In <u>Caldwell</u> County on bids received February 27, 1931, contract construction of grading and drainage structures from Highway #3-A near Luling to the Gonzales County line, a distance of 1.179 miles, on State Highway #29, S.P. 932-A, is awarded to Huse Popejoy, Waco, Texas, for \$16,970.87, which is the lowest and best bid.

3766. In <u>Victoria</u> County on bids received February 27, 1931, contract for construction of grading and small drainage structures from Refugio County line to Victoria, a distance of 16,904 miles, on State Highway #128, S.P. 840-E, is awarded to E. G. Powell, Jacksonville, Texas, for \$55,808.17; and the contract for the large structures is awarded to Monarch Engineering Company, San Antonio, Texas, for \$44,823.99, which are the lowest and best bids.

3767.

In <u>Hunt</u> County an initial appropriation of \$42,428.41 State Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #1, S.P.949-A extending from the end of F.A.P. 171 southwest of Greenville to Wellington Street in Greenville, a distance of 2.511 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish for such improvement its proportionate share of the actual cost when county funds are available and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county. This minute is supplementary to minute #3654, dated January 22, 1931, which authorizes advertisement for bids. A.F.E. 31-77.

In Johnson County an initial appropriation of \$26,424.73 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #68, F.A.P. 592-D, extending from the Ellis County line to a point 1.7 miles west of Venus, a distance of 2.587 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish for such improvement its proportionate one-third share of the actual cost when county funds are available and such rightof-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county. <u>A.F.E. 31-78</u>

3769.

In <u>Tarrant</u> County an increase appropriation of \$747.95 State Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #114, S.P. 839-D, from Dallas County line to Denton County line, a distance of 10.04 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures. This additional appropriation being required to properly finance underpass near Grapevine. Texas, as per agreement dated January 21st, 1930, with the St. Louis and Southwestern Railway Company. <u>A.F.E. 31-79</u>.

In <u>Comanche</u> County an initial appropriation of \$92,279.44 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #10, F.A.P. 580-G, for the construction of Leon River Bridge and roadway approaches, on condition that said county will furnish such rightof-way as may be required to be not less than 100 ft. in width, fencing to be done by the County. <u>A.F.E. 31-80</u>.

In <u>Foard</u> County an initial appropriation of \$136,892.81 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #28, F.A.P. 536-B & C, extending from a point 5 miles west of Crowell to the Cottle County line, a distance of 15.451 miles, for the construction of a triple bituminous surface treatment on water bound macadam **Base** course, on condition that said county will furnish \$68,446.40 for such improvement, and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Foard County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is onethird. <u>A.F.E. 31-81</u>

In <u>Montague</u> County an initial appropriation of \$77,746.00 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be Expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #2, F.A.P. 128-C, Reop., extending from the Red River Bridge south, a distance of 1.919 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county, and with the further understanding that when funds are available Montague County shall reimburse the Highway Department to the extent of one-third the actual cost of construction. <u>A.F.E. 31-82</u>.

It is ordered by the Commission that <u>Cottle</u> County be reimbursed to the extent of two-thirds of the actual cost of construction of an earth dam built by Cottle County at a cost of \$3,100.00 upon receipt of a certified statement off cost from the County Clerk of said County. This dam was built during Unit I construction adjacent to Station 1195 of F.A.P. 536-A, approximately 9.4 miles northeast of Paducah on Highway #28 for the purpose of securing water to be used during the construction of Unit II. <u>A.F.E. 31-83</u>.

In Wheeler County an initial appropriation of \$35,516.79 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #75, F.A.P. 547-E and S.P 844-E, extending from Shamrock to the Oklahoma State line, a distance of 13.299 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$18,577.42 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required to be not less than 100 ft. in width, except within the City of Shamrock, where the minimum right-of-way width shall be not less than 80 feet, fencing to be done by the County; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate Wheeler County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3% of the F.A.P. 547-E and 50% of that portion of S.P. 844-E, not eligible for Federal participation. In <u>Randall</u> County an initial appropriation of \$30,570.12 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #33, F.A.P. 174-A-Reop., from Canyon to the Deaf Smith County line, a distance of 15.220 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures on condition that said county will furnish \$15,285.06 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the County; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate Randall County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3 percent. <u>A.F.E. 31-85</u>.

