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Moved by D. K. Martin, seconded by Cone Johnson that the bid of N. V. Duncan, 112 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, on S. P. 900, Unit II, Walker County be rejected for the reason that the said N. V. Duncan has not complied with prequalification requirements of the Department; the circumstances being that he filed a financial statement after the time prescribed by the Highway Commission, which was defective and that it was sent back to him for correction and that the said N. V. Duncan has not corrected the statement, consequently no financial statement is on file in compliance with the requirements of the Department and the Department is without information as to the financial ability of the contractor to carry out the terms of the contract. When this action was taken, no objection was made by or in behalf of the said Duncan.

In <u>Jasper</u> County the State Highway Engineer is directed to relocate State Highway #8 so as to eliminate the five grade crossing north of the town of Jasper when County signifies its willingness to secure 100 ft. right-of-way on location to be selected and approved by the State Highway Department.

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In <u>Goliad</u> County the State Highway Engineer is instructed to make a survey and an estimate of cost of constructing a graveled road from the town of Goliad to the State Park and route the road as near to the **O**ld Aranama Mission as possible, thence to LaBahia Mission, thence to the Fannin Burial Ground, and also an estimate of cost of building a low-water bridge. Goliad County funds of \$5,000.00 to be used in constructing the road from Goliad to the Park.

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In Bexar, Kendall, and Comal Counties the State Highway Engineer is authorized to make a survey of Highway #9 from the city limits of San Antonio to a connection with the present Highway in Kendall County approximately three miles north of the Bexar-Kendall County Line, a distance of 26.0 miles, and of Highway #66 from San Antonio to a point in Comal County near Spring Branch, a distance of 23 miles in Bexar County and 11 miles in Comal County; and to accept the proposition of E. P. Arneson to complete the location surveys and prepare route sketch map and right-of-way information on Highway #9 from San Antonio to connection with present road in Kendall County (26 miles) and Highway No. 66 from San Antonio to Bexar-Comal County Line, a distance of 23 miles, as an extension of his contract of November 8, 1930, covering similar work done on Highways in vicinity of San Antonio; and, to establish the routing of Highway No. 66 in Comal County between the Bexar County Line and a point near Spring Branch, a distance of 11 miles, within narrow limits for \$50.00 per mile of actual survey.

In <u>Bexar</u> County the State Highway Engineer is directed to again take up with Bexar County the provisions of Minute #1543, providing for a short section of construction at or near Fratt, including an underpass of the M. K. & T. Railroad.

In <u>Bowie</u> County on 6.3 miles of State Highway #5 beginning at a point approximately 6.4 miles west of Hooks and extending to a point approximately 2 miles east, the State Highway Engineer is authorized to regravel and place a double bituminous surface on condition that Bowie County will furnish completely cleared and fenced a 100 ft. right-of-way, or in no case less than 50 feet from the center line of said road and the side away from the railroad right-of-way, not to be effective until estimate is furnished.

In <u>Bragoria</u> County an initial appropriation of \$94,781.38 State Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engine or through the Construction Division on State Highway #36, S.P. # 889-C, extending from the Fort Bend County line to West Columbia, a distance of 13.834 miles, for the construction of Concrete Pavement, on condition that said county will furnish the entire amount of funds available for this improvement in County Road Districts No. 11 and 25, amounting to approximately \$144,058.26. A.F.E.-31=617.

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In <u>Brazoria</u> County an initial appropriation of \$18,402.91 State Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #19 & 36, S.P.#268-B, extending from the West property line of Mulberry Street, the west City Limits of the town of Freeport, to the east property line of Pine Street, a distance of 1.431 miles on Second Street in the town of Freeport, for the construction of Concrete Pavement and an Underpass Structure at the Missouri Pacific Railroad, on condition that said County will furnish \$18,402.91 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate, Brazoria County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is one-half. This Minute is supplementary to Minute #4197, dated May 2nd, 1931, and amends only that portion in regard to the limits of the project, it being desired to extend the length one block to the Mest City Limits of Freeport. <u>A.F.E.=31=618</u>.

