BUCKNELL FOOTBALL A CENTURY OF TRADITION

The game bore little resemblance to what we now know as football, and even one of the school names has been changed. In November of 1883, a group of students from Lafayette College journeyed west to play a group from the University at Lewisburg in the relatively new sport of football. The sport was so new, in fact, that the majority of the dozen or so students from Lewisburg, who did not have a coach and had practiced only briefly, had never seen a game of football before playing in one.

The players from Lewisburg, whose school would be renamed Bucknell University in 1886, lost that first game, 59-0, and perhaps because of that experience, their school did not play another official game until 1887.

Still, the seeds had been planted for a program that would grow into one of the most respected programs in the East by the 1950s, and will celebrate its 120th season in 2005.

Scores of marvelous players have donned the Orange and Blue over the course of the 119 seasons of Bucknell football, and each season gives rise to new names, new heroes, new legends.

Here is a quick trip through the colorful tradition that is Bucknell football:

1891


Still playing without a full-time coach, Bucknell gains its first victory ever with a 16-10 triumph over Lafayette. The Bison also defeat Cornell (4-0) and Penn State (12-10) on their way to a 6-2-1 record. The team includes Andrew Wyant, who later goes on to play for the legendary Amos Alonzo Stagg at the University of Chicago and is a member of both the Bucknell Hall of Fame and the National Football Hall of Fame.

1900

Christy Mathewson concludes his marvelous Bucknell football career and begins a professional baseball career that ranks among the best of all time. A hard-running fullback and tackler, "Matty" also excels as a kicker and gains national attention with two field goals against Army.

1918

Bucknell records the first of its three undefeated seasons. En route to a 6-0 record, the Bison are nothing short of dominant, outscoring opponents 236-7. The season ush-




Bucknell's 1899 football team — Christy Mathewson is in the back row, third from the right.

ers in a quarter-century of prosperity, as Bucknell enjoys 24 winning seasons in the next 26 years.

. 1924

The team sets a thenschool record for victories with an 8-2 mark and meets Lafayette on October 18 in the first football game ever played in Memorial Stadium. Wally Foster, the captain of that Bucknell team, scores the first points in stadium history.



. 1931

Led by future NFL Hall

of Famer Clarke Hinkle, Bucknell rolls to an unbeaten 6-0-3 record. The Bison's undefeated mark is tested in the final game of the season, against also-unbeaten Fordham, but the Bison prevail, 14-13, in a classic at the Polo Grounds.

. 1934

Edward (Hook) Mylin leads the Bison to a 6-2-2 regular-season record and a berth in the first Orange Bowl game, on January 1, 1935. After a two-day train trip to Miami for the game, Bucknell hammers the University of Miami, 26-0.

1951

In the midst of a four-year stretch in which Bucknell goes 27-8, head coach Harry Lawrence and his team finish perfect at 9-0, perhaps the finest season in school history. The defense includes Little All-America defensive tackle George Young (long-time general manager of the New York Giants), while the relentless offense averages 463.3 yards per game. That breaks the Eastern record set in 1945 by a Davis- and Blanchard-led Army team.

1960


After opening the season at 2-2, Bucknell rolls past Lafayette, Lehigh, Colgate, Temple and Delaware — by a combined score of 107-14 — to finish 7-2 and win its firstever Lambert Cup. Quarterback Paul Terhes earns Little All-America honors.

1964

Just four years after leading Bucknell to its first Lambert Cup title, head coach Bob Odell repeats that feat, as the Bison finish 7-2. After opening the season with a loss, Bucknell wins seven of the next eight games, including a 21-14 season-ending win at Delaware. The Bison squad features Little All-America end Tom Mitchell, who would later enjoy a fine pro career with Baltimore and San Francisco.

1968

Sam Havrilak sets a Bucknell single-game total offense record with 397 yards against Colgate, a mark that still stands. Havrilak, who would graduate with every Bucknell total offense record, later played with Tom Mitchell for the Baltimore Colts.

Ken Jenkins arrives at Bucknell,

and over the next four years, develops into one of the finest players in Bucknell history. He would set a school record with 1,270 rushing yards in 1980, and he later played with three NFL teams.

