OUR WORK

With the help of dedicated volunteers, we collect fresh bread from many local bakeries who generously donate their surplus at the end of the day.

We slice the loaves, sort the rolls and buns and pack every item in plastic bags to maintain freshness.

As we deliver fresh bread to the hungry and needy and share a moment of Grace with the isolated and lonely, it helps us build a strong community spirit, one that is conscious of the difficulties and hardships in our society.

WHERE WE WORK

Our main distribution centres are located in Marrickville, Erskineville, Balmain, Earlwood, Lewisham, Carnes Hill and Strathfield (by 2017).

Minor hubs are also located in: Redfern, Belfield, Belmore, Campsie, Clemton Park, Croydon Park, Hurstville, Camperdown and Pagewood.

DEMOGRAPHICS

We now share bread beyond Sydney's Inner West, and we are set to deliver over 180,000 bags of bread this year.

70% of this bread is distributed from our centre in Marrickville and 30% from the other centres.

WHO WE WORK WITH

We extend our reach to those in need by supplying fresh bread to charitable organisations, boarding houses, nursing homes, community groups, special schools, churches, outreach programs and individuals who share bread where it makes a difference in their communities.

Some of the organisations we support include: Exodus Foundation, St Vincent de Paul's Night Patrol, Asylum Seeker Centre, Australian Red Cross, Encounter Life Australia -**Borderless Community Services and** Chris Riley's Youth Off The Streets.
