

**THE NORTHWEST CAMPAIGN, 1885**

In the year 1885, the Government of Canada formed only eighteen years earlier, was deeply committed to the creation of one nation from sea to sea. To that end, the Government had taken a number of significant steps. In 1858, the Dominion Government purchased Rupert's Land and the North-Western Territory from the Hudson's Bay Company to form the Northwest Territories. Survey of this newly acquired territory was then commenced. Perhaps the most important step was the completion of the transcontinental line of the Canadian Pacific Railway, thus effectively linking the west coast with the east coast. There was, however, a serious obstacle to the Government's plans for the West. Many of the indigenous people were unwilling to accept the role which the Government had chosen for them as a subject people. Their traditional way of life, which was drastically affected by the arrival of the white man, was in the process of being destroyed. In the face of this, the Government was obliged to the point of starvation. For many Cree, there was little choice, when in 1876 they signed Treaty No. 6 with the Dominion Government. In this treaty, the Cree agreed to give up their traditional way of life and to accept the provisions of the treaty. In return, the Government agreed to provide them with assistance. While some of this Government assistance had been rendered to the Cree by 1885, a number of Indian Agents had aggravated the already tense situation through their own actions. Like the Cree, the Metis hunters of the Northwest were adversely affected by the depletion of the buffalo herds. Moreover, they were concerned that the Dominion Government showed little interest in their rights, especially concerning land ownership. These issues came to a head in the spring of 1885, when first the Metis under Louis Riel, then the Cree under Chief Big Bear took up arms against the Dominion Government. The Government responded by dispatching a military expedition to quell the insurrection. This map depicts the places and events relevant to the Northwest Rebellion in the Dominion of Canada circa 1885. The various routes taken by the North-West Field Force and the locations where it was engaged, are shown in detail.

**CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS**

**1884**  
 4 June Louis Riel, living in exile in the United States of America, is invited to return to Canada by a Metis delegation led by Gabriel Dumont.  
 11 July Riel holds his first public meeting since his return to Canada at Red Deer Hills.  
**1885**  
 19 March Riel establishes a provisional government in Saskatchewan. The Prime Minister of Canada, Sir John A. Macdonald, dispatches Major General Frederick Middleton to the Northwest Territories where he is to assume command of the Winnipeg militia in light of the recent Metis unrest.  
 26 March A force composed of North-West Mounted Police (N.W.M.P.) and Prince Albert volunteers commanded by Major Charles Clarke clashes with a Metis force led by Gabriel Dumont near Frog Lake. The Police and volunteers are forced to retreat to Fort Carlton.  
 27 March General Middleton arrives in Winnipeg. He departs for Qu'Appelle that evening with the 90th Battalion (less one company attached to Qu'Appelle), he writes the Minister of Militia and Defence, A.T. Carson. That more troops are needed. Carson mobilizes regular troops and orders them west to join General Middleton's force. In addition to these troops, certain militia units are also ordered to mobilize at Fort Pitt.  
 30 March General Middleton sends part of his force under Lieutenant Colonel Houghton to Fort Qu'Appelle.  
 2 April Chief Big Bear's Cree and other Indians arrive at Frog Lake. General Middleton moves the remainder of his force to Fort Qu'Appelle.  
 5 April The first troops from the East reach Winnipeg.  
 9 April General Middleton's Batocche Column leaves Qu'Appelle for Batoche.  
 9 April General Middleton authorizes Major General T.B. Strang to assume command of the Alberta Field Force which is being formed in Edmonton and then on to Fort Pitt where he would join with General Middleton's Batocche Column.  
 11 April General Middleton orders Lieutenant Colonel Ostrer to take the troops at Swift Current and to proceed from that place to Battersford. (Total strength: 545.)  
 13 April The Batocche Column leaves Swift Current for Battersford. Inspector Dickson and his detachment of N.W.M.P. abandon Fort Pitt to the Carabiniers Mont-Royal. **1 June** 29 The Batocche Column lands at a point ten kilometers from Fort Pitt where they are met by a messenger from General Strang who is carrying a message from General Strang.  
**2 June** 30 General Strang orders Major Steele and the cavalry to reconnoitre the Indian position at Frenchman's Butte. Major Steele reports that the position has been abandoned.  
**3 June** 31 General Strang orders his force to continue the pursuit of Chief Big Bear. They make camp three kilometers north of Frenchman's Butte that evening.  
**4 June** 32 General Middleton visits General Strang's camp. He authorizes General Strang to move his force towards Frog Lake via the Orion Lake. Major Steele with the cavalry (total strength: 27) to follow Chief Big Bear's trail.  
**5 June** 33 Major Steele's detachment overtakes Chief Big Bear's party at Loon Lake. After inflicting several casualties, Major Steele's force with the food and three ambushed policemen, retreats on the night. Chief Big Bear's Cree continue their retreat on the night.  
**6 June** 34 General Middleton orders the 85th Battalion to return to Fort Pitt while he continues the pursuit of Chief Big Bear with his cavalry.  
**7 June** 35 Scouts report to General Strang that Indians were seen in the vicinity of the Hudson's Bay Company store near Beaver River. General Strang takes a small mounted party to prevent the store's stock from being removed.  
**8 June** 36 The 65th Battalion and W.L.I. set off for the Hudson's Bay Company store.  
**9 June** 37 General Strang continues his pursuit of the Indians with his cavalry. Upon reaching the Roman Catholic mission at Beaver River, General Middleton's mounted force reaches the site of Major Steele's camp.  
**10 June** 38 General Middleton orders the Midland Battalion at Fort Pitt to return to the Northwest Field Force at Frog Lake.  
**11 June** 39 General Middleton orders Colonel Ostrer at Battersford to take Fort Pitt to the Carabiniers Mont-Royal.
