Other Information:

The pit was infilled during 1985 and the geological exposures protected by a low bund.

Reasons for Notification:

This site, in suburban Norwich, is the type locality for the Upper Chalk (Cretaceous) Catton Sponge Bed. This famous late Campanian rock unit represents an early diagenetic hardened level (hardground) which has a well preserved fauna including important ammonites and many undescribed sponges. This seldom exposed horizon representing a hardened sea bed (a rarity in the Chalk) is an important marker band across East Anglia and is best seen at Catton.