1986

1978

Two years after formation of the league is announced, the Colonial League (later renamed the Patriot League) debuts with six members — Bucknell, Colgate, Lehigh, Lafayette, Holy Cross and Davidson. The Bison's first-ever league game is one for the ages. Trailing Colgate in the fourth quarter, 39-25, Bucknell rallies to take a 40-39 lead with 52

seconds left, but the Red Raiders drive for a game-winning field goal attempt with four seconds left. After a bobbled snap from center, Colgate completes an impromptu pass play that nearly goes for a touchdown, but Bison defensive back Robert Hawkins drags down the receiver at the 9-yard line on the final play of the game.

1989


Bucknell's newly-renovated stadium is rededicated in honor of Christy Mathewson. Much like the stadium's namesake, Bucknell opens play in the "new" facility with a victory, handing Dartmouth a 36-20 setback on September 30.

1995

The Tom Gadd tenure begins at Bucknell, and the Bison finish 7-4. Rich Lemon becomes Bucknell's all-time rushing leader on opening day.

1996

Fittingly, Rich Lemon concludes his remarkable career with a Patriot League title, as Bucknell outlasts Colgate, 28-27, in the heart-stopping season finale. The win gives Bucknell its first football title in over 30 years. Lemon graduated with 4,742 rushing yards, nearly 2,100 more than the previous record-holder.

1997

The Bison roll out to a 10-0 record before falling to Colgate in their season finale to finish 10-1. The 10 wins were the most in school history, and many came in thrilling fashion, as the Bison won seven times by seven points or less.

2001

Bucknell celebrates its seventh straight winning season, a first in Bison annals.

_ 2003

After the legendary Tom Gadd loses a long battle with brain cancer, Bucknell turns to Tim Landis as its 25th head coach. Landis quickly resores the good fortunes of the Bison football program. After a 2-9/0-7 season in 2002, Bucknell finishes 6-6/4-3 to complete one of the nation's best one-season turnarounds.

THE TOP 10 A LOOK AT THE 10 MOST SIGNIFICANT BUCKNELL FOOTBALL GAMES EVER PLAYED... AND THE ONE THAT WASN'T

Stephen Taylor wasn't able to observe a football team practicing as he made his way to Harrisburg early in 1846 with the proposed charter for the fledgling University at Lewisburg, but even before the name of the school was changed in recognition of benefactor William Bucknell, the sport had been introduced on campus and gained some popularity.

Today, the sport is a fixture on fall Saturdays, and its history is prominent in any accounting of Bucknell's athletic heritage. The Bison gridiron story (did you know that the word "gridiron" derives from the manner in which the field was formerly marked?) includes many notable games, and we could probably argue for the next 150 years as to which were the most significant.

Before designating the 10 most significant games, please permit a look back at some of the more noteworthy games played by Bucknell football teams.

In 1881, a group of students from Bucknell and State College (as Penn State was known in those days) played a game of football which, at one time, was recognized as the first contest in the sport by either school, though now both schools say that it was only an informal meeting.

Bucknell's first official football game came against Lafayette on Thanksgiving Day, 1883, but a lack of student interest following that initial venture curtailed play for four years. In 1887, the sport returned to stay as Bucknell played its first two official games with Penn State.

Within another four years, Bucknell was playing regular schedules, and by 1895, the university had its first head coach.

The 1900 team finished 4-4-1, but gained national attention in an 18-10 loss to West Point. All the scoring for Bucknell came on two field goals by a hard-running fullback named Christy Mathewson.

The New York writers covering the game spread the word about this talented athlete, whose 48-yard field goal in that game was the longest in the country that year. Mathewson, who went on to become one of the nation's most admired athletes as a pitcher for the New York Giants, liked football more than baseball, and if the National Football League had existed at the time, it is probable that baseball would have been deprived of one of its greatest and most famous players.

Bucknell originally played football on Loomis Field, now home of the University's Gateway residences. In 1924, the Bison moved into what is now Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium, and christened the new field against Lafayette before a crowd of 15,000. Lafayette won the contest, 21-3, despite a 43-yard field goal by Bison captain Wally Foster to open the scoring.

Late that year, Bucknell beat Navy, 6-0, and Rutgers, 12-7, to highlight the first of three seasons in which Bucknell was coached by "Uncle Charlie" Moran, who had led Centre College's "Praying Colonels" to a memorable upset of Harvard. The Bison finished 8-2

in 1924, which represented the most victories ever by a Bucknell team.

