#### **Practice Sessions:**

#### FOOD & WINF

From stunning harbourside locations to inner-city heritage makeovers, Sydney's newest dining precincts pack a tasty punch.

The Streets of Barangaroo has flourished into 'Feast Central' by the harbour in just 18 months, with leading lights of the Australian restaurant scene joining the party. Seafood-focussed Cirrus Dining comes from the award-winning team behind Monopole and Bentley; Catalan-inspired Born by Tapavino extends Frank Dilernia's Spanish empire, and contemporary Chinese Lotus is manned by two ex-Billy Kwong chefs. The world tour of food also takes in Turkey with acclaimed Anason, Vietnam with PhDmo, Japan with Zushi and Ume Burger, Indian at Spiced by Billu's and New Orleans at NOLA Smokehouse and Bar. One of Sydney's original small bars, Shirt Bar, has an outpost, while Banksii is the city's first vermouth bar, stocking more than 40 varieties. Perched above it all is Untied, a brand new rooftop eatery with a hip tropical vibe and wow-factor harbour views. Be sure to take The Streets of Barangaroo Walking Tour so you don't miss a morsel.

In the inner west, the former Rozelle Tramway Depot is reborn as Tramsheds Harold Park, a home for culinary artisans, including Belles Hot Chicken, Bekya, Jared Ingersoll's Butcher and The Farmer, Flour Eggs Water from the A Tavola team and Dust, a third-generation bakery serving breakfast, lunch and dinner. Tramsheds' Artisan Lane extends the epicurean experience to tastings, pop-ups and workshops – from pizza making to French cooking lessons.

Circular Quay has taken a giant leap into the food scene with its new three-level extravaganza of eateries, **Gateway**. More than 25 respected names reside alongside flagship **Popina**, the only spot you'll find wood-fired pizza and artisan pasta sharing menu space with labneh, hummus and knafeh. Neighbours include Neil Perry's **Burger Project** and dessert heavyweights **Zumbo** and **Gelato Messina**.

Chippendale's **Kensington Street** is another hive of culinary activity. In The Old Rum Store, **Bistrot Gavroche** has two new restaurant neighbours: award-winning Sicilian chef Lino Sauro's **Olio**, and the American/Japanese **Eastside Grill**, from international chef Stanley Wong. Wong and Sauro, along with fellow chef Tiw Rakarin, also showcase their skills at private dinners in the building's top-floor function space, **Private Kitchen**.

Also part of the exciting food mix is **Spice Alley**, a funky laneway packed with aromatic Asian eateries, **Mekong**, which specialises in heady Asian fusion dishes, and the Old Clare Hotel's **Automata** and **Kensington Street Social**.

#### SHOPPING/ARTS & CHITHIRE

Sydney's two waterside shopping centres are now linked by the Hello Sydney! Shopper Hopper ferry service. The sunshine-yellow boat shuttles between the souvenir heaven of Darling Harbour's Harbourside and the discount designer must-haves at Drummoyne's Birkenhead Point Outlet Centre, where more than 120 top labels, including Armani, Hugo Boss, Calvin Klein, Furla and Aquila, await. Birkenhead Point is expanding to include even more premium outlets this year.

Givenchy and Fendi have joined the line-up of global luxury names including Zara, Gap, Kate Spade and Aesop at **Westfield Sydney**, which has extended hours for dining during Vivid Sydney, 26 May – 17 June.

The historic **Queen Victoria Buidling** and **Strand Arcade** blend beautifully restored interiors with a host of enticing fashion boutiques featuring local and international brands.

Australia's first John Lewis store can be found at Myer in Brookvale's **Warringah Mall**, while public artworks and more than 30 new retailers complete the \$55 million redevelopment of Glebe's Broadway Shopping Centre.

#### NIITNAAR & ANVENTIIRE

In the air, on land and water, Sydney's landscape is an adventure playground.

One of the city's most famous landmarks is the 134m-high Sydney Harbour Bridge, where night time **Bridge Climbers** can boogie on an illuminated dance floor at the summit during Vivid Sydney. Get the adrenalin racing on a **SKYWALK** at Sydney Tower Eye, a pulse-raising adventure onto a glass platform 268m above the city streets, or soar among the animals on a self-propelled WILD Flight inside Darling Harbour's **WILDLIFE** Sydney Zoo. For more animal attractions, Taronga Zoo's **Wild Ropes** traverses the zoo at treetop level on ropewalks and ziplines. Relish the rush of skydiving in a wind tunnel with **iFLY Downunder** or channel your inner James Bond at **Jetpack Adventures**, both of which are located at Penrith in Western Sydney. Sydney's newest adventure park, **Treetops Sydney – The Hills**, is located in beautiful Cumberland State Forest and has 126 challenges, including 20 flying foxes, among the towering bunya pines.

Horsepower addicts can do a hot lap in a Turbo WRX rally car at Rally School near Windsor or take a V8 supercar for a spin at Sydney Motorsport Park. Opt for a more genteel ride in a classic Porsche through the Royal National Park with Cliff to Coast or a Porsche Drive Day on the northern beaches with Driving Adventures. Prefer two wheels? Cycle along the 35km of trails at Sydney Olympic Park, keeping an eye out for hidden gems such as lookouts, bird hides, wildlife refuges, mangrove boardwalks and outdoor art.

Experience the harbour at full throttle in a jetboat ride from Circular Quay or Darling Harbour, hover above in a helicopter, or take the ultimate white-knuckle Sydney ride with a **Red Baron Aerobatic Experience**. Mild Winter weather is just about right for surfing or stand-up paddle boarding at Manly or Bondi Beach. Try a sunrise kayak from Palm Beach with **Pittwater Kayak Tours**, for a real treat. Venture beneath the waves on a **Shark Dive Extreme** at Manly SEA LIFE Sanctuary or mingle with the resident spooks on a **Ghostly Encounters Tour** at the haunted Quarantine Station.

#### ACCOMMODATION

Sydney offers a wide range of accommodation, from five-star harbourside properties and budget hotels by the beach to boutique inner-city stays, hostels and self-contained apartments. Some of the more popular vantage points for accommodation are the city centre and Darling Harbour, Chinatown and Potts Point, Pyrmont, Manly, Bondi Beach and Coogee Beach in the city's east. A selection of sparkling five-star properties around The Rocks, Circular Quay and Darling Harbour have stunning restaurants, bars, clubs and five-star harbour views.
