Positive public response to the tree lighting trial

I wanted to report on the very positive public response to the tree lighting trial at the junction of North Walpole Road and the South West Highway over Christmas.

There were three facebook posts about the Tree lighting on Walpole People. Each post received between 39 and 44 likes and up to 12 supportive comments. One or two comments sought more information. The CDG also received three emails, two in support and one against.

The following is a selection of typical comments from email and Walpole People:

- Simple, probably not too expensive to make into permanent feature, very effective. Highlights our natural entry to the town, without brass and glass or glitz. Says it all without one word. This positive support would also surely save the triangle and leave it as is. Best suggestion put into action in over 20 years. Complements the timber logs. Congratulations CDG.
- They look great lit up like that. Well done CDG team I truly hope the Shire of Manjimup take on this project.

Our understanding is that the Shire's application for a clearing permit for trees along the southern end of the North Walpole road has not been granted. There will need to be further discussion with the Shire about the upgrade of the North Walpole Road and the intersection.

The CDG would like to thank Peter Newton of the SES and Richard Williams of Wyadup Electrics for their support in conducting the trial.

Based on the strongly positive community feedback, the Shire has offered technical support and suggested that the CDG apply for a Community Grant to establish a more permanent lighting setup. We'll keep you posted.

Letters to the Editor

Call to Arms - 'Australian Defence' responds

Readers may be excused if they do not remember my letter to the Editor titled 'Call To Arms' appearing in the 22nd March 2017 edition of the Walpole Weekly.

This letter was prompted by an ABC news report of Australian Defence Force's Royal Australian Air Force bombing of IS targets within Syria, and claiming, the RAAF did not collect, hold or publish information of civilian casualties - a conflict, we at St George's Walpole, were much in prayer over.

In my letter I gave notice to the Editor that I had written to the Member for O'Connor, the Honourable Rick Wilson MP, seeking clarification on this claim. Unfortunately, due to an incorrect postal address given to me by an independent source, our concerns did not come before the Minister until the 8th December. Nevertheless, on its reception, I am pleased to say there was an immediate response from Mr Wilson's Office.

Mr Wilson in his letter to me said, "I assure you this is a serious enquiry and as soon as your letter was received I made representation on your behalf with the Minister for Defence." Mr Wilson advised me the ADF takes allegations of civilian casualties seriously and has a strict reporting and investigative processes in place.

Mr Wilson continued, "The ADF has independently published a fortnightly report on Australian air strikes summarising targets and locations engaged by Australian aircraft in Iraq and Syria. These reports are available on the Defence website: http://www.defence.gov.au/Operations/Okra/FortnightlyReports.asp Also on this Defence website ADF Reporting and Investigative Processes are provided.

Mr Wilson said he has been assured there are no credible reports of civilian casualties caused by the Australian Air Group in Syria.

We are served well by our democracy and the good men and women who serve as our representatives in Government allowing freedom of inquiry and transparency of information, and I am grateful to the Ministers referred to above for their ready response on this matter of our nation's military engagement.

Jennifer Obourne, Electoral Officer thanked me for our prayers for all caught up in the Syrian conflict, and I can assure her that all men and women of faith in our community will seek to continue to be faithful in this duty of prayer.

Annual Community Grants Round 2018-2019

The Shire of Manjimup's annual community grants round for 2018/19 opens Monday, 12th February 2018, allowing another opportunity for community groups and organisations to seek funding for projects, events or activities.

Each year Council allocates up to 2% of the Shire's previous year's rates income back to the community by way of grants. Last year this equated to \$165,898 in cash support for local events, sports clubs, community centres, art projects, community gardens, youth zones and more.

It is a great opportunity for groups, however they are required to be incorporated to receive funds. Groups which are not incorporated are still able to apply but must nominate the name and ABN details of an organisation to receive funds on their behalf, if successful.

The annual round of community grants is an extremely worthwhile exercise for organisations to seek funding. Shire President Paul Omodei said "Funding is available under three categories: events, community projects and youth. We know the funding can be essential to the success of community events and projects." Cr Omodei added "If you think you have a worthy idea let us hear about it."

Application forms can be downloaded from the Shire's website, picked up from the Shire Administration Centre, or from the Manjimup, Pemberton, Northcliffe and Walpole Community Resource Centres and public libraries

Flowering wild in Walpole

It is impossible at this time of year not to mention Corymbia Ficifolia. Indigenous to this area, particularly slightly east of Walpole, it originated between here and Albany, however it is now grown in many parts of the world for its striking flowers. Most people would have noticed the variability in flower colour with bright red to scarlet to pink, orange or even an apricot version. I have heard comments on how the soil type might influence the colour but wasn't sold on this since even in our Main Street varying colours will grow next to each other. Research tells us that there is great genetic variability in this species in regard to height and flower colour. So growing it from seed is like opening that box of chocolates... you never know what you are going to get.


Eucalyptus Ficifolia is one of 3 bloodwoods and the bark is usually brown to dark grey. It can grow 10 - 15 metres tall, however sometimes will grow as a small Mallee-like tree once again due to genetic variability. Commercially, nurseries are attempting to produce hybrid varieties that are more predictable in colour and height. Personally I'd rather embrace the surprise element.

Simple small actions adding up to make a big difference

The Plastic Reduction Denmark group are back in action entering their third year of initiatives.



Last Friday they had a stall outside IGA X-press (see picture above) encouraging the use of plastic bag alternates. There were lots of great encouraging conversations with their gentle approach to positive behavioural change.

Thanks to the store owners Anton and Maryann Perak for their ongoing support.

With the WA ban on single use plastic shopping bags fast approaching, the group is concentrating efforts on the smaller, fruit/veg/nut bags made from upcycled netting (see picture below).

If that isn't enough, the group is also taking on the challenge of encouraging a reduction in disposable take-away cups. They are collecting them at present to replace the plastic bags in their educational art piece, the giant Freddo Fin fish (he is currently at Denmark Community Resource Centre).

It is staggering that Australians use almost three million cups a day and whilst some councils will take lids and a percentage of cups into the recycling stream, most don't make in into the recycle bins and therefore end up in landfill. One brave café in Perth that has totally banned takeaway cups, estimates that it has prevented the use of around 70,000 disposable cups in 12 months, with no negative impacts on their business. Whether it is single use plastic bags or disposable cups, as consumers we are very powerful with our choices. Can you Refuse To Use?

Children were treated to an array of different activities from cooking classes with Helen Webster to arts and craft mornings with Miss Everett.


Being a part of the local community is what the CRC stands for and having these school holiday activities is a chance to bring the local children and holiday families together.


The children made kites, painted ceramic mugs and cooked delicious homemade savoury muffins which we at the CRC got to sample and they were delicious.