Moran's 1925 team visited President Calvin Coolidge in the White House while in Washington to play Georgetown, and the Bison were rolling along at 6-2-1 when they played at the University of Detroit on Thanksgiving Day. The Bison won that game, 7-0, but the flamboyant coach also had scheduled a game at Dayton two days later. The travel and two games in three days were too much, and the weary Bison dropped a 19-0 decision.

This was not the first time Bucknell encountered scheduling difficulties. The 1891 team, led by Hall of Famers Andrew Wyant and "Warhorse" Allen, opened the season with a 16-10 victory at Lafayette, but then had to play Lehigh the following day and suffered a 62-4 beating.

Future College Football Hall of Famer Carl Snavely made his debut as Bucknell coach in 1927, and promptly posted a 13-7 win over Penn State, the Bison's first win ever in State College. His teams went on to beat the Nittany Lions for the next three years, and then the future Big Ten power dropped Bucknell from its schedule for three years.

Times do change.

In 1929, Bucknell completed its second 8-2 season in history with a 78-0 win over Dickinson. In that game, future college and professional Hall of Famer Clarke Hinkle scored 50 points, still a Bucknell record.

A 7-6 loss to Temple on Oct. 10, 1930 was noteworthy, for it was the first regularlyscheduled night football game ever.

Bucknell went 6-0-3 in 1931 for its second of three undefeated seasons, and the record included season-ending wins over two of the powers of the day, Washington &

Jefferson (10-6) and Fordham (14-13). The latter was played before a large crowd at the Polo Grounds, where Christy Mathewson had gained fame for the New York Giants.

Edward "Hook" Mylin arrived on the scene in 1934 and led Bucknell to a 7-2-2 record that included a 13-7 win over Penn State and a 26-0 rout of Miami in the Orange Bowl.

In 1938, the second season under Al Humphreys, the Bison won at Penn State, 14-0. It was the last time that Bucknell would defeat the Nittany Lions, who rose to national prominence following the end of World War II.

In 1949, Bucknell finished 6-2, and both losses (to Temple and Gettysburg) were by one point. Gettysburg scored the winning TD in its 34-33 win in the final 40 seconds.

Bucknell closed out the 1950 season with four straight wins, which set the stage for the 1951 campaign, in which the Bison rolled to a 9-0 mark. The perfect season concluded with a 21-20 win at Colgate and a 33-6 trouncing of Delaware in Memorial Stadium that led to a more than mild celebration on campus.

The 1951 team boasted several All-East and Little All-America players, and the Associated Press poll released on Nov. 20 listed Bucknell at No. 20 in the nation.

In 1954, BU beat Lehigh, 48-46, in a wild affair that produced the highest losing score ever by a Bison opponent.

One of the great eras in Bucknell football began in 1958 with the arrival of Bob Odell, and after a 1-8 mark in that first season, Odell led Bucknell to a 15-8 Homecoming win over Rutgers in 1959. The following year, a shutout of Delaware capped a 7-2 season and earned the first of two Lambert Cups for Odell's teams. The Bison reclaimed Eastern

supremacy in 1964, winning the Lambert Cup with a 7-2 mark.

Bucknell won the Middle Atlantic Conference title in 1965 with a 26-14 win over Delaware, and closed the season with a 22-14 win over Davidson. In that game, All-America Tom Mitchell was chasing the national record for career receiving, and coach Carroll Huntress and his staff devised a formation designed to hit Mitchell with short passes while he was in the backfield. On the second attempt, a bad snap from center led to a big loss, and attempts at the record were abandoned.

Mitch Farbstein, a member of the Buck-

• Bucknell played George Washington at home on Oct. 10, 1925, the day Christy Mathewson was buried in Lewisburg. In his memory, there was no cheering in the first quarter.

• Penn State dropped Bucknell from its football schedule for three years. It happened after the Bison beat the Nittany Lions three straight times between 1927-30.

• The 1935 Orange Bowl game between Bucknell and Miami featured the first-ever college football photograph transmitted over the wire by the Associated Press. nell Athletics Hall of Fame, was captured in the pages of *Life* after he led Bucknell to a 14-13 win over Gettysburg in 1971. That same year, the bruising fullback scored five touchdowns in a 33-0 win over Lafayette.

A 39-yard field goal by Al Yuknus with 20 seconds left gave Bucknell a 19-17 win at Dayton in the 1982 season opener, the Bison's first visit to the southern Ohio city since "Uncle Charlie" tried to win two games in three days in 1925. The game was also one of the hottest in Bucknell annals, as gametime temperature on the artificial surface was 112 degrees.

