Motion by Mr. Sterling, seconded by Judge Mly, that State Highm way \#113 be redesignated to go from Victoria in Victoria County, to Austwell, in Refurio County, via Tivoli. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Sterling, seconded by Judge Ely, that the Federal Aid Highway System as described in the letter of the Secretary of Agriculture of August 12, 1923, be modified providing for the cancellation of State Highway $\$ 59$ from Midfield, Matagorda County, and also that portion of State Highway \#58 from Bay City, in Matagorda County, to Ganado, in Jackson County, and that State Highway 458 be extended from Bay City to the Army Camp, via Palacios, and that the State Highway Bngineer make a request of the Bureau of Public Roads for this modification. Motion carried. of the Commission of August 24,1925 , October 10, 1927, November 15, 1927, and February 22, 1928, relative to the highway between Rockport, in Aransas County, and Palacios, in Matagorda County, be cancelled and in lieu thereof State Highway 457 be extended from Rockport by way of Portilavaca to a connection with State Highway \#58, just east of Blessing, in Matam gorde County; the location to be on the most practicable route, to be approved by the State Highway Higineer. Motion carried.
of $\$ 8,800$, Motion by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Mr. Sterling, that the $a$ um of $\$ 8,800,00$ be made as a special maintenance allotment to cover the cost of redecking and reflooring the Brazos River Bridge on Eighway \#19, in Brazoria, County, this worly having been completed in a satisfactory manner under the terms of a contract between the State Highway Department and the Houston \& Brazos Valley Railway Company, dated June 13, 1927, and also to pay for the placing of an asphaltic surface treatment on this bridge in accordance with the terms of said contract. Motion carried.
of $\$ 9,000$ Motion by Mr. Sterling, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that the sum of an approach apan on the Brazos River Briage on Highway $\$ 58$, near West Columbia, in Brazoria County, contingent upon the county paying fifty ( $50 \%$ ) per cent of the cost which is estimated at $\$ 18,000.00$ and placing their share of the cost in escrow. Motion carried. be appropriated to Comanche County out of the State Highway Fund to $\infty$ ve the cost df grading and structures on State Highway $\# 10$, from Comanche to the Brawn County line, on condition that Comanche County furnish an equal amount and in addition, furnish the State 80 ft . right-of-way; Iocation to be, approved by the State Highway Engineer. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Juage Ely, that two-thirds State and Federal Aid be allotted to Kllis County for constructing concred pavement on that part of Highway \#6, 8 $3 / 4 \mathrm{miles}$ long, between Waxahechlec fad Forreston, covered by B.A.P. $487-\mathbb{F}$, the estimated cost of which pavepent is $\$ 235,000.00$, on condition that Ellis County furnish $1 / 3$ of the cost of seid project and furnish 80 ft . right-oferway; and that the State High Tay Engineer be directed to appoint a Resident Engineer to prepare plans and advertise for construction. Motion cerried.

March 19, 1928. the project, be made to Iimestone County for the recingtruction and paving with conctete of that part of Federal Aid Project 137 within the city limits of Mexia, not to exceed one mile and not then beyond a point where the houses on said Highway are closer then 200 feet apart. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Sterling, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that the sum of $\$ 6,000.00$ be appropriated for the painting, refiooring and repairing of the Trinity River Bridge, on Highway \#\%, near Liberty, Texas, in Liberty County. Motion carried.

Motion by Judge Ely, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that $\$ 7,000,00$ be appropriated to cover the cost of constructing a creosoted pile trestle with I-beem spans over the Pecos River on State Highwey \#99 and that the State Highway Engineer be authorized to prepare plans and advertise for bids. Motion carried. This is between Pecos and Crockett Counties.

Motion by Mr. Sterling, seconded by Judge Ely, that since the present location of the 17 miles of Highway $\# 12-B$ in Stary County, from Roma northwest to the Starr-Zapata County line has a very poor alignment and is poorly located, and since the proper location has been surveyed, that the unexpended belance of the main tenance budget for thissection bf highway, amounting to $\$ 9,000.00$ be expended in clearing and grubbing and grading and maintaining this stretch of highway on the surveyed and proper location. Motion carried.

