

## May 4, 2010 Primary Election Returns

### Post-Primary Contests and Recounts

Following the 2010 Primary Election, no contest or recount petitions were filed with the Indiana Election Division for the nomination to a federal, state, or state legislative office.

Following the 2010 Primary Election, no contest or recount petitions were filed with any county election board for the nomination to a judicial office.

### Candidate Vacancies Occurring After the Primary

**No candidate** was nominated by the Democratic Party at the 2010 Primary Election for the office of **United States Senator**. The Democratic Party filed a Certificate of Candidate Selection to Fill an Early Ballot Vacancy for a Federal Office with the Election Division on May 15, 2010, designating **Brad Ellsworth** as the Democratic Party nominee for this office.

**Mark E. Souder**, the Republican Party nominee for the **U.S. House of Representatives, District 3**, filed a statement of withdrawal as the nominee on May 26, 2010. The Republican Party filed a Certificate of Candidate Selection to Fill an Early Ballot Vacancy for a Federal Office with the Election Division on June 12, 2010, designating **Marlin A. Stutzman** as the Republican Party nominee for this office.

**Lettie Oliver**, the Democratic Party nominee for **Indiana State Senator, District 31**, died March 1, 2010. The Democratic Party filed a Certificate of Candidate Selection to Fill an Early Ballot Vacancy for a State Legislative Office with the Election Division on June 17, 2010, designating **Frank J. Anderson** as the Democratic Party nominee for this office.

**Gary C. Wobler**, the Democratic Party nominee for **Indiana State Representative, District 39**, filed a statement of withdrawal as the nominee on June 17, 2010. The Democratic Party did not fill this ballot vacancy.

Following the May 6, 2010 Primary, and in accordance with the procedures set forth in Indiana Code 3-13-1, the Democratic and Republican Parties also filled certain candidate vacancies resulting from the **failure of any individual to seek nomination** to an office by filing as a candidate in that major party's primary.

Likewise, following the procedures set forth in Indiana Code 3-13-1-20, the **Libertarian Party** filled certain general election candidate ballot vacancies resulting from the failure of the Libertarian Party to nominate a candidate for an office at that party's state convention.

Following procedures set forth in Indiana Code 3-8-6, individuals were certified as **independent candidates or candidates of other political parties** for placement on the general election ballot after filing petitions of nomination to an office signed by a sufficient number of registered voters residing within the election district for the office.

Following procedures set forth in Indiana Code 3-8-2-2.5, individuals were certified as **declared write-in candidates** for offices on the general election ballot after filing a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate. The names of write-in candidates are not printed on the general election ballot. The names of write-in candidates who file their declaration of intent with the Election Division are certified to the respective county election boards under Indiana Code 3-8-7-30.

### **Special Election: U.S. House of Representatives, District 3**

**Mark E. Souder, U.S. Representative for District 3**, resigned that office, effective May 21, 2010. A special election to fill this vacancy was conducted on November 2, 2010, the same date as the 2010 General Election.

On June 12, 2010, the Republican Party certified **Marlin A. Stutzman** as its candidate for this office in the special election. On June 18, 2010, the Democratic Party certified **Thomas Hayhurst** as its candidate for this office in the special election. On August 10, 2010, the Libertarian Party certified **Scott Wise** as its candidate for this office in the special election. There were no candidates nominated by petition, or declared write-in candidates, for this special election.

## November 2, 2010 General Election Returns

### Post-Election Contests and Recounts

A contest petition in the election for **Secretary of State** was filed with the Indiana Election Division on November 19, 2010, at 10:59 a.m. The Indiana Recount Commission dismissed the contest petition in this matter on December 12, 2010.

A recount and contest petition in **Indiana State Representative, District 76**, was filed with the Indiana Election Division on November 18, 2010. The Indiana Recount Commission dismissed the contest petition in this matter on December 5, 2010. The Commission concluded the recount in this matter on December 18, 2010, and issued a Certificate of Recount setting forth the votes received by each candidate in this matter, as determined by the Commission.

No other recount or contest petitions were filed with the Indiana Election Division for any other federal, state, or state legislative office.

Except as noted below, no recount or contest petitions were filed with any circuit court clerk for any judicial office or for the office of Prosecuting Attorney.

A recount petition was filed with the Marion County Circuit Court Clerk for the office of **Marion County Small Claims Court Judge, Wayne Township**. However, as of December 20, 2010, the deadline for completing a recount for a local office under IC 3-12-6-21.9(b), an order for a recount in this matter had not been issued by the Marion Superior Court.
