Dear Family and Friends:

Your Soldier recently reported to the 198th Infantry Brigade at Fort Benning, Georgia to begin the training that will prepare him to become a U.S. Army Infantryman. His decision to join the Army is a significant one, undoubtedly influenced by the pride and patriotism you have instilled in him.

Your Soldier has been assigned to Easy Company for his One Station Unit Training (OSUT). As his Company Commander, I would like to welcome you to Easy Company, 1st Battalion, 19th Infantry Regiment, and to the Army Family. The Company Cadre take pride in caring for and training these outstanding young men, building them into Infantry Soldiers. Our Drill Sergeants are specially selected, highly trained, and proud of their mission. They teach, train, and assess your Soldier throughout the cycle, and assist him in every manner to help him graduate. The Drill Sergeants will instill self-discipline, physical tenacity, mental toughness, and the tactical skills required of an infantryman into your Soldier.

<u>Mail</u>. We deliver mail to your Soldier as soon as it arrives. Mail typically takes longer to complete processing, but your Soldier will receive all of his mail that comes through the company. Please do not send packages containing the items on the contraband list enclosed in this letter (Enclosure 1). Soldiers are encouraged to write letters home throughout their training. Due to the rigors of this course, your words from home will serve as a great source of comfort and motivation.

- NOTE: Please outline (in your Soldier's PLT color) the back and front border of your envelope and write your Soldier's Roster Number on the front as well (Enclosure 4). This will help the Cadre sort the mail quicker.

- NOTE: Do not worry if you sent mail already without marking the borders. We understand you may not know his platoon or Roster Number until his first letter. If you have not received a phone call or letter prior to week four, please call the Company Training Technician at 706-544-8062.

Phone. Soldiers are given phone privileges once during the first nine weeks of training. This will occur within the first **72 hours** of their arrival to the company. Any additional phone calls are granted as earned privileges to the Soldiers. All privileges will be suspended or withheld based on performance.

Emergency Contact. In the case of a serious emergency (i.e., death in the family, serious illness, etc.) contact your local <u>American Red Cross</u> to ensure that the message will be sent through the proper channels. Ensure they know your Soldier belongs to E Company, 1-19 Battalion, 198th Brigade at Sand Hill, Ft. Benning, GA. This will be the FASTEST way to contact your Soldier.

<u>Family Day Pass</u>. Soldiers who have completed all mandatory graduation requirements up to Phase III, have no pending UCMJ actions against them, and have successfully demonstrated the basics of Soldiering, will be granted a Family Day Pass. The Family Day Pass consists of two days from **5-6 May**. This break represents the completion of Initial Entry Training (IET), before your Soldier resumes specific Advanced Infantry Training (AIT), immediately following the Family Day Pass. This pass is an earned privilege that can be denied at any time due to misbehavior. An orientation briefing for families and guests will occur at 0800 in the 1-19th Battalion classroom 128 located at 9075 Holcomb Drive, Ft Benning, GA 31905.

- Instructions for Family Day Pass: (Subject to Change)

5 - 6 May 2017

0800 – Family Day Pass Brief in Classroom 128 (First Day Only)

0900/0800 (Second Day) - Pass

1900 – Return to Company

- NOTE: Your Soldier will be your best source for information regarding Family Day Pass. All Soldiers who do not qualify for a Pass will be afforded the opportunity to notify their Families immediately. It is HIGHLY recommended that all travel reservations are made with a refund option.

- NOTE: Directions to the Company will be posted on the 1-19 IN Battalion Facebook Page (search for @119rocksteady on Facebook). It is also recommended that visitors to Ft. Benning download the free GuideOn App and search for (Keyword) 1-19.

Soldiers will be required to return back to the company area each day no later than 1900. Soldiers MUST adhere to the rules of OSUT, including restrictions from alcohol, tobacco, drug use, automotive driving, caffeinated items and other contraband. Soldiers will not be allowed to bring any such items back to the Company at the conclusion of the Pass. Throughout the Pass, Soldiers must remain in military uniform and observe all military customs, courtesies, and discipline. Soldiers will remain in the Columbus, Georgia or Phenix City, Alabama area (within a 25 mile radius).

<u>Turning Blue Ceremony</u>. At the completion of OSUT, Soldiers who have completed all graduation requirements and who are not pending any UCMJ and/or Entry Level Separation, will be awarded the Infantry Blue Cord and participate in the Turning Blue Ceremony.

A Turning Blue Brief will take place prior to the ceremony at **0800** on **8 JUNE** 2017, at the same location as the Family Day Pass. The Turning Blue Ceremony will be immediately after the brief. During the Turning Blue ceremony your Soldier will receive his Infantry Blue Cord, signifying that he has completed all requirements to earn the title of U.S. Army Infantryman. Upon completion of the ceremony, your Soldier will be released for the remainder of the day.

Graduation. Graduation will occur on 9 JUNE 2017 outside the National Infantry Museum. The ceremony will begin promptly at 1000. I recommend you arrive an hour early to allow time for parking and finding a seat. Upon completion of the ceremony, Soldiers will be released to travel to their follow-on assignments. For more information about graduation and the National Infantry Museum, visit their website at www.nationalinfantrymuseum.com. Click on "Plan Your Visit" and then "Graduations".

- NOTE: Only the Soldiers who have met all requirements will graduate. If a Soldier fails to pass a mandatory event or is injured, he will be recycled to another company to complete the missed training. Your Soldier will have the opportunity to notify his Family if he fails to graduate.

The Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) office can assist the Family and friends of graduating Soldiers by referring local hotels and car rental agencies. You can

visit their website at www.benningmwr.com. On-post accommodations are limited and on a first-come, first-served basis so you must call ahead to check availability: (706) 689-0067. MWR also offers the opportunity to stay at the Uchee Creek Recreation area. Uchee Creek provides individual cabins that are completely furnished, including a kitchen, for about the same price as a hotel room. Uchee Creek can be reached at (706) 545-4053 (details are also available on the MWR website). 


