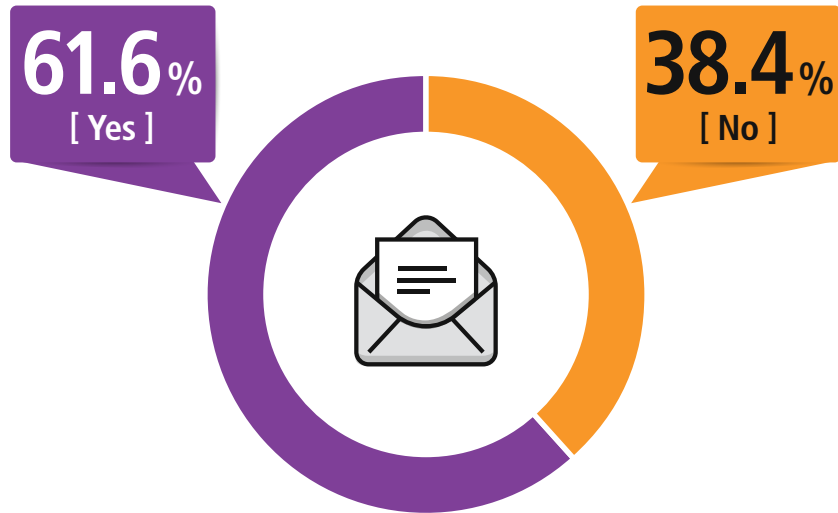


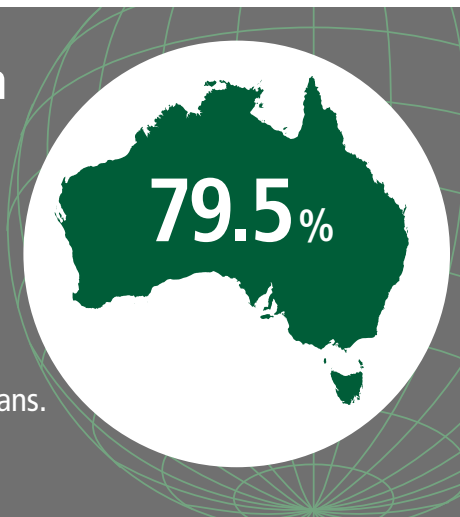

Overall participation rate for the survey

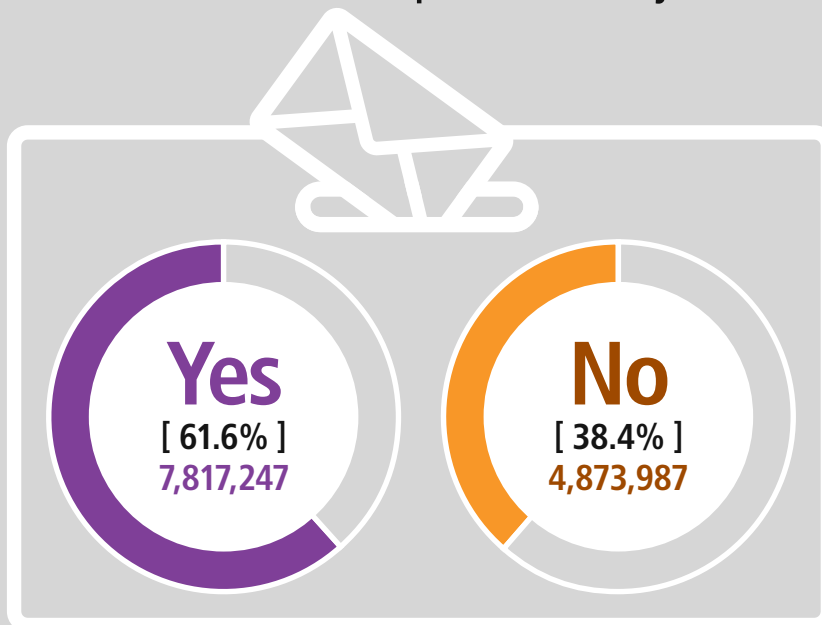
The Australian Marriage Law Postal Survey was mailed out to **16,006,180** eligible Australians.

