LOCAL GOVERNMENT, ENGLAND AND WALES CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

The Woking (Parish of Byfleet) Order 1989

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the Local Government Act 1972 (a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order which gives effect to proposals submitted to him under sections 47, 48(9) and 51(1) of that Act, more than six weeks before the making of this Order, by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England following recommendations made to them under section 48(8) of that Act by the Woking Borough Council for proposals about parishes in the borough:

Citation and commencement

1.-(1) This Order may be cited as the Woking (Parish of Byfleet) Order 1989.

- (2) This Order shall come into force on 1st December 1989 for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (b).
- (3) For all other purposes this Order shall come into force on 1st April 1990.

Creation of new parish

2. There shall be created in the borough of Woking a new parish, to be known as Byfleet, which shall consist of the part of the unparished area of the borough which is marked El on the maps prepared by the Department of the Environment, marked "Maps of the Woking (Parish of Byfleet) Order 1989", duly numbered for reference, and deposited in accordance with regulation 5 of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976.

Parish council for the new parish

- 3.-(1) There shall be a parish council for the new parish of Byfleet created by article 2.
- (2) From 1st April 1990 until the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1990 the parish council of the new parish shall consist of the councillors representing the Byfleet ward of the borough of Woking. Thereafter the parish council shall consist of 9 parish councillors.
- (3) The new parish shall be divided into 3 parish wards as shown on the maps referred to in article 2 above, to be called the Byfleet North, Byfleet South East and Byfleet South West

parish wards. From the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1990 each parish ward shall be represented by 3 parish councillors.

- (4) Councillors for the new parish shall retire on the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1991 and in every fourth year thereafter.
- (5) The proper officer of the Woking Borough Council shall convene -
 - (a) the first annual meeting of the parish council for the new parish; and
 - (b) the first assembly of the parish meeting for the new parish.
- (6) If in the new parish the first assembly of the parish meeting is held before the first annual meeting of the parish council, that parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair who shall have, for the purpose of that occasion only, the powers and authority of the chairman of the meeting.

Expenses of the new parish council

4. For the financial year beginning on 1st April 1990, the Woking Borough Council shall set its personal community charge for the new parish, and make payments to the council of the new parish, as if that parish council had issued a precept to the borough council requiring the payment of the sum of £25,000.

EXPLANATORY NOTE


(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order creates in the borough of Woking a new parish and parish council of Byfleet, and makes transitional provision for parish electoral arrangements.

The map forming part of this note (page 5) gives a general guide to the areas affected. Prints of the detailed boundary maps (described in article 2) may be inspected at all reasonable times at the office of the Woking Borough Council and at the office of the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB.

The new parish will have approximately an area of 293 hectares and a population of 7,185.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (S.I. 1976/246 amended by S.I. 1978/247) contain general provisions regarding the effect of orders such as this one.