In 1987, back-to-back home games with Holy Cross (a 48-10 loss) and Columbia (a 62-20 win) brought the national news media to Lewisburg in droves.

The media came first to chronicle the Frank Merriwell-like heroics of the Crusaders' Gordie Lockbaum, and then returned the next week as Columbia attempted to escape its collegiate-record losing streak.

The Lions attempted an onside kick on the opening kickoff, but that failed, and Bucknell led 28-0 by the end of the first quarter and the Lions went on to their 37th straight loss.

Lou Maranzana's first season as head coach in 1989 included a very special afternoon, as the Bison's home stadium was rededicated to the memory of Christy Mathewson. Matty would have been proud, as the Bison that day beat Dartmouth, Maranzana's alma mater, 36-20.

The Tom Gadd era began in 1995, and the 7-4 record included a dramatic 21-14 win at Colgate in the first overtime game in Bucknell history.

The drama of that contest, though, paled in comparison to the Bucknell-Colgate game in 1996, as the Bison and Red Raiders again played into overtime, this time with the Patriot League title on the line. In a game that will be long remembered by all in attendance, Bucknell battled to a 28-27 win when a Colgate two-point conversion pass in overtime was batted down by Brandon Little, who would later earn All-America honors.

Bucknell built on its championship season by winning its first 10 games the following fall and compiling a 12-game winning streak, the second longest in school history. In the process of posting more wins than any other Bison team, Coach Gadd's charges were nationally ranked and led the Patriot League in total defense for the third straight year. However, the memorable season and win streak came to an end with a 48-14 loss at Colgate in a game that again decided the Patriot League crown.

The Bison continued their winning ways in 1999, turning in their fifth straight winning season with a 7-4 record behind an offense that scored 320 points — the third-highest single-season total in school history. Quar-

terback Don McDowell turned in one of his career-best performances to lead the Orange and Blue to a 21-16 victory at nationallyranked Colgate, while Jabu Powell stepped in at running back and led the Bison to their first win at Penn's Franklin Field (23-16) in over 30 years.

In 2001 the Bison made it seven straight winning seasons — a first in the history of the program — while playing on their new state-of-the-art FieldTurf.

With their football fortunes reaching heights never before seen, the Bison were dealt a devastating blow when Gadd had to step aside in 2002 to battle brain cancer. He lost that battle in March 2003. Gadd tied the BU record for career coaching victories with 48, achieving that figure faster than any of his predecessors.

Tim Landis succeeded Gadd in 2003, and quickly restored Bucknell's recent tradition as a Patriot League contender. The Bison finished in third place with a 4-3 league record, just one year after finishing 0-7. In his second season the Bison improved to 7-4 and were 4-2 in the Patriot League to record their second consecutive third-place finish.

On the following pages are the 10 most significant Bucknell football games ever played, compiled in chronological order. There are certainly many more games that deserve consideration, but we had to make some tough choices. Let the friendly arguments begin.

BUCKNELL FOOTBALL HISTORY

LAFAYETTE 59, BUCKNELL 0 (November 30, 1883)

Certainly not a score for Bucknell followers to remember, but the game is historic because it was the first one. A brief excerpt from an account of the game indicates that the style of both play and writing have changed over the years:

"...At this point the time for the first inning was up, and a breathing spell of fifteen minutes was given. At the beginning of the second inning, the University team came up somewhat discouraged, but nevertheless determined to make the other side work for whatever they might secure.

"They now used several of Lafayette's tricks with good result, and showed that it was but want of skill and practice that they had worked so disastrously in the first part of the game. For a full fifteen minutes, the ball was carried about the field without either side gaining a single point."

BUCKNELL 12, RUTGER\$ 7 (November 22, 1924)

The win gave tremendous recognition to the Bucknell football program. Playing at Franklin Field in Philadelphia, 'Mose' Wilbach scored both touchdowns for the Bison. Rutgers had gone into the contest undefeated.

BUCKNELL 14, FORDHAM 13 (November 21, 1931)

The game, played at the Polo Grounds, capped an undefeated (6-0-3) season and ended the brilliant Bucknell career of Clarke Hinkle, regarded by many as the finest Buck-

nell player ever.

Fordham also entered the game undefeated, and the contest was covered extensively by the New York media, bringing national attention to Bucknell and its football program.