In <u>Gray</u> County an initial appropriation of \$117,994.74 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #33, F.A.P. 421-G, extending from the Carson County line to Pampa, a distance of 7.386 miles, for the construction of concrete pavement, on condition that said county will furnish \$58,997.37 for such improvement, and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Gray County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3 percent. <u>A.F.E. 31-86</u>.

In <u>Crosby</u> County an initial appropriation of \$8,750.23 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #24, F.A.P. 443-E, extending from the west line of Read Dist. #1 to 1.51 miles east of Crosbyton, a distance of 6.044 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$4,375.12 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the County; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate Crosby County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3 percent. <u>A.F.E. 31-87.</u>

In <u>Lubbock</u> County an initial appropriation of \$266,067.21 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #9, F.A.P. 546-A, extending from Lubbock to the Hale County line, a distance of 16.405 miles, for the construction of concrete pavement, on condition that said county will furnish \$133,033.61 for such improvement; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Lubbock County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3 percent. A.F.E. 31-88.

In <u>Lubbock</u> County an increase appropriation of \$134.96 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #9, F.A.P. 613-D, from Lubbock to Lynn County line, a distance of 12.32 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$2,335.77 for such improvement. This additional appropriation being required to cover the final estimate. A.F.E. 31-89.

3780.

In <u>Lubbock</u> County reference is made to Minute #3664, which provides for the construction of one mile of pavement on State Highway #7, on College Avenue adjacent to the Technological Coblege; it being brought to the attention of the Commission that College Avenue is entirely on State property, the City thereby not being able to assist in constructing it, and it being requested by the Directors of the Technological College that a two 20 ft. stretch of pavement be constructed adjacent to the College, the Commission is willing to construct one 20 ft. section of this pavement provided Lubbock County will furnish the cost of an additional 20 ft. of a similar stretch; and provided that Lubbock County will pay the entire cost of curb and gutter.

3781.

In <u>Hall</u> County an initial appropriation of \$23,420,73 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #18, F.A.P. 602-B, from the east line of Road Dist. #4, to Hulver, a distance of 10.550 miles, for the construction of gfading and drainage structures on condition that said county will furnish \$11,710.37 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Hall County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3 percent. A.F.E. 31-90.

In <u>Reeves</u> County, State Highway #17, F.A.P. 607-A, and S.P.965-A extending from Pecos to Arno, a distance of 17.250 miles, said county shall furnish such right-of-way as may be required to be not less than 100 feet in width, except within the City of Pecos, where the right-ofway shall not be less than 60 feet in width, fencing to be done by the Countyl This minute is supplementary to and voids only that portion that fequires 100 ft. width of right-of-way of Minute #2889, dated May 20,1930.

3783.

In <u>Pecos</u> County an initial appropriation of \$82,817.05 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #27, F.A.P. 612-B, extending from 7.22 miles west of Fort Stockton to the Reeves County line, a distance of 24.218 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$41,408.52 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Pecos County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost which is 33-1/3 percent. <u>A.F.E. 31-91</u>

3784.

In <u>Runnels</u> County an initial appropriation of \$66,893.11 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #4, F.A.P. 590-A, extending from Ballinger to the Concho County line, a distance of 10.957 miles, for the construction of a triple bituminous surface treatment on a caliche base, on condition that said county will furnish \$33,446.56 for such improvement; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Runnels County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3 percent. <u>A.F.E. 31-92.</u>

3785.

In <u>Brown</u> County an initial appropriation of \$72,439.96 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #7, F.A.P. 583-C, extending from 2.5 miles east of Brownwood to the Mills County line, a distance of 12.344 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$24,969.98 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required fencing to be done by the county; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Brown County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost which is one-third. The County's share of the cost of this construction is 33-1/3 %, less \$7,500.00, this credit being part of the \$20,000.00 reduction in county funds provided for in Minute #3062, dated July 30, 1930. A.F.E. 31-93.

