Motorcycling Victoria




Motorcycling Victoria is a not-for-profit State Controlling Body for all motorcycle sport in Victoria.

MV aims to provide a safe, fair and inclusive environment for riders, coaches, officials and volunteers to participate in motorcycle sport.

The sport's volunteer-base is passionate and significant, working in tandem with MV to achieve its aim.

Motorcycling Victoria also provides highly-qualified officials and coaches through various training and education courses facilitated by MV to progress the sport and keep it safe.



Motorcycling Victoria, formerly known as the Auto Cycle Union of Victoria, was formed in 1928. The name changed to Motorcycling Victoria in 1999.

MV has over 70 affiliated motorcycle clubs across the state and has over 6000 members participating in nine disciplines of the sport.

In the early 70s, Motorcycling Victoria purchased land on Strath Creek Road, which has since become the State Motorcycle Sports Complex, formerly known as Reg Hunt Park. The first track to open at the SMSC was the motocross track and was opened by the then Prime Minister, the Honourable Sir Malcolm Fraser, in 1975.

The Dirt Track was opened in 1988 and the Road Race Circuit a few years later.

Ongoing development of the facility has been paramount to ensure Victoria's motorcycling community has a first-class sporting complex for newcomers to the sport and a professional area to train potential future champions of the sport. The MV-owned SMSC has also hosted the only World Motocross & Supermotard Grand Prix events to take place in Australia in 2000, 2001 and 2005.

MV is well-regarded as a progressive and innovative association, and a sound commercial partner, that networks well with other State Sporting Associations to garner knowledge that enables it to set a high standard within the sporting industry.

A MOTORCYCLING COMMUNITY WAS BORN

BROADFORD -THE HOME OF MOTORCYCLE SPORT IN VICTORIA

The State Motorcycle Sports Complex at Broadford is the home of motorcycle sport in Victoria.

Purchased by Motorcycling Victoria in 1975 this unique complex comprises of 160 hectares (400 acres) that comprised of up to 12 tracks that can host a variety of disciplines:

- Road race circuit (2.1km)
- Supermotard track
- Motocross tack
- Junior motocross track
- Supercross track
- Dirt track
- Speedway circuit
- Junior speedway circuit
- Enduro open-terrain areas
- Natural-terrain motocross areas
- Endurocross track
- Trials areas

The SMSC hosts numerous Club, State and National-level competitions and recreational events each year that see participant and spectator numbers in excess of 4000 people.


Broadford has also previously had the honour of hosting World Championship-level events for motocross and supermotard racing.

Each year, the complex hosts the much-lauded Broadford Bike Bonanza, which is a festival that celebrates classic motorcycle machines and takes place over the Easter long weekend. The SMSC also has a range of other infrastructure in place to support numerous activities at the venue including:

- Pit sheds with power and lighting
- Undercover garaging for vehicles
- Toilet & shower amenity blocks
- Media & conference rooms
- Race control centre
- First aid rooms and medical assistance
- On-site catering
- On-site camping