The game, though, was marred by tragedy; Fordham's Connie Murphy died from injuries sustained in the game.

BUCKNELL 26, MIAMI 0 (January 1, 1935)

The very first Orange Bowl Game, this contest is probably the most written-about game in Bucknell history. The Bison's appearance in the game — which was no doubt aided by tireless efforts of publicity director Art Brandon — continues to bring widespread national publicity to Bucknell each January 1.

The game showcased the coaching talents of "Hook" Mylin, and the first AP photo ever transmitted from a college football game came from this contest.

As for the halftime show, which has become a staple of current Orange Bowl games, a newspaper account indicates that, "between the halves, the University of Miami band paraded around the field, followed by a truck carrying several University coeds in an orange-colored bowl. The young ladies threw oranges and tangerines, with more or less accuracy, among the spectators." Every victory in 1951 was necessary for the undefeated season, but this win came in the next-to-last game, on the road, and was one of only two games all year decided by seven points or less. It was also Bucknell's only win over Colgate in the 1950s; the Red Raiders ended BU's record 17-game winning streak in 1952.

BUCKNELL 26, DELAWARE 0 (November 19, 1960)

This was the fourth shutout in nine games for a terrific defensive team, and precipitated 24 hours of furious campaigning that led to Bucknell's first-ever Lambert Cup.

The win also came on the heels of eight straight losses to Delaware, and clinched first team Little All-America honors and other awards for quarterback Paul Terhes.

BUCKNELL 24, HARVARD 21 (October 3, 1964)

The Bison ended 73 years of frustration against the Ivy League, and the large number of Boston media in attendance were in high praise of Bucknell. The win also provided the impetus for two other three-point wins and Bucknell's second Lambert Cup in four years.

The contest also started Tom Mitchell en route to the first of two straight Little All-America and Eastern small college Player of the Year campaigns.

BUCKNELL 26, DELAWARE 14 (November 20, 1965)

The victory clinched the Middle Atlantic Conference title, which was – until 1996 – the Bison's only football conference championship ever. The game also closed the curtain on one of the finest careers in Memorial Stadium history, as Tom Mitchell played his final home game.


These games have been combined into one for this list, as they were the final two home games of coach Fred Prender's first year, and resulted in two big upsets.

UMass had entered the game undefeated (6-0), but Mitch Farbstein and Bob Langan each ran for two touchdowns as the Bison beat the Minutemen.

The next week, Bucknell faced a Colgate team that stood 4-2-1, and had hammered Bucknell, 47-24, the year before. Farbstein was unstoppable, rushing for 192 yards and a touchdown as the Bison routed the rivals from the Chenango Valley.

Student enthusiasm has been unsurpassed since that time, and the goal posts came down after both games.

BUCKNELL 28, COLGATE 27

(November 23, 1996)

Bucknell and Colgate met in Lewisburg with the Patriot League championship at stake, and the Bison won their first football league title in 31 years in dramatic fashion, as Brandon Little broke up a Colgate two-point conversion try in overtime.

Bucknell had lost an early 14-0 lead, and trailed 21-14 before Jim Fox engineered a remarkable 99-yard scoring drive midway through the fourth quarter, tying the game at 21-21 and forcing overtime.

Bucknell scored first in overtime, with Fox throwing his fourth touchdown pass of the game. Colgate answered, and then opted for a two-point conversion rather than a kick that would have forced a second overtime. With the league title riding on a single play, Colgate quarterback Ryan Vena rolled right and threw into the end zone, but Little batted the pass down, and bedlam ensued.

The game also was the final Bucknell contest for record-setting running back Rich Lemon.

HONORABLE MENTION

BUCKNELL ? , DELAWARE ? (November 23, 1963)


The list above was restricted to games that were actually played. A game that was never played, however, also deserves mention.

On Nov. 22, 1963, the nation was shocked and paralyzed by the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The Bucknell campus mourned with the rest of the world, and the football game scheduled at home the next day with the University of Delaware was postponed.

Bucknell had won three of its first five games before stumbling in a 14-13 loss to Lafayette. However, victories over Temple, Colgate and Lehigh brought the Bison to 6-3 going into the Delaware game.

A victory would give Bucknell a tie with Delaware for the Middle Atlantic Conference University Division championship. The Blue Hens were 8-0 overall and ranked first in the national small college polls conducted by both the Associated Press and United Press International.