In <u>Brown</u> County an initial appropriation of \$277,455.93 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #10, F.A.P. 580-B, extending from 1.5 miles east of Brownwood to the Comanche County line, a distance of 14.242 miles, for the construction of concrete pavement, on condition that said county will furnish \$82,485.31 for such improvement, and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Brown County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost which is 25%. The County's share of the cost of this construction is 25% less \$7,500.00 this sum of \$7,500.00 being part of the \$20,000.00 reduction in county funds provided for in Minute #3062, dated July 30, 1930. <u>A.F.E.</u> **3D-94**.

In <u>Haskell</u> County an initial appropriation of \$326,864.73 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #30, F.A.P. 452-C and S.P. 597-C, extending from Haskell north to the Knox County line, a distance of 17.598 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures and concrete pavement, on condition that said county will furnish \$169,529.43 for such improvement, and such rightof-way as may be required, to be not less than 100 ft. in width, except within the City of Haskell where the minimum right-of-way width shall be 75 feet and within the City of Weinert where the minimum right-of-way width shall be 85 feet, fencing to be done by the county; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate Haskell County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3% on F.A.P. 452-C, and 50% on that portion of S.P. 597-C not eligible for Federal participation. That part of minute #1767 applying to this project is hereby cancelled. A.F.E.31-95.

In <u>Freestone</u> County an initial appropriation of \$457,269.14 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #32, F.A.P. 483-B, extending from Fairfield to the Leon County line, a distance of 17.396 miles, for the construction of concrete pavement, and with the further understanding that when funds are available, Freestone County shall reimburse the Highway Department in such amount as necessary to provide one-third the actual cost of constructing Units I and II. <u>A.F.E. 31-96</u>.

In <u>McLennan</u> County an initial appropriation of \$13,851.99 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #67, F.A.P. 593-A, from Bosque Blvd, east to a connection with Highway #2, a distance of 3.171 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures on condition that said county will furnish \$6,926.00 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing additional cost, which is 33-1/3%. This minute is supplementary to minute #1162 dated January 23, 1929. <u>A.F.E. 31-97.</u>

3790.

In <u>McLennan</u> County an initial appropriation of \$91,853.22 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #67, F.A.P. 593-C, extending from the Bosque County line to the Speegleville Road, a distance of 14.416 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$72,080.00 (\$5,000.00 per mile) for such improvement, and such rightof-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate McLennan County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost. This minute is supplementary to Minute #1162, dated January 23rd, 1929. <u>A.F.E. 31-98.</u>

In <u>Bosque</u> County an initial appropriation of \$13,064.10 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #67, F.A.P. 593-D, extending from Valley Mills to the McLennan County line, a distance of 0.424 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county, and with the further understanding that, when funds are available Bosque County shall reimburse the Highway Department to the extent of one-third the actual cost of construction. <u>A.F.E. 31-99.</u>

3792.

In <u>Harrison</u> County an increase appropriation of \$4,196.02 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #43, F.A.P. 481...F, from Sabine River to Marshall, a distance of 10.709 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, this additional appropriation being required to cover overruns on final estimate. <u>A.F.E. 31-100</u>.

3793.

In <u>Henderson</u> County an initial appropriation of \$206,122.95 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #40, F.A.P. 576-A, and S.P. 881-A, extending from Athens to Eustace, a distance of 11.141 miles, for the construction of concrete pavement, on condition that said county will furnish \$68,000.00 for such improvement. <u>A.F.E. 31-101</u>.

In <u>Henderson</u> County an initial appropriation of \$105,900.93 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #40, F.A.P. 576-B, extending from Eustace to the Kaufman County line, a distance of 5.586 miles, for the construction of concrete pavement on condition that said county will furnish \$32,000.00 for such improvement. <u>A.F.E. 31-102</u>.

