## METHODOLOGY

## ABOUT THE PROBE RESEARCH OMNIBUS

Between March 12 and April. 13, 2018, over two waves of the quarterly Omnibus, Probe Research surveyed a random and representative sampling of 2,000 adults residing in Manitoba.

For more than two decades, Probe Research Inc. has undertaken quarterly omnibus surveys of random and representative samples of Manitoba adults. These scientific telephone surveys have provided strategic and proprietary insights to hundreds of public, private and not-for-profit clients on a range of social, cultural and public policy topics. The Probe Research Omnibus Survey of 1,000 Manitoba adults is the province's largest and most trusted general population survey.

## SURVEY INSTRUMENT

The survey instrument was designed by Probe Research in close consultation with the Winnipeg Free Press.

Minor statistical weighting has been applied to this sample to ensure that age and gender characteristics properly reflect known attributes of the province's population. All data analysis was performed using SPSS statistical analysis software.

## KEY FINDINGS

- With the endorsement of 44 per cent of decided voters province-wide, Manitoba's governing Progressive Conservatives are clearly the province's most popular political party. The NDP is well back at 28 per cent while the Liberals are currently supported by 19 per cent of provincial voters. Twenty-three per cent of Manitoba's eligible voters were unable or unwilling to declare a party preference at this time.
- The Brian Pallister-led PCs are holding firmly onto similar levels of popular support they enjoyed this time last year. Meanwhile, support for the NDP is unchanged since December and is roughly on-par with its April 2016 election performance. For its part, Manitoba's Liberal party has seen a six-point decline in popularity since December. However, its current level of popular support is higher than its actual 2016 election results.
- Rural Manitoba voters remain overwhelmingly on-side with the Tories, while there is a far more competitive, three-way contest in Winnipeg.
- In Winnipeg, the PCs are most heavily favoured in Northeast and Southeast neighbourhoods, while the NDP out-polls its rivals only in the Core area. The three parties are highly competitive in Southwest Winnipeg.

Support for the PCs is highest in rural Manitoba (59\%), among men (51\%) and among those with high school or less (54\%).
Support for the NDP is highest among women ( $35 \%$ ) and Indigenous people (42\%).
Support for the Liberals is highest among Winnipeggers (25\%) and those in lower-income households (33\%).