Interest in the game was at an all-time high on campus, in Lewisburg and the surrounding area, and the media almost certainly would have overflowed Memorial Stadium's

press facilities. A sellout was a distinct possibility.

And then the shots rang out in Dealey Plaza. We watched a president take the oath of office on an airplane. We cried. We saw Jack Ruby make a shambles of any pretense of security. We cried again as a young boy saluted his father and the funeral procession moved slowly down Pennsylvania Avenue. We talked about what had happened and tried to get back to some semblance of "normal."

That included trying to reschedule the football game for the following weekend (Delaware said no), Thanksgiving Day (Delaware said no), or at a neutral site (Delaware said no).

The game that might have brought Bucknell its first conference crown and one of the largest home crowds in history was never played.

Delaware finished the season undefeated with its 8-0 record. UPI kept the Blue Hens at the top of their poll and awarded them a national championship plaque. AP, though, asked questions about why the game wasn't played, and learning of the Blue Hens' intransigence, dropped Delaware to second in its final ranking.

The game would be the last Bison contest to be canceled until 2001, when the September 11 tragedy again brought a halt to the sports world, including the Bucknell-Cornell football game.

George Young, noted National Football League executive and former Bison football star, passed away in December 2001 at the age of 71. Young earned Little All-America honors in 1951 on the Bison team that went 9-0, the last Bucknell team to finish a season undefeated. A 1952 BU graduate, Young

played in the Blue-Gray All-Star Game and then one season with the Dallas Texas before breaking into the front office ranks with the Baltimore Colts in 1968. He held several positions in that organization before moving to the Miami Dolphins as director of personnel and pro scouting in 1974.

Young was named general manager of the Giants in 1979, serving 19 years with that organization and helping it to Super Bowl titles following the 1986 and 1990 seasons. The winner of the NFL's Executive of the Year Award an unprecedented five times, Young was named Senior Vice President of Football Operations for the NFL in 1998.

Young was inducted into the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame in 1980.







TOM GADD/1965 & 1995 TEAM\$

TOM GADD REMEMBERED

On December 22, 1994 Tom Gadd was introduced as Bucknell's new head football coach. Raised in California, Gadd was highly regarded in college football circles as a defensive guru, although he was hardly a household name among Bucknell followers in Lewisburg, Pa. It did not take him long to make his presence felt. Taking over a program that had enjoyed only

one winning season in its previous 14, Gadd quickly instilled a winning spirit back into Bison Football, and he re-connected with the alumni, involving them in every step of the program. An inspiring presence not only in the locker room, but all across campus and in the surrounding communities, Gadd never had a losing season at Bucknell. The no-name from the other coast became one of the most beloved coaches in Bucknell annals. and he led the Bison football program to its most glorious seven-year stretch ever. On March 1, 2003, Tom Gadd passed away after a two-year fight with brain cancer. While the disease robbed Bucknell of a legend and a friend, his legacy will long carry on.

The Tom Gadd Era (1995-2001)

In seven years under Tom Gadd, Bucknell ...

• Enjoyed seven straight winning seasons, the only time in the 119-year history of the program it's ever happened.

• Won 48 games, lifting Gadd into a tie for first on Bucknell's all-time list of winning coaches. He achieved that mark faster than any other coach.

• Won 73.7 percent of its home games. Bucknell went 28-10 at home under Gadd.

• Placed a total of 97 players on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll, more than any other team.

• Captured only the second conference championship in program history, and the first since 1965. Bucknell won the Patriot League title in 1996.

• Established school records for most wins in a season and in a seven-year period. The Bison enjoyed their first 10-win season in 1997.






CELEBRATING THE 1965 & 1995 BUCKNELL FOOTBALL TEAMS

The 2005 season marks the 40th anniversary of the 1965 Bucknell team that won the Middle Atlantic Conference title. It was the last conference crown for the Bison for 31 years, until the 1996 club won the Patriot League.

First-year head coach Carroll Huntress led Bucknell to a 6-3 mark, including a season-ending three-game winning streak during which the Bison outscored their opponents 89-28. A 26-14 victory over Delaware in the second-to-last game of the season clinched the title for Bucknell.

The final contest of the season closed the storied career of star wide receiver Tom Mitchell. Mitchell still holds a number of Bucknell receiving records, including receptions in a game (13), receptions in a career (173) and

This is also the 10-year anniversary of Bucknell's memorable 1995 campaign. It was the first season under head coach Tom Gadd, and a Bison squad posted a 7-4 record, equaling their highest win total since 1951.

