**MATCHUP NOTEBOOK.....**

Nebraska and Texas are both making their fifth appearance in the Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship. Nebraska represented the North Division in 1996, 1997, 1999 and 2006. Texas was the South representative in 1996, 1999, 2001 and 2005. Both programs are 2-2 in previous Championship appearances.

Nebraska and Texas will meet for the third time in the Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship. Unranked Texas upset the No. 3 Cornhuskers, 37-27, in the Conference's inaugural championship game played in St. Louis in 1996. Three years later No. 3 Nebraska beat No. 11 UT, 22-6, in San Antonio.

Nebraska and Texas did not meet during the regular season. Championship game participants have met six times previously during the regular season -- 1999 (Nebraska-Texas), 2000 (Kansas State-Oklahoma), 2001 (Colorado-Texas), 2002 (Colorado-Oklahoma), 2005 (Colorado-Texas), 2007 (Missouri-Oklahoma).

This year's game marks the 11th time one of the Championship game participants has the opportunity to play in the national title game with a win. The team one win away from playing for the national championship is 5-5 in the Big 12 title game.

The South has an edge in the previous 13 title contests, holding a 9-4 advantage. North and South teams alternated wins in the first nine years of the game. The South has now won the last five in a row.

The designated home team in each of the first six Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship games (1996-01) was the winning squad. The home team has won nine of the contests overall, however the visiting squad was victorious in four of the last seven. Nebraska is the home team for this year's title event.

Cowboys Stadium is the sixth different venue to host the Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship. Four Big 12 teams (Baylor, Oklahoma, Texas A&M and Texas Tech) played in the new stadium this season. Nebraska and Texas will each make their first appearance.

The Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex has played host to a previous Championship game as the 2001 event was played at Texas Stadium in Irving - a 39-37 win by No. 7 Colorado over No. 3 Texas.

At least one participant in the game has been ranked among the top eight nationally in each of the 14 Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championships. Texas enters the game at No. 2/2 (Harris/coaches) while Nebraska is No. 22/20.

Twenty-five of the 28 squads in the championship contest have been ranked at the time of the engagement. In addition, Texas jumped from unranked to No. 20 in the next AP survey after upsetting then-No. 3 Nebraska, 37-27, at St. Louis in 1996.

## BCS Sightings

The 2008 season marked the fifth time the Big 12 has advanced two teams to BCS games in the same season (2001, '03, '04, '07, '08). Conference teams have played in 16 BCS games in the 11-year history of the structure, posting a 7-9 mark.

## Big 12 Heisman Winners

The Big 12 has four Heisman winners in the league's 13-year history, the most of any conference during this time span. A Big 12 player has captured the trophy four of the last 11 seasons: 2008-Sam Bradford (OU); 2003-Jason White (OU); 2001-Eric Crouch (NU); 1998-Ricky Williams (UT).

In 2008, Texas QB Colt McCoy finished second, 122 points behind Bradford, while Texas Tech QB Graham Harrell and WR Michael Crabtree finished fourth and fifth, respectively. This marked the first time in the award's 74-year history four of the top five finishers hailed from the same conference.

## Television Partners

ABC concludes its 14th season as the conference's national network television partner. The Big 12 also continued its long-standing relationship with FSN for its cable rights. FSN sublicensed select television games in 2009 to ESPN and Versus.

## **BIG 12 FOOTBALL...DID YOU KNOW**

- Six quarterbacks in Big 12 history have surpassed the 10,000-career passing yards mark, including three (McCoy, Reesing and Robinson) who will finish their careers in 2009 - Texas Tech's Graham Harrell (15,793), Texas' Colt McCoy (14,651), Missouri's Chase Daniel (12,515), TTU's Kliff Kingsbury (12,429), Kansas' Todd Reesing (11,840) and Oklahoma State's Zac Robinson (10,048).
- The Texas Tech at Texas game on Sept. 19, 2009 was the earliest Conference contest since Nebraska hosted Oklahoma State on Aug. 30, 2003.
- Six starting quarterbacks (Robert Griffin – Baylor; Sam Bradford – Oklahoma; Austen Arnaud – Iowa State; Taylor Potts – Texas Tech; Steven Sheffield – Texas Tech; and Zac Robinson - Oklahoma State) missed starts due to injury in 2009, compared to only one (Stephen McGee, Texas A&M) in 2008.
- This season, 22 different QBs have started for Big 12 teams. Last season, 15 different quarterbacks started in the Big 12. Only Kansas, Missouri, Texas and Texas A&M have started the same quarterback in every game.
- Oklahoma ends the regular season with a nation-leading home win streak of 30 games. Texas is tied for fourth with 15 consecutive home victories.
- Texas has made a nation-leading 84 appearances in the 91 all-time BCS standings. Oklahoma is third with 69 showings.
- Six Conference teams were ranked in one of the national polls six consecutive weeks from Sept. 6-Oct. 11, 2009. This happened four consecutive weeks last season from Sept. 28-Oct. 19, 2008..
- The Big 12 will send at least seven teams to bowl games for the 10th consecutive season. Eight teams are bowl eligible for the seventh season.
- Big 12 teams have participated in 92 bowl games since 1996, including 69 from 2000-2008.
- Eleven of the Big 12 teams have "gone bowling" since 2005.
- Seven Big 12 teams have won a bowl game since 2005.
- Nine of the 14 Big 12 Football Championships have been televised in prime time on ABC, including the 2009 contest.
