Reasons for Notification:

A geological site which displays the best exposure of The Upper Cretaceous (Late Campanian) Beeston Chalk, a unit not exposed in coastal sections, and representing some of the youngest *in situ* chalk in Britain. The site is famous for its large flints, known as 'potstones' and 'paramoudras', with their remarkable contained burrow systems. The Chalk is here very fossiliferous; of note are the specimens of the molluscs *Belemnitella* and *Inoceramus* and Sea Urchin *Echinocorys* which it commonly yields.
