The Health & Safety Authority commissioned market research in 2005 to identify the best ways to assist micro-businesses improve their compliance with health and safety regulations. Specific results relating to micro-businesses in the Agricultural sector are presented below.

## Conditions that Facilitate Compliance: (i.e. where investment has most impact)

- 1. Increased awareness of health and safety as a priority issue
- 2. Publications must be simple
- 3. Availability of adequate information
- 4. Availability of training
- 5. Compliance must be time efficient

**Trade Association:** 31% of all respondents were members of IFA

Risk Assessments: 62% of respondents (with >5 years experience in the

sector) state that they can conduct a risk assessment

Risk Perception: Respondents in the agricultural sector perceive a high

level of risk in their work - "likely to get hurt at work"
