This tank lost the running gear and engine in the thirties, as it was re-used as fixed artillery.

It was then upgunned with a 45mm gun (Alex Pankov)

MS-1 (T-18) hull – Polish Army Museum, Fort IX Czerniakowski, Warsaw (Poland)

It is one of many T-18 used as strong holds on Molotov Line on Russian-German border of 1939-1941. It was part of Przemyśl Fortified Region and was discovered in the 1990s and recovered from Leżachów village near Sieniawa, where it was used as strong hold near San river (Rafał Białęcki)