Bucknell possessed an intimidating defense that held four opponents to less than 10 points, including one shutout. In their seven victories, the Bison limited opponents to just 67 points (9.6 per game). Ed Burman, who was the Defensive Player of the Year in the Patriot League, registered a Bucknell record 14.5 sacks.

Junior running back Rich Lemon was the catalyst of the offensive unit. Bucknell's all-time leading rusher, he tallied his third consecutive 1,000yard season with 1,297 yards and earned his third straight All-Patriot

HALL OF FAM

S ix former Bison athletics stars along with legendary lacrosse coach Sid Jamieson have been elected to the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame. The Class of 2005 will be formally inducted at a breakfast ceremony during Homecoming Weekend festivities on Oct. 1. The inductees will also be honored at halftime of the Bucknell-Marist football game later that afternoon.

The Bucknell Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 1979 to honor the very best in the history of Bison athletics. Elected to the Class of 2005 – the 27th Hall of Fame class – are former basketball stars Mike Bright '93 and Harvey Carter '73, record-setting football quarterback Scott Auchenbach, track and field sensation Tameka Hinton '95, wrestling standout Ed Curran '88 and lacrosse scoring machine Justin Zackey '94.

This year's induction brings to 186 the number of outstanding student-athletes, coaches, administrators and friends of Bucknell whose contributions to Bucknell athletics are forever preserved in the Hall of Fame.

SCOTT AUCHENBACH '90 was one of the best passing quarterbacks in Bucknell football history. As a senior in 1989 he was named Most Valuable Player of the Colonial League and was selected as an Honorable Mention All-American. He ranked seventh among all Division I-AA quarterbacks in passing efficiency that season, and he graduated with 13 school passing and total offense records. Auchenbach threw for 2,385 yards and 19 touchdowns in 1989 and had 418 completions for 5,256 yards and 42 touchdowns in his career.

A team co-captain and Christy Mathewson Award winner as the top senior athlete at Bucknell, Auchenbach still holds school records for passing yards in a season and career, completions in a career, touchdown passes in a career and total offense in a season (2,511 in 1989) and career (5,404). He is the only quarterback in 119 years of Bison football to throw for over 5,000 yards, and his name is still etched in the NCAA record book for most consecutive completions to start a game (18 vs. Colgate in 1989).

MIKE BRIGHT '93 was the top player on Bucknell's outstanding teams of the early 1990s. He was the Patriot League Player of the Year as a senior in 1993, when he led the Bison to a 23-6 record and the league's regular-season title. Outstanding in all phases of the game, Bright is Bucknell's No. 3 all-time scorer with 1,670 points, trailing only fellow Hall of Famers Al Leslie (1,973) and Bob Barry (1,809). He also remains the school's career steals leader with 286, which is a whopping 113 steals more than any other player in Bison annals. Bright also nabbed 834 career rebounds, seventh all-time at Bucknell, and he is one of only two players in school history to record 1,500 points and 800 rebounds.

HARVEY CARTER '73 was a three-year starter and two year captain of the Bison basketball team. Carter was a First Team All-Middle Atlantic Conference selection as a senior in 1972-73, when he led the team in scoring at 14.2 points per game under coach Jim Valvano. In fact, Carter led the team in both scoring and rebounding in each of his last three seasons at Bucknell. He logged 1,013 points and 783 rebounds in his career, making him one of only 13 players in school history to collect 1,000 points and 500 rebounds. He still ranks 29th on Bucknell's career scoring list and eighth on the rebounding chart, and he is one of only four men in the last 50 years to lead the team in scoring and rebounding three straight years.

ED CURRAN '88 was a three-time East Coast Conference wrestling champion. Hall of Famer Tom Scotton is the only other Bucknell wrestler to make that claim. He qualified for the NCAA Tournament three times and was a guarterfinalist in 1986. As a senior, Curran posted a 23-4 record at 134 pounds, and he posted an impressive career record of 71-20-1, which was then the second-highest victory total at Bucknell. He was the Outstanding Wrestler at both the Bloomsburg Invitational and Cornell Invitational in 1987. Curran was just as successful off the wrestling mat, where he made the Dean's List every semester, won the prestigious University Prize for Men and was a Second Team Academic All-American. He also earned the ECAC Medallion and graduated magna cum laude.