In <u>Tyler</u> and <u>Jasper</u> Counties an initial appropriation of \$158,549.71 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #40, F.A.P. 606-A, from Rockland to Angelina County line, a distance of 1.534 miles, for the construction of Neches River Bridge and roadway approaches, on condition that said county will furnish such rightof-way as may be required to be not less than 100 ft. in width, fencing to be done by the county. <u>A.F.E. 31-103</u>.

3796.

In <u>Waller</u> County an increase appropriation of \$3,893.99 State Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #6, S.P. 778-D, from Precinct #6 line to Harris County line, a distance of 6.399 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures. This additional appropriation being required to cover overruns on final estimate. <u>A.F.E. 31-104</u>.

3797.

In <u>Brazoria</u> County an increase appropriation of \$27,706.86 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #58, F.A.P. 442-B, extending from the Matagorda County line, to the San Bernado River, a distance of 7.416 miles, for the construction of concrete pavement, on condition that upon the sale of county bonds, Brazoria County shall reimburse the State Highway Department to the extent of one-third of the entire cost of construction, and with the further understanding that the county shall place in escrow sufficient bonds to cover its share of the cost, and if requested by the State Highway Commission, Brazoria County will immediately convert said bonds into cash. This appropriation is necessary in order to provide additional funds for the difference between the revised estimate and the appropriation of \$180,105.62 made in Minute #3689. <u>A.F.E. 31-105</u>.

In <u>Wharton</u> County the State Highway Department agrees to pay to Wharton County two-thirds of the actual cost of an 18 foot strip down the center of the proposed city paving on the route of State Highway #12, through the City of Wharton, Texas, from the south property line of Colorado Street to the G. C. & S. F. Railway tracks and will pay two-thirds the actual cost of construction of a 20 foot pavement from the south property line of Colorado Street to the north end of the Colorado River Bridge, aggregating in all 0.667 miles in net length, on condition that the P.S. & E. for this work be submitted to the State Highway Engineer and approved, and that the county enter into a project agreement with the State covering the work. The State Highway Engineer is hereby authorized to act for the commission in the execution of the agreement. <u>A.F.E. 31-106</u>

In <u>Karnes</u> County an initial appropriation of \$94,916.18 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #16, F.A.P. 434-C & E, extending from the Wilson County line to the end of F.A.P. 434-D, a distance of 6.039 miles, for the construction of rock asphalt surface on a crushed stone base, on condition that said county will furnish all the funds it has in escrow for such improvement, and on the further condition that when funds are available, Karnes County shall reimburse the Highway Department in such amount as necessary to provide one-third the actual cost of constructing Units I and II. <u>A.F.E. 31-107</u>

In <u>Gonzales</u> County an initial appropriation of \$70,352.81 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #81, F.A.P. 440-E, from a point 5.55 mikes east of Smiley to the DeWitt County line, a distance of 5.320 miles, for the construction of a limestone rock asphalt surface course on a crusher-run limestone and volcanic ash base courses, on condition that said county will furnish for such improvement its one-third proportionate share of the actual cost when county funds are available and such right-of-way as may be required to be not less than 100 feet in width, fencing to be done by the county. <u>A.F.F. 31-108</u>

In <u>Colorado</u> County an initial appropriation of \$66,464.60 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #71, F.A.P. 417-C, from the Fayette County line to the Colorado River, a distance of 11.405 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$33,232.30 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate Colorado County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3%. <u>A.F.E. 31-109</u>.

In <u>Guadalupe</u> County an initial appropriation of \$173,155.69 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #3-A, F.A.P. 521-A, extending from the east city limits of Seguin to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles east of Kingsbury, a distance of 9.554 miles, for the construction of a concrete base with rock asphalt top, on condition that said county will furnish \$30,000.00 for such improvement and be credited for such county funds as were expended in excess of the County's pro-rata share on Unit I construction (\$11,651.48) and with the further understanding that when funds are available Guadalupe County shall reimburge the Highvay Department in such amount as necessary to provide one-third the actual cost of constructing Units I and II. <u>A.F.E. 31-110.</u>

In <u>Gillespie</u> County an increase appropriation of \$51.94 fitate Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #9, F.A.P. 42-A & B-Reop., from Mason County line to Kendall County line, a distance of 27.63 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures. This additional appropriation being required to pay final estimate. <u>A.F.E. 31-112</u>.

