Created for the ultra-serious and über-talented, this audition-only, full-time course is Australia's leading Certificate IV in Performing Arts qualification focused on musical theatre and commercial dance.

With over 26 years of delivering quality performing arts tuition, Brent Street is the most recognised and respected training ground for performing arts professionals. And for 20 years, Brent Street has offered a Certificate IV in Performing Arts qualification – focused on musical theatre and commercial dance – which is recognised by the national vocational education and training regulator, the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASAQ).

While national qualifications standardise appropriate competency outcomes and meet national quality assurance requirements, it certainly doesn't mean that all Certificate IV in Performing Arts courses are the same. The design of Brent Street's program is unique and it's a curriculum that's been honed over almost two decades to consistently deliver results. "It's a Certificate IV in Performing Arts but it's really a Development Program designed for those who are almost professionals," says Artistic Director Cameron Mitchell.

"We're going on 20 years doing these courses and it's like a good wine ... you just get better with age. We know exactly what we have to do to make sure you have the tools to go on and be the best in the business. And we have a great track record. While the design of the Brent Street curriculum is the bedrock of its success, it's the teachers who bring the program alive, because those who teach at Brent Street, do so with passion.

Headed by Artistic Director, Cameron Mitchell, who's been running the training program for over 10 years, many Brent Street teachers are graduates who have excelled as performing artists, established successful careers and who return to Brent Street to 'pass it on'. 

exceptionally high proportion of working performing arts professionals in the industry, all of whom are at the top of their game.

However, stage success isn't the only ticket to teaching there. Cameron oversees a tough screening process for all teachers who must have formal qualifications in the performing arts, a minimum of five years' industry experience and three years' teaching experience. Teachers must also have a finger on the pulse of what's happening in the industry and be able to develop from and teach the very latest trends.

As well as these technical performing arts skills, though, all teachers must be committed to fostering individuality, creativity and self-expression.

While classes led by the Brent Street staff teachers are top notch, they're enhanced by a number of classes with international guest choreographers and master classes with members of the Brent Street Artistic Council.

Brent Street Agency™ represents young adults and children from three years old to secure television commercials, films, series, voice overs, musical theatre and still photography. As a small, hands-on agency, its aim is to achieve castings for everyone represented. Well respected within the industry, the Agency team provides personal and professional artistic representation and advice based on years of experience.

Group auditions are held each year in October/November and April/May. This year, the fee for Brent Street Agency is \$475, which covers a professional photo shoot, membership with either of the online casting sites, AT2 or Showcast (at our discretion), and a 12-month membership.

Caroline O'Connor is a multi-award-winning singer/ dancer/actress who continues to grace the stages of Broadway, the West End, the Royal Albert Hall and the Sydney Opera House. As Nini in Baz Luhrmann's

Oscar-winning film Moulin Rouge, Caroline came to the attention of music lovers all over the world. Some of her signature roles include Piaf, Judy Garland, Velma Kelly in Chicago, Anita in West Side Story and Mabel in Mack & Mabel.

- > As Velma Kelly in Chicago, Caroline won the celebrated Mo Award for Female Musical Theatre Performer of the Year and a Green Room Award.
- > Her Australian productions include the one-woman play Bombshells. written especially for Caroline by acclaimed playwright Joanna Murray-Smith. She has since filmed Bombshells for ABC Television and toured the play to sell-out performances at the Edinburgh Festival (where she won the coveted Fringe First Award), London's West End at the Arts Theatre (for which she received her second Laurence Olivier Award nomination), and at the World Stage Festival in Toronto, Canada.



Steven Heathcote

Steven Heathcote, who spent 24 years dancing with the Australian Ballet – 20 of them as principal artist – has received three Helpmann Awards, two Mo Awards and an Australian Dance Award for Outstanding Performance by an Individual. In 1991, he was

appointed a Member of the Order of Australia for his services to dance.

- > After retiring from the dance stage in 2007 as the Australian Ballet's longest serving Principal Artist, Steven appeared in the 2009 feature film, Mao's Last Dancer, directed by Bruce Beresford.
- > In 2010, Steven conceived and directed a new production of Handel's Julius Caesar, for Victorian Opera.

Guest appearances overseas have been with a variety of companies including:

- > The Kirov Ballet in 1989, American Ballet Theatre in 1991 and 1993. Birmingham Royal Ballet, Ballet Nacional de Cuba, The Royal Danish Ballet, Kiev Ballet and Latvian National Ballet.

Kellie Dickerson is a well-known music director. conductor and musician who's currently the Musical Director for the Australian production of WICKED. She has been the recipient of the Donald Peart Memorial Award for Music, the Brian Stacev Memorial Trust

Scholarship to Young Conductors and won a placement in the Symphony Australia Young Conductor's Programme.



Certificate IV in Performing Arts (91508NSW)

Course outcomes

Students undertake training across a range of performance arts areas including dance, acting, singing, staging and production of live theatre and commercial performance.

Performance skills are developed and maintained to prepare students for work in a variety of live and recorded settings as a 'triple threat' - a versatile dancer, actor and singer.

Students become competent in dance genres including classical ballet, contemporary, theatrical and commercial jazz, tap and acrobatics. They learn skills in vocal technique, musicality and how to transfer acting techniques to a range of theatrical situations. Students are equipped with the skills needed to maintain peak performance quality by learning how to maintain fitness. They become competent choreographers and develop and maintain stagecraft skills.

The Certificate IV in Performing Arts (91508NSW) is a nationally recognised qualification. Gaining a Certificate IV enables students to be well equipped for employment in the performing arts and entertainment industries.

Students gain a breadth of technical skills, knowledge and understanding in performance discipline and practices.

Pathways

This course is part of a suite of studio and performance-based courses for people intending to undertake intensive studies in performing arts within the entertainment industry:

- > who are interested in a performance career:
- > who may have completed a Cert II or III performing arts or entertainment industry focused course, although it is not a prerequisite for entry into the Cert IV. Any previously attained units will be considered for recognition of prior learning (RPL);
- > who may wish to progress to national performing arts and entertainment qualifications and membership in MEAA (Media and Entertainment and Arts Alliance); and
- > who seek employment in musical theatre productions, commercial dance, TV and film, live theatre, cruise ship performances, casinos, clubs and resorts.

Fees* and course dates

The fee for the Cert IV course is \$10.560 based on \$503 per unit (including GST). An initial deposit of \$560 is payable on application. The remainder of the course fee is payable fortnightly with 20 payments of \$500 deducted from a nominated account from Feb 1, 2013.

Cert IV is a full-time, one-year program. It runs for 40 weeks from Monday to Friday. The course commences in early February and concludes in December 2013 (dates TBA).

Training assessment arrangements

Assessments include performance and production work, written reports, and the demonstration of skills learnt both on and off the job. Talent agent feedback at end-of-year auditions is a component in assessing student competency.

*FOR AUSTRALIAN RESIDENTS

Selection and enrolment of learners

Acceptance into this course is by audition only. This course is open to students over the age of 17 who have completed Year 10 secondary education and have an interest and aptitude in the performing arts. Enrolment is completed at orientation, which commences on the first day of term.

Client support services

Language, literacy and numeracy support teachers offer small group and one-to-one tutoring as needed. Counselling and career support services are provided by the classroom teacher in conjunction with a mentoring program with industry professionals.

Legislative and licensing arrangements

All teachers and support staff are checked annually for compliance with Working with Children legislation. Brent Street is an Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA) registered training organisation (RTO # 91488).

Complaints and appeal arrangements

Brent Street values feedback from students and employers and has a comprehensive Complaint and Appeal policy and procedures. All feedback contributes to enhancing Brent Street's programs to ensure best practice and continuous improvement.

Procedures for complaints and appeals are outlined in the Orientation Manual and include recommendations for informal resolution by way of consultation with teachers and staff. If a complaint is unable to be informally resolved, a written complaints process is in place to ensure speedy resolution of any issues.

Students may apply in writing to appeal a decision within 14 days of receiving written advice from Brent Street. To ensure transparency of process and fairness, the General Manager will consider any written appeals.

FAQs

How much are the fees?*

Fees for 2013 are \$10,560 for the Certificate IV in Performing Arts. Fees are payable as follows:

- > An initial payment of \$560 upon acceptance into the course; and
- > Twenty payments of \$500 deducted fortnightly from your nominated account from Feb 1, 2013.

Will I need to purchase additional books, resources, costumes and equipment?

You are required to purchase your own dance clothes and shoes. Books and costumes are all included in the course fees along with your Brent Street hoodie.

Costume Deposits

All students are required to pay a deposit for all costumes provided for Eisteddfod competitions and the Graduation concert.

A fee of \$50 per costume (maximum \$250) must be paid prior to receiving the costume. This refundable deposit will be returned after the end of year Graduation when all costumes are returned and checked for damage.

Any damage to costumes will result in the forfeit of your deposit for that costume.



What if I am a good dancer but have not had much exposure to acting or singing?

All performers have strengths and weaknesses which we aim to develop throughout the course. Therefore, you do not necessarily have to be outstanding in all disciplines, but we will discuss this with you at your personal orientation tour.

What if I live interstate and cannot attend a personal orientation tour?

In making a commitment to move states, we would suggest that you feel comfortable with your decision by attending a tour. However, we recognise that this is not always possible. We can organise for interstate auditions to be undertaken via DVD. Please contact Brent Street for details.

Can I apply for Austudy?

Yes, students enrolled in the Certificate IV in Performing Arts (91508NSW) can apply for Austudy.

What are the hours?

The course is full-time Monday – Friday with a minimum of 6 hours of classes per day over four (4) terms of approximately 10 weeks each.

When I graduate, what qualification will I receive?

You will graduate with a Certificate IV in Performing Arts (91508 NSW). This qualification is accredited by ASQA and recognised as part of the Australian Qualifications Framework. Should you wish to continue on to further studies in a related field, you may receive Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) for your studies at Brent Street. Students who do not satisfactorily complete the requirements of the Certificate IV will receive a Statement of Attainment listing the units of the competency achieved.

Do my academic grades count towards my audition?

No, your audition is based on practical ability only.

A full audition kit will be provided when your audition is booked.

Do I need a talent agent?

No, you do not need a talent agent prior to joining Brent Street.

We do have the Brent Street Talent Agency™ on site and you can ask them about professional representation once you are a student.

What if I live out of town?

Brent Street recommends Homestay as an option of securing accommodation. Students seeking accommodation may find these websites of some assistance.