TAMEKA HINTON '95 is a first-ballot Hall-of-Famer and quite simply one of the top woman athletes in school and Patriot League history. She graduated with a whopping 19 conference track and field gold medals, including four straight in the 55-meter dash, 100-meter dash and 200-meter dash. She also earned league title in the shot put. Hinton was named Outstanding Performer of the Patriot League Championships three times and was elected to the Patriot League All-Decade Team. She still holds school records in the indoor 55-meter dash (7.12), 300-meter dash (41.54 in an event that is no longer held) and sprint medley relay (4:08.7). She also broke the indoor mark in the 200-meter dash (24.95) and now ranks second by just .01 seconds. Outdoors Hinton still ranks second in the 100 meters (12.09), third in the 200 meters (24.85) and sixth in the shot put (42-10 ¹/₄). She captured the 1995 Christy Mathewson Award as the top athlete in her class.

The only head coach in the 38-year history of Bison lacrosse, SID JAMIESON retired from coaching following the 2005 season. Tenth among all collegiate lacrosse coaches with 242 career victories. Sid led his Bison teams to seven championships in three different conferences, including four straight Patriot League titles from 2000 to 2003. He was named the USILA National Coach of the Year in 1996 after directing Bucknell to a perfect 12-0 season, and he led the Bison to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 2001. He has also been a dynamic force on the international lacrosse scene through his involvement with the Iroquois National Team, and he has served as an avid spokesman for the Native American influence on the sport. From 1983-86 Jamieson served as head coach of the Iroquois Nationals and led the team to the 1984 World Lacrosse Games. He took the team to the World Lacrosse Championships in Perth. Australia, in 1990 while serving as the team's executive director, and he is currently an emeritus member of its executive board. Many of lacrosse's most prominent honors have been bestowed upon Jamieson, who was also an assistant football coach from 1967-88. He won the highly esteemed Gen. George M. Gelston Award in 1985, as the person who most represents the symbol of the game of lacrosse. He received the Howdy Myers Memorial Award as college lacrosse's "Man of the Year" in 1986 and 1996, and just this spring he received the Spirit of Tewaaraton Award for his contributions to the sport

One of Jamieson's all-time great players was JUSTIN ZACKEY '94, who still holds the Bucknell records for goals in a season (63) and career (138) and points in a season (79 in 1993). A two-time Honorable Mention All-American who led the nation in goals per game (4.20) in 1993, Zackey was a First Team All-Patriot League pick in 1993 and 1994 and was a two-time Academic All-American (third team in 1993 and first team in 1994). He is the only player in school history to have two sevengoal games. A biology and geography double major, he earned a prestigious Luce Foundation Scholarship and studied ethnic issues in China during a year-long project. During his undergraduate days he served as a teaching assistant for summer geography courses in Eastern Europe and West Africa, and he also studied in London for a semester.

In addition to the 68 football-playing members of the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, five of Bucknell's inductees also have been inducted into national football halls of fame.

Andrew Wyant, a Bison star from 1888-91, who later went on to play with the University of Chicago, is a member of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame.

Clarke Hinkle, an outstanding back who later starred for the Green Bay Packers, is a member of both the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame and the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

Carl Snavely and Edward "Hook" Mylin are members of the National Football Hall of Fame and the Helms Hall of Fame. Snavely went 42-16-8 at Bucknell from 1927-33 and also coached at Cornell, North Carolina and Washington (Mo.) University. Mylin, who succeeded Snavely, coached Bucknell's Orange Bowl championship team.

Bob Odell, who coached Bucknell to Lambert Cup titles in 1960 and 1964, was inducted into the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame in 1992 in honor of his remarkable career at Penn.

The most famous member of the Hall is probably Christy Mathewson, who is also a charter member of the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y. At Bucknell, Mathewson was an outstanding dropkicker and fullback on Bison football teams from 1898-1900.

Nominees should be persons who have had outstanding careers as athletes, coaches or administrators at Bucknell. Athletes must wait a minimum 10 years from graduation in order to become eligible.

Those making nominations are asked to forward to the committee any available information in support of the nomination. This might include letters, news clippings, photographs, reference to passages in books or magazines, or any other document which might be helpful to the committee in its deliberations. Materials will be returned to the owner upon request. The deadline for nominations for the 28th Hall of Fame class is January 1, 2006.
