ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT Dated April 18, 2012

THIS ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is effective this April 18, 2012, by and between the European Centre for a Modern Ukraine, ("Client") having its principal office located at 14 Rue de la Science, 1040 Brussels, Belgium, and Mercury Public Affairs, LLC, 137 Fifth Avenue, 3rd Floor, New York, NY 10010, d/b/a Mercury / Clark & Weinstock, having its principal office located at 701 8th Street, NW, Washington, DC 20001, ("the Provider").

WHEREAS, Client wishes to have the Provider performing the services hereinafter referred to, and

WHEREAS, the Provider is willing to perform these services,

NOW THEREFORE THE PARTIES hereby agree as follows:

Services

The Provider shall perform services to assist the Client in strengthening its ties to various organizations in the United States. The Provider shall achieve objectives through a combination of policy and communications expertise, as well as other services that may be agreed by the Parties in writing, ("the Services").

Term

The Provider shall perform the Services during the period commencing on April 18, 2012 and continuing through the term, the date of termination, or any other period, as may be subsequently agreed by the parties in writing.

Payment

Client shall pay the Provider an amount as mutually agreed by the parties for services rendered, plus pre-approved expenses for travel. Client shall pay Provider by wire transfer in advance of each month, including the beginning of the term of this Agreement. The payment of the expenses shall be performed upon prior written consent of Client. Pre-approved expenses shall be invoiced each month and paid with the fees due for the following period.

Client's Representative

Client designates Ms. In Kirsch as its representative. The representative shall be responsible for the coordination of activities under this Agreement.

Performance Standard

The Provider undertakes to perform the Services with the highest standards of professional and ethical competence and integrity.

Confidentiality

The Providers shall not, during the term of this Agreement and within two years after its expiration, disclose any proprietary or confidential information relating to the Services, this Agreement or ECFMU business or operations without the prior written consent of ECFMU.

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Ownership of Material

Any studies, reports, opinions or other material, or otherwise, prepared by the Provider for Client under the Agreement shall belong to and remain the property of Client. The Provider may retain a copy of such documents and software.

Governing Law and Language

The Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the District of Columbia and the United States of America, and the language of the Agreement shall be English.

Termination

Either Party may terminate this Agreement with at least 60 days prior written notice to each other. Payment for services shall be made through the date of the termination.

Attachment to registration: Description of FARA Activity Responses to Exhibit B - Questions 7.8,9

The European Centre for a Modern Ukraine (ECFMU) engaged Mercury/Clark & Weinstock, now Mercury Public Affairs, (Mercury) in the second quarter of 2012 to represent it in promoting closer ties between Ukraine and the West – principally, the European Union (EU) and the United States. The goals included Ukraine's entry into the EU, the signing and ratification of the Association Agreement between Ukraine and the EU, and the ratification of the Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area agreement.

Mercury sought to facilitate opportunities for engagement on Ukrainian political developments and reforms for American elected officials, opinion leaders, the media and civil society organizations. Specifically, Mercury worked to highlight the work of the Ukrainian government to align with western democracies generally, and the EU specifically, on security, political and economic issues. To accomplish this goal, Mercury set up educational events and meetings for members of Congress and staff, think tanks and other non-governmental organizations, and the media. Speakers at these events included Ukrainian government officials and other experts on Ukraine and the EU, including Aleksander Kwaśniewski, former president of Poland, Alfred Gusenbauer, former Chancellor of Austria, and Romano Prodi, former Prime Minister of Italy. Mercury employees themselves provided similar briefings. Mercury also contacted members of the media to provide them information about Ukraine, its election and its reforms in the hope that the media would cover these topics.