Motion by Judge Ely, seconded by Mr. Sterling, that Taylor County Fe allotted $\$ 3,432.23$ State Aid, which is $2 / 3$ of what an 18 foot strip of pavement of the seme type adjacent to the City of Merkel for approximately 1223' through the City of Merkel on State Highway \#l would have cost, on fondition that the City of Merkel pass and keep in effect and enforce an prdinance requiring parallel parking along the entire highway through the city, and further that Taylor County, and the City of Merkel, will guaranta to the State to maintain the pavement as constructed in a condition satis factory to the State Highwey Department. Motion carried.

Motion by Judge Ely, seconded by Mr. Sterling; that the sum of $\$ 3,500,00$ be appropriated out of the State Highway Fund to pay the cost of locationsurvey of State Highway \#6, and of State Highway \#20, through Waller County, Texas, the location to be along the most practicable direct route and to determine the plost feasible junction point between these two highways. Motion carried.

March 19, 1928. Ht ing theer be authorized to have survey made for the location of Highway \#23 north of Jernon, in Wilbarger County, to the State line, on condition that Wilbarger County shall provide not less than 80 ft . rightofmay and pay the expense of said survey. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Sterling, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that an allotment of $\$ 20,000.00$ or so much thereof as necessary be made to Williamson County for the purpose of inproving and graveling approximately 7 miles of State Highway \#102 from the Lee County line west, and that the State Highway Engineer be authorized to advertise for bids for the completion of said project. It is further understood and agreed that the $H_{1}$ ghway Comaission reserves the right that when this project is completed to dism continue this road as a State Highway and turn it over to Lee and Williamson Counties for maintenance. Motion carried.

Motion by Judze Ely, seconded by Mr. Sterling, that the sum of $\$ 3,000,00$ be expended out of the unexpended balance of Maintenance Budget \#16, authorization \#30 in Zapata County for surveying and locating a permanent location for the fifty-eight miles of Highway \#12-B across Zapata County, the present location being very poor and the digment bad. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Sterling, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that application for designation from Walnut Springs, in Bosque County, to Glen Rose, in Somervell County, a distance of 10 miles, be postponed indefinitely. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Sterlinc, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that the allotment of $\$ 33,000.00$ Federal Aid, $\$ 100,000.00$ State Aid and $\$ 66,000.00$ County Aid granted to Matagorda County on June 20, 1927, for grading and drainage structures on approximately 33 miles of State Highway \#58, between the Brazoria County line and Midfield be canceled; and that \$133,000,00 State Aid be granted in Iieu thereof on Highway \#58 from \$razoria County liae to Blessing, on condition that Matagorda County contributed $\$ 66,000,00$ to such work, and further that the allotment as made on June 20, 1927, on H1 ghway \#59, from Midfield to the Army Camp be made to apply on Highway \#58 from Blessing to the Army Comp, via Palacios. Hotion carried.

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Whereas, it appeans that there are certain gaps in the Highway System thest should be provided with a surfacing at this time,

Therefore, be it resolved, that the financing of the following gaps be taken up with the respective counties in which they lie and if these counties can provide the required funds then the following allotments of aid be made, and if the counties furnish their pro rata share as set forth below, the State Highway Engineer is directed to have prem pared the necessary plans and proceed with the awarding of contracts;
(1) Taylor County. Two-thirds State and Federal Funds for the placing of a surfacing on T.A.P. 444-1, Highway \#1, west of Abilene with the County fumishing oneathird of the total cost of the completed road.
(2) Tom Green County. Two-thirds State and Federal Funds for the placing of a surfacing on that portion of B.A.F. 229 from San Angelo to the Rumels County line on Highway \$30, with the County furnishing onethird of the total cost of the completed road.
(3) Hopkins County. State and Federel Funds for the construction of hard surfacing sections $C$ and $D$ on F.A.P. 431 on condition that the total amount to be contributed by Hopkins County, first and last, shall be one-third of the total cost of construction of all improvements on Highway \#1, through the said County of Hopkins.
(4) Crimes Countye Two-thirds State and Federal Funds for the placing of a surfacing on F.A.P. $471-C$, Highway f 6 , with the County furnishing one-third of the cost.
(5) Hall County. Wwo-thirds State and Federal Funds for the placing of surfacing on that portion of J.A.P. $438-\mathbb{H}$, Highway \#F5, now being used by the traffic with the county furnishing onemthird of the cost.

