PREPARING FOR THE COLINIAN RENEWAL COURSE

Eleven Marists from all continents will be participating in the Colinian Period of Renewal (CPR) which will begin on Ash Wednesday, 1 March 2017. This will take place at La Neylière for five months. The primary purpose of the CPR is to give those who have worked at least ten years in the ministry field *a long period of deep spiritual renewal*, for *spiritual growth and*



conversion, following the model of a Second Novitiate (SD 2009, N° 41). Fr Tony Kennedy from Australia will be the director. As part of his preparations, he and general assistant Fr Kevin Duffy spent some time at La Neylière in late January, in the snow, meeting with the staff of the house and the local Marist community. In February he has continued his preparations at the General House in Rome.
