way shall be furnished free of cost to tho Stato.

The State Highway Higineer is directed to submit a request to the Buraau of Public Roads, the Torlis Progress Administration, and the National Fnergency Council providing for this program adjustment.

Minute 12050 dated March 17, 1936 is hereby cancelled since the conditions provided above are intended to entirely supersede those of the previous order.

In Tarrant County, it is hereby ordered that the Works Program Highway projects (Items 38 and 39 of the WPM olassification), providing for the roconstruction of Highway 2, extending from the Munisipal Airport north a distance of approximately 8.1 miles, for each of which items $\% 82,000.00$ Works Program funds were assigned, or a total assigninent of $164,000.00$, be withdrawn from the program since it has been found that proper desien will require funds considerably in excess of the amount assigned, and since it is considered impracticable to maintain a detour that will satisfactorily serve the antioipated volume of Centennial traffic.

It is hereby further ordered that in Travis County, a Works Prom gram Highway project be added to the progran (Item 48 of the whM classification), providing for the reconstruction of grading, drainage structures, and surfacing on Highway 2 along Congress Avenue in Austin, extending from the south end of the Congress Avenue Bridge south a distance of approximately 0.4 mile , at an estimated cost of $\$ 65,000.00$ with an assignement of $\$ 65,000.00$ Works Yrogram (WPMH) funds to be obtained from the funds released by the proposed program withdrawal mentioned above.

It is hereby further ordered that in Trarrant, County, a Works Trogram Highway project be added to the program (Item 49 of the WPMI classification), providing for the construction of grading, drainage structures and surfacing on sections of Highway 15 between its intersection with Highwsy 2 and its intersection with Highway 10, a distance of approximate ${ }^{2}$ 1.2 iniles, at an sstimated cost of $\$ 70,000.00$, with an assignment of $70,000.00$ Works Program (WPMIF) funds to be obtained from the funds rem leased by the proposed program withdrawal mentioned above.

The State Highway Engineer is directed to submit a request to the Bureau of Fublic Roads, the Works Frogresis Administration, and the National Emergency Council, providing for these program adjustments.

Since Titus County, through its Comnissioners' Court, has signim fied its willingnoss and readiness to furnish the required rightsmof-way on Hichway No. 1 from Mt. Measant west to Franklin County line and including the connection into Mt. Flessant on West First Stroet, Titus County is hereby requestad to secure by purchase or condemnation the roquired rights-ofmay on Highway No. 1 from Mt. Pleasent west to the Frank lin County line and including the comection into Mt. Pleasant on West First Striset, on location approved by the State Highway Engineor and in accordance with field notes and maps furnished by the State Highway Engineer.

In Iistus County, it is hersby ordered that Minute No. 12052 dated March 17, 1936, is amended to read as follows:

In Titus County, reforence is made to Minute No. 11320, which authorized the securing of right-of-way on the approved route of states Hishway No. 1 in Titus County.

On appliation of the County Judge, the Highway Connission hereby orders that the original plan be adhered to on the condition that the County will secure the right-of-way on both the approved line and on the connection into Mt. Pleasart.

This modification in Titus County is conditioned on all the right-ol'way being secured and fenced on both routes as previously rem quested, and the State Highway Finginoer is hereby authorizod to proceed with the construction on the connection into Mt.