The type of surfacing on each of these projects is to be determined by the State Highway Engineer.

Motion by Mr. Sterling, seconded by Judge Ely, that in the futur no hard surfacing will be placed through the Maintenance Department where counties have failed to secure or giarantee as much as an 80 ft , rifehtof way: this shall apply to all authorizations heretofore made for the topping of State Highways. Motion carried.

On motion of Mr. Johnson, seconded by: Judge Hiy, the following resolution was passed:

WHRERAS, the process by which foreign cement is made is not certainly known; and

WHMRHAS, the same necessarily undergoes certain climatic and Weather conditions and must be stored in large quantities before using;

The State Highway Engineer is hereby authorized to aubmit all such cement to adequate tests before being used in the construction of State Highways, twenty-eight day tests if necessary. Motion carried.

Motion by Judge Bly, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that the sum of \$2,799.31 be appropriated for the construction of improvements to the division warehouse of Division $\$ 5$, at Lubbock, Texas. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Judge Ely, that the bond of Gibio Ginchrist. State Highway Engineer, in the amount of $\$ 5,000.00$ be approved. Motion carried.

Motion by Judge Hily，seconded by Mr．Sterling，that contract for the construction of grading and drainage structures using copper iron cilverts，from end of F．A．P．$\# 360-A$ ，northwest to Kinney County line，on Highway \＃3，T．A．P．$\$ 360-C$ in Uvolde County，be awarded to Kyle and Peter－ son．Hutto，Texas，for $\$ 82,008.19$ ，same being the lowest and best bid and said awqrd is concurred in by Mr．P．H．Everett，Highway Engineer， Federal Bureau of Public Roads，and Mr．D．W．Hooper，County Engineer of Uvalde County．Motion carried．

Motion by Judge Ely，seconded by Mr．Sterling，that contract for the construction of grading and drainage structures from the Young County Iine northeast to Archer City on Eighway \＃79，F．A．P．\＃532mB，in Archer County，be awarded to Mç耳iung Construction Company，for $\$ 31,989.57$ ； same being the lowest，and best bid and said award is concurred in by Mr．P．H．Everett，H ghway Engineer，Federal Bureau of Public Roads， and Mr．Guy R．Johnstón，Resident Engineer．Motion carried．

Motion by Judge Ely，seconded by Mr．Sterling that contract for fonstruction of gravel base course and double bitwninous surface treatment from Trinity to Groveton on Highway \＃94，S．A．P．677－A，Unit II，in Trinity pounty，be awarded to the Lone Star Construction Company，San Antonio，Tea for $\$ 211,568.32$ ，with the provision that for the item of＂material hauled flditional $\frac{1}{4}$ mile＂haill shall be paid for as thrugh it originated at the delivery points shown on the houl diagrams embodied in the plans for this Hroject regardless of actual points of origin of the haul．Said award yeing the lowest and best and is concurred in by Mr．G．R．Abney，Resident Fngineer．Motion carried．

Highway Engineer is authorized to make location surveys on those portions of State Highways $1,2,3,4,5,6,7,9,12,14,15,16,20,30,31,32$, 40 and 43, as may not already have been located on locations definitely provided for, the cost of such locations to be kept separate for each county in order that it may be charged back to the construction of arch highways when made. For this work there is an appropriation hereby made of $\$ 100,000,00$. The State Highway Engineer is authorized to place parties in the field or to contract under definite provisions for such location surveys. Motion carried.
