Historical Context	In May 1933 the CSR Sugar Mill barracks at Childers was bought for £100. The barracks were dismantled and moved by rail and re-erected as the Dundowran Recreational Hall. It was opened officially on 15 July 1933.			
Physical Description	Low set on wooden stumps; gable iron roof with skillion extension over side room on western side. Timber frame, weatherboard cladding. Front porch with gable roof, main double door on long side, 5 x sash windows on long side with ventilation louvres below, metal window hoods.