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In Brazos County an initial appropriation of \$113,105.06 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #6, F.A.P. No. 471-F, and S. P. # 738-F, extending from Bryan to College Station, a distance of 3.223 miles, for the construction of Grading and Drainage Structures, S. P. No. 738-H, extending from College Station southwest a distance of 4.417 miles, for the construction of drainage structures and Clearing and Grubbing, and F. A. P. 471-I, extending from a point 4.417 miles southeast of College Station to the Grimes County Lin a distance of 15.152 miles, for the construction of Grading and Drainage Structures, on condition that said county will furnish \$56, 552,53 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, fencing to be done by the County; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate Brazos County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is one-third This appropriation is subject to the provisions of Minute No. 2588, dated February 26, 1930. A.F.E.~31~619.

In Brazos County an initial appropriation of \$13,193.61 State Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Maintenance Division on State Highway #90, between the Navasota and Brazos Rivers, a distance of 2.128 miles for surfacing with gravel. This appropriation being made for Betterment Work, Job No. M-17-U-3, and without right-of-way requirements, as 100 ft. right-of-way was secured when Unit I was constructed. A.F.E. 31-620.

In Brown County an increase appropriation of \$34.89 State funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #10, S. P. 899-C from Survey Station 0+00 south 750 feet, to a connection with present paving on main street in the town of Brownwood, a distance of 0.014mile, for the construction of concrete pavement. This additional appropriation being required to pay over run on final estimate, the county funds specified in Minute No. 4349 being sufficient to provide one third of the actual cost. A.F.E.-31-621.

In Brown County en initial appropriation of \$19,756.13 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway #7, F.A.P. #583-B, a distance of 0.713 miles, for the construction of St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Overpass and approaches on condition that said county will furnish \$13,203.51 for such improvement, and such right-of-way as may be required, to be not less than 100 ft. in width, fencing to be done by the County; and with the further understanding that should the cost of improvement exceed the foregoing estimate Brown County shall furnish its proportionate share of the additional cost, which is one-third, and further conditioned upon the Railway Company providing \$6,650.89, or onethird of the actual cost of the overpass. A.F.E.-31-622.

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In <u>Burnet & Llano</u> Counties the State Highway Commission is willing to muthorize the Emery, Peck and Rockwood Co., or their associates, to submerge the present Llanc-Burnet State Highway, if they will pay to the State Highvay Fund the sum of 135,000,00, and will in addition furnish free of cost to the State and fully fenced, any right-of-way that may be required by the State Highway Department on the land owned by the said Company. The portion of such highway to be submerged is that portion which lies within the area of the lake or impounded water of the said Company.

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In <u>Burnet</u> and <u>Llano</u> Counties the State Highway Engineer, upon receipt of a statement from the Emery, Peck & Rockwood Company that they will pay to the State \$135,000.00 in accordance with an order passed this day, shall be authorized to make a location survey to change the highway between Burnet and Llano to below the proposed dam. He shall be authorized to make a right-of-way map and furnish same to Llano and Burnet Counties, and to secure from them an agreement to the effect that the necessary rightof-way will be fenced and furnished by them. When this has been done, the State Highway Engineer is authorized to complete the plans and advertise for bids for the construction of a bridge over the Colorado River and to do only what necessary work may be required to open a graded road to connect on either side with the present state highway.

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In <u>Caldwell</u> County an initial appropriation of \$2,758.45 State Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Maintenance Division on State Highway #80, from Luling West a distance of 0.53 miles for graveling and Double Bituminous Surface Treatment. This appropriation being made for Betterment Work, Job No. M-14-R-4 and on condition that said county will furnish such right-of-way as may be required to be not less than 100 feet in width, fencing to be done by the County. <u>A.F.E.-31-623</u>.

In <u>Caldwell</u> County an initial appropriation of \$53,216.18 State and Federal Funds is hereby made to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Engineer through the Construction Division on State Highway No. 3.A, F.A.P. The State Highway Engineer is directed to ascertain from each Division Engineer the wage scale for common or unskilled labor paid by this Department on maintenance work of a similar nature to construction work, and on each contract hereafter awarded each proposal will contain a supplementary statement from each bidder, which statement will contain a minimum wage scale fixed by this Department and constitute the agreement of the bidder to pay such minimum wage and to furnish each Resident Engineer at the time of payment of his estimate a certificate of the wages paid together with a record of the charges made for board to each laborer in case a boarding house is operated, and all other deductions from such wages.