In <u>Caldwell</u> County an initial appropriation of \$15,018.26 State Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #29. S.P. 932-A, from the Gonzales County line to an intersection with Highway #3-A, a distance of 1.179 miles, for the construction of grading and drainage structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$7,509.13 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the county; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate Caldwell County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is 33-1/3%. A.F.E. 31-113.

3806.

In <u>Kinney</u> County an initial appropriation of \$178,391.11 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #3, F.A.P. 484-A & B, extending from the west city limits of Brackettwille to a point 1,700 feet east of the Val Verde County line, a distance of 17.289 miles, for the construction of rock asphalt surface course on caliche base, on condition that Kinney County shall furnish its proportionate share of the cost when County Funds become available in accordance with the terms of Minute #3705. <u>A.F.E. 31-114</u>.

It is ordered by the Commission that the State Highway Engineer be instructed to notify the State Highway Commission of Louisiana, that Texas is agreeable to joining in the building of a new bridge across Sabire River, at the point where Louisiana Route #6 meets Texas Route #21, in <u>Sabine</u> County, for work to start during the year 1931, but are unable to participate in the building of the Jasper-Leesville Bridge, Louisiana Route #21 and Texas Route #45, in <u>Newton</u> County, and the DeQuincy-Orange Bridge, Louisiana Route #7, and Texas Route #87, in <u>Orange</u> County, but will consider same for program of 1932.

The above appropriation is made on the condition that Calhoun County contribute an additional sum of \$35,000.00 to cover the remainder of the increased cost of this project. <u>A.F.E. 31-171</u>.

It is ordered by the Commission that the State Highway Engineer be authorized to enter into negotiations with the Missouri Pacific Railway Company for the construction of an underpass for State Highway #128, near Refugio, in <u>Refugio</u> County, and when negotiations have been completed the State Highway Engineer is authorized to execute a contract on behalf of the State for the construction of this underpass.

It is ordered by the Commission that the State Highway Engineer be authorized to enter into negotiations with the Missouri Pacific Railway Company for the construction of an underpass for State Highway #145, near Kittie, in <u>Live Oak</u> County, and when negotiations have been com-lete the State Highway Engineer is authorized to execute a contract on behalf of the State for the construction of this underpass.

In <u>Austin</u> County an initial appropriation of \$7,070.14 State Fund is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Maintenance Division on State Highway #60, from Wharton-Austin County line north to Wallis, a distance of 2.60 miles; this appropriation being made for betterment work, Job M-17-L-3, for crusher run limestone base course and on condition that said county will furnish such right-of-way as may be required to be not less than 80 feet in width, fencing to be done by the county. <u>A.F.E. 31-173</u>.

3932.

In <u>Dallas</u> County the survey as made by the State Highway Engineer of alternate route into Dallas beginning at West Commerce Bridge and inter secting the present Dallas-Fort Worth Pike at a point about 2,000 feet west of Westmoreland Avenue, is acceptable as an alternate State Highway into the City of Dallas. The State Highway Engineer is directed to take this matter up with the Commissioners' Court of Dallas County with a view to a bond issue to construct this highway, and at the same time provide funds for widening the Davis Street route into the city limits of Dallas; this to be on condition that the City of Dallas provides for the widening of Davis Street with the idea that both routes shall be maintained as State Highways into the City of Dallas.

After hearing from the Dallas County Commissioners' Court that they are favorable to these improvements, the State Highway Engineer is directed to make estimates together with Dallas County as to the cost of these improvements and report back to the Commission; the State Highway Engineer is further directed to prepare tentative designs of these routes with the necessary width of right-of-way and, at the time the estimates are presented to the Commission, report as to the necessary right-of-way and the possible cooperation of Dallas County.

It is ordered by the Commission that an appropriation of funds be made to cover the cost of making surveys, securing necessary data and the preparation of plans for the following special bridge projects:
