TEAM NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors begin a two-game road trip (Mar. 31 Apr. 3) Saturday night against the Boston Celtics at TD Garden. Toronto and Boston have split the first two meetings, with the home team winning both games. Kyle Lowry and DeMar DeRozan are averaging 21.0 and 19.5 points, respectively, in two games versus the Celtics this season. The Raptors will host Boston on Apr. 4 in the second game of a back-to-back set.
- Toronto needs one more win to tie the single-season franchise-record of 56 victories set during the 2015-16 campaign. This is the third straight year the Raptors have won at least 50 games. Prior to the 2015-16 season, Toronto had never recorded a 50-win season. The Raptors currently lead the Eastern Conference by 3.5 games over Boston and play the Celtics two more times.
- The Raptors have made at least 10 three-pointers in a franchise-record 17 consecutive games (Feb. 26 Mar. 27). Toronto is shooting .385 (224-for-582) from three-point range during this span. The Raptors have made 10-or -more three-pointers in 55 games (46-9) this season; something they did 37 times last year.
- Toronto is averaging 32.9 three-point attempts (third in the NBA), up from 24.3 attempts last season. The Raptors have already set single-season franchise records in both three-pointers made and attempted (892-for-2464).
- Jonas Valanciunas is averaging 12.7 points, 8.5 rebounds and 22.5 minutes in 71 games this season. Valanciunas is the only NBA player averaging at least 12.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in 25.0 minutes or fewer.
- Toronto's bench ranks fourth in the NBA in scoring (42.0 ppg). The Raptors ranked 26th in bench scoring each of
 the past two seasons (2015-17). Since Jan. 1, Toronto's bench leads the NBA averaging 45.1 points. The Raptors
 outscored Denver 53-29 in bench points Tuesday night. Toronto's second unit combined to score 31 of the team's
 32 points in the fourth quarter. Jakob Poeltl scored all 12 of his points in the final quarter.
- **Kyle Lowry** has made a single-season franchise-record 221 three-point field goals, topping his own record of 212 set during the 2015-16 campaign. Lowry is the only player in team history to make 200 three-pointers in a season. Lowry has made at least three three-pointers in each of his last seven games played (Mar. 15-27); shooting .582 (32-for-55) from beyond the arc during this span.
- The Raptors are 47-13 this season when recording 20-or-more assists in a game. Toronto dished out 20+ assists 34 times (26-8) last season. The Raptors currently rank sixth in the NBA in assists per game (24.2). **Kyle Lowry** leads the team averaging 6.8 assists, while **DeMar DeRozan** is averaging a career-high 5.2 assists. Lowry and DeRozan combined for 16 of Toronto's 33 assists Tuesday versus the Nuggets.
- Fred VanVleet led the reserves in scoring for the 16th time this season with 15 points in 25 minutes Mar. 27 vs. Denver. VanVleet has now scored at least 14 points off the bench in five straight games (Mar. 16-27), shooting .528 (28-for-53) from the field and .529 (18-for-34) from three-point distance during this stretch. VanVleet has scored in double figures in eight of his last nine games played (Mar. 9-27).
- Toronto outscored the Nuggets 60-36 in the paint Tuesday night. The Raptors have scored at least 50 points in
 the paint three of the last four games (Mar. 21-27); averaging 52.5 points during this stretch. Toronto currently
 ranks sixth in the NBA (first in the East) in points in the paint per game (48.5). **DeMar DeRozan** is averaging a
 team-high 8.6 points in the paint this season.

- Ranks 15th in the NBA in blocks per game (1.29); has blocked multiple shots in 24 games.
- Toronto is a perfect 7-0 this season when he scores at least 20 points (Last: 21 points Feb. 14 at Chicago).
- Shooting .516 (16-for-31) from the field over the last three games (Mar. 23-27).

C - JONAS VALANCIUNAS #17 MIN: 22.5 REB: 8.5 AST: 1.1 STL: 0.4 TO: 1.5 BLK: 0.9 PTS: 12.7

- Ranks eighth in the NBA with a .570 (355-for-623) field goal percentage.
- Leads the team in double-digit rebounding games (25) and double-doubles (23).
- Has scored 20-or-more points in a single-season career-high 12 games (Last: 23 points Mar. 23 vs. Brooklyn).

G - DEMAR DEROZAN #10 MIN: 34.1 REB: 3.9 AST: 5.2 STL: 1.1 TO: 2.2 BLK: 0.2 PTS: 23.3

- Ranks 10th in NBA scoring (23.3 ppg) and fifth in free throws made (436).
- Averaging a career-high 5.2 assists; has dished out at least five assists in 46 games.
- The Raptors are 13-2 this season when he scores 30-or-more points (Last: 42 points Mar. 7 at Detroit OT).

G-KYLE LOWRY #7 MIN: 32.3 REB: 5.6 AST: 6.8 STL: 1.1 TO: 2.3 BLK: 0.2 PTS: 16.6

- Leads the NBA in charges drawn (32); had 15 charges drawn (tied for 12th in the NBA) in 60 games last season.
- Ranks ninth in the NBA averaging 6.8 assists and tied for third in three-point field goals (221).
- Averaging a career-high 5.6 rebounds; has collected 10-or-more rebounds 11 times (Last: Mar. 23 vs. Brooklyn).

TORONTO -- Kyle Lowry scored 23 points, C.J. Miles had 20 and the Toronto Raptors routed the Celtics 111-91, snapping Boston's four-game winning streak ... DeMar DeRozan added 15 points, DeIon Wright had 14 and Fred VanVleet 10 as Toronto won its fifth straight home meeting over Boston ... Kyrie Irving started for Boston after missing the previous three games because of a right quad contusion ... He scored 17 points in 22 minutes ... Terry Rozier scored 18 points, Marcus Morris had 12 and Jaylen Brown 11 for the Celtics ... Boston's Al Horford shot 1 for 5 and finished with two points in 24 minutes ... Toronto won its fifth straight home game and improved to 22-4 at Air Canada Centre, the best home mark in the NBA ... All six of Lowry's field goals were 3-pointers ... Lowry and Miles combined for 11 of Toronto's 17 3-pointers ... Lowry made his first three 3-point attempts but no other Raptor connected from long range in the first quarter ... Toronto led 22-18 after one ... Toronto's bench extended the lead in the second ... VanVleet scored 10 points and Wright had nine as the Raptors connected on 13 of 19 field goal attempts in the quarter to take a 58-37 lead at halftime ... Toronto had a 30-15 edge in bench scoring at halftime.

CLEVELAND -- LeBron James scored 35 points and added 17 assists, his last setting up a late a 3-pointer by Kevin Love, as the undermanned Cavaliers rallied to beat the Raptors 132-129 ... The Cavs were down five rotational players and coach Tyronn Lue, who missed his second straight game for health reasons ... James added seven rebounds without committing a turnover in nearly 40 minutes ... James made three free throws in the final 7.8 seconds, but missed one with 3.9 seconds to go, giving Toronto a final shot ... DeMar DeRozan got a decent look on a 3-pointer -- contested by James -- at the horn but missed ... Love finished with 23 points and 12 rebounds and George Hill had 22 on 10-of-11 shooting for the Cavs ... Kyle Lowry scored 24 and DeRozan had 21 for the Raptors, who scored 79 points in the first half and were in control in the third quarter before James brought Cleveland back ... With the Cavs up 125-124, James drove the lane and whipped the ball into the corner to Love, who knocked down his 1,000th career 3-pointer ... C.J. Miles sat out with a flu bud.

TORONTO -- DeMar DeRozan, Jonas Valanciunas, and Fred VanVleet each scored 15 points and the Toronto Raptors beat the Nuggets 114-110 ... Nikola Jokic had 29 points and 16 rebounds, and Paul Millsap scored 20 points for the Nuggets ... Jakob Poeltl scored all of his 12 points in the fourth quarter, including eight straight for Toronto at one stretch ... Toronto outscored the Nuggets 53-29 in bench points ... Up 85-82 through three quarters, Denver reeled off five straight points in the first minute of the fourth to open an eight-point advantage ... Toronto answered with a 13-2 spurt over the next four minutes ... The Raptors led 111-101 after Poeltl capped his outburst with a layup with just over a minute left ... Back-to-back 3-pointers by Jamal Murray and Wilson Chandler cut it to 111-107 with 18 seconds remaining ... After VanVleet made a pair of free throws, Jokic banked home a 3 to make it 113-110 with 10 seconds to go, but Denver couldn't get any closer ... The Nuggets led 47-39 with 5:43 left in the second but Valanciunas scored eight points and Serge Ibaka had six as the Raptors rallied to tie it at 58 at halftime ... Kyle Lowry scored nine points in the first to help Toronto lead 25-23 after one.

GAME 74 - MARCH 25, 2018 LA CLIPPERS 117, TORONTO 106

TORONTO -- Lou Williams scored 26 points, 18 in the final quarter, and the Los Angeles Clippers overcame an 18-point first-quarter deficit to beat the Toronto Raptors 117-106 ... Tobias Harris scored 20 points, Montrezl Harrell had 19 points and Milos Teodosic 15 for the Clippers ... Williams connected on seven of 11 shot attempts in the fourth, scoring 12 consecutive points for the Clippers in one stretch ... Jonas Valanciunas had 16 points and 10 rebounds for the Raptors ... Fred VanVleet scored 16 points, Pascal Siakam had 15, and Serge Ibaka 12 ... Harrell and Williams each scored six points as the Clippers used a 16-2 run at the start of the fourth quarter to turn an 80-80 tie into a 14-point edge with 8:43 remaining ... Toronto rallied, cutting it to 105-100 on Ibaka's 3 with 2:58 to go ... After a Clippers timeout, Williams converted a three-point play, then added back-to-back jumpers to close out his 12-point run, giving the Clippers a 112-103 lead with 1:29 left ... Valanciunas scored 12 of Toronto's first 14 points and the Raptors led 27-9 after Ibaka's 3 at 5:49 of the first ... Los Angeles closed the quarter with a 19-8 run, cutting it to 35-28 after one ... VanVleet scored eight points in the second and Toronto led 60-53 at halftime.

ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES...

- The Raptors have the second-best home record in the NBA with a 31-7 (.816) mark. Toronto is averaging 113.1 points (tied for second in the NBA) and 12.0 three-point field goals at Air Canada Centre. The Raptors tied a franchise-record with 12 straight home victories earlier this season (Nov. 7 Jan. 1). Air Canada Centre has been sold-out for 175 consecutive games (including playoffs) the longest streak in team history. The franchise-record for home wins in a single-season is 32 set in 2015-16.
- Toronto has scored at least 120 points in a single-season franchise-record 24 games, second most in the NBA behind only Golden State (29). The Raptors are 21-3 this season when they score 120-or-more points.
- The Raptors won a franchise-record nine straight road games Feb. 11 -Mar. 20. Toronto has the fourth-best road record in the NBA (24-13) this season and has tied the franchise-record for road victories in a singleseason set in 2015-16 (24).
- Toronto topped the 100-point mark in a franchise-best 23 consecutive games (Jan. 28 Mar. 18), breaking the previous record of 20 games (Jan. 6 Feb. 20, 2010).
- The Raptors tied their longest winning streak in franchise history with 11 straight victories Feb. 26 - Mar. 16. Toronto also won 11 consecutive games Jan. 6-30, 2016. The Raptors' average margin of victory during the win streak was 11.7 points.
- Toronto became the first team this season to secure a playoff berth with a 121-119 victory Mar. 7 at Detroit (OT). This marks the earlier date the Raptors have ever qualified for the postseason and the fewest number of games played (64) to qualify. Previously, the earliest Toronto has ever qualified for the playoffs was Mar. 23, 2016.
- The Raptors finished the month of February with an Eastern Conferencebest 9-2 record, which included six victories of 20 points-or-more points. Toronto's average margin of victory last month was 19.3 points. According to Elias, the Raptors also had the best point differential (+15.27) in the month of February since the 1990 Phoenix Suns, who had a +15.33 point differential. Toronto averaged 117.5 points (fourth in the NBA) last month.
- DeMar DeRozan was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Month for January. DeRozan earned the honour for the third time. He was named co-winner along with teammate Kyle Lowry in January 2016 and won for the first time in April 2015. DeRozan ranked second in the East in scoring (25.3 ppg) and added 5.9 assists as the Raptors went 10-5 in January. He scored at least 30 points in four games, highlighted by a franchise-record 52 points in an overtime victory Jan. 1 vs. Milwaukee. DeRozan had at least eight assists in four games and posted the highest assist average for any month of his nine-year career.
- DeMar DeRozan scored a single-game franchise-record 52 points in an overtime victory Jan. 1 vs. Milwaukee. DeRozan shot 17-for-29 from the field, 5-for-9 from beyond the arc and a perfect 13-for-13 at the free throw line. The previous scoring record was held by Vince Carter (51 Feb. 27, 2000 vs. PHX) and Terrence Ross (51 Jan. 25, 2014 vs. LAC).
- Dwane Casey was named Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for December. It's the fifth time in five seasons Casey has earned the honour, having previously won for December and January 2016, November 2014 and December 2013. Toronto finished the month with an Eastern Conference best 11-3 (.786) record and averaged a conference-high 111.0 points. The team's winning percentage marked the best December record in franchise history.
- Dwane Casey coached his 500th game for the Raptors on Dec. 10 at Sacramento. Casey is the longest serving coach in franchise history (seven seasons) and the winningest. Under Casey's guidance the Raptors improved their win total in five consecutive seasons (2011-16), including a franchise-record 56 wins during the 2015-16 season. Casey's also holds the team record for playoff victories (17) and guided the Raptors to the 2016 Eastern Conference Finals for the first time.
- Scotiabank and MLSE have announced an expanded sponsorship and philanthropic partnership which will see the home of the Toronto Raptors transformed into the Scotiabank Arena in July, 2018.
- The Toronto Raptors and Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada expanded their long-standing partnership to feature a prominent program in support of diabetes awareness and prevention, and beginning in the 2017-18 season, include the first jersey patch partnership in the team's history. The Sun Life patch will appear on the front left shoulder of Raptors game jerseys. Jersey sponsorships will be introduced league-wide as part of a three-year NBA pilot program.

Under Casey's leadership the Raptors have won three Atlantic Division titles (2013-16) and advanced to the playoffs in a franchise-record four consecutive seasons (2013-17).

DeMar DeRozan and **Kyle Lowry** represented Toronto at the 2018 NBA All-Star Game in Los Angeles for a third straight season. DeRozan was voted as a starter by the fans, media and players, while Lowry was selected as a reserve by the coaches. DeRozan, a native of Compton, is a four-time All-Star and made his second straight start. He scored a team high-tying 21 points for Team Stephen. Lowry made his fourth consecutive All-Star appearance and recorded a game-high 11 assists for Team Stephen. Lowry also participated in his third straight Three-Point Contest as part of All-Star Saturday Night.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DeMar DeRozan has been selected as Eastern Conference Player of the Week 10 times during his nine seasons in Toronto, including five times this season. DeRozan was named East Player of the Week for games played Nov. 13-18, Dec. 18-24, Jan. 1-7, Feb. 26 - Mar. 4 and Mar. 5-11.

Nov. 13-18: Averaged 26.8 points, 7.3 rebounds and 6.0 assists in four victories, including a 129-113 road win against the Western Conference leading Houston Rockets.

<u>Dec. 18-24:</u> Averaged 34.0 points (third in the NBA), 4.3 assists and 4.0 rebounds in three games. He scored a then career-high 45 points Dec. 21 at Philadelphia.

Jan. 1-7: Averaged an NBA-high 35.7 points, 6.0 assists and 4.3 rebounds in three games. Highlighting DeRozan's week was a franchise-record 52-point performance Jan. 1 vs. Milwaukee in overtime.

Feb. 26 - Mar. 4: Averaged a team-high 20.8 points, 5.8 assists and 3.0 rebounds in four games. DeRozan led (or tied) the team in scoring during all four of Toronto's victories. Mar. 5-11: Averaged a team-high 24.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.3 assists as the Raptors won an NBA-best four games. Highlighting DeRozan's week was a 42-point performance during Toronto's 121-119 overtime victory Mar. 7 at Detroit. He made a coast-to-coast dunk with 4.6 seconds left in regulation to give Toronto the lead and assisted on Fred VanVleet's game-winning basket in overtime.

DWANE CASEY HEAD COACH



Under Dwane Casey's leadership the Raptors have won three Atlantic Division championships and advanced to the postseason in a franchise-record four consecutive seasons. He has guided the club to a 261-215 (.554) regular-season mark, including the only two 50-win seasons in team history. He is the longest tenured coach in team history and is the franchise's all-time winningest coach.

The Raptors posted their second 50-win season in 2016-17, despite missing All-Star point guard Kyle Lowry for 21 games and integrating two new players into the rotation following the trade deadline. Casey earned his fourth Eastern Conference Coach of the Month honour in December. The Raptors averaged a conference-best 112.1 points with a +11.1-point differential. Toronto also finished the month ranked second defensively holding opponents to 101.1 points per game. He is the only coach in franchise history to earn the Coach of the Month award multiple times (January 2016, November 2014 and December 2013).

In 2015-16, Casey directed the Raptors to their fourth Atlantic Division championship and set a team record with 56 victories. It was the first time in franchise history the Raptors had topped 50 wins in a season. The Raptors finished second in the Eastern Conference, the highest position in franchise history. Casey showed an ability to adapt and succeed as he was missing two-fifths of his starting lineup for more than 60 games and started a rookie for 20 games following the All-Star break.

He earned his third Coach of the Month award for January after guiding the Raptors to a 12-2 mark, setting a team record for wins in January and the best winning percentage (.857) in a month with 10 or more games. The Raptors won a franchise-best 11 consecutive games (January 6-30) and swept a seven-game home stand for the first time in team history.

In 2014-15, Casey led the Raptors to a second consecutive Atlantic Division championship and 49 victories. His club had sole possession of first place in the Eastern Conference for the first time in team history and remained there from November 4 – January 1. The defensive-minded Casey showcased an up-tempo offence that set a franchise best with 726 made three-pointers and was the second-highest scoring unit in team history. They also finished in the Top-10 in the League for fewest turnovers for a third straight season.

In 2013-14, the Raptors recorded 48 wins, an Atlantic Division championship and the third overall seed in the Eastern Conference. Casey's squad also set a franchise record with 22 road wins and matched an all-time high with 16 victories against Western Conference opponents. Casey continued his emphasis on the defensive end of the court as Toronto ranked in the Top 10 in points allowed (98.0, 6th) and opponent field goal percentage (.450, 10th).

The season turned for Casey and the Raptors following a seven-player trade with Sacramento on December 9. From that point forward the club posted the best mark in the Eastern Conference at 41-22.

In the 2012-13 campaign, Casey and his coaching staff oversaw the marked development of a youthful core of players including DeMar DeRozan, Amir Johnson, Jonas Valanciunas and Terrence Ross. DeRozan established career highs in points, rebounds, assists and minutes. Johnson posted career bests in points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks and minutes. Valanciunas earned NBA Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month honours.

In his first season with the Raptors, Casey took a unit that ranked near the bottom of the NBA in every defensive category and transformed the culture and results. The Raptors finished the 2011-12 campaign as the league's season leader for greatest improvement in opponent field goal percentage and opponent scoring. Toronto ranked in the Top 10 in fewest points allowed (9th), opponent field goal percentage (8th) and three-point field goal percentage (5th). The team had finished in the bottom third of the league in all three categories in the 2010-11 season.

Casey agreed to a multi-year contract extension June 7, 2016. He was named the eighth head coach in franchise history June 21, 2011 joining the organization just nine days after helping lead the Dallas Mavericks to the 2011 NBA Championship. Casey, 58, has served as a head coach, associate head coach and assistant coach in the NBA 20 of the past 21 years. He has coached in two NBA Finals (1996 and 2011) and two NBA All-Star Games (1996 and 1998).

Casey spent three seasons (2008-11) as an assistant with the Mavericks. Dallas posted a 162-84 (.659) mark during that span, winning 50 or more games in each of Casey's three seasons with the team. Casey was in charge of a defensive unit that held its opponents to 96.0 points per game (6th in the NBA) and .450 per cent shooting from the field (8th in the NBA) in the 2010-11 regular season. In the 2011 postseason, Casey's defense posted series victories over offensive powers the likes of Kobe Bryant, Kevin Durant, Russell Westbrook, LeBron James and Dwyane Wade. Dallas held its playoff opponents to 92.5 points per game and .447 per cent shooting from the floor.

Toronto is Casey's second stop as an NBA head coach. His first endeavor as a bench boss was with the Minnesota Timberwolves from 2005-07. He had the club in playoff contention with a 20-20 record when he was replaced January 25, 2007. His 2005-06 squad finished in the NBA's top 10 in fewest average points per game and lowest opponent field goal percentage.

Casey began his NBA coaching career in 1994 as an assistant with the Seattle Supersonics. He spent 11 seasons with the Sonics where he served under long-time NBA head coaches George Karl, Paul Westphal and Nate McMillan. He was promoted to associate head coach in November 2000. Nine of his teams in Seattle finished above .500 with five winning 50 or more games. The 1996 squad won the Western Conference Championship after finishing the regular season with a franchise record 64 victories.

In 14 seasons as an NBA assistant, Casey's teams have registered a 689-427 mark (.617) with eight campaigns of 50 or more wins. His teams have qualified for the playoffs in 11 of those 14 seasons.

Prior to joining the Sonics, Casey spent five years as a head coach in Japan. He also coached Japan's National Team with basketball legend Pete Newell. In the summer of 1998, Casey coached the team to its first World Championship appearance in 31 years.

From 1985-89, Casey was an assistant under legendary collegiate coach Eddie Sutton at the University of Kentucky. The Wildcats posted a 90-40 mark during that span. He also served as an assistant under Clem Haskins at Western Kentucky University from 1980-85.

Casey began his coaching career at Kentucky in 1979 as a graduate assistant under Joe B. Hall. While at UK, he recruited and coached eventual NBA players Winston Bennett, Sam Bowie, Rex Chapman, LeRon Ellis, Shawn Kemp, Chris Mills, Dirk Minnifield, Irving Thomas and Melvin Turpin.

Casey played collegiately at Kentucky and helped the Wildcats register a 30-2 record in his junior season and capture the 1978 NCAA Championship. A four-year letterman, Casey was named team captain his senior year and won Kentucky's all-academic award.

A native of Morganfield, Kentucky, Casey earned a degree in business administration from Kentucky in 1979. He and his wife, Brenda, have a daughter, Justine, and son, Zachary.




