College Highlights: Earned Honorable Mention All-Independent Team honors as a senior. Named Second Team All-Mid-Continent as a junior. Earned Mid-Continent Sixth Man of the Year as a freshman. Finished collegiate career as Chicago State's all-time leading Division I scorer with 1,510 points.

Senior (2006-07): Averaged 14.5 points, 3.1 rebounds, and 4.7 assists. Started 25 of 29 games. Scored 20 or more points seven times. Registered season-high 33 points vs. Valparaiso. Recorded three double-doubles of points and assists, including a 18-point, 11-assist effort at Oakland. Tallied 12 points, 11 assists, and five steals vs. New Mexico State. Scored 24 points on 10-for-15 shooting at Eastern Michigan. Notched 20 points at Michigan State. Posted 20 points and seven assists at UTEP. Scored 20 points and dished out nine assists vs. Wright State.

Junior (2005-06): Averaged 18.0 points, 3.4 rebounds, 3.9 assists, and 1.9 steals. Ranked sixth in the Mid-Continent in scoring, fourth in assists, second in steals, ninth in free throw percentage (.762), and ninth in three-point field goal percentage (.393). Scored 20 or more points ten times and topped the 30-point mark three times. Exploded for a career-high 39 points on 13-for-18 shooting, 7-for-11 from three-point range, and added eight assists vs. Oakland. Scored 37 points at Illinois-Chicago. Sank six threes in scoring 35 points at Cal State Fullerton. Tallied 26 points, a season-high ten rebounds, and a season-high six steals at Bradley. Registered 25 points at Nebraska. Posted 21 points, six rebounds, and seven assists at Michigan. Dished out a season-high ten assists vs. UMKC. Hit 19-for-23 free throws on his way to scoring 30 points vs. UMKC in the first round of the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament. Earned All-Tournament honors.

Sophomore (2004-05): Averaged 10.0 points, 1.7 rebounds, and a team-high 2.7 assists. Started 25 of 28 games. Scored in double figures 14 times. Registered a double-double of 19 points and a season-high ten assists vs. Western Illinois. Scored 17 points at Northwestern. Tallied 16 points, six rebounds, and a career-high six steals vs. Southern Utah. Notched 13 points at UCLA in the season opener. Registered season highs of 23 points and six rebounds vs. Valparaiso in the first round of the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament.

Freshman (2003-04): Averaged 8.4 points, 2.0 rebounds, and 2.1 assists in 22.5 minutes a contest. Started nine times. Scored in double figures ten times. Registered season highs of 26 points, seven assists, and five steals at DePaul. Scored 22 points on 8-for-13 shooting, including 4-for-4 from three-point range at Wagner. Tallied 19 points and five assists vs. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.
