(Sonoma County, CA, August 28, 2014) — Weill Hall at Sonoma State University's Green Music Center (GMC) will celebrate the 2014-15 season with a gala on <u>Sunday, September 28, 2014, at 3:00 p.m.</u> featuring a performance by entertainer <u>Michael Feinstein</u> in a salute to Frank Sinatra. The concert celebrates the start of the 2014-15 MasterCard Performance Series, and the first season programmed by recently appointed Co-Executive Director Zarin Mehta.

Michael Feinstein is a multi-platinum-selling, two-time Emmy and five-time Grammy Award-nominated entertainer. Dubbed "The Ambassador of the Great American Songbook," he is considered one of the premier interpreters of American standards. His 200-plus shows a year have included performances at Carnegie Hall, Sydney Opera House and the Hollywood Bowl as well as the White House and Buckingham Palace. Feinstein has received national recognition for his commitment to celebrating America's popular song and preserving its legacy for the next generation.

The 2014-15 season opens <u>Friday</u>, <u>September 19</u>, <u>2014 at 7:30 p.m.</u> with the bluegrass-meets-classical duo of mandolinist/composer <u>Chris Thile</u> and bassist/ composer <u>Edgar Meyer</u>.

The lineup continues on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>September 20 at 7:30 p.m.</u> with three-time Grammy Award winner <u>Ramsey</u> <u>Lewis</u> and rising jazz vocalist <u>Cécile McLorin Salvant</u>, performing in respective sets.

Gala Dinner

The concert will be followed by a 1940's nightclub-themed <u>cocktail reception and dinner</u>, featuring a plated dinner by <u>Chef Holly Peterson</u> from Flourish. Event décor will be overseen by <u>Thierry Chantrel</u> of San Francisco's La Follia, who has designed numerous special events for the Green Music Center. Proceeds from this event will support performances and educational activities at the GMC.

The 2014-15 Gala Committee is co-chaired by Joan Weill and Alice Chiang, with additional representation from GMC board members Anisya Fritz, Carol Miller, Debby Hopkins, Marne Olson, Cherie Hughes, Judy Vadasz, Janet Lamkin and Sharon Winslow.

About the Artist

Dubbed "The Ambassador of the Great American Songbook," <u>Michael Feinstein</u> is a multi-platinum-selling, two-time Emmy and five-time Grammy Award-nominated entertainer who has recorded more than thirty albums of American jazz and pop standards, including *The Sinatra Project* (2008) which reached #3 on the Billboard Jazz chart and earned him a fifth Grammy Award nomination.

Feinstein's musical celebration of "Ol' Blue Eyes" continued in 2011 with the release of *The Sinatra Project, Vol. II: The Good Life* and with the premiere of the Emmy-nominated television special, *Michael Feinstein – The Sinatra Legacy.*

In 2007, he founded the Michael Feinstein Great American Songbook Initiative, dedicated to celebrating the art form and preserving it through educational programs, master classes, scholarships and prizes to students across the country. Feinstein serves on the Library of Congress' National Recording Preservation Board, an organization dedicated to ensuring the survival, conservation and increased public availability of America's sound recording heritage.

He was named Principal Pops Conductor for the Pasadena POPS in 2012 and made his conducting debut in June 2013 to celebrated critical acclaim. He also serves as as Artistic Director of the Palladium Center for the Performing Arts, a \$170 million, three-theatre venue in Carmel, Indiana, which opened in January 2011.