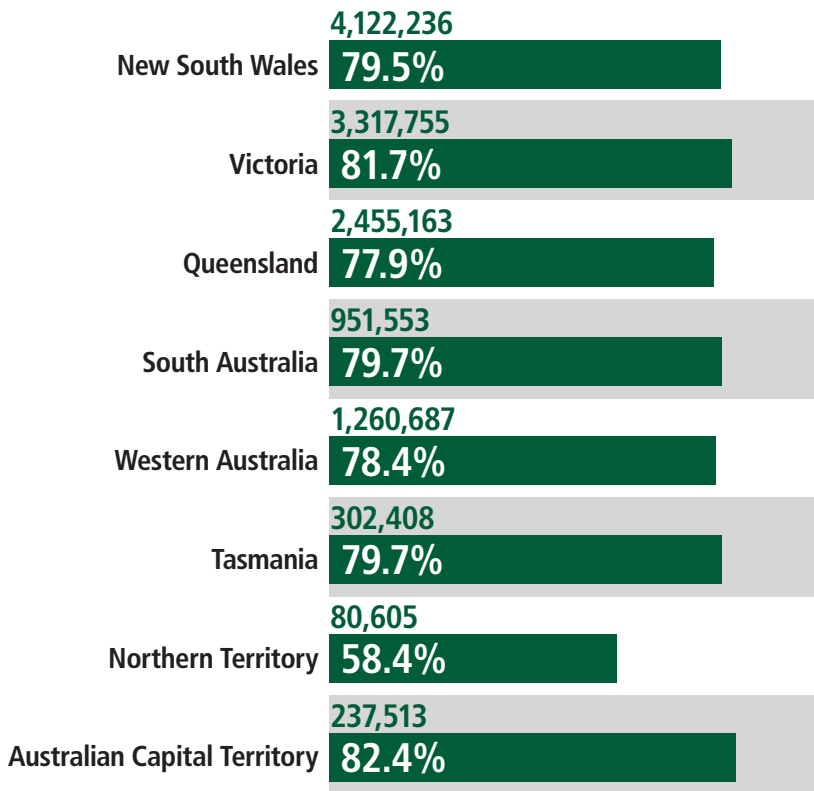

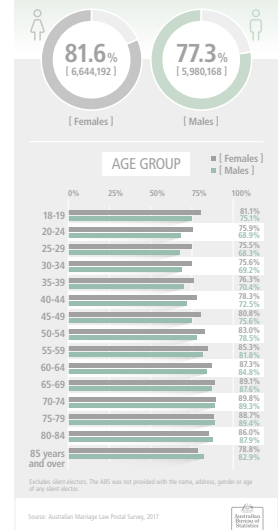
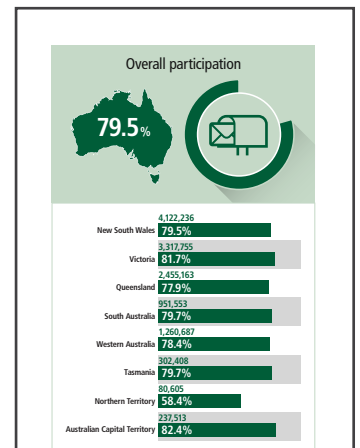
Overall participation



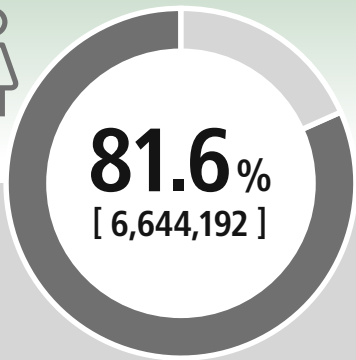

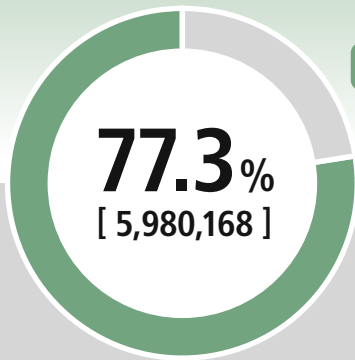

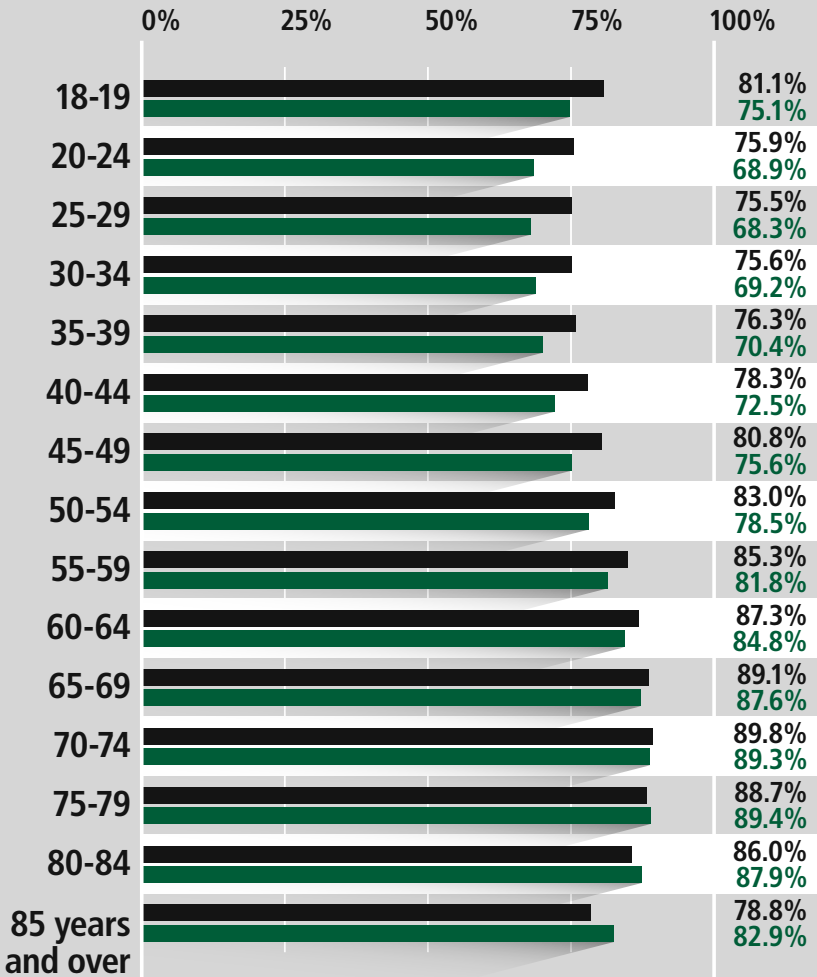
