<b>Property Description</b>	The building was commissioned by the Bishop Gargallo in 1592, and was to be used as a				
	college for the Jesuits in Malta. The building is three storeys highs and is constructed with				
	airy, vaulted corridors on all three floors. The rooms which consisted of the old lecture				
	halls, classrooms and lodging rooms of the Jesuits are all connected to the corridors. The façade of this building is characterized by the main entrance which consists of a Doric				
	portico leading to a flight of stairs. Above the portico, there is a three-dimensional				
	sculpture featuring a crowned coat-of arms which is flanked by a unicorn on one side and				
	a lion on the other. The windows on the ground floor are not aligned with those on the first and second floors. The building has also a small church with a simple interior having				
	a raised podium above the altar, supported with braided columns. A unique collection of				
	artefacts from Papua New Guinea and Africa as well as a number of plaster casts of				
	statues and busts of classical Greek figures and wall friezes taken from the originals at the				
	Acropolis are exhibited in the corridors of the Old University.
