

National Chemistry Quiz



Every October and November, WA RACI members volunteer to present Australian National Chemistry Quiz plaques at secondary schools throughout WA. Held during National Chemistry Week in July, the Australian National Chemistry Quiz is one of the RACI's most significant annual activities, and aims to promote interest in and appreciation of the role of chemistry and chemists in our society. All students receive a Certificate of Participation, with the top 800 entrants also receiving a Plaque, and entrants obtaining 100% receiving a Certificate of Excellence and a plaque. Over the years, the Quiz has grown from 29 000 Australian students in 1984 to an international quiz involving over 115,000 students from 15 countries in 2010.

I attended an assembly at Como Secondary College on Tuesday 19th October to present a National Chemistry Quiz Plaque to Year 11 student, Eliot Courtney, acknowledging his outstanding results in the 2010 Quiz. This marked the first time that a student at Como Secondary College had been awarded a plaque and it was great to see how excited and enthusiastic both staff and students were about the award. It's always good fun to represent the RACI and promote Chemistry at events such as this, and the schools are always very appreciative to have a RACI member visit. I'd heartily recommend anyone interested in volunteering to present National Chemistry Quiz Plaques at a local school to get in touch with the WA Branch and give it a go.



The RACI Western Australian branch invites applications for the annual David Koch Postgraduate Student Travel Grant. The award, up to a maximum value of \$3000, is available to Honours, Masters and PhD students in WA with the purpose of sponsoring national or international travel to an approved conference. The successful applicant will be required to write a report on the conference for the RACI WA Branch Newsletter. Applications close on **Friday 25th February 2011**. Application forms are available from the RACI WA Branch Coordinator (wabranch@raci.org.au or PO Box 421 Leederville WA 6903). Applications will be evaluated by Dr Phillip Fawell, CSIRO Process Science and Engineering and Dr Harry Linge, Past Chair of the RACI Surface Science Group.

To be considered eligible:


- 1. The student must present either a talk or a poster. Oral papers will be given precedence.
- 2. The research must fall within the remit of the RACI.
- 3. The student must be a member of the RACI (Associate RACI membership is \$70) and be enrolled at a WA-based Institution.

Background to the Award

The David Koch Postgraduate Student Travel Award has been offered annually to WA students since 1994. Whilst initially focusing on surface science and physical chemistry, the award has recently been opened to all students undertaking pure or applied chemistry-based research.

The David Koch Postgraduate Student Travel Grant commemorates the late Dr David Koch, former Chief of Mineral Chemistry, who initiated the move of CSIRO from Melbourne to Perth in 1984 and fostered and supported WA-based co-operative research in Hydrometallurgy and other related sciences. He is also commemorated by the Koch Building at the CSIRO Waterford site, adjacent to the Curtin University Resources and Chemistry Precinct.

The award is made possible by the efforts of RACI WA Branch Surface Science Group, which was formed in 1984 when members of the then CSIRO Division of Mineral Chemistry relocated from Melbourne to Perth to form the nucleus of what is now CSIRO Process Science and Engineering at Curtin University. Surface Science was the key expert area underpinning much of the early hydrometallurgical/mineral processing/mineral science work of CSIRO and the group coordinated contact with staff at Curtin University, WASM, Murdoch and UWA and held annual conferences to facilitate technology transfer and student participation in research.
